Biden EO on China Investments, Treasury ANPRM

On August 9 President Biden issued an Executive Order focused on national security threats stemming from U.S. investments in the People's Republic of China (PRC), specifically those related to technologies critical for military and intelligence capabilities.

The E.O. aims to protect U.S. national security while maintaining open investment. It sets forth a new program, focusing on prohibiting certain U.S. transactions and requiring notifications to Treasury regarding others, specifically related to the following technology areas:

Semiconductors and microelectronics Quantum information technologies Certain artificial intelligence systems <u>READ MORE</u>

The U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement's Interagency Labor Committee for Monitoring and Enforcement today requested the government of Mexico review an allegation that workers at the Yazaki auto parts facility in Leon, Guanajuato, are being denied the right to freedom of association.

This is the seventh time in 2023, and twelfth time overall, the United States has sought Mexico's review under the USMCA's Rapid Response Labor Mechanism. <u>**READ MORE</u>**</u>

President Biden signed into law a measure implementing the initial deal negotiated under the US-Taiwan Initiative on 21st-Century Trade First Agreement, even while raising concerns about the constitutionality of the law.

The President cautioned Congress that he does not intend to follow all of the requirements of the new law relating to the sharing of negotiating texts. **READ MORE**

USTR to Review Russia's WTO Compliance, PNTR Status

The USTR is mandated by law to annually report to Congress on Russia's implementation of WTO agreements, including agreements on Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures and Intellectual Property Rights, as well as its progress towards acceding to the Information Technology Agreement (ITA) and the Government Procurement Agreement (GPA).

The USTR is currently soliciting public comments for this year's report to gauge Russia's compliance with the commitments made during accession. Specific areas of interest include import and export regulations, subsidies, standards, sanitary measures, intellectual property rights, government procurement, rule of law issues, trade facilitation, and other WTO commitment <u>READ MORE</u>

Lamb Producers Seek Import Relief

US lamb producers are seeking relief from imported lamb and mutton through a phase-in tariff rate quota.

Protect American Lamb, a project under the auspices of the R-CALF USA, has filed a petition with US Trade Representative Katherine Tai.

The 33-page petition shows that imported lamb and mutton, primarily from Australia and New Zealand, have increased 2,363 percent in dollar value and 543 percent in quantity since the early 1990s. <u>**READ MORE</u>**</u>

USDA: Sanitary and Phytosanitary Standards (Codex)

Treasury Outreach on Beneficial Ownership Rules

In remarks last week in Lexington, Kentucky, Under Secretary of the Treasury for Terrorism and Financial Intelligence Brian E. Nelson spoke to common concerns about the implementation of the Corporate Transparency Act (CTA) which requires certain U.S. and foreign companies to report to FinCEN information about their beneficial owners:

BIS: International Atomic Energy Agency Safeguards Protocol

Bureau of Industry and Security, Department of Commerce published a request for comment on the Additional Protocol to the United States—International Atomic Energy Agency Safeguards

The Additional Protocol requires the United States to submit declaration forms to the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) on a number of commercial nuclear and nuclear-related items, materials, and activities that may be used for peaceful nuclear purposes, but also would be necessary elements for a nuclear weapons program. **READ MORE**

DDTC: Filing Requirement / Clarifications Rule Category XXI

The Census Bureau issues this final rule amending its regulations to reflect new export reporting requirements related to the State Department, Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC) Category XXI Determination Number.

Specifically, the Census Bureau is adding a conditional data element, DDTC Category XXI Determination Number, when "21" is selected in the DDTC USML Category Code field in the Automated Export System (AES) to represent United States Munitions List (USML) Category XXI. <u>READ MORE</u>

Polite Bowing Out with a Bang

Departing Assistant Attorney General for the Criminal Division Kenneth Polite told Reuters the department's enforcement pipeline has several more "global resolutions," or large corporate settlements pending in coming months.

Mr. Polite, who will be joining Sidley Austin in October after overseeing corporate resolutions such as Glencore,

ABB, Danske, and Stericycle attributed the backlog to COVID related- delays. Polite said to expect "much larger schemes and activities." **READ MORE**

Colombian Bank Settles FCPA Case for \$80 Million

A bad penny always turns up. Odebrecht S.A, the perennial source of corruption settlements under the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA) delivered again, snaring a banking subsidiary of Grupo Aval, the holding company of the second richest man in Colombia.

Corporación Financiera Colombiana S.A. (Corficolombiana), a Colombian financial services institution, has agreed to pay over \$80 million to resolve parallel bribery investigations by criminal, civil, and administrative authorities in the United States and Colombia stemming from the company's involvement in a scheme to pay millions of dollars in bribes to high-ranking government officials in Colombia. <u>READ MORE</u>

End Transactions with Burmese Banks

All transactions with two sanctioned Burmese banks must have been wound down by August 5, according to the State Department.

In June, the United States designated two of Burma's military regime-controlled banks, Myanma Foreign Trade Bank and Myanma Investment and Commercial Bank. <u>READ MORE</u>

OFAC: Ex-Head of Central Bank of Lebanon Sanctioned

The U.S. Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) has designated Riad Salameh, the former governor of Lebanon's central bank, and four of his close associates for corrupt and unlawful activities. Salameh allegedly used his position to funnel hundreds of millions of dollars through shell companies for personal enrichment, investing in European real estate.

The sanctions do not extend to the Banque du Liban (BdL) or its U.S. correspondent bank relationships. <u>READ</u> <u>MORE</u>

OFAC - Belarus G/Ls Steel & Aviation

The Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) is issuing Belarus General Licenses authorizing the wind down of transactions with a Byelorussian Steel Works and Airline. The Action includes the addition of a Miami, FL based steel trader and the Minsk Civil Aviation Plant 407, "the leading enterprise in the CIS and the countries of the former USSR in repair, modernization and maintenance of the Yak-40, Yak-42, Yak-52, Tu-134 aircraft of all modifications," according to the company website. <u>READ MORE</u>
