Bonus Tariffs on Canned Beer

The Trump administration has imposed a 25% tariff on all imported canned beer and empty aluminum cans beginning Friday April 4, according to a notice issued by the Department of Commerce. Modelo— the top-selling beer in the U.S.—is primarily distributed in cans. <u>READ MORE</u>

Liberation Day Tariffs Announced

Again dispensing with the niceties of congressional consent, President Trump invoked emergency powers and levied a 10% tariff on imports from all countries effective April 5th. TikTok Deadline Creeps Despite Law

Citing the "tremendous progress" his team has made, President Trump issued a second executive order delaying the enforcement of a nationwide ban on TikTok, despite the statutory limit allowing only a single extension. The new order, signed on April 4, extends the ban's implementation by another 75 days, exceeding the authority outlined in the Protecting Americans From Foreign Adversary Controlled Applications Act (PAFACA). <u>READ MORE</u>

On March 31, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) submitted the 2025 National Trade Estimate (NTE) to President Trump and Congress. More Iran Drone Sanctions

The U.S. Departments of Justice and Treasury took coordinated action to disrupt an Iranian procurement network that illicitly acquired U.S.-origin technology to support Iran's drone program and its military-industrial complex. April 1, 2025, the Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) imposed sanctions on eight individuals and six entities across Iran, the United Arab Emirates (UAE), and the People's Republic of China (PRC) for their roles in acquiring components for unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) used by Iran's military. <u>READ MORE</u>

Russian Aircraft Parts Smuggler Sentenced

A Russian national residing in Florida was sentenced to 70 months in prison for conspiring to illegally export controlled aviation technology to Russia and for laundering funds connected to the scheme. His co-conspirator was sentenced in December 2024 to two years in prison. <u>READ MORE</u>

Money Laundering Pardon Unprecedented Move

In a rare and possibly unprecedented action, former President Donald Trump issued a full presidential pardon to a corporation, HDR Global Trading, operator of cryptocurrency exchange BitMEX.
