## Deceased body found leads to possible hit and run investigation

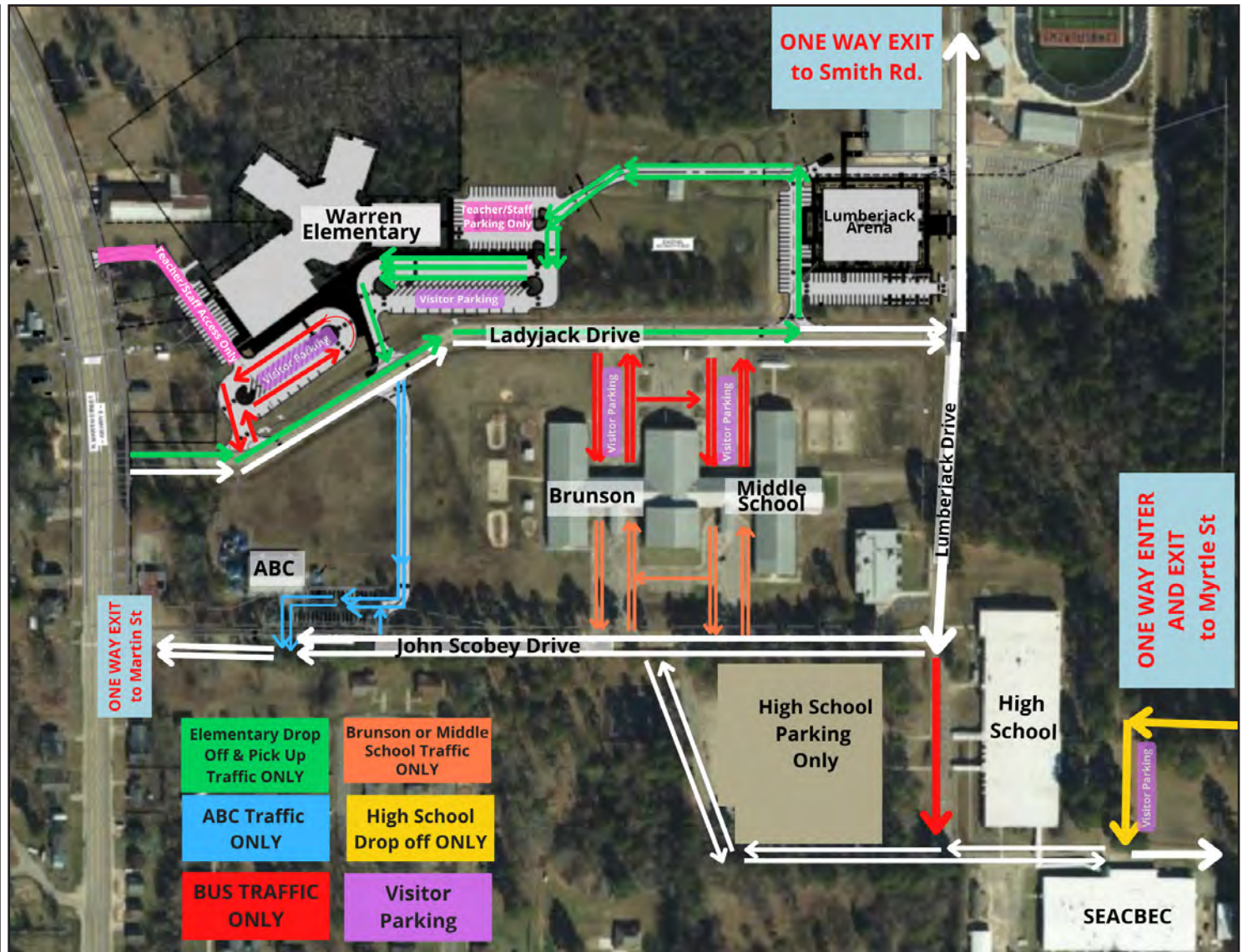
At approximately 5:12 a.m. on 15 August 2023, the Warren Police Department responded to a call of a possible deceased male in a parking lot on the corner of Gannaway & Church Street.

Upon arrival Officers found the body of a white male who was later identified as Eli Perrin, 21, of Arkadelphia. Shortly after arriving on the scene officers discovered that Perrin's vehicle was involved in a one vehicle accident on Highway 8 North approximately three miles outside the city limits. The accident had been investigated a few hours earlier by the Bradley County Sheriff's Department. The investigating Deputy Sheriff stated that upon his arrival at the accident the vehicle which was registered to Perrin appeared to have veered off the highway and struck a light pole. The vehicle appeared to have been abandoned due to the fact that there was no driver or anyone else on the scene. Perrin's body was processed and will be sent to the Arkansas State Crime Laboratory for an autopsy to determine a cause of death.

According to investigators the incident is being investigated as a crime pending results from the State Medical Examiner's Office.

On August 16, 2023, the Warren Police Department received the preliminary autopsy result of Eli Perrin. Perrin, 21, was found deceased at the corner of Gannaway and Church St. in Warren on Monday August 14. According to the State Medical Examiner's Office, Perrin's death was a result of being struck by a motor vehicle. Law Enforcement Officials have now classified the incident as hit and run/vehicular homicide.

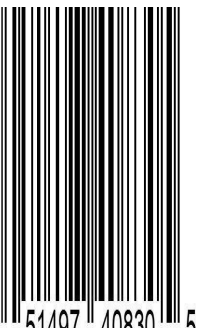

The publishers of The Eagle Democrat have chosen to publish articles from the past Oldtimer's Notebook in memory of Robert L. Newton. This article was first published July 21, 2001.

William Aubert Martin (USAF-Ret.) is one of the remnant of the faithful old crowd that never used to miss a Bradley County Pink Tomato Festival.

The group included Colonel Martin, Senators Dale Bumpers and David Pryor, surely Henry Lee Turner, the retired school official at Morrilton who is always there when there is any sort of gathering of Arkansas people.

Colonel Martin was here for the recent festivity: who has seen either of Arkansas' two U.S. Senators in Bradley County, of late?

In 2001? 2000?

Maybe we don't amount to much to the State's new power elite, based now in that sprawling megaplex that includes Fayetteville, Springdale, Rogers, and Bentonville.

Well, Governor Huckabee was here...he even entered the tomato-eatin' contest.

The Governor, onetime Hope radio announcer and onetime rising preacher in the Southern Baptist Church, comes across on television as being excessively-portly (i.e. FAT); he doesn't give that impression in person.

Back in Bradley county again was Lt. Governor Win Rockefeller, bravely he auctioned off the "first box" of Bradley County tomatoes at the all-tomato luncheon. Affiliated Foods of Little Rock

and its CEO, Jerry Davis, paid five thousand dollars for the tomatoes.

That's FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS that goes directly into the coffers of the festival for 2002...the 46th such festival in Warren town.

Two items of concern about the festival.

Attendance at the all-tomato luncheon at the elegant family life center at First Baptist was just awful.

Perhaps 40 to 45 percent of the places at the tables were left unfilled.

Festival officials said they'd sold "all the tickets" for ten dollars each...lots of folks, for one reason or another, were willing to eschew a delicious meal and lose their ten-spot.

Also, this is the first time in our memory that Channel 7 television in Little Rock didn't give extensive coverage to the festivity.

There are reasons for this, of course, since onetime Warrenite Dale Nicholson, who heads the TV venture, wouldn't voluntarily give up providing the wonderful publicity for his hometown.

To Nicholson we'd say: "thanks for everything you've done for us and, if you can, send old Good Lookin', the hair-ad weather man back in 2002!"

Colonel William Aubert Martin was in the Class of '49 at WHS, one laden with people who would taste future success.

There's Colonel Martin, who headed the Arkansas Bar Foundation and who had 30 years in the Air Force Judge Advocate department;

## Warren City Council hears from public

The Warren City Council heard from members of the community at their meeting on Monday, August 14.

The council first heard from Juanita Jones during public comments. She said a pawn shop was being turned into a vape shop. Her concern was businesses that take, but don't give back to the community.

Another resident, Billy Joe Harding, told the council the property next to him was not being kept up. He said the owner has a donkey and it makes noises all night and smells bad.

Resident Virginia Phillips said the roads on west side were too narrow.

In other business, Josh Escamilla was approved to be appointed to the Civil Service Commission by the city council.

Warren Mayor Gregg Reep reported the city received two bids for roof projects on the Warren Municipal Building and the emergency services building. Mayor Reep said he wanted to consult with architects first and see how to finance the projects.

Mayor Reep also reported he received a proposal from student Seth Wyatt at Clinton School to do an economic study on how to recruit retail businesses in the city. He said it wouldn't cost the city anything, but the city council approved to pay for mileage up to \$500.

Warren Police Chief Shaun Hildreth reported the new vehicles were working and on patrol.

The city council approved an ordinance on dogs at the pound, due to the increasing number of dogs sheltered there. The ordinance states dogs must stay a minimum of five days to the maximum of 21 days before being euthanized. The ordinance went into effect immediately.

Warren Fire Chief Chuck Moore reported the fire department responded to 17 calls. He said they are keeping the tile wet on the Bryant Building. The fire department was also awarded a grant to purchase air packs. The city council approved to pay the 32 firefighter dues.

Building Official Rob Johnson said they were 99.9 percent through with the Bryant Building. The city has been in compliance with ADEQ regulations. Various property clean up complaints were discussed.

The following were approved for re-appointment to the Planning Commission for three years: Jennifer Rodriguez, James Hooper, Albert Hammons, and Dana Langsford.

The Warren Municipal Building will be closed for Labor Day on September 4.

The next city council meeting will be at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, September 11 at the Warren Municipal Building.

## Arkansas History Minute

The year was 1861, and after a divisive presidential election, the nation was tearing itself apart. Eight states had seceded from the Union. And now, Isaac Murphy faced a choice.

In May 1861, the Arkansas Secession Convention had reconvened after the battle at Fort Sumter in South Carolina. After the fall of the Union base, President Abraham Lincoln called for troops from the still-loyal states to defend the Union. For the states of the Upper South, this was too much. Shortly after Lincoln's announcement, Virginia, which had initially voted against secession, voted to pull out. Now it was Arkansas's turn to decide, and the delegates were pushing heavily for secession.

This was not the first time that Murphy had to take a stand. He was born in 1799 in Tennessee, but his father died while he was still young. He eventually attended college in Pennsylvania, becoming an attorney and a teacher. He married in 1830, but his infuriated father-in-law soon disowned his daughter after finding out that Murphy was an abolitionist. He refused to change his views, and his wife stayed by his side.

After moving to the Fayetteville area, he bought a farm and continued to teach and practice law. He was elected as a Democrat as the first treasurer of Washington County as Arkansas claimed statehood in 1836. He declined to run for re-election in 1838. In 1846, he was elected to the first of two terms as a state representative. As a legislator, he took the lead in an attempt to create a statewide public school system. However, he was unable to convince enough legislators of the value of an education system for the state and faced strong opposition to the costs.

He hit hard times financially and lost his farm in 1851. The family moved to nearby Huntsville in Madison County. In 1856, he was elected to the state senate, representing Madison and Benton counties. After the election of Lincoln in 1860, Murphy was elected as a delegate to the secession convention.

The issue of slavery and secession bitterly divided families, political parties, churches, and communities. Murphy promised from the beginning that he would not support secession. In the first session in February 1861, the state narrowly rejected secession at the convention in Little Rock in February by a vote of 39-35. Murphy had been part of the majority that rejected disunion. Nearly all of the delegates supporting the Union were from northern Arkansas.

The bulk of the slave population was in southern and eastern Arkansas. As slavery was practiced in the American South, it was typically tied to the cultivation of certain labor-intensive crops, such as tobacco, rice, sugar, or cotton. Cotton was the only one of these crops grown in Arkansas at the time. Cotton could only be grown in certain areas, and the hills and mountains of northern and northwestern Arkansas made it impossible for the crop to be cultivated in those areas. As a result, there were very few slaves in that part of the state. As a result, the push for secession was far more subdued or even non-existent in those areas.

When the second session convened in May, support for the Union had collapsed. Delegates now voted 65-5 to secede. On a second vote to try to show unity in the state, Murphy could have gone along with the crowd, but Murphy alone stood against secession. He announced that he promised he would support the Union, and he would not break that promise. While there were howls of disapproval, he stood firm. He also refused to support the new secessionist state constitution.

When Union troops invaded Northwest Arkansas in 1862, he and his family fled to Missouri to avoid the violence. After Little Rock fell to Union forces in September 1863, Arkansas Unionists began trying to piece together a new, loyal state government. Among their choices for governor, one name alone was mentioned: Isaac Murphy, who had stood for the Union all along. Isaac Murphy became the state's eighth governor in 1864, serving until 1868, leading the state out of the dark years of the war.

Sometimes the passion of the moment is the wrong answer. The Civil War devastated Arkansas. For Isaac Murphy, integrity was the right course.

Senate Week in Review from Ben Gilmore Senator

During the 2023 session the Arkansas legislature enacted a lengthy list of new laws to strengthen the integrity of the elections.

Act 620 grants more power to the state Board of Election Commissioners to detect and prevent voter fraud. The board has been conducting an audit after each general election, and Act 620 requires an audit after primary elections also. The new law sets up a review of elections every two years for the board to investigate any indications of wrongdoing, primarily in absentee voting and voter registration.

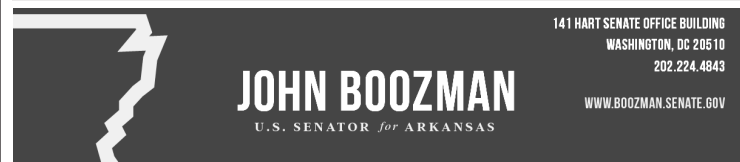
Act 620 makes it a felony to forge someone's signature on applications for voter registration or for absentee ballots.

Act 444 outlines the rights of poll watchers, to ensure access to all parts of the election process. Poll watchers must complete an online training course, set up by the state board of Election Commissioners.

The main goal of Act 444 is to make sure that poll watchers have uniform and fair access to all stages of the voting process. For example, they're to be allowed within three to six feet of the check-in area.

Poll watchers may bring a list of eligible voters and may challenge a ballot by speaking to an election official. However, they may not interfere with anyone's ability to vote, either by harassment, intimidation or coercion. They must wear name tags and may not wear political badges promoting a candidate or an issue.

Act 441 requires the Secretary of State to use multiple strategies to ensure the integrity of voter registration lists.



President Woodrow Wilson signed into law legislation creating the National Park Service to support the conservation and preservation of lands for the enjoyment of future generations on August 25, 1916. This idea had been evolving for decades as leading conservationists worked to protect the lands they loved from development. As we mark the 107th birthday of the National Park Service, we celebrate Arkansas's treasures and recognize ongoing efforts to improve stewardship of our nation's most precious sites and landmarks.

Earlier this month, Pea Ridge National Military Park celebrated a 140-acre land donation from The Conservation Fund to complete the area within the park's envisioned boundaries.

I was honored to join events commemorating this milestone and the collaboration of private and public entities working together to preserve the history, protect the habitat, and ensure the park is a place for learning and reflection in the years to come.

Pea Ridge National Military Park is a unique historical site within a dynamic region with so much cultural significance. Fortunately, many Arkansans can experience all it has to offer with relative ease.

While most people associate Pea Ridge with the Civil War battle, it also serves as home to another historic piece in the fabric of Arkansas's and our nation's story: the Butterfield Overland Mail Route.

From 1857 to 1861, this trail made it easier to transport mail and goods to the western frontier. This route truly helped facilitate America's westward expansion. It is a symbol of the pioneering spirit we still seek to embody.

I was proud to champion its designation as a National Historic Trail and work with local citizens, national organizations and government agencies to highlight its importance to our nation's history. Congress passed the legislation and the president signed it into law in January 2023.

Formally recognizing its important historical significance will help educate others

One strategy is to compare our lists with those in other states, to prevent a person from registering and voting in more than one state. Another strategy is to make full use of the Social Security Administration's file of people who have died.

The Secretary of State's office will develop an address verification process. The office will report annually to the legislative Joint Performance Review Committee on the accuracy of voter registration records.

Act 353 prohibits county election officials from using a drop box for the collection of absentee ballots. Unless absentee ballots are sent through the mail, they must be delivered into the hands of someone in the physical office of the county clerk.

Act 320 also tightens the rules governing absentee ballots. It requires anyone who goes to the county clerk to drop off absentee ballots for

another person to present a photo ID. Anyone who helps a voter fill out an application for an absentee ballot must provide his or her name, address and signature on the application.

Act 320 prohibits county clerks from distributing unsolicited absentee ballots or applications to potential voters. County clerks may make the applications generally available online or in their office.

Act 141 creates a new criteria to allow a voter to use an absentee ballot. If you are prevented from voting in person due to an observance of your religious discipline or due to a religious holiday, you will be eligible to vote absentee.

Act 462 changes the laws governing the creation of new political parties. It requires 10,000 signatures to establish a new political party ballot. The threshold had been 3 percent of the total votes cast in the most recent race or governor.

That's why I was proud to support a measure last Congress that offers veterans and Gold Star Families free lifetime access to these sites.

The Alexander Lofgren Veterans in Parks (VIP) Act made law a Department of Interior program that provides a free pass to these heroes. We expanded this idea by creating a lifetime pass and launching an annual pass for current servicemembers, which can be easily converted into a lifetime pass once they leave active duty.

Time outdoors has proven to be a successful tool to help veterans heal from the invisible wounds of war. Ensuring those called to serve have access to these lands is the least we can do to demonstrate our appreciation for their sacrifice.

Passes are available online, including on the National

Park Service website, and at many national park and federal recreation sites to those presenting the correct documentation.

More than a century after the creation of the National Park Service, the commitment to maintain access to the beautiful landscapes we're blessed with is unyielding. In recent years, Congress has made significant investments to conserve the spaces that help define America. I'm pleased to support these efforts and will continue advocating for measures to preserve public land so generations to come have access to the many blessings they provide.
