Alleged **Fort Hood** killer's girlfriend indicted on 11 new counts

By SABRINA ANDERSON Messenger News Reporter

Cecily Aguilar, 23, of Killeen was indicted on 8 additional counts by a federal grand jury on July 13 in connection to the April 2020 death of Fort Hood soldier Spc. Vanessa

Aguilar was initially indicted on three counts in July 2020, including one count of conspiracy to tamper with evidence and two counts of tampering with evidence.

According to court documents, the new charges include one count of conspiracy to tamper with documents or proceedings, two counts of tampering with documents or proceedings, three counts of accessory after the fact, one count of destruction, alteration or falsification of records in a federal investigation, and four counts of false statement or representation.

Spc. Aaron Robinson allegedly killed Guillen in late April of 2020, and her body was later found June 30 of the same year. Before police could apprehend him. Robinson shot and killed himself the day after Guillen's body was found.

Aguilar was Robinson's girlfriend at the time, and both were





She is survived by her daughter, Denise Sullivan;



The Power of Posture



"If you do not stand firm in your faith, you will not stand at all." —Isaiah 7:9 NIV

Amy Cuddy has done a variety of interesting studies on the power of posture. Her research demonstrates that standing tall and engaging in various "power poses" can actually improve our performance. It won't endow you with knowledge you don't already have or allow you to have superhuman strengths, but standing like a superhero will allow you to make the most of your inherent abilities and knowledge. One of the interesting things to come out of her research is the finding that you can do these "power poses" in private for relatively short periods of time (as little as one or two minutes) and see improvements in your performance. The standard power pose is simply standing tall, putting your hands on your hips (arms akimbo), pulling your shoulders back (to thrust out your chest), and holding your -head up. Pretty easy to do, and we are also warned that "powerless poses," such as being hunched over and dropping your head can lead to poorer performances. Let's face it, when we look and feel confident, we are more likely to perform well, and God wants us to do and be well. So stand up tall and hold your head high. You can do it! - Christopher Simon





Hornets ranked fourth in district

Jonesboro, Oglesby picked to win six-man districts

Dave Campbell's Texas Football magazine is on the racks. This year's guide to Texas football, features four Texas Aggies on the cover.

The Aggies are projected as one of the top teams in the nation with a solid defense expected to hang with the Alabama Crimson Tide.

The magazine, known as "the Bible" of Texas football, always signals another approaching season for the school-boys.

This year, the Gatesville Hornets are picked fourth in District 9-4A, Division II.

The Hornets have 27 returning lettermen and 14 of 22 starters back from a 4-6 squad that earned the fourth playoff spot last year. Covid-19 led to the Hornets forfeiting their bi-district berth against eventual state champion Carthage. This year, coach Luke Howard's team is picked fourth again in the six-team district.

Jarrell and Robinson were the Hornets' two wins in district last year. They both have new head coaches this year and are tabbed as fifth and sixth in the preseason district rankings.

Key returners for the Hornets are quarterback Wesley Brown, receivers Carson Brizendine, Parker Allman and Trevor Smith, linemen Evan Hanson and Jaiden Gomez on offense.



Summertime is here; use your electronics

By Michael Acosta

(As a licensed professional fishing guide, Michael Acosta shows you how to find them. A Granbury resident of more than 35 years, he has been fishing all of his life, and has been a licensed guide since 1998.)

We are still fairly early in the summer, but those typical summer patterns are essentially in place. Today's topic is on locating those fish in the summer on our area lakes.

First of all, in the heat of the summer, the morning is typically your friend. Though the fish may not bite every morning, I would not miss the morning bite. Chances are this is one of your best choices this time of the year. Right now, I prefer to be on the spot right at sunup which is around 6:30 a.m. This is the coolest time of the day and the fish are more apt to be active.

I also like to keep track of the predicted feeding times according to the moon. With no outstanding weather event, these feeding times may be fairly accurate. If the morning bite does not pan out, chances are the next feeding opportunity will more than likely be around those predicted feeding times.

Summertime fish are known to suspend and you can rely on your electronics to locate these fish. Your electronics can show you where the thermocline is located as well as the suspended fish.

With a thermocline present on many lakes, the fish tend to suspend in the thermocline when they are less active. Catching suspended fish at a certain depth may be one of

the trickier presentations to master.

Some folks troll or down rig to work a lot of water to find

When the fish are not suspended and are on shallower flats and humps, I like to use my electronics to look for fish/bait "huddled" on the bottom. These fish on the bottom are generally more active at times.

I like to bounce a slab off the bottom to draw a strike. Crankbaits and other minnow imitations will work as well. Summertime fish are creatures of habit, for sure. If you locate structure or feeding areas on your electronics you may want to save those waypoints. Summertime fish many times will be in the same general areas year after year. For instance, striped bass generally migrate to the lower ends of a reservoir in the summer months. Humps, ridges and ledges near deeper water are always good candidates.

Sometimes in the summer it is prudent to set up on a hump or ridge and wait the fish out. Eventually they will feed. Chumming the water with diced shad is another tactic that at times may get the fish to start feeding.

Use and trust your graph to locate fish, bait and structure. It can be one of the best tools on your boat. See you on the water

On other lakes, Lake Whitney striped bass limits continue to be common near the Island and near McCown.

Possum Kingdom Lake striped bass are fair to good around Hell's Gate and near the dam.


