

Wonder in the heavens coming in 2024



A rare astronomical event - a total solar eclipse - will occur in the spring of 2024 and Gatesville is expected to be a top viewing location.

Gatesville is prime spot for viewing solar eclipse **BY JEFF OSBORNE**

Gatesville is the perfect location for people wanting to experience a total solar eclipse in the spring of 2024, and Joyce Talbott offered a preview of what people can expect during a presentation to her fellow Gatesville Lions Club members.

"It's very rare to have a total solar eclipse," Talbott said, adding that conditions have to be exactly right with the positioning of the sun, moon and Earth for the astronomical event to occur. "It is a unique and amazing event."

The eclipse that will be seen in Gatesville will occur on April 8, 2024. Gatesville's geographic location indicates it should experience the eclipse for 4 minutes and 24 seconds, a condition known as totality.

"That's unusual," Talbott said.

She noted that half of the city of San Antonio is expected to experience the eclipse, while the period of totality in Austin is only expected to be 1 minute and 45 seconds. "Houston is not in the path

of totality," Talbott said.

The center of the path of totality in Gatesville is expected to be at the intersection of U.S. Highway 84 and Texas Highway 36.

"We are not far from the very center of totality," Talbott said.

The longest recorded period of totality experienced during an eclipse was about 7 and a half minutes, she said.

play a strong role in boosting the ability of the Gatesville Independent School District to improve the students' lives, and one of the local businesses making contributions is Black Acre Title Company.

Black Acre, which is part of Capital Title of Texas, was recognized during the Community Partner Spotlight presentation during the GISD Board of Trustees' December meeting.

"We want to recognize a local business and community partner for their generosity towards our students," said GISD Superintendent Barrett Pollard. "For the second straight year, Black Acre Title Company has sponsored students for the Christmas season. In other words, the employees donated their time and money to buy Christmas gifts for needy students. Specifically, each student received a pair of pants, a shirt, a coat, a pair of shoes and a toy or item of interest depending on their age."

Black Acre employees sponsored 15 students in 2021 and increased the number to 20 students this year.

"That's very significant in these difficult economic times," Pollard said. "That's quite a lot of money they donate. If it was not for the generosity of Black Acre, these students likely would

Talbott said. "It is beautiful, but it is capable of rendering you blind."

Those wanting to view the eclipse should purchase special solar eclipse glasses. Several websites list the glasses for sale, and Talbott said there are better deals for ordering larger quantities, which may be helpful for those wanting to view the eclipse with groups.

Why are solar glasses needed?

"The sun can burn the retina of the eye, so wearing solar eclipse glasses is very important, even if there is just a partial eclipse," Talbott said.

The eclipse is expected to be visible in Gatesville starting

about 1:27 p.m. on April 8, 2024.

Tips that Talbott suggested include: "Take the day off, watch the weather, be flexible, get your solar glasses in advance, bring chairs (to your viewing spot) and take pictures of the people you are with - not the eclipse. Also, record your memories of the experience."

Talbott said people should not try to photograph the eclipse unless they are a professional photographer.

"An eclipse can not only render you blind, it can also destroy your camera," she said, adding that specialized equipment is needed.

One book Talbott recommended is the children's book "Totality! An Eclipse Guide in Rhyme and Science."

Gatesville Mayor Gary Chumley said because of the community's favorable viewing location for the eclipse, some people from out of town are already attempting to make hotel reservations, and the city's population is expected to temporarily expand significantly.

"We are expecting as many as 80,000 people may visit Gatesville that day," he said. Chumley added that planning committees will work to help organize local response.

not have received these very important items."

Natasha Clary of Black Acre said the company tries to find local children who might not otherwise receive help and donations.

"I emailed Barrett (Pollard) and asked if there were kids that teachers or counselors

knew about that we might be able to help," Clary said. "A lot of parents work and don't get government assistance, but they don't have extra money to spend on Christmas." Clary said the goal is to try to do even more next year.

"Hopefully next year we're going to challenge the community starting in about September so we can sponsor even more kids,' she said.



Christianity is a religion of paradoxes, and one of the most paradoxical elements of Christianity is the incarnation, the idea that God became man, being born as a helpless child in the humblest of circumstances. Nativity scenes memorialize this event, showing a baby lying in a manger, which is nothing more than a feeding trough for domesticated animals. But Jesus's birth is only the first of many paradoxes. At the other end of Jesus's life is the paradox of the almighty God letting himself be taunted and tortured, and ultimately letting himself die an ignominious death by hanging on a cross. We do well to remember that Christianity turns many virtues on their head. Strength, pride and wisdom are replaced by weakness, humility and a kind of naivete or simple-mindedness. At this time of year when we celebrate Christ's birth with lavish spending and gift-giving, we do well to remember that material things are golden fetters and that poverty makes us free to live a simpler, more spiritual life. The Son of God was born in a manger, and as He himself told a potential follower, he still had nowhere to lay his head. Jesus appears to be telling this man to count the cost of becoming his follower. Christmas might make us think that Christianity is nothing but sweetness and light when in fact it's incredibly difficult to be a good Christian. – Christopher Simon



Gatesville topples Llano 59-41, keeps rolling




Thanks to a 59-41 win over Llano on Monday, the No. 23 Gatesville boys basketball team will head into Christmas the winners of 14 straight games.

The Hornets (16-1) got double figures from Banner Allman, Tyler Shea, and West Allman and Kase Cox provided a first half spark that helped fuel a 22-7 run that helped separate an early close game.

The game tipped off at 11:15 a.m. at Llano and the early going certainly lacked any type of playoff atmosphere. Llano also tried to dramatically slow the game down and limit possessions and transition baskets. It worked to a certain degree as the Hornets finished the game thirteen points under their season per-game average.

Gatesville led just 11-9 after one quarter thanks to

eight points from Banner Allman in the period. In the second quarter, Shea came alive scoring 12 of his 16 points and Gatesville led 28-16 at the half.

Cox, a sophomore who came in averaging nine minutes per game, played eight minutes in the first half and 15 for the game. He scored three points, had two rebounds, two assists, a steal, and forced two more Llano turnovers. He played most of the second quarter as the Hornets extended their lead.

In the second half, the Hornets were simply the better team - even playing their second game without their fantastic senior forward Carter Williams, who will be back in the Hornets lineup

after Christmas. They forced 24 turnovers in the game and committed just eight fouls. Llano shot five free throws in the game compared to 15 for the Hornets.

Banner Allman finished the game with 21 points and 7 rebounds while Shea had 16 and eight rebounds. West Allman scored 14 points - 12 in the second half - and Rayshon Smith had three points in the game. Graceson Stewart had two points in the win.

Gatesville returns to the court on Dec. 28 for a final round of tournament play in Brownwood. They will open tournament play with Dublin before a second-round game against Wall. Their opponent in their final game of the tournament will be either

Brownwood, Big Spring, or a third matchup with Little River-Academy.

They will play three more non-district games before opening the district slate on Jan. 13 at home against the No. 18 Connally Cadets. The Hornets will also play their second district contest - on Jan. 17 - at home, taking on the Salado Eagles.

TPWD to stock rainbow trout

The annual Texas winter tradition of rainbow trout stocking is heading back to waterbodies across the state. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) will continue stocking thousands of rainbow trout through early March.

"TPWD stocks catchable sized fish during winter months to create unique winter angling opportunities throughout Texas," said Carl Kittel, TPWD Rainbow Trout Program director. "Rainbow trout love cold water and can be caught on a variety of baits and lures (worms, commercially available pastes, corn, spinners, spoons, flies and more), and are great to take home and eat. Our winter rainbow trout program has been a favorite of anglers for over 40 years.'

TPWD plans to stock 337,469 rainbow trout. Because rainbow trout are unable to survive in Texas after winter, anglers are encouraged to keep up to their daily bag limit of five trout. In Texas, children under 17 fish for free, but adults must have a fishing license with a freshwater fishing endorsement. An angler fishing in a Community Fishing Lake or from

a dock, pier or jetty within a Texas State Park may use no more than two poles. The statewide bag limit is five trout, except on parts of the Guadalupe River where special limits are in effect.

The dates and locations are subject to change due to inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances. Be sure to check the 2022-23 Trout Stocking Schedule online (on the TPWD website) before you go fishing to confirm the stocking date and check fishing regulations.

* Nolan Creek in Belton, Dec. 30.

* W.M. Brook Park Lake in Lampasas, Jan. 5.
