US Files USMCA Complaint on Canada's Digital Tax

Evidently the "strong concerns with Canada's unilateral digital service tax" the USTR cited in the readout of last weeks meeting between Ambassador Katherine Tai and Minister of Export Promotion, International Trade, and Economic Development, Mary Ng. Sullivan in Beijing

National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan met with China's Foreign Minister Wang Yi in Beijing last week, where the two sides agreed to initiate a call between the heads of state of both countries "in the coming weeks" and a video call at the military-theater-command level "at an appropriate time."

U.S. efforts to curtail Chinese access to advanced tech, including semiconductors, were criticized by Wang, with the top Chinese diplomat calling on Washington to stop politicizing trade issues. **READ MORE**

NTE Report: Foreign Trade Barriers

The NTE Report sets out an inventory of significant foreign barriers to, or distortions of, U.S. exports of goods and services, including agricultural commodities and U.S. intellectual property; foreign direct investment by U.S. persons, especially if such investment has implications for trade in goods or services; and U.S. electronic commerce.

USTR invites comments to assist it and the TPSC in identifying significant foreign barriers to, or distortions of, U.S. exports of goods and services, U.S. foreign direct investment, and U.S. electronic commerce for inclusion in the NTE Report. READ MORE

FinCEN AML Filing Regs Published

Treasury's Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN) issued two rules to help safeguard the residential real estate and investment adviser sectors from illicit finance. The investment adviser rule is slated to go into effect in January 2026. Its residential real-estate rule is scheduled to begin in December 2025. READ MORE

USAID to Revamp Sanctions Regs, Expand Reporting

The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) is considering updating its sanctions-related provisions and contract clauses for assistance and acquisition awards.

A primary factor under review is whether to expand reporting requirements to enhance USAID's monitoring of recipients' and contractors' activities involving sanctioned jurisdictions or sanctioned individuals and entities subject to the sanctions programs administered by the U.S. Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC). RTX: Endemic ITAR Compliance Failures

RTX Corporation, the defense contracting roll-up formerly known as Raytheon, has entered into a settlement agreement with the U.S. Department of State following a comprehensive investigation into violations of the Arms Export Control Act (AECA) and the International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR).

By paying \$100 million in fines and promising to spend another \$100 million on compliance programs, the firm avoids debarment and further criminal or civil action. **READ MORE**

Trade Show Antiboycott Cases Abound

A Pennsylvania flashlight manufacturer is the latest US firm to get caught up in antiboycott violations related to participating in trade shows in the Middle East.

Streamlight, Inc. paid the Commerce Department a \$44,750 penalty to resolve three alleged violations of the antiboycott provisions of the Export Administration Regulations (EAR). **READ MORE**

Boston Consulting Group Angola Bribery Declination

The Justice Department declined to prosecute the Boston Consulting Group, Inc. (BCG) for a scheme in which the firm paid \$4.3 million in "commissions" to obtain consulting contracts with the government of Angola.

The Government's investigation found evidence that from in or about 2011 until in or about 2017, BCG, through its Lisbon, Portugal office, paid its agent in Angola to help BCG obtain business from the Angolan Ministry of Economy ("MINEC") and the National Bank of Angola ("BNA"). READ MORE

Georgia Tech Security Whistleblower Suit

The United States joined a whistleblower suit and filed a complaint-in-intervention against the Georgia Institute of Technology (Georgia Tech) and Georgia Tech Research Corp. (GTRC) asserting claims that those defendants knowingly failed to meet cybersecurity requirements in connection with the Department of Defense (DoD) contracts.

The whistleblower suit was initiated by current and former members of Georgia Tech's Cybersecurity team. **READ MORE**

Military Radio Exports Foiled

The Justice Department unsealed a criminal complaint charging a Hungarian national with violations of U.S. export controls targeting Russia, including by conspiring with others to illegally export U.S.-origin radio communications technology to Russian government end users without a license.

Bence Horvath is charged by complaint with one count of conspiring to violate the Export Control Reform Act of 2018 (ECRA). He was arrested on arrival at San Francisco International Airport in San Francisco, California, on Aug. 23. **READ MORE**

CBP Seeks Pipeline Data Standards

CBP invites the general public and other Federal agencies to comment on a proposed Global Interoperability Standard capable of tracking changes in ownership and destination of pipeline-borne goods such as crude oil, from wellhead to refinery.

If successful, the test could result in the ability to potentially eliminate all port-level paper processes as well as create an automation environment in which pre-arrival data collection, in-bond tracking, and Free Trade Agreement compliance traceability no longer pose issues. READ MORE
