Local clinic offers mental health services and resources for the community

Mental health has become a growing concern in the United States, especially within Texas.

According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness, one in five U.S. adults experience a mental illness each year. In 2021, 43% of adults in Texas reported symptoms of anxiety or depression, and 26% of them were unable to receive needed treatment. In addition, The Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute reports that approximately two million children and youth in Texas aged six through 17- about 35% - have a mental health need.

For most of those experiencing a mental illness in a rural area, it is often a challenge to find care and treatment. Central Counties Services is a local resource for those who are experiencing a mental illness or men-

tal health crisis. Formerly known as MHMR, Central Counties Services provides low to no-cost services for uninsured or underinsured adults and children in clinics across Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, and Milam counties.

The non-profit agency's Gatesville clinic is one of the locations that provides mental health services and resources for those living with major depression, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, severe emotional crisis, among others. Adult offerings include assessment and referrals, counseling, employment and housing support, skills training, and medication management.

"We provide case work, which means they come in and we build treatment plans with clients," said Julia Smith, an adult case worker at the Gatesville clinic.

Smith explains the process of receiving care and treatment for a mental illness through a Central Counties Services clinic. The first appointment would consist of an intake interview with a licensed mental health professional who will inquire about symptoms and how those symptoms affect daily life, suicidal thoughts, and more.

"The most important thing is to be very honest," Smith said. "For a lot of people, it's hard to talk about those things, but the more honest that you are, the better understanding that we have.

After the intake assessment, the client is assigned to a case worker who will develop a treatment plan based on their diagnosis and individual needs.

"You would then build goals and objectives underneath those needs," Smith

said. "You see them at least once a month. and then if they want medication after the treatment plan is in place, then they can have medication services with the doctor."

Smith adds that treatment plans help people manage symptoms to cope with everyday life, including anxiety or depression that affects life at work, home, or in the community.

To make an appointment with the clinic, Smith said individuals can call or visit the clinic in person.

"If someone needs services, they could call and ask any questions - that's always available," Smith said.

The agency also provides a mobile crisis outreach team (MCOT) for those who are experiencing a psychiatric crisis. The team provides

A "Pickle" for Christmas

The tradition of the "Christmas Pickle" is one of the most unusual Christmas customs that exists to this day

It was reported that in the 1880s Woolworth stores started selling glass ornaments that had been imported from Germany. Some of these ornaments were shaped to look like various fruits and vegetables including pickles.

According to an old German tradition, the pickle was the last ornament to be hung on the Christmas tree, and the child that found the pickle first received an extra present. This tradition carries on to this day even in

Central Texas where many German immigrants settled prior to 1900.

There are several legends or myths surrounding the Christmas Pickle. One of which centers around a Civil War prisoner who was originally born in Germany. He was starving to death and begged a guard for one last pickle. The guard took pity on him and gave him a pickle, which supposedly gave the prisoner the mental and physical strength to continue on.

Despite the many stories about the origins of the pickle, some families to this day continue to practice this holiday tradition.

Then I was growing up in Fort Worth, my buddies and I would go to the driving range in Forest Park and knock a few golf balls around. up with water moccasins. All of us were wearing tall rubber boots and we had 410s and 22s and spotlights. We made one loop around that big pool. Of course, when you do all that shooting and snake killing, it scares the other snakes. We did one orbit around that pond. Then we went to another location to give that place a chance to settle down. Then we came back and did one more loop, and that one night around that one pool we killed 57 water moccasins.

Once you spear a water moccasin, there's an odor that gets on that gig and if you go find a frog, and you get that gig down there close to that frog before you make that final plunge that frog smells the odor of that snake and will jump because it thinks there is a snake right on him. So, we had to have our snake gigs and we had to have our frog gigs, because never the twain could meet. "I have personally seen

Then we'd take a ride on the train that ran through the park or ride the revolving swings that sling riders out on a 45-degree angle. On the way home one night - for some reason - we pulled into the entrance to the Botanical Gardens. It had a series of pools leading up to the entrance gate. The pools were full of frogs. None of us had ever gone frog gigging before, and I don't remember what we used to catch the frogs, but we caught a bunch. We put them in the back of my pickup and went to the home of some unsuspect-

ing classmate and put the frogs in his front yard.

It was the only time I've gone frog gigging, but I've interviewed a few since then and it sounds like a lot of fun. I love to eat frog legs.

Jim Thompson, of Sulphur Springs, knows about water moccasins.

"One night, we were out east of town at Bruce Matthews place, and he had two or three different pools where we could gig for frogs. We were at what we call the big pool. It was shallow for the most part and it was just covered We didn't do much frog gigging that night because we were having so much fun and success at killing snakes.

"There were cows all around, and I don't know if a water moccasin could kill a cow but they might could make a cow lame and swell up. Course the dairyman didn't want those snakes out there, so we turned it into something fun. We'd just go snake killin'.

"We learned real quick that whenever you go to use a gig, you don't use the same gig for frogs that you use for water moccasins.

gray or black. Ugly as a mud fence in a rainstorm. A water moccasin will walk five miles to bite you. They're mean. If they bite you and you don't treat it, it could kill you. We ain't talkin' about a fun snake. It's not a snake that you can pick up and play with. There's only five or six, I don't know, venomous snakes in North America, and water moccasin is one of them. It's one of the mean ones."

CHRISTMAS FRUIT DROPS

- 1 ½ c. sifted plain flour 1 egg ½ tsp. baking soda ½ tsp. vanilla
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 c. mixed candied fruit,

finely chopped ½ c. butter ½ c. nuts, chopped ¾ c. sugar

Stir together flour, baking soda, and salt. Cream together butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add egg and vanilla, beat well. Blend candied fruits and nuts with flour mixture; blend into creamed mixture. Drop by teaspoon full on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 10 minutes or until brown. Allow to cool on the cookie sheet for three minutes before removing to a wire rack to cool completely. Be careful, will burn easily.

intervention, assessments, and referrals wherever the crisis is taking place within the community, including at home or Mental health services for children and adolescents include family training and support, screening and assessment, referrals, skills recovery plan' for kids, and we review it every 90 days (where for adults it's every six months)." Bridgewater also meets with children who have intellectual and developmental disabilities. She said the clinic offers children the same mental health crisis services as adults. She adds that she makes connections with the counselors and teachers at the schools to ensure she can monitor how the students are doing in class outside of the in-person meetings. "I think that's the biggest part - is getting that communication, that connection, especially because a lot of parents don't even know that we are here," Bridgewater said. Parents must call to schedule an intake appointment for their children and do not need a referral from the school district. While the Gatesville clinic does not fully service intellectual and developmental disabilities, the clinic offers referrals to other locations within the agency's network that provides those services.

The non-profit determines fees for services on a sliding scale based on the individual's ability to pay.

and community protection," Wuenschel said.

Early symptoms can last one to two weeks and usually include:

Runny nose
 Low-grade fever (generally minimal throughout the course of the disease)

 \cdot A mild, occasional cough

• Apnea – a pause in breathing (in infants)

As the disease progresses, the traditional symptoms of pertussis appear and include:

• Paroxysms (fits) of many rapid coughs followed by a high-pitched "whoop"

Vomiting

• Exhaustion (very tired) after coughing fits

How to prevent: • Up-to-date DTAP immunization in children and TDAP in teens and adults

· Practice good hand

hygiene (washing with warm soapy water for at least 20 seconds).

• Wearing a mask while sick and around sick patients

• Sanitize waiting areas and exam rooms thoroughly.

Pertussis is a contagious disease only found in humans that spreads from person to person. People with pertussis usually spread the disease to another person through aerosolized droplets from coughing or sneezing.

Pertussis can also spread when others in close contact breathe in the pertussis bacteria. Many babies who get pertussis are infected by older siblings, parents, or caregivers who might not even know they have the disease. at work.

Those experiencing a crisis can call the Crisis Hotline at 800-888-4036, which is available 24 hours/ seven days a week and will connect callers with a professional.

Smith emphasizes the importance of not allowing the stigma behind mental illness keep someone from seeking treatment.

"There are people who come in and they seem to have it all together and they live a productive life, but they come in for talk services, just to have sessions with their caseworker and talk things out," Smith said.

"It's not just people who are just severely mentally ill coming in here," Smith adds. "It's people who are just trying to cope with the rising expenses of groceries and trying to handle and manage everyday stress, so that's available."

training, counseling, and family mentoring.

Rachael Bridgewater, a children's case worker with Central Counties Services, meets with children from ages 4 to 17 years at school districts in Oglesby, Gatesville, Evant, Jonesboro, Hamilton, and Hico.

After the students speak with a licensed healthcare professional and receive a diagnosis, Bridgewater said they also build a treatment plan like case workers do with adult clients. She said she tries to see students at least twice a month and reviews goals with them every 90 days.

"Once the treatment plan is in place, then I can see the kids at school during the school year, and then during the summer or on holidays they come to the office," Bridgewater said. "Where my treatment plans differ a little from the adult side is in the fact that it's called a 'person-centered As an agency funded by the Texas Department of State Health Services, services will not be denied to any eligible individual.

To be eligible for adult services, clients must be at least 18 years old and reside in Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, or Milam County and meet the agency's financial criteria as an uninsured or underinsured resident, according to the Central Counties Services website. For children or adolescents, they must reside in either one of the five counties, be between the ages of 3 and 17 years, and have serious emotional/behavioral problems that interfere with their functioning at home, school, or in the community.



Cucumbers sold in 34 Texas stores recalled over salmonella concerns

This past November, Walmart recalled cucumber slices sold in 34 Texas stores over concerns that they might be contaminated with salmonella.

In a recall announcement posted by the Food and Drug Administration, it stated that the recalled MarketSide Fresh Cut Cucumber Slices were sold between Oct. 12 and Nov. 26, with date codes up to Dec. 1. The cucumbers were sold in clear plastic containers with a universal product code or price look-up code of 62969. States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) notified SunFed that the cucumbers were associated with reported salmonella infections between the dates of Oct. 12 and Nov. 15.

According to the recall announcement, SunFed has also contacted each of its direct buyers to advise are implicated in the recall. Salmonella is made up of bacteria, which can infect a person after swallowing the bacteria. The CDC states that contaminated food is a main source of the illness. The CDC also estimated salmonella to cause about 1.35 million infections in the U.S. each year. possession should not consume, serve, use, sell, or distribute the recalled product. It is also encouraged to clean and sanitize surfaces that could have come into contact with the recalled product to reduce cross-contamination. • Recalled products

should be thrown out or destroyed so they may not be consumed or returned to the point of purchase. If you think you have consumed a recalled product and do not feel well, contact your healthcare provider. Consumers who have purchased the recalled products may obtain additional information by contacting SunFed's recall hotline at 888-542-5849.

"As soon as we learned of this issue, we immediately acted to protect consumers," Craig Slate, President at SunFed said in the recall announcement. "We require all of our growers to strictly comply with the FDA food safety requirements."

Walmart advised customers to toss out the cucumber slices or return them to the store from which they purchased them. No other products sold by SunFed The recall announcement noted that healthy people who are infected with salmonella often experience fever, diarrhea (which may be bloody), nausea, vomiting, and abdominal pain.

Walmart stated in a recall announcement that consumers should take the following actions:

• Check to see if you have recalled Marketside Fresh Cut Cucumber Slices.

Jonesboro High School's Future Farmers of America (FFA) program made its annual trip to the Bosque River District Talent Show at McGregor High School on Wednesday, Dec. 11, where junior Braxton Dossey and senior Clayton Herring placed first.

"We are hoping this year will be his big break," Ferguson said. "Braxton overcame a serious neck injury in the summer, and I know the entire community is proud watching him thrive after that. His faith in God seems so vibrant."

As for Herring, this was his first time competing at the talent show, although he and Dossey have spent a lot of time picking guitars together.

"Clayton is one the hardest working boys I know," she said. "His classmates joke that he always says, 'I'd rather be on a tractor.' He is also in my work program and has more work hours logged than any other Jonesboro student."

Ferguson mentioned that the duo mainly practiced

outside of school but started gearing up for the talent show by performing in her classroom about a month prior to competition.

"Their fellow FFA members and I truly enjoyed the classroom concerts," she said. "I've only had the privilege of knowing Braxton and Clayton for a semester. I'm proud of more than just their musical talent. Braxton and Clayton are both respectful and outstanding young men."

Ferguson mentioned that the talent show is important because it is a true confidence builder while also giving students the opportunity to network with other FFA members from their area.

Herring expressed that the biggest thing the talent show taught the duo was how to deal with their stage fright.

"Learning how to deal with the nervousness of standing in front of a crowd on stage will benefit my public speaking ability," Dossey said.

Ferguson expressed that she hopes that Dossey and Herring see what they are capable of in the future.

"Not only do they have the Area talent show to prepare for, but they will be gearing up for our spring Career Development Events; Braxton will compete in livestock judging, and Clayton will be in entomology," she said. "Hopefully, this taste of success encourages them to do their best in all their upcoming FFA events."

"Winning first place felt incredible and brought a sense of pride and validation for the hard work we put in," Herring said.

"It felt like our hard work was noticed by many people and further proves that Jonesboro ISD is the greatest school district in America," Dossey said.

The duo will perform a different song for their Area competition in May but are still undecided on the song choice.

"They want to make sure they choose songs that will get the crowd excited," Ferguson said.

"I have very high expectations," she said. "They are extremely talented young men. The top three teams at Area will receive a banner for their win, but only first place will advance to state. I truly believe they have the ability to win."

GISD sends letter to parents about safe storage of firearms

In the wake of thousands of gun-related deaths across the United States in 2024 alone, Gatesville Independent School District distributed a letter to parents as a reminder about the safe storage of firearms.

The message stems from a Texas law, which is under Texas Education Code 37.222, that went into effect at the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year. Its purpose is to increase awareness about safe gun storage practices by distributing information to parents, explains Gatesville ISD Assistant Superintendent Dr. Yancey Sanderson.

"By working together, schools and parents can play a role in promoting a culture of safety," Sanderson said.

The letter provides parents with resources on how to safely store firearms and talk with their children about these safety measures. It states that restricting access to guns is critical in preventing suicide deaths, unintentional shoot-

ings, and other tragedies.

"Gun safety is a crucial concern for everyone," Sanderson said. "Providing educational resources can help reduce the risk of accidents and tragedies in communities across the state."

Teresa Johnson, a parent at Gatesville ISD, said she was not aware of the law but is glad it is in place.

"I was glad to receive the letter. It is a great reminder for those of us that are familiar with safe firearm storage to stay vigilant," Johnson said. "And to also get the word out to those that don't necessarily know the risks of not using childsafe storage."

The letter notes that it is unlawful to store, transport, or abandon an unsecured firearm in a place where children have access to the firearm. Under Texas Penal Code 46.13, a person commits the offense of making a firearm accessible to a child if they fail to secure the firearm or leave the firearm in a place where they know or should know that the child could gain access to it. "I believe it is important for everyone to know and to teach their children about gun/firearm safety even if you do not own a gun," Johnson said.

According to the letter, 4,613 Texans experienced gun-related deaths in 2021. The Texas Department of State Health Services reports that 55% of Texas firearms deaths in 2020 were suicides and that 59% of all suicides in Texas were by firearms. Suicide attempts involving firearms have a 90% fatality rate. "I feel like our school district takes child safety very seriously," Johnson said. "Educating parents/guardians on types of safety is one of the best ways to help keep a child safe."

Texas DPS heightens enforcement this holiday season

AUSTIN - The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) is committed to keeping Texans safe this holiday season. The Texas Highway Patrol (THP) will conduct its annual Christmas and New Year's holiday traffic enforcement campaign beginning Dec. 20 and running through the rest of the year. Troopers will be out on the

roads looking for people who are speeding, not wearing their seat belts, driving while intoxicated, or committing other traffic violations.

"During the holidays, our roads are busier than ever, so safety must remain a top priority," said Colonel Freeman Martin. "I again want to remind Texans to be alert, put your phones down, and make driving your sole focus when you're behind the wheel. If you see emergency vehicles stopped along the side of the road, move over or slow down—it's the law. If we all simply pay attention and follow the traffic laws, we can help ensure everyone makes it home safely for the holidays this year."

THP will increase enforcement as part of Operation CARE (Crash Awareness and Reduction Effort), which runs nationwide from Dec. 20 - Jan. 1. During DPS' 2023 Christmas and New Year's enforcement efforts, there were more than 103,317 citations and warnings issued. This included over 28,578 speeding citations; 1,538 seat belt and child seat violations; 3,340 citations for driving without insurance;

and 145 felony and fugitive arrests.

DPS offers the following safety tips for the upcoming holiday season:

• Don't drink and drive. Make alternate plans if you are consuming alcohol.

• Eliminate distractions while driving, including the use of mobile devices. Texas law prohibits the use of portable wireless devices to read, write, or send an electronic message unless the vehicle is stopped. If you're using a navigation device or app, have a passenger operate it so you can keep your eyes on the road.

• Move Over or Slow Down for police, fire, EMS, Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) vehicles and tow trucks stopped on the side of the road with emergency lights activated. Show the same courtesy to fellow drivers who are stopped on the side of the road. So far in 2024, there have been more than 12,204 Move Over, Slow Down violations. • Buckle up everyone in

the vehicle — it's the law. · Slow down, especially in bad weather, heavy traffic, unfamiliar areas, or construction zones.

• Drive defensively, as holiday travel can present additional challenges.

• On multi-lane roads, use the left lane for passing only. Not only is it courteous driving and avoids impeding traffic, but Texas law also requires slower traffic to keep to the right and to use the left lane for passing only (when posted).

• Don't cut in front of large trucks and try not to brake quickly in front of them. They can't maneuver as easily as passenger vehicles and pickup trucks. • If you can Steer It, Clear It: If you are involved in a non-injury crash and your vehicle can be moved, clear the traffic lanes to minimize traffic impact. Leaving vehicles in a traffic lane increases traffic congestion and leaves those involved with an increased risk of harm or a secondary wreck. On some highways, if you don't move your vehicle when it's safe to do so, it's against the law.

• Keep the Texas Roadside Assistance number stored in your phone. Dial 1-800-525-5555 for any type of assistance. The number can also be found on the back of a Texas Driver License.

• Check your vehicle to make sure it is properly maintained and always ensure your cargo is secure.

• Report road hazards or anything suspicious to the nearest law enforcement agency.

• Monitor weather and road conditions wherever you are traveling. For road conditions and closures in Texas, visit drivetexas.org

DPS would also like to remind Texans about the iWatchTexas program, a critical resource for reporting suspicious activity within the community to help prevent dangerous attacks. It's especially important to be vigilant as people gather for parades, festivals, and other community events. Tips can be reported via the iWatchTexas website, the free iWatch iOS or Android mobile app, or by calling 844-643-2251. All reports are confidential.

MUSEUM SPOTLIGHT Those dusty old streets....

In the early days of Gatesville, long before the streets were paved, the roads throughout the city were comprised of ordinary dirt, mud, or sometimes gravel. This was primarily the case with the roads surrounding the courthouse square.

In those days, before automobiles, folks would arrive on the square using horses, buggies, and sometimes bicycles.

The dust generated by those means of transportation was often stifling for early day shoppers and those visiting the courthouse.

Robert E. Lee Meeks used a horse-drawn water wagon to sprinkle Gatesville's gravelly Main Street and the streets surrounding the square to keep down the dust. Back in those days, paved streets were unheard of.

Meeks was in the street sprinkling business from about 1908 to 1920. It took 18 to 20 tank loads of water to make the sprinkling system run from his horse-drawn wagon.

He charged each down-

town merchant 25 to 50 cents each week and would collect his salary every Monday. Hence, he received the nickname of "Monday Meeks."

The public is invited to drop by and see all the historic items that have been collected at the Coryell Museum. The building is full of interesting stories about the history of the county.

Visitors are welcome to drop by the museum located at 718 E. Main to view the massive spur collection. Coryell Museum and Historical Center is open Wednesday through Saturday, as is the gift shop. Yearly, Coryell Museum memberships are \$20 for singles, \$30 for families, and \$40 for businesses, which includes free admission to the museum, plus four newsletters. Of course, large and small donations are welcome at all times. Coryell Museum of-

fers area schools and tour groups a delightful, guided tour through the museum with docents at many exhibits. Call the museum at 254-865-5007 to plan a visit.



a special stop at the Sports Complex to attend Christmas at the Ballpark.





Manville, 18, said his feelings about the season so far are somewhat mixed.



Nyah Buntun — 5-4, point guard, Stockton, California, Saint Mary's High School. Buntun will be the first Tarleton State Women's Basketball player from California in the Brock Era. The Stockton, California, native was ranked as the No. 2 point guard in California and ranked No. 6 overall in the state by Prep Girls Hoops.

Serving as a captain for Saint Mary's High School girls' basketball team, Buntun led her squad to a 26-6 last season. Earning Marin Catholic All-Tournament Team honors in 2023, Buntun was instrumental in the Rams' postseason run. Buntun helped Saint Mary's High School to four victories in the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Playoffs last season, with the Rams knocking off the No. 1 seed Folsom High School in the championship to clinch the section title.

NIH Grant awarded to Tarleton State for research on pain processing

STEPHENVILLE — Dr. Amber Harris Bozer, head of the department of neuroscience at Tarleton State University, has been awarded a \$408,000 grant from the National Institutes of Health to study how the nervous system processes pain.

"Millions of Americans

concern," said Bozer. "This study contributes to the body of literature that advances our understanding of how the nervous system works for pain."

The study will focus on the sensory and emotional components of pain present in individuals with chronic knee osteoarthritis to gain a better understanding of how this pain is processed. groups."

The grant will fund five graduate students who will learn how to use the complex machinery required for this research, gather data through testing, analyze the results and present the findings at various conferences.

"Research is what transformed my life and gave me a career path. For five students, their careers will be transformed and they will be even more competitive as they look for PhD programs in their field," said Bozer. Bozer has submitted work for NIH grant consideration for the last five years and is excited to have finally accomplished her goal with a study that she is passionate about and believes will make a difference in students' lives, as well as those struggling with chronic pain. She explained that this victory was a team effort and that she would not have been able to attain this grant without the support of her colleagues and the university, including NIH grant writing training from Dr. Diane Stearns, Tarleton State provost and executive vice president for academic affairs. She hopes to encourage others who are discouraged or



suffer from chronic pain, making it a prolific health

"What we are doing is profiling the brain activity during the different dimensions of pain, specifically what's going on in your brain when you're processing the sensory component of pain versus the emotional component of pain," explained Bozer. "We have this 256 electrode cap that we're going to put on people's heads to record brain activity from individuals who don't have chronic pain and compare these two

feel like they cannot achieve this goal to keep trying.

"Science is all about rejection. Grants get rejected, you get rejected from fellowships or jobs and you have a choice about how you face that rejection. You can give up, or you can take the feedback, learn from your rejection and do better."

RELLIS Rovers Engineering Team scores at NASA-TSGC Design Challenge

STEPHENVILLE — Senior engineering students from Tarleton State University's RELLIS campus won awards in four categories at the recent NASA-Texas Space Grant Consortium Design Challenge in League City.

The capstone project team of Akash Musale, Easton Duplichan, Silas Hill and Swaid Alrashed scored in Top Design (third place), Best Poster and Model (fourth place), Best Oral Presentation (fourth place) and Top Peer Review (fourth place), competing against 19 other teams from various universities.

Nicknamed the RELLIS Rovers, the team is led by faculty advisor Dr. Nourouddin Sharifi, assistant professor in the department of engineering technology. Their goal was to design an innovative, user-friendly personal electric vehicle for lunar exploration, addressing challenges like rugged terrain, abrasive lunar dust, and size, weight and power constraints.

"I'm proud to support students in meaningful academic experiences that drive their achievement and professional development," Sharifi said. "I always remind them, "Work hard, and awards will follow."

The NASA-TSGC Design Challenge tasks undergraduate students with proposing, designing and fabricating innovative solutions aligned with NASA's research objectives. Sponsored by NASA and administered by TSGC, the challenge provides a platform for academic and professional growth.

Each participating team collaborates with a NASA mentor and submits five deliverables to TSGC per semester. The two-day NASA showcase provides an opportunity to present research through posters and oral presentations. Scholarship awards are given to the winners, with each RELLIS Rover team member eligible for a \$600 scholarship.

The Texas Space Grant Consortium unites 65 universities, industrial organizations, nonprofits and government agencies, ensuring that the benefits of space research and technology reach Texans statewide.

Rayshon Smith and the offensive line honored in Student Spotlight

Staff Reports

At Monday night's Gatesville ISD School Board meeting, Rayshon Smith and the Gatesville Hornets football offensive line were honored during the student spotlight. Superintendent Dr. Barrett Pollard had the following to say:

Rayshon Smith went into his senior year with 2,795 yards, which already placed him as the 4th leading rusher in Gatesville history. He quickly moved into 3rd place and racked up an impressive 2,172 yards and 29 touchdowns this year. During most of the season, Rayshon was the leading rusher in all Central Texas, averaging 164.5 yards per game. In summary, Rayshon was the 3rd person in school history to rush for 1,000 yards for three seasons in a row; the 3rd all-time career rusher with 4,967 yards; the 3rd all-time leader in career rushing touchdowns with 57; and the 3rd all-time leader in career scoring with 366 points.

One other side note: in the last game of the regular season against Connally, Rayshon carried the ball a whopping 46 times. If you watch the sidelines during a game, you will notice Rayshon frequently giving a high-five to his linemen and getting water bottles for the defense.

A big part of these rushing accomplishments go to the offensive linemen. The

Hornets faced many talented defenses but were still able to put up impressive rushing numbers thanks to these big men. Offensive linemen typically do not receive a lot of notoriety, so we wanted to honor them for their huge contributions to the football team. Our offensive line did a fantastic job creating holes for the running back, attracting very few penalties, and demonstrating good sportsmanship. All these young men put in countless grueling hours during summer workouts, two-a-days, 6 a.m. morning workouts, after-school practice, and Saturday film.
