# **Coryell County approves \$8 million price tag for district court building**

The Coryell County Commissioners Court approved a guaranteed maximum price (GMP) of more than \$8 million for the development of a downtown county annex during a regular meeting on Dec. 12. The building will house the 440th District Court, justice-of-the-peace courts, and constables for Precincts 3 and 4, and Texas Game Wardens.

The total GMP is \$8,016,114.53. The action follows a presentation of the price from contractor Butler-Cohen, which took place at a special meeting on Dec. 5.

Following a close evaluation by the Coryell County Facilities Committee last year, the structures currently used by the courts have been considered insufficient and substandard, according to a previous article by The Messenger.

"They have outgrown (the current building) and just need a proper courtroom," County Commissioner Scott Weddle said.

The overall project amounts to \$9.5 million, a factor that led to a lengthy discussion at the Dec. 12

• Real-time alerts: Customers receive immediate notifications via text, email, or voice during any service disruptions.

• Customized updates: Users can personalize notification preferences and receive updates tailored to their specific location or service plans. "We believe this system will redefine how customers interact with TNMP and perceive their service providers during outages," TNMP Vice President of Operations Keith Nix said in a press release. "It's a testament to our continuous efforts to elevate user experience."

# Wreaths Across America honors fallen veterans annually

To honor our fallen veterans during the holiday season, the Turnersville Cemetery Association annually partners with Wreaths Across America to place balsam veteran's wreaths along the tombstones of our past veterans.

On Saturday, Dec. 16, National Wreaths Across America Day took place at over 3,700 participating locations across the country. At Turnersville Cemetery, 250 veterans' wreaths were placed by family members and volunteers.

Every year since 2008,

Congress proclaims a Saturday in December as National Wreaths Across America Day, which is typically held on the second or third Saturday of the month.

From the volunteers, sponsors, and the truck drivers, each person played an important role in the mission to remember the fallen, honor those that serve and their families, and to teach the next generation the value of freedom.

The volunteers included members from Jonesboro Independent School District 4-H, the Turnersville Volunteer Fire Department, and the Turnersville Cemetery Association.

"Community participation involves saying the name of each veteran as their wreath is placed, so that they and their families know they are not forgotten," Turnersville Cemetery Association Secretary Patty Weber said. "Taking time during the busy holiday season to place the wreaths is a small effort in comparison to their sacrifices."

At each of the sites, Wreaths Across America Location Coordinators work throughout the year with a cemetery contact and local governments to organize and promote the ceremony, coordinate wreath delivery, and manage the placement of wreaths.

Turnersville Cemetery Association Secretary Patty Weber and Karen Campbell are the Location Coordinators for Wreaths Across America.

In addition to the Location Coordinators, most Wreaths Across America locations rely on the assistance of community members, local businesses, and civic groups and organizations to place wreaths on the day of the event. Wreaths Across America believes the tradition represents a living memorial that honors veterans, activeduty military, and their families.

The balsam veteran's wreath was a gift of respect and appreciation, sponsored by an individual or organization, and placed on a headstone by volunteers as a small gesture of gratitude for the freedoms Americans enjoy. For centuries, fresh evergreens have been used as a symbol of honor and have served as a living tribute renewed annually.

There is no cost to attend an event on National Wreaths Across America Day and all are welcome to join. However, Wreaths Across America receives no government funding.

Each veterans' wreath placed on National Wreaths Across America Day is sponsored for \$17 per wreath.

National Wreaths Across America Day and other events are made possible by thousands of volunteers who organize local

meeting about how the county would cover the additional \$1.5 million. The total cost reflects expenses outside of the GMP, such as the demolition, independent testing, civil engineering, surveying, utility connection, furniture, and equipment.

Within the framework of the budget we have right now, can we write a check for \$9,512,352, and the answer to that is no," County Judge Roger Miller said.

Commissioner Weddle and Commissioner Kyle Matthews discussed utilizcounty's current budget and borrowing from other funds.

"At the end of the day, no matter what we do, I want to make sure that it is legally sufficient and does not question the legality of the decisions that the court has made," Miller said.

Matthews presented a statute that says the court could amend the budget in the interest of the taxpayer. However, the same statute also claims county funds should remain in strict compliance with the original budget except in an emergency or public necessity.

"I think it's pretty clear that we can amend it, too

Following private meetings with financial advisors during a court recess to gather more insight into amending the budget, Miller motioned to approve the GMP. He adds that the court must make an amendment to the budget prior to utilizing funds outside of the \$8 million.

With a GMP in place, construction for the new building can move forward. Some work has already begun on the annex, such as the excavation of the parking lot.

The county approved the building design by Southwest Architects in September of last year. The plans include a 120-seat district courtroom, jury box,

ing available funds from other projects within the budget, including broadband and capital improvement, plus funds leftover from the county jail expansion. With this money, Weddle said the county has the means to pay the \$1.5 million toward the annex.

Miller was concerned about the legalities of making changes to the

Matthews said.

Weddle said they determined at a previous meeting - with the guidance of the Coryell County Attorney - that they can pursue either option in the bill.

"They have to allow us that," Weddle said. "When we're making a budget, we cannot foresee everything that is happening throughout the year."

Weddle estimates that a groundbreaking for the annex will take place around mid-January. While a project timeline has not been set, construction will take approximately 10 months.

## CCGS Program to explore Sanborn Fire Maps

Beginning in 1867, the Sanborn Map Co. produced detailed maps of city buildings for use by fire insurance companies. The Sanborn Map Co. continues to provide an expanded mapping and visual concepts business today.

Genealogists and historians have found a bonanza in these maps, which show architectural details of city buildings as they change through the years. Many of the buildings are identified with an owner's name or its commercial use. Of particular interest is the change in types of businesses that operated in the same building through the years. Mysterious, long-lost buildings such as a calaboose and arched cellars are revealed to stir one's imagination.

The Sanborn maps available online for Coryell County are limited to Gatesville and the date range 1885-1920. Even this small section of our local history gives a valuable and different perspective on genealogical and historical research. Sherry Lawrence will present a program on the Gatesville Sanborn Maps at the Jan. 9, 2024, Coryell County Genealogical Society meeting. The public is welcome to attend the meeting at the Gatesville Public Library at 6 p.m.

# RECIPE

*The following article and recipe about shortbread appeared in the Christmas edition of The Gatesville Messenger 80 years ago on Dec. 24, 1943.* 

SHORTBREAD IS TASTY

The sliced cherries and the chopped almonds

1/3 cup cornstarch 4 cup powdered beet sugar ¼ cup butter 1 egg yolk, beaten <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup candied cherries, quartered Sift together flour, cornstarch, and sugar. Add butter, blending with fingertips until thoroughly mixed. Add egg yolk and mix well with fork. Add almonds and cherries. Form into a ball. Place in the center of a greased cookie sheet. Pat. or roll out, about half an inch thick keeping as perfect a circle as possible. Pinch edges decoratively. Arrange halved cherries and almonds or angelica in the center. Bake in a slow oven (300 degrees) for half an hour - or until center is done and edges are lightly browned. Allow it to cool. Loosen carefully with spatula before transferring from cookie sheet. The shortbread may be shaped in a square and cut into finger strips before baking if preferred.

Want to please someone who "has everything" with a really extra special Christmas gift?

A festively decorated round of Royal Scotch shortbread is the perfect answer to that very pressing problem.

The familiar tartancovered, heather-trimmed tins are missing from the stores this year, so we'll use a really wonderful old Christmas recipe from Scotland and make some ourselves instead.

A quarter cup of powdered sugar is all the recipe requires, so you can plan to make as many rounds as you can for Christmas gifts.

After all, sugar is a precious item this Christmas, isn't it? And it's good to know something so delectable requires so little!

One of the tricks in making good Scotch shortbread is to rub the butter into the flour mixture with the fingertips instead of a pastry blender. The butter softens slightly that way and absorbs the flour and sugar perfectly. are the ingredients that give the regal touch and unbelievably Christmassy texture to this usually somewhat austere Scotch specialty. It's so good you just have to taste it to

believe it! Save half a dozen of the most perfect cherries and almonds for decoration or use bits of green angelica with the cherries instead.

If you have a box of glace fruit, you can let your imagination run riot of course and really go to town, but in general the cherries will do the job very nicely indeed.

When the shortbread is baked, cut a round of white cardboard exactly the same size. Slide a broad spatula gently under the round of shortbread when it is cool and lift it carefully on to the cardboard.

Wrap gaily in cellophane and trim proudly with red ribbons and holly, for a gift of Royal Scotch shortbread is a very elegant gift indeed.

# Managing seasonal depression during the holidays

One factor is known as seasonal affective disorder (SAD), which tends to occur during fall and winter when less daylight puts a strain on one's emotional wellbeing.

"For folks who have chronic depression and were in a stable remission for the rest of the year, it can be very common to see that flare up where it was stable just a few months ago," Malti said.

A recent survey by the American Psychological Association (APA) shows that nearly 89% of adults claim something causes them stress during the holidays, while 41% say it increases their stress compared to other seasons. One of the top stressors found in the survey includes financial wellbeing as the pressure increases to spend money on gifts. Excess stress is often associated with increased feelings of depression and anxiety, according to the APA.

Since holidays like Thanksgiving and Christmas often revolve around family gatherings, Malti said it can also trigger feelings of stress, grief, or loneliness if one is experiencing a family conflict or loss.

"I think the reality for most people is some of those relationships may be strained for one reason or another and can create a difficult time for folks (during a time) meant to be spent with your family, friends, and loved ones," he said. "A number of us may have a mother, father or loved one who has passed away, and the memories of previous Christmases or Thanksgivings spent at a grandmother's house or grandfather's house are no longer here due to a loss in the family.

Malti said that seasonal changes not only affect those with a history of depression and anxiety, but also those who might not normally struggle with a mental illness.

Some of the signs of depression include chronic fatigue, loss of interest in activities once found enjoyable, and changes in sleeping and eating patterns. While depression and anxiety might present similar symptoms, anxiety also includes excessive worrying, fear, and irrational thoughts.

"I discuss this a lot with my patients, but if you feel like you're struggling with any new feelings of depression or any anxiety, often times that can come in very subtle ways," Malti said.

When it comes to managing one's mental health around the holidays, Malti provides a few recommendations that might help with symptoms:

Remain active with aerobic exercise for about 30 minutes four to five days a week, such as walking or using an elliptical machine to work large muscle groups and elevate the heart rate.

• Get enough sleep each night. Malti recommends keeping a consistent sleep schedule to keep the circadian rhythm in check.

Stay engaged with others. If family or friends live far away or are no longer around, find activities or ways to get involved in the community.

"Especially during the holidays, both community outreach and church programs usually have a

number of things going on to bring people together that may not have a lot of close family or friends that they are able to visit or are no longer alive, so it still allows people to have that sense of family they may not have anymore," Malti said.

Malti emphasizes the

importance of seeking medical help if one is struggling with any signs of depression, anxiety, or their overall mental health.

"Historically, depression has been stigmatized, but it's a very common thing we see and manage in a doctor's office," Malti said. "I encourage anybody to be open about the way that they're feeling. If they feel like they are struggling with depression, to not feel like they'll be judged in any sort of way or be put in some category or feel like they are crazy, because none of those things are true. It's a very common thing that people struggle with."

# Christmas tamales in Pecos

ulema Ulate makes Christmas tamales in a small building in Pecos. "I usually start making them right after Thanksgiving," she says. "I do twenty, thirty, forty dozen a day. I take pre-orders."

She makes a bunch.

"Last year, I did close to

four hundred dozen. I had never counted it up before, but I guess if you multiply twelve times four hundred, you get forty-eight hundred. That's close to five thousand.

Sulema says she learned the recipe from her mother, who prepared Christmas tamales for her ten children.

"I carefully follow the recipe to the letter, measuring out the ingredients exactly so all tamales are exactly alike. I do it all by hand myself because I'm one of those people that want to make sure everything gets done right, you know.' She makes pork and

chicken tamales.

"I had always made only pork. Then someone asked me to make some with chicken. I did, and they turned out really well.'

She says tamales at Christmas time is a Mexican tradition.

"Now, I think it's not just Mexican people who want them."

Some people pick them up at her small building, but Sulema delivers most of them. She assembles the tamales, then freezes them. When she gets ready to sell them, they are put in a vegetable steamer to cook them, so they'll be fresh.

"I sell the tamales for seventeen dollars a dozen."

Sulema has had a catering business for thirty-three years and caters events all over the state. She does some big jobs in major cities. She was born in Pecos and has lived there all her life. She does volunteer work for local organizations. Sixteen years ago, she and her husband started a free Thanksgiving Day dinner for the community, held in the Pecos Community Center.

"Each plate has turkey and dressing, mashed potatoes, green beans, sweet potatoes, cranberry, bread, and dessert." The desserts are either pumpkin or pecan pie.

"My cornbread for the dressing is made from scratch."

She shops in Odessa and Midland for bargains on the things she needs. She'll buy hundreds of turkeys. People make donations to pay for the event, which draws a large crowd every year. Last year, she bought twenty-five hundred plastic plates, used all of those and had to get several more.

# Gatesville hoops teams fall, resume tourney play after holiday break

The Gatesville boys and girls basketball teams are in the midst of a muchneeded break after each squad stumbled in their final games before the holidays.

The Lady Hornets (7-11) fell 47-41 in a road contest at Mineral Wells on Dec. 15. while the Hornets dropped a Monday matinee to Llano 50-43 on Dec. 18. The boys team beat McGregor 55-52 on Dec. 15 and head into the break with a 15-3 record.

The lone Texan to compete, Jordan Rae, earned a top-10 finish in the Women's Indoor Pentathlon on Friday in Pittsburg, Kansas. She earned 3404 points across her five events. This performance earned Rae the No. 2 spot in school history for the Women's Indoor Pentathlon.

Rae tied for third place in the high jump with 806 points, her best event of the weekend. She had top-15 finishes in her other four events on the weekend. In the 60m hurdles she earned 842 points with a time of 9.33. In the shotput, Rae threw a dis-

Teresa Da Silva returned to the starting lineup and led the Texans with 11 points on 4-of-7 shooting. Jakoriah Long scored nine points (3-5 FG), Elise Turrubiates tallied eight points (3-5 FG) and six rebounds, while Faith Acker

added four points, five rebounds and four blocks.

The Texans and Lady Demons were tied 40-40 entering the fourth quarter. Northwestern State won the final frame 19-11 as they outshot Tarleton 6-of-9 (.667) to 3-of-16 (.188). The Texans actually outshot the Lady Demons in the game 19-of-56 (.339) to 19-of-59 (.322), but were outrebounded 45-34.

It was a slow start to this one, with a combined three points over the first four minutes of action. The margin was one-possession for either team over the first eight minutes, with Northwestern State taking a 13-9 lead into the second quarter.

After Northwestern State led 16-9, Tarleton fought back with a 7-1 run, then tied the game at 20-20 with 3:15 to play in the second quar-

ter. The Texans held a onepoint lead at halftime, 24-23, forcing the Lady Demons to shoot 6-of-33 (.182) from the field, including 1-of-12 (.083) from beyond the arc in the first half.

The Texans had their best offensive quarter in the third, making 7-of-14 (.500). Neither team led by more than three in the frame, deadlocked at 40-40 entering the fourth.

Tied at 44-44 with 7:14 to play, Northwestern State went on a 10-1 run over the next five minutes to put the game out of reach.

# GISD's GEAR UP announces senior winter checklist

The Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) has provided an important checklist for seniors who will graduate in 2024.

GEAR UP helps students understand how to prepare, apply, and pay for college. The program provides services such as academic advising, personal finance, summer enrichment camps, career exploration, college tours, and the process of applying for financial aid. The senior winter check-

list includes:

Get your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) submitted Create your Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID. Your parents will also need an FSA ID if they don't already have one. The FAFSA will likely be open sometime in December.

Complete the FAFSA as soon as possible and watch out for announcements about the opening date.

#### The earlier the better

Apply to your colleges of choice as early as possible. Be sure you are aware of the college application deadlines for your choice of colleges. Many popular and selective colleges will have deadlines for applications as early as Dec. 1, while others have deadlines in January or February. Be sure to send your transcript if prompted by your college of choice.

Once accepted, follow the instructions or checklist for the next steps. This will likely include creating and logging in to your student portal and email, applying for student housing, and registering for orientation or summer freshman camps. Be sure to do this immediately as important information will be available through your student portal. Check your college email regularly so you don't miss important information and deadlines.

#### **Apply, apply, apply** Apply for scholarships by using the Scholarship Lady of Central Texas scholarship database with the

password "24goforit" and check with your counselor

for local scholarships. Obtain letters of recommendation from teachers, coaches, and other important people in your life to include with your scholarship applications if required.

Spend time on your scholarship essays and get resources to assist you with completing it, whether that may be an English teacher, counselor, or parent.

Apply for student housing if you plan to live on campus. Once accepted to your college of choice, look for housing application information and deadlines. You will likely need to pay a deposit with your housing

#### application.

#### Register for orientations, freshman camps, and more

Once accepted, watch and register for orientation days, informational sessions, and summer freshman camps. These are very important to attend, so take advantage of any and all opportunities to learn more about your college, its traditions, and make connections.

Be sure to register for spring dual credit if you are interested.

Decide if you need to take or re-take the ACT or SAT and get registered.

#### Up your game

Keep up your grades, take advantage of extra credit assignments, and utilize sure to immediately check with your teachers about makeup work and deadlines for submission. **Participate**

toring. If you are absent, be

Participate in extra-curricular activities and consider taking advantage of community service or volunteer opportunities.

Participate in GEAR UP activities and college visits.
