

Presbyterian Cruises Past Mid-Atlantic Christian

Eleven Presbyterian Blue Hose players scored led by six double-figure scorers as Presbyterian (7-4) cruised past the Mid-Atlantic Christian Mustangs, 118-51, in front of a season-high Education Day crowd of 1,007. Presbyterian's 118 points set the program's Division I era record for most points in a game.

Jamahri Harvey and Jonah Pierce scored 16 points apiece. Harvey was a perfect 6-for-6 shooting from the field including 3-for-3 from beyond the three-point arc. Pierce also grabbed nine rebounds. Kaleb Scott and Marquis Barnett scored 15 points each. Scott was a perfect 7-for-7 from the field while grabbing five rebounds. Barnett grabbed five rebounds with five steals and four assists. Kory Mincy and Carl Parrish each scored 11 points off the bench. Trevon Reddish-Rhone with a strong all-around game with nine points, seven rebounds, and a season-high seven assists. Kobe Stewart scored eight points off the bench while shooting 3-for-5 from the field.

Presbyterian finished the game with a 58-14 advantage on points in the paint and a 55-11 advantage on bench points. For the game, Presbyterian shot 69.8 percent from the field while limiting Mid-Atlantic Christian to 34 percent shooting.

HOW IT HAPPENED

FIRST HALF - Presbyterian scored the game's first six points and never looked back. Scott, Barnett, and Reddish-Rhone connected on early baskets for the Blue Hose. Mid-Atlantic Christian scored five straight points cutting PC's lead to 6-5. Presbyterian went on a 7-0 run behind baskets from Reddish-Rhone, Barnett, and a threepoint basket from Samage Teel, who scored eight points and dished out seven assists in the win. MACU connected on a three to get within five points of PC, 13-8. PC scored four straight points pushing their lead to 17-8 with 12:35 on the clock. MACU scored two points cutting PC's lead to 17-10. Then, the Blue Hose blew the game open with a 15-0 run taking a 32-10 lead after a fast break layup from Barnett with 6:42 on the clock. Presbyterian pushed their lead to a first half high of 38 points, 54-16, after a made free throw from Barnett with 30 seconds on the clock. MACU connected on two free throws with three seconds on the clock. Presbyterian led 54-18 at the half.

SECOND HALF – At the 15:38 mark, Presbyterian led 68-26 and MACU would not get any closer. Presbyterian's lead ballooned to a game-high 67 points after two free throws from AJ Shaw with 41 seconds left in the game. NOTES

After scoring 118 points, Presbyterian improved

to 12-0 in games that they have scored 100 points in the school's Division I era.

Charlotte, N.C. – The Presbyterian College Blue Hose women's basketball team (7-3) beat the Queens University of Charlotte Royals (4-5), 68-60 on the road, despite being down by 22 points with a minute to go in the first half.

After losing 38-19 at halftime, the Blue Hose came out with a vengeance in the second half, scoring 49 points while holding the Royals to just 22 points in the final two quarters. Mara Neira scored a new season-high of 24 points and came up huge in the beginning of the fourth quarter where she drilled four consecutive three-point shots to put PC ahead 54-49. First Quarter - Queens started out the game by scoring the first eight-points before a jumper from Christina Kline ended the Royal's streak. PC picked up another point after a foul on Bryanna Brady, but Queens sent the game to a media timeout with a 12-3 lead. The Royal's took the next six-points before Paige Kindseth swished a two-point bucket to make the score 18-5. Queens ended the first quarter with a score of 24-6.

Second Quarter - Presbyterian scored the first four-points of the second quarter behind buckets from Ashley Carrillo and Neira. After two more points from both sides, followed by a scoreless three minutes, the Royals claimed the last twopoints before the media timeout which gave them a 28-12 lead. Queens made the next basket but PC answered with four-points of their own to make the score 30-16. The Royals then went on an eight-point run before Herrin made a three-point jumper to end the first half. After two quarters Queens led by 19 points with a score of 38-19.

Third Quarter - A layup by Brady started off the second half for the Blue Hose. Queens answered with a two-point jumper, but the Blue Hose fought for the next 10 points to bring the Royal's lead down to nine. A three-point play from Queens made the score 43-31, but a pullup jumper from Herrin followed by a layup from Laney Scoggins made it an

eight-point game with a score of 43-35. Baskets from both sides kept it that way, until Herrin swished a perfect three-point shot to make the score 45-40. Two more points from both teams ended the third quarter with a score of 47-42.

Fourth Quarter - Neira started off the final quarter of play on a hot streak after draining four straight three-point shots to give the Blue Hose their first lead of the game with a score of 54-49. The Royal's took the next four-points before a layup by Kindseth made the score 56-53 with Presbyterian still holding the lead. Both teams exchanged free throws to push the score to 58-55 when a layup from Neira put the Blue Hose up by five with 2:30 to play. Queens took the next five-points to tie the game at 60 points apiece before a layup from Carrillo put PC up by twopoints with 1:03 left to go. After Queens committed several fouls, the Blue Hose scored the last six-points of the game to secure a 68-60 victory.

NOTABLES

Mara Neira scored a season-high of 24 points after shooting 50% from the field (8-of-16) and from outside the arc (4-of-8).

Natalie Herrin recorded a new career-high of 12 points and 6 rebounds.

The team came back and won the game after being down by 22 points (38-16) with 1:02 left in the second quarter.

Held Queens to 22 points in the second half while scoring 49 points themselves.

Shot at 57.1% (16-of-28) from the field in the second half.

The Presbyterian College Blue Hose women's basketball team (8-3) took victory over the South Carolina State Bulldogs (1-11) with a score of 63-52. Three double-figure scorers led PC to their sixth consecutive win. The Blue Hose's six game win streak ties the program's record for most consecutive wins in a season. The last time this happened was during the 2012-13 season.

COACH SHARP'S THOUGHTS

"SC State played a great game, our team really responded at halftime. Usually our assist total shows you how our offen-



sive end is going. We had three assists at 60% (6-of-10) from the field, and 40%halftime, but had nine in the second half and I think that shows that we came out of the locker room really well."

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - The Presbyterian College Blue Hose women's basketball team claimed their second weekly award in a row after Tilda Sjökvist collected her first Big South's Offensive Player of the Week accolade.

Sjökvist played a key role in both of Presbyterian's wins last week. First PC beat UNCW on the road with a score of 64-51. Then, the Blue Hose welcomed Morehead to Clinton, S.C. where PC won 65-59. This was Sjökvist's fourth and fifth consecutive double-figure scoring games.

Overall, Sjökvist totaled 44-points and shot 62.5% (15-of-24) from the field

and 50% (6-of-12) from the three-point line. She made 100% (8-of-8) of her free throws and added five steals, seven assists, and three rebounds to her efforts. In Presbyterian's

road win over UNCW, Sjökvist recorded 18-points (which was her season-high at the time) while shooting

(2-of-5) from outside the arc. She went 4-of-4 from the line, and added four assists, two rebounds, and two steals.

In the home win over Morehead State, Sjökvist recorded a new career-high of 26-points after shooting 64.3% (9-of-14) from the field while shooting 57.1% (4-of-7) from outside the arc. She made all four of her free throw attempts while also tallying three steals, three assists, and a rebound.

Throughout Presbyterian's seven games this season, Sjökvist has averaged 11.4 points per game which ranks her seventh in the Big South Conference. She is also ranked seventh in the conference for her 2.9 assists per game and sixth for her 1.7 3-PT field goals per game. Sjökvist has also recorded seven steals and 16 rebounds.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - The Presbyterian College men's tennis team, who have captured Big South Conference Tournament titles in 2017, 2021, and 2023, were picked to finish second by the league's coaches in the Big South Preseason Poll, as announced on Thursday.

Last season, Presbyterian shared the Big South regular-season title while capturing the program's third Big South Tournament title and earning a bid to the NCAA Tournament. The Blue Hose have reached the Big South Conference Tournament Championship match six times in the program's history while claiming three tournament titles. The Blue Hose are under the guidance of head coach John Collins, who is in his fourth season at PC. Presbyterian returns six letterwinners off last season's team led by senior Javier Matos, a 2023 Second Team All-Big South Singles and Doubles selection, and sophomores Denim Yadav, the 2023 Big South Freshman of the Year, and David Mamalat, who earned Big South Freshman of the Week accolades three times last season. Rounding out the returners are juniors Pedro Cardoso and Loup Alleno and sophomore Austin Skoog. Joining those returning letterwinners are talented newcomers freshmen Marco Foglieni, from Italy, and Evgenios Vasilakis, from Greece. Presbyterian began its 2024 season on the road at perennial NCAA Tournament team the Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders Saturday, January 13 at 2 p.m.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Presbyterian College Blue Hose women's tennis team was selected third by the league's coaches in the Big South Preseason Poll, as was announced on Thursday.

The third-place selection marks the highest ever preseason ranking the Blue Hose have earned in their time in the Big South surpassing the fourth-place selection during the 2022 preseason.

"Really excited for our program and our team with this preseason honor." Said Presbyterian head coach Joel Roberts. "We have been building the program for the last few years and it just shows the hard work the girls have put in. They also know we still have to go play the matches and get the wins we need to continue to build our program and exceed expectations."

Charleston Southern received six first-place votes and 36 total points as the Buccaneers were predicted to win the league. UNC Asheville earned five second-place votes with 29 total points. PC earned 22 points and finished third in the preseason poll. Gardner-Webb slid into fourth place with 19 points while Longwood placed fifth (11 points). Radford rounded out the field with nine points in sixth place. In addition to the preseason poll, the Big South has had coaches around the league vote for a preseason player of the year for the first time. Noa Boyd from Charleston Southern is this year's Big South Preseason player of the year after receiving 14 points. Presbyterian's Lucianna Piedra received five points for this award.

The Blue Hose 2024 season began Saturday, January 13 with PC traveling to Charlotte, N.C. for a match against Queens followed by one against Charlotte. Big South play begins March 17 with a home match against Longwood.

TRAILS ABLAZE, GLASS CEILINGS SHATTER: PC TAKES DOWN THE FIRST NCAA DI WOMEN'S WRESTLING QUAD DUAL

THE PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE WOMEN'S WRESTLING TEAM COMPETED IN THE FIRST TRAILBLAZER DUALS AT CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA AT THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

OWA CITY, IOWA – You don't know what history sounds like until you hear it with your own two ears – but this wasn't just history, it was HERstory.

The Presbyterian College Blue Hose Women's Wrestling team traveled to the University of Iowa in Iowa City to compete in the first ever NCAA Division I Women's Wrestling Quad. The event, rightly dubbed the "Trailblazer Duals," featured the only NCAA DI schools in the country to offer women's wrestling as a collegiate sport: the Presbyterian College Blue Hose, the Sacred Heart University Pioneers, the Lindenwood University Lions and the host, the University of Iowa Hawkeyes.

"The atmosphere in the Carver-Hawkeye Arena was electric. Every movement warranted some sort of reaction from a crowd filled with excited and enthusiastic wrestling fans," said PC head coach Brian Vutianitis.

History was the sound of a roaring crowd and fans shouting "TWOOO!" History was the sound of fire cannons blasting on the matsides as competitors went to cordially shake hands before they battled for six long, grueling minutes. History was the sound of athletes cheering and high-fiving, harmonizing with the sounds of other athletes weeping and consoling. History was all the sounds that could be heard inside the infamous Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

"The arena was bleeding black and gold and gigantic in size," said freshman wrestler Lilly Luttrell. "The moment you walked out there were cameras, spotlights, fog and even pyrotechnics in the works. It was the kind of stuff you see on T.V. for men's wrestling, but only this time it was for the women of this sport."

The Trailblazer Duals also marked another glass-ceiling-breaking moment for women in sport with the largest crowd in history at a women's wrestling event, the attendance totaling at 8,207 spectators.

"Competing in front of 8,207 people is insane to even believe," said freshman wrestler Maddie Kubicki. "It just shows how much this sport has grown and how women's wrestling is constantly making history in its own way. I have no words for what it was like to be surrounded by thousands of fans watching us make history. All I could do was just take it all in and enjoy this rare experience."

After falling to the No. 8-ranked Hawkeyes (44-1) and the fifth-ranked Sacred Pioneers (26-18), the 13th-ranked Blue Hose picked up their first dual win of the season against 11th-ranked Lindenwood with a closely fought 25-20 victory. This upset in the rankings was highlighted by two back-to-back pins by Kubicki at 155 lbs. and Henlee Haynes at 170 lbs.

According to PC sophomore Paige Wehrmeister, who picked up a pair of wins on Sunday, the event was vaster than square footage and spectator numbers compared to the gymnasiums with "around 8 people in the stands" of some of the dual events from the past season.

Kubicki agreed.

"All eyes were on us," she said. I'm used to coaches and parents yelling in a gymnasium."

Numbers and hype did not deter the Blue Hose, though. They said the noise is just background static when it comes to what happens between whistles.

"It just felt like wrestling because that's what I did," said freshman Alyssa Mahan, who went 2-1 on the day, picking up a pin and a 13-4 decision win. "The only thing on my mind was just to go out there, do my thing, score points and wrestle hard through every position."

"When wrestling, I usually don't focus on who's watching me, I just go out there and fight each match with everything I have," said Kubicki.

Vutianitis holds a similar attitude toward coaching as Mahan and Kubicki hold toward competing.

"I wouldn't say coaching in front of a crowd this size is much different than coaching in our home gym, only because I make it my job to separate any emotion of our surroundings from the goals of the event," he said. "I am grateful to have been a part of such a largely attended event but coaching, to me, is very much the same no matter where or what event we are attending."

Any other athlete or coach could easily let the pressure of the overwhelming percentage of attendance wearing an opposing team's colors or cheering in the moments where your face is in the mat get to them, but not PC Women's Wrestling.

"You know going into Carver-Hawkeye that the crowd isn't going to be on your side," said Wehrmeister.

Iowa's team brought the numbers in – of course. A Big 10 school with a men's wrestling team holding 24 national championships and one of the most dedicated fan bases in college wrestling, people are going to want to see how the women's team measures up.

What Iowa brought was big, but what

the Blue Hose brought was equally important.

In the locker room before the team walked out to be greeted by their opponents, there was more media and a crowd much larger than any college women's wrestling team has ever been used to. PC's team quietly lined the chairs of a meeting room in the visitor's locker room, about 50 paces away

from the sounds, cameras and lights that would soon strike the athlete's faces.

This was the calm before the storm.

"Don't get it mixed up," Coach Vutianitis said, scanning the room to make eye contact with each of the athletes. "The crowd may be cheering for them, but this moment is for you. Division I Women's Wrestling doesn't exist without you. This moment doesn't exist without you."

He said all of this in reference to the fact Presbyterian College was the first NCAA DI school in the nation to offer a sanctioned varsity women's wrestling team in 2019. Since then, two other schools, Sacred Heart and Iowa, added women's wrestling with Lindenwood moving up from Division II this season.

Those thousands of Hawkeye fans would not exist without a small liberal arts college in Clinton, South Carolina, with one-eighth of the student body of that crowd, adding the sport to its roster five years ago. The investment was history which continues to breed history, each year by tenfold.

The history made this Sunday only exists with PC Women's Wrestling. PC is the past, present and future of Division I women's wrestling, inside and outside of the Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Blue Hose have a lone message: This is only the beginning

Having her hand raised in six consecutive matches to aid the Presbyterian College women's wrestling team to four victories in a row, true freshman Cassia Zammit was selected as the Adidas / Game One PC Student-Athlete of the Week.

Joining fellow newbie Henlee Haynes who received the distinction on November 7, Zammit kept the train rolling during the team's first-ever complete shutout over the weekend against Huntingdon (47-0), defeating her opponent in the 136-lb. class via 70-second pin.

Behind a 4-2 overall record, the Blue Hose find themselves at number 13 in the latest NWCA countrywide rankings. Zammit may just be the hottest of the bunch thanks to her increasing win streak, boosting her individual mark to 7-2 on the young campaign.

A native of Miamisburg, Ohio, Cassia's pin on Saturday landed as the fourth fall of her PC career for a group that has calculated 75 W's since the start of the semester. At present, it's been 30 days and counting since the freshman has taken a loss (going 3-0 inside Templeton Gym).


Prior to the one-sided beatdown over the Hawks last weekend, Zammit helped Presby defeat both Bluefield State and Allen by an added difference of 68 points with a forfeit and a 10-0 technical. Currently, she equals Haynes (170) and Chiara Barbieri (101) for the thirdhighest win count on the roster.

While the majority of PC's slate thus far has occurred in a dual setting, the rest of December will see the squad enter into two tournaments just over two weeks apart. They'll head to Emory & Henry in Virginia for the Wasp Open in three days' time, transitioning to the esteemed Midlands Championships in Chicago on the 30th.

Presbyterian similarly squared off in the Wasp Open 12 months ago and utterly dominated the field on their way to an eventual ninth-place national finish in March, claiming six different wrestlers in the top three of their respective weight class at that specific event in 2022.

The Presbyterian College Athletic Department partnered with Game One on a multi-year apparel agreement last November as an official team dealer for Adidas. The partnership extended the university's alliance with Adidas which began in 2015 to outfit the Blue Hose athletic programs.

On Saturday, Sept. 30, USC Union Anglers Isaac Greene and Bryson Holderness won the Clemson Bass Fishing Trail "Lake Keowee" event. It was their first collegiate win and only the third tournament of the year.

"We capitalized on our opportunity," said Holderness. "It was truly a special day for us."

Holderness, a freshman from Gilbert, SC, says that the bass fishing team at Union was a perfect fit for him. After graduating from Gilbert High School, where he competed on their bass fishing team, he found that USC Union was an affordable option that allowed him to take online classes and work during the week while doing what he loves on the weekends. "What I enjoy most about the sport of fishing is being in the great outdoors," he said. Though he says it can be challenging to persevere through the up and down results of the sport, this win had made him more confident in himself and Greene as a team. "I am excited to see how we compete against some of the best college anglers in South Carolina and across the US in the spring."

"Our sport is never the same two days in a row," said Greene. "Constant change makes it so anglers are always having to evolve and change as well." On the weekend of the competition, he and Holderness were able to find some good fish on the practice day, but were not able to locate them on the day of the tournament. "We talked and made a simple move and like magic we had our five fish limit in the boat. [Soon] we were culling out (replacing smaller fish with the bigger) and we kept upgrading all day long and ended up being able to pull off the win with 15.9 pounds and a 4.7-pound big fish." Greene is a freshman from Landrum and had competed on the Landrum High School team since he was in 6th grade. "Coach Coone reached out and I was drawn to the team chemistry and the small campus," he said. He is looking forward to competing out of state in the spring season.

"I'm pretty happy with the overall success that we've had so far this season," said Coach Cameron Coone. "I'm proud of Isaac and Bryson for getting the win on Lake Keowee, because it is not an easy place to catch a giant bag of largemouth." He says that the team is getting to the point in the season where they tend to have a lot of success. "Fish patterns change with the weather and our anglers historically do well during the late fall to winter transition," he said. Coone says that recruiting for the bass fishing team has been going "exceptionally well" as



he has had multiple potential students visit from outside the university's normal recruiting areas. "I am excited with the growth and momentum that we currently have going forward."

"This game is 90% mental and 10% physical," said freshman Jaeden Weathers. "So much can go wrong and so little can go right." A graduate of Laurens High School, where he was the #1 golf player, he says that the furthest his ball has ever traveled is 374 yards, but that having more speed and power makes it harder to be accurate. Between the simulator and his teammates, though, Weathers says he learns a lot. "We're all friends, but there is definitely a lot of friendly competition," he said. "We help each other grow."

Freshman Logan Crawford says he feels confident going into the team's first matches. "We've got some good guys on the team," he said. "My swing has improved a lot." Since he began playing on the team at Ware Shoals High School, where he became the #1 player, Crawford says he has "gotten a lot better than he thought he was going to be."

These players can be found practicing on their new driving course or in their indoor golf simulator at the Laurens location. They are currently using a Garmin, which is placed behind the players when they hit the ball in their indoor simulator. The device connects to an app on the player's phones, where they can then see their total distance, speed, backspin, deviation and much more. In the coming weeks, the team will begin working with a new simulator box, with which they can virtually play over 200 courses and download playback videos to study later.

"We are in the infant stages," said Coach Gil Moss. He currently has seven players on his team, two sophomores who played at Union County High School and 5 freshmen, and he says that they played well at their first scrimmage match. "These are good guys. We are having a great time."

Bantam Soccer Team Wins Record Number of Region Awards

The USC Union men's soccer team brought home a record number of awards this season. Mila Mzamane, a freshman from Johannesburg, South Africa, was recognized as the Junior National College Athletic Association Region 10 Player of the Year and was named an All Region Player (1st team) and Head Coach Marc Curlee was awarded Coach of the Year. The Presbyterian College Blue Hose acrobatics & tumbling program and head coach Kara Christian announce their 2024 schedule. The schedule is highlighted with four home meets in the Templeton Center.

"We have a competitive schedule this season that will allow our team to showcase their talent and the hard work they have put in during the off-season," said Christian, who is in her second season at the helm of the Blue Hose acrobatics & tumbling team. "We have emphasized our team culture and growing as a unit and are very excited for this season. As acrobatics & tumbling continues to grow, there are additional opportunities for more divisional competition with new Division I programs. This season we compete against three division I teams that will be in their first season of competition, Iona, Long Island, and Morgan State."

The season begins with home meets against Limestone on Sunday, February 18, and Talladega College on Sunday, February 25.

PC competes five times in March. The Blue Hose travel to Tennessee to face King on Tuesday, March 5. Then, the Blue Hose travel to New York for road meets against Iona on Sunday, March 10, and Long Island on Thursday, March 14. Presbyterian finishes the month of March with home meets against Morgan State on Friday, March 22 and Bluefield State on Saturday, March 30.

In April, the Blue Hose finish the regular season with a road meet in Florida at Saint Leo on Thursday, April 11.

The season culminates with the NCATA Championships at Fairmont State University, April 25-28.

The Blue Hose return nine letterwinners while welcoming 14 newcomers to the 2024 roster.

The Presbyterian College baseball team announced its 2024 slate which features 29 home games at Elton Pollock Field. The schedule also features five games against teams from the ACC and the SEC along with two matchups against teams from the 2023 NCAA tournament.

"Our 2024 schedule promises to be as challenging as ever." Said head coach Elton Pollock. "It includes several SEC and ACC midweek opponents, as well as a tough conference schedule. That said, four of our first five weekend series are at home, which will lighten our travel load immensely compared with years past. I am excited about our team this year and look forward to the challenges ahead."



FEBRUARY

The 2024 schedule opens with a threegame home series against St. Peter's University from February 16-18.

The Blue Hose will then take their first road test on February 20 when they travel to Clemson University to battle with the Tigers in their first ACC matchup.

Following another three-game homestand against Canisius, St, Joseph's, and Quinnipiac, PC will travel to Athens, Ga. for their first SEC matchup against the University of Georgia on February 27.

Presbyterian finishes off the month at home with four games against St. Bonaventure from Feb. 29 – Mar. 2. MARCH

After Western Michigan visits Clinton on March 5, PC will head to Memphis, TN for three more road games from March 8-10 against Jackson State, Memphis, and Butler.

The Blue Hose then return to S.C. for a game in Charleston on March 12 against the Citadel.

Their last home stretch of the month will be against George Washington University from March 15-17.

Closing out the month with eight more games on the road, PC will once again face Clemson at Fluor Field on March 20 before opening up conference play with a three-game series at Longwood from March 22-24.

A trip to the University of South Carolina will mark the second SEC matchup of the season on March 26.

The Blue Hose close out March with a trip up to North Carolina to battle Gardner-Webb from March 28-30. APRIL

In the month of April, after traveling to Atlanta, Ga. to face Georgia Tech, PC will spend a majority of their time at home with games against Radford (April 5-7), Western Carolina University (April 9), Winthrop (April 12-14), and USC Upstate (April 26-28).

Presbyterian also has contests at Wofford (April 16) and High Point (April 19-21).

MAY

PC will travel to Charleston, S.C. for a trio of games against Charleston Southern from May 3-5, before returning home for a game against Wofford on May 7. The Blue Hose will play against the Citadel in a three-game series, starting in

Clinton on May 10-11 and then moving to Charleston, S.C. for the final game on May 12.

The final road match of the regular season will be on May 14 against Western Carolina followed by the final home series against UNC Asheville from May 16-18. POSTSEASON

The 2024 Big South Baseball Tournament will be played at Truist Point in High Point, N.C. The fourteam tournament will determine the Big South's automatic bid recipient to the NCAA Championship which will be held Thursday-Saturday, May 22-26.

On the heels of the program's highest Big South Conference efficiency rating last year that came with their first 3-1 start in league play, the Presbyterian College lacrosse team has revealed its upcoming spring schedule, the 17th in school history.

Officially uncovered by head coach Eric Clakeley – who'll ride in his fifth season with the Blue Hose in 2024 – the squad will feature in 16 matches with eight apiece between home and away designations. The slate will begin on February 10 at Bailey Memorial Stadium for a showdown with Stetson.

"We're very excited about our team's capabilities this season", remarked Clakeley with just under two months until showtime. "Being able to play nonconference games in Georgia and New Hampshire is a very cool opportunity for some of our students to play close to home, and we feel that there's a really solid blend of home and away meetings that will help this team get stronger in a hurry".

Four of the team's first six encounters will be held from Clinton, with the aforementioned contest against the Hatters landing as the first time that PC will open up a season on their home base since 2020 (Clakeley's debut year with the university).

From there, the Blue Hose will hit the road for a pair in a nine-day stretch. They'll move to Kennesaw State on Feb. 15 for matchup number two before battling Xavier on the 24th for the second consecutive campaign, although this time in Ohio.

Returning to Bailey for three in a row – a sequence that didn't take place last spring – Presbyterian will welcome UMass Lowell, Akron, and Rider in an ultra-busy week with that entire trio taking place over a five-day window.

The pay-off for PC's home-heavy opening will result in a three-match period as the visitors, making a long trip upward to face Southern New Hampshire on March 16. Three days later, Central Connecticut will host coach Clakeley's unit, segueing into the Big South opener versus reigning conference champion Mercer on the 27th in Macon.

From that point, every remaining duel will occur in league territory. Both Longwood and Furman will enter Bailey Stadium on March 30 and April 6 before the Blue Hose head to High Point on the 10th to reach the halfway tab of the eightgame divisional layout.

Split evenly among home and road settings for the final four regular season dates, PC will take an April 13 trip to Gardner-Webb ahead of their last two clashes from Clinton against Radford (Apr. 20) and Winthrop (Apr. 24).

The '24 finale, while not held at home, will instead come to fruition just down the road in Spartanburg for an April 27 rivalry renewal with Wofford. Closing the slate against the Terriers, Presby saw the opposite end of the spectrum last time out by kicking off the conference schedule against that same club in a 12-8 victory.

Should PC end the year as one of the top four teams in the Big South standings, they'll earn a ticket to the conference tournament beginning on May 3. The Blue Hose assembled a final record of 6-11 in 2023, with five of those W's taking place whenever the team played the visiting role.

The 2023 Big South Conference Tournament and Co-Regular Season Champion Presbyterian College men's tennis program and head coach John Collins release their 2024 spring schedule.

"Our guys worked incredibly hard all fall and now we are excited to shift our focus to our spring campaign," said Collins, who is in his fourth season as PC's head coach. "We have set a standard these last few years of playing a nationally and regionally competitive schedule that allows us to finish in the top 10 of the Carolina Region and be at the top of the Big South Conference and we look forward to keeping that standard."

The Blue Hose begin the dual match season with road matches against perennial NCAA Tournament teams at Middle Tennessee (January 13) and Georgia Tech (January 19). The Blue Hose begin a fivematch homestand at the Templeton Tennis Courts against Lander on January 26 and a doubleheader against Belmont Abbey on January 27.

The month of February begins with home matches against Limestone (February 3) and Queens (February 4). Presbyterian finishes the month with road matches in Tennessee against Chattanooga (February 24) and Tennessee Tech (February 25).

Presbyterian begins the month of March with a rematch of the 2023 Big South Tournament Championship match with a road contest at Gardner-Webb on March 2. Then, Presbyterian plays five straight home matches against South Carolina State (March 3), Samford (March 7), Elon (March 10), and Big South Conference foes Longwood (March 17) and Radford (March 23). PC travels to Charlotte, North Carolina to play Charlotte (March 29) and Rice (March 30).

In April, Presbyterian plays former Big South Conference opponent Campbell on the road on April 6. The Blue Hose finish Big South Conference play with a home match against UNC Asheville on April 11. A road match at William & Mary (April 13) concludes the regular season. The four-team Big South Conference Tournament will take place at Marion Diehl Park in Charlotte, N.C., April 20-21.

Comprised of 53 matchups – 26 of which will be held at the recently-renovated PC Softball Complex – Presby's '24 slate includes a 10-game home sequence right out of the starting blocks and an additional eight-game stretch of homeonly meetings in the thick of Big South Conference play through April.

"We look forward to the 2024 season with great expectations," commented Williams upon becoming PC's winningest



coach in the D-I era last spring at 103 victories and counting. "We have enjoyed on-the-field success the last few years and look to continue that in the immediate future with hopes of bringing a conference championship to Clinton."

FEBRUARY

Two strings of five-game weekends will begin PC's journey (all set from their home turf), tossing the season's first pitch on February 9 at 2:30 versus Tennessee Tech. Presbyterian takes on TTU twice in that three-day span as well as Norfolk State, with a Feb. 10 date against Alabama A&M sandwiched in between.

The following weekend sees the same blueprint only with different opponents, battling Morehead State and Youngstown State twice each along with a one-off against Valparaiso from February 16-18.

Queens will be the first school to tussle with the Blue Hose outside of South Carolina, hosting coach Williams' squad for a February 21 doubleheader that leads into a four-game Georgia Southern tournament (also involving Purdue Fort Wayne) that weekend. MARCH PC will close month by he welcoming Wofford on the 28th, beginning a five-game homestand that bleeds March. into Both Drexel and Albany will make the Palmetto trip for a quartet of meetings on the 1st and 2nd, finishing a sequence of 15 out of 21 games to be held on the group's home base.

A visit to the Sunshine State will await thereafter, headed to Jacksonville to face the Dolphins but not before back-to-back DH's on the 8th and 9th versus reigning MAAC Tournament champion Marist Tarleton and State.

The final foe before Big South c o m p e t i t i o n gets underway, Western Carolina will be the destination to close

PC's seven-contest spurt away from home, enacting a doubleheader in Cullowhee on March 12.

Williams' unit will have home field advantage for the '24 league opener in a three-game series with Winthrop, making a quick excursion to Furman for another non-conference DH on March 20.

Presbyterian will continue to dip in and out of Big South affairs, returning to divisional action near the end of the month in an expedition to Longwood.

APRIL + POSTSEASON

Starting on April 3, the Blue Hose will find their second-longest home streak of the calendar but at a price of being forced to remain the visitor for the final nine regular season dates. They'll host South Carolina State for a Clinton two-parter before staying put for the next six against Charleston Southern and USC Upstate.

The last duals to be held outside of the conference umbrella, PC will face off with ACC stalwart NC State on April 20 and 21. From there, they'll wrap up the spring shift with consecutive weekend series at

Gardner-Webb and Radford.

May 9-11 are the dates set in stone for the Big South Tournament, a four-team bracket that will take place in nearby Rock Hill. Presby will look to return to the postseason after winning 36 games and making the league semifinals in 2021, putting together a 25-22 overall mark a year ago.

The Presbyterian College Blue Hose women's tennis program and head coach Joel Roberts release their 2024 spring schedule. The Blue Hose will compete in 11 home matches at Templeton this spring.

"Really excited for the spring season." Said Presbyterian coach Joel Roberts. "We have a great schedule this year and I am very excited to see how the season develops. The girls worked extremely hard all fall and they know we have to be ready to go right when we get back to school for our first match against queens"

The Blue Hose open their spring slate on January 13 as they travel to Charlotte, N.C. to battle Queens with a 12 p.m. first serve. The opening weekend wraps up the next day with a match against Charlotte.

PC will make the trip to Columbia, S.C. on January 21 for a match against the South Carolina Gamecocks before opening their home slate on the 25th with a 2 p.m. start against Lander.

The month of February begins with two matches on the road starting on Feb. 2 against Coastal Carolina with a 1 p.m. first serve followed by another 1 p.m. start against UNC Wilmington the next day.

Four of the next five games will take place here in Clinton against Belmont Abbey (Feb. 9), North Greenville (Feb. 10), Tennessee State (Feb. 18), and the College of Charleston (Feb. 21). The only road match in this stretch is set for a 10 a.m. first serve in Spartanburg against the Wofford Terriers on Feb. 17.

The Blue Hose will close out the month with a pair of road matches in Georgia. First, against Georgia State on Feb. 24 followed by a trip to Kennesaw State at 1 p.m. the following day.

PC will stay in Clinton for the entirety of the month of March with five straight home matches against UNCG (March 9), Quinnipiac (March 14), Longwood (March 17), Gardner-Webb (March 20), and Chattanooga (March 29).

PC's final home match of the regular season is set for April 3 against Charleston Southern with a first serve at 1 p.m.

Presbyterian will play on the road against UNC Asheville on April 10 followed by their final match of the regular season against Radford on April 13.

The 2024 Big South Conference Tournament will feature the top four teams in the league and is set to take place at Marion Diehl Park in Charlotte, N.C. on April 19 and 20.



CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Presbyterian College Blue Hose women's basketball team claimed their fourth Big South weekly award of the season after sixth year center Bryanna Brady's performance against Columbia College. Brady was named Big South Co-Player of the Week which is the third weekly award she has earned in her career and the second this season.

LAST WEEK'S PERFORMANCE

Last week, the Presbyterian Blue Hose beat the Columbia College Koalas 62-53 on Sunday, December 31. Brady scored a new seasonhigh of 27 points while shooting 73.3% (11-of-15) from the field. She also shot 62.5% (5-of-8) from the free throw line and dished out two assists. Defensively, Brady helped the team hold the Koalas to no points for almost 11 minutes in the second half. She added four rebounds and a block to her efforts.

ON THE SEASON

Throughout Presbyterian's 15 non-conference games this season, Brady has led the team with an average of 12.7 ppg while shooting at 55.9% (71-of-127) from the field and 75.4% (49-of-65) from the line. Both her points per game and free throw percentage rank her sixth in the Big South Conference. Brady is also ranked sixth in the conference for her 0.6 blocked shots per game and eighth in the conference for her 2.0 offensive rebounds per game.

Men's Soccer Coach Nick Finotti Named Technical Advisor for South Region U.S. Youth Soccer's ODP

Presbyterian College Blue Hose head men's soccer coach Nick Finotti has been named the technical advisor for the South Region for the Boys' United Soccer Youth Soccer Olympic Development Program (ODP). Finotti has served as a head coach in the South Region U.S. ODP program since 2009.

The Olympic Development Program has a core purpose of identifying and providing opportunities for high-potential players, facilitating their development, and exposing them to the next level of their chosen pathway. Led by US Youth Soccer and its Sport Development team, ODP boasts top-tier coaches from throughout the United States. Its alumni coaches include recently-named US Women's National Team head coach Emma Hayes.

Finotti just completed his first season at the helm of the Blue Hose men's soccer program. This past season, he coached a Blue Hose team that had three First Team All-Big South selections, as well as players named Big South Newcomer of the Year and Freshman of the Year. This past season, Presbyterian set a program Division I record scoring record with eight goals in PC's season-opening win over Southern Wesleyan.

Before becoming Presbyterian's head coach, he spent four years as an assistant coach at Wofford. During his time at Wofford, Finotti helped recruit and coach two players who were named Southern Conference Freshman of the Year, ten All-Southern Conference selections, and 11 Southern Conference All-Freshman team selections.

Before joining the Wofford coaching staff, he spent 15 years (2005-19) as the co-director of the boys' ECNL program at the Carolina Elite Soccer Academy. While at CESA, he was head coach of three teams and coached over 200 players who would play college soccer and eleven players who went on to play professional soccer. He led teams to four USYS Premier League Championships and 16 South Carolina state championships.

From 2002-07, he spent five seasons as head coach at Northwestern and Greenville High Schools. He won 118 games, and five region championships while making two appearances in the state championship game. He earned South Carolina Coach of the Year honors twice and was a five-time Region Coach of the Year selection.

Finotti began his coaching career with three seasons as an assistant coach at Lander University from 2000-02. During his time at Lander, he coached two All-Americans and helped guide the team to the 2001 National Quarterfinals.


