Narcotics officers were investigating the sale of illegal narcotics in the area of the Midway Quick Stop when they got behind a black street bike and attempted to conduct a traffic stop. The subject fled from Officers onto the Memory Garden Road. While behind the subject, officers noticed the subject tossing items into the roadway. The pursuit continued through the Stockton Community onto Highway 52 East into Morgan County and ended with the subject being apprehended in the Robbins area of Scott County. Stowers was charged with felony evading arrest, reckless endangerment, registration violation, conditional licenses, possession of unlawful drug paraphernalia, and simple possession of Schedule 3 drugs. Stowers is being held at the Fentress County Jail on a \$80,000.00 bond. Scott County Sheriff's Office assisted FCSD with the arrest.

Propane tank explodes like bomb in Clarkrange



A propane tank exploded in Clarkrange last week, the result of an explosion known as a BLEVE: Boiling Liquid Expanding Vapor Explosion. A BLEVE results when a pressurized liquid reaches a temperature above its boiling point. With a boiling point at -44 Fahrenheit, propane may rapidly change from its pressurized liquid form inside a tank to its gas form when exposed to ambient temperatures. And since propane burns, a violent, incendiary explosion like the one in Clarkrange can occur when a tank is compromised. Fentress County Volunteer Firefighter Tyler Arms informed the Fentress Courier that the Fire Department recently had received BLEVE training, but in this case the dispatch call went out after the explosion had occurred. Firefighters arrived on scene and addressed the explosion's aftermath, which included parts of the propane tank being shot through the walls of the residence and other remnants of the tank scattered around the neighborhood. No one was injured in this explosion

TISA Legislation Launches on Feb. 24 with Presentation from Gov. Lee and Commissioner Schwinn

Tennessee Governor Bill Lee and Tennessee Department of Education Commissioner Penny Schwinn will share legislation for the new student-based funding formula, known as the Tennessee Investment in Student Achievement formula (TISA), on Thursday, February 24. Tennesseans will have access to a livestream presentation that breaks down key aspects of the legislation and funding proposal. Details about the presentation will be announced next week.

"After an extensive process with input from thousands of Tennesseans, we are on the cusp of achieving an updated approach to public education that prioritizes students and invests in the future of Tennessee," said Gov. Lee. "I thank our partners in the General Assembly who have worked with us for months to improve the way we fund public schools, and I have every expectation that we will get this done during the current legislative session."

"From the start of the public engagement process, Tennesseans from across the state have weighed in and developed a strong vision for how to best fund public education," said Commissioner Penny Schwinn. "Under the TISA, we will put the funding focus on students and give Tennesseans clear information to understand how districts and schools are using funding to help our students thrive."

For the first time in over 30 years, the TISA will update the way Tennessee invests

in public education by moving to a student-based funding formula, including the following components:

- Student-based funding starts with a base funding amount for every public-school student.
- Additional funding may then be allocated based on weights to address individual student needs.
- Direct funding is another opportunity for students to receive additional funding allocations to support specific programs, like tutoring.
- Outcome incentives are awarded based on student achievement to empower schools to help all students reach their full potential.

In January, Gov. Lee and Commissioner Schwinn released a draft framework for the new student-based K-12 funding formula, which incorporated input from thousands of Tennesseans. Starting last fall, the Department of Education and the General Assembly convened 18 funding subcommittees, organized a legislative steering committee, and provided over 1,000 opportunities for the public to engage, including 16 public town halls and local match conversations across the state.

Welcome To Top Trail!

Troy Norris developed this program for all horse trail riders riding at different levels as it provides a way to track trail mileage for horses and riders. As more people now have access to GPS, Top Trail's role has evolved to provide ways to upload GPS application data to the site for personal and competition tracking.

Moving here in 2017, Troy Norris brought Top Trail with her. The site's online membership is now international in scope but its influence is so strong, people include Top Trail data to make life decisions regarding lifestyle choices; among which Jamestown proves a strong contender. It naturally provides many purchasing opportunities on desirable trail systems. The program flourishes in this area, a trail riding haven. One Top trail member relocated to Jamestown just to focus on her riding. Although Top Trail provides a way to count mileage for individual horses and riders, it fuels a bit of competitive spirit for those reaching for top mileage recognition.

Mrs. Norris graciously allowed the Fentress Courier to include some excerpts from articles written for "We Ride Sport and Trail"

magazine.

She writes...

I've got a confession: I was thinking only of me and my horse when first I brainstormed and mapped out the Top Trail Horse program. I've long wanted a way of tracking just how many miles I've ridden in a specific place and/or period, as well as a grand total, in general. Plus... I'm a little competitive. That's when I found out that I'm not alone!

I started using my planner in 2002 to record my ride mileage and notes as I was conditioning for distance riding competitions. It might sound crazy but I didn't have a GPS, so I was clocking my mileage with my truck pre- or post-ride, since the trails I rode were mostly back-country roads adjacent to my ranch. I became well-acquainted with Google Earth for the off-road rides to get an estimate of the ridden mileage.

These days we have a multitude of options to record our trail tracks from using our smartphones equipped with GPS, to slick handhelds like a Garmin...I kept thinking how fun it would be to see how ALL my trail miles compare to others' mileage across the entire

country. And so, I put my thoughts into action and created the Top Trail Horse program (www.toptrailhorse.com). When we reach milestones along the way, we earn Top Trail certificates and patches to commemorate them.

The Top Trail program actually began to take shape as a Facebook Group in 2013, with the main competitive attraction being the Trail Horse Challenge.

Equine mileage was recorded on a spreadsheet when we first started. This form of record keeping became more and more difficult for me — especially as our membership grew! Fortunately, the Open Trail Project website (trail sharing website) allowed us to use their site for our tracking purposes, and this helped us begin to develop the program more fully.

Top Trail eventually evolved past the limitations of the Open Trail website's abilities, so the decision was made to move the program to its own internet domain. In January 2019, we rolled out the new Top Trail website. Most of our existing members transferred their miles to the new website, and many new members have joined us along the way.

Once a rider becomes a member of the Top Trail community, all challenge entry fees are waived! We currently have 6 challenge divisions in which our members compete. We also have several affiliate groups like MFTHBA, NATRC, Michigan Horse Council, 40 Something Cowgirls, and others who create even more opportunities for our members to shine.

There's so much packed into Top Trail — it's not just about riding to win! It's about getting outdoors, enjoying nature, connecting with our horses and other equestrians, and recording the ride. Whether it takes our riders years to reach milestones or mere months—it's all good—Top Trail members are there to celebrate with you!

We welcome all riders (and those who drive their horses, as well) to join our community. We are supportive, seek to build each other up, encourage considerate horsemanship, and trail stewardship on the journey. So if you would like a little encouragement to get out and ride, please join us! www.toptrailhorse.com.

Mill Brothers offers portable sawmilling and wood slabs for sale in Jamestown

When Chris Riley and Chris Hammock formed Mill Brothers Sawmill “to help people bring their projects to life,” they knew they would be offering portable lumber milling, and they knew they wanted to put their unique spin on milling here in Jamestown, but they weren’t exactly sure in what additional ways their own project would come to life. Chris and Chris spoke to the Fentress Courier recently, and Riley provided a metaphor to explain how Mill Brothers already has grown to offer a value-added product that people might be surprised to find in Fentress County:

We got into the water and we found out where the currents were taking us, so we have been swimming with the current. As we become stronger swimmers, we venture out into new waters.

One of the new waters Mill Brothers has ventured out into is taking shape at 1055 Taylor Place Rd., at the old Rogers Feed Store, where Riley and Hammock are finishing

construction of their wood-drying kiln. The kiln is the center of Mill Brothers’s retail operation, where Riley and Hammock very soon will offer for sale kiln-dried woods they have milled with their trailered sawmill. The Mill Brothers expect to have the showroom floor finished and stocked with choice cuts of wood by the end of March. While they are completing construction of their kiln, Riley and Hammock have inventory scheduled to arrive from an offsite kiln in March – the first lot to arrive will include 50 walnut slabs for craftsmen to incorporate into their own projects. Live-edge slabs in a rotating variety of wood species are expected to feature prominently in the Mill Brothers showroom.

Riley had owned Campfire Coffee, and Hammock was manager at Mountain Barn Builders for 6 years before joining to become Mill Brothers.

The “brothers” take pride in sourcing slabs of endemic species from surrounding properties and farms and forests. Once a landowner has felled his own timber, Mill Brothers brings the sawmill to the logs, rather

than the landowner having to arrange for his logs to be brought to the sawmill. When a recent customer brought Mill Brothers to his property to clear some trees, he pointed to a walnut tree, 30” in diameter, and recalled watching that tree grow unhurried by time for the last 50 years. All he asked is that Mill Brothers give him something from the tree that he could make something out of. Another customer, who was clearing some white oaks, used the wood Mill Brothers milled on his property to construct a bridge over the creek that runs through his property. These are the stories Mill Brothers likes to tell and the projects Mill Brothers wants to help you bring to life.

Mill Brothers’s portable sawmill is available now for your clearing project. Their kiln is nearing completion, and their showroom soon will be stocked with slabs for whatever project you have in mind. Mill Brothers can be reached by phone at 931-879-6455 if you have felled timber you want milled on your property, or Mill Brothers accepts logs at their 1055 Taylor Place Rd. site.

TV miniseries featuring the UC and Fentress County to air on PBS in May

Tommy Lee and Hannah Carroll of the Upper Cumberland Development District (UCDD) updated the Joint Economic Community Development Board on a TV miniseries project in the works that will highlight the Upper Cumberland and Fentress County.

The Cookeville PBS affiliate, WCTE, will film the 10-episode miniseries under the auspices of the Economic Development Administration (EDA), a bureau of the US Department of Commerce.

Filming begins in March and the miniseries showcasing the 14 counties of the Upper Cumberland will premier in May. Featuring local business is a prerequisite for EDA funding, so Fentress

County businesses will make appearances in the series.

Holler Media, which publishes the Fentress Courier in addition to the newspapers of public record in Overton, Clay, and Jackson Counties, has signed a letter of support to submit to the US Department of Agriculture that would fund a Season 2 of the UC series.

Taxpayers vulnerable to preparers’ errors

Taxpayers are responsible for mistakes made by tax preparers. You can’t just point at your tax professional to avoid liability.

If the IRS determines that you underreported your income, there are several types of penalties. One is the penalty for substantial underpayment of your tax liability. Substantial underpayment is understating your tax liability by at least 10 percent.

The negligence penalty does not require a set percentage but applies to disregarding rules.

The IRS punishes fraud with a 75% penalty. As an example, if you owed \$10,000, the penalty would be \$7,500.

If you claimed the Earned Income Tax Credit (EIC) and committed fraud by error, the IRS may ban you from claiming the EIC for the next two years. When the IRS determines that a taxpayer fraudulently claims the credit, the EIC is disallowed for ten years.

Tax returns which include the EIC have the highest audit rates. In 2021, the EIC can be as much as \$6,728. Consequently, losing the EIC could be very costly.

Several studies have consistently shown that non-credentialed tax preparers had a higher rate of returns with an error. They would also be responsible for the highest rate percentage of EIC overclaims.

A Taxpayer Advocate survey found that the low-income population is more likely to be taken advantage of by unskilled or unscrupulous tax preparers.

Unfortunately, many people don’t know how to determine whether a preparer is competent to prepare their tax return.

The vast majority of tax professionals are non-credentialed and are not required to take any courses in tax preparation or pass competency tests.

Credentialed preparers, including attorneys, certified public accountants (CPAs), and enrolled agents (EAs), are generally required to pass competency tests and take a minimum amount of continuing education each year.

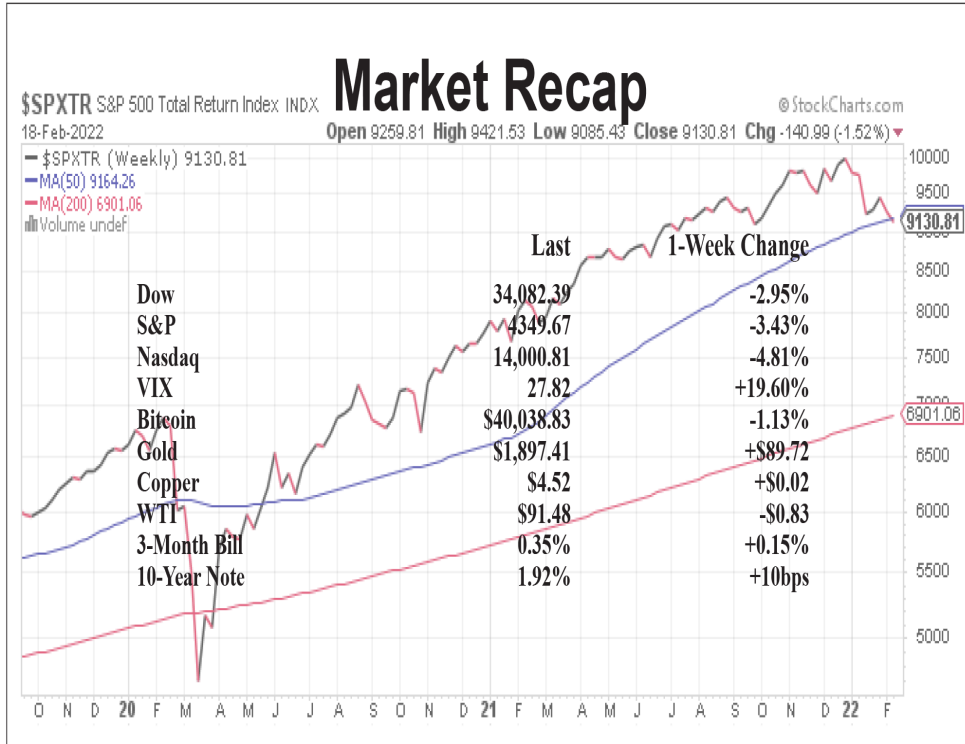

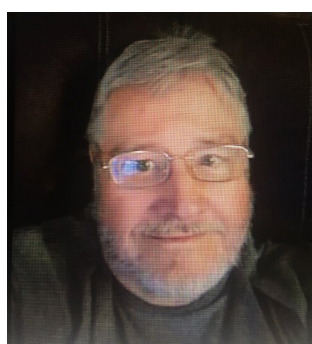

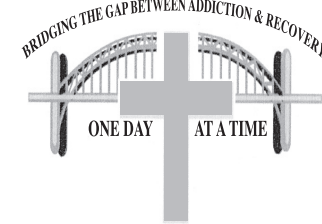
