Tolar eyes \$50 million plant

Local elected officials say that Vista Sand plans to open a \$50 million plant in the Tolar area that may create as many as 80 jobs and increase tax revenues for the county and school district.

Vista Sand specializes in industrial silica sand for oil and gas fracturing. The plant will be on 500 acres off Electric Road about one mile east of Tolar, according to Tolar Mayor Terry Johnson and Precinct 1 Commissioner James Deaver.

Both officials view the plant positively and believe it will be a boon to economic development.

However, they said that some Tolar residents – particularly those who live

closest to the site – are not in favor of the plant.

A Town Hall meeting is planned to discuss citizens' concerns and to provide answers to their questions.

The meeting will be held at 6 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 17, at the Tolar Community Center, located at 120 Tolar Cemetery Road.

In a written statement emailed to the Hood County News, Joe Drew, director of Technical Services for Vista Sand, said the company is "investigating" the potential of the land.

"This investigation includes due diligence on utilities, rail service, logistics, product viability, etc. to better understand if a future sand operation is feasible," he wrote.

Johnson, however, said that the com-

pany has purchased the land and has drilled wells.

"Yeah, it's coming," he said of the plant.

Said Deaver: "They're going to start putting equipment in in mid-January."

Drew stated that the company anticipates "an increase in activity in the first quarter of 2017."

"This activity will include surveys, foundation studies, site logistics, and general foot traffic of individuals that

are helping us determine potential of the project," he wrote.

"These studies will need to be completed before Vista will make any decisions on moving forward."

Johnson and Deaver noted that the plant will be located by railroad tracks and that most of the sand will be transported by rail.

"There won't be a lot of truck traffic," Johnson said.

Deaver said that there will be a day shift and a night shift at the plant – and maybe even three shifts.

Deaver said he believes that there are many local residents who have the skills needed to work at the plant, so hopefully Vista Sand will not have to

hire people from outside the county.

He said that the plant will create 65 to 80 jobs.

Johnson said that he intends to talk to neighbors who live near the Vista Sand plant near Cresson in order to be better prepared for the Town Hall meeting.

"With everything, there's good and bad," he said.

He views it as mostly good, though, stating that the plant might result in more restaurants opening in Tolar and maybe even jobs that will keep Tolar High School graduates from leaving town to look for work.

"I've been told that the company takes very good care of their employ-

City to test turns on square today

Crockett-Bridge intersection blocked

Weather permitting, part of the square will be blocked off today.

The city will be conducting tests at the Crockett and Bridge intersection to ensure that large vehicles will be able to navigate turns once the streets have been narrowed due to wider sidewalks.

That intersection is on the northeast side of the square, opposite Pearl Street.

The widening of sidewalks is part of the Downtown Streetscape and Pedestrian Improvement Project, which will get underway this month.

The Public Works Department will be working with emergency services crews to conduct the testing.

Several dozen traffic cones will be used to create a mock-up of the proposed design.

Practice turns will be performed by drivers in a fire department ladder truck, a dump truck and other city vehicles.

The intersection will be blocked off this morning, and testing will be done in the afternoon, according to city officials.

Aerial photos and video will be taken of the testing by Sight Glass Flights, LLC. Various offi-

cialists will also be on site.

The City Council approved the testing after merchants and others expressed concerns and requested that such tests be conducted.

Engineers who have been working with the city on the project say that emergency vehicles, delivery trucks and other large vehicles should be able to navigate the turns.

They said they were able to test turning radiuses through the use of special software.

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has also been involved in the design of the project.

TxDOT's Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) is providing grant funds that will cover 80 percent of the costs. The city will pay the rest, plus engineering fees.

The scope of the project involves sidewalks, lighting, streets and landscaping.

A few weeks ago, the City Council awarded the bid to the Fain Group out of Fort Worth.

The bid was for about \$2.6 million.

Men hurt at bull-riding event

Thornberry was not the only man who encountered the ornery bull that night.

Stock producer Jimmy Council, stepping into the arena to help Thornberry, broke his ankle by landing on it wrong, Clark said.

The bull, seeing Council on his hands and knees, ran over him, breaking a few ribs, according to Clark. Council was taken to the hospital by an ambulance.

"We're dealing with live farm animals that don't want to cooperate," Clark said. "That's part of the sport."

Car crash claims life of Granbury woman, 22

A one-car accident claimed the life of a Granbury woman on New Year's Eve. Margarita Katheryn Dorothy Ochoa, 22,

Ochoa was transported to John Peter

Smith Hospital in Fort Worth where she later died. The crash occurred near Loop 567. Police are investigating the cause of the crash. Ochoa was a clerk at Conoco and a former server at Cotton Patch Cafe, according to her Facebook page.

Thacker sent to prison for 2 years

Azaria Thacker, a Granbury mother sentenced earlier this year to four years' probation and no jail time in connection with the drowning death of her young son who died while in the care of a babysitter, will spend the next two years in prison.

Judge Ralph H. Walton Jr. made the decision at a probation hearing Friday after listening to testimony in the 355th Judicial District Court in Granbury.

A motion to revoke Thacker's probation was filed Dec. 1 by Hood County District Attorney Rob Christian after Thacker was charged with mis-

demeanor assault in an alcohol-related domestic dispute with her boyfriend on Nov. 29. Alcohol use is prohibited under the terms of Thacker's probation.

Thacker, jailed since Dec. 1, appeared in court Friday wearing shackles and Somervell County Jail clothes.

At the hearing, Thacker's boyfriend said part of his face went "numb" after Thacker hit him in the left eye with a wooden post during the physical confrontation between the two last months. The boyfriend's 14-year old daughter called 911 after witnessing the fight.

Thacker, who tested positive for alcohol use after being arrested Nov. 29, admitted to using alcohol on the night of the domestic dispute.

In court Friday, Thacker's probation officer recommended continued community supervision, 120 days in jail and placement in a substance abuse facility program for Thacker.

Disagreeing with the recommendation of the probation department, Christian asked for the maximum of 24 months in the state jail for Thacker.

"They did an evaluation of this defendant just six months ago and determined that she didn't have a substance abuse problem," said Christian, in closing. "I believe her problem is not an addiction but just a cavalier attitude about the crime she's committed, the probation and the grace this jury gave her and the orders of this court."

In June, Thacker was found guilty of criminal negligence and endangerment to a child in the death of Aaryn Thacker, 3.

On the day of the incident, Thacker went to work and left her children in the custody of drug-using babysitter Briana Lee Delbridge. Later that day, Thacker's young daughter was found unattended in the streets outside her home.

Aaryn Thacker was found unresponsive in the water near the Sandy Beach boat dock.

Delbridge, 19, was sentenced to 15 years in prison in August after pleading guilty to reckless injury to a child.

ees," he said. "I'm hearing good things."

Johnson also stated that there has been talk of putting in houses or "ranchettes" after Vista Sand has finished mining at the site, which would create jobs for framers, carpenters and others.

"This could turn into a lot of tax dollars for us," he said.

Drew said that the numbers cited by the elected officials are "fluid."

He added that Vista Sand will be "transparent" as it moves forward, and that the community will be given an "update" on the company's activities and goals at the Jan. 17 meeting.

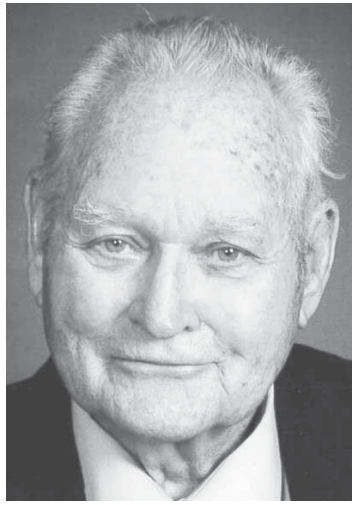

Born on Oct. 6, 1916, in Fort Worth, Eddie became fascinated with dancing as a teenager, but shyness kept him off the dance floor. Finally at age 21, he scraped together \$10 for 10 dance lessons and fell in love - not only with dancing but with his stunning instructor, Lavonia Bellah.

They married three months later, on New Year's Eve in 1938. Together, they opened the Lavonia Bellah Dance Studio and made a name for themselves teaching thousands in North Texas to ballroom dance. At their peak, they had four dance studios in Fort Worth and Dallas.

Along the way, they raised three children, their son, Eddie Deems Jr. and Lavonia's nieces, Lavonia Lou and Sharon Owens. In 1988, the couple retired and, four years later, Lavonia died of cancer.

Devastated by the loss of his wife of 54 years, Eddie eventually started to dance again as a way of coping with his grief.

"When Bellah died, I almost didn't make it," Eddie told the Star-Telegram in 2001. "Dancing kept me going. It gave me something to look forward to."

Louise Ratliff was one of his first students. They formed a friendship that eventually led them to the alter on Dec. 27, 1997.

For the next 20 years, Lou-



ise and Eddie built a wonderful, joyous life together that revolved around dancing. For years they taught ballroom dance together at Fort Worth's posh Petroleum Club. By this time, Eddie was well into his 80s. Eddie also taught private lessons in Granbury where they lived, first at the Center for Health and Wellness and later at the YMCA.

At age 99, he was still wearing his "uniform" a dark suit, crisp white shirt and ascot and teaching students to cha-cha, rumba and swing. April 15, 2016, just six months shy of his 100th birthday, Eddie finally hung up his dancing shoes due to respiratory issues.

Still, he had dance in his heart and enjoyed reminiscing about the old days when he was Fort Worth's Fred Astaire of sorts. There's no doubt that this centenarian's longevity was due to dancing. He lived to dance and danced to live.

Lang requests that anyone planning to attend the ceremony and reception RSVP as quickly as possible by emailing Mike@LangCampaign.com or contacting his chief of staff, Zach Maxwell, at 254-488-4664.

"As a citizen legislator, I want to make sure that our office maintains an open door with the constituents I am honored to represent," Lang stated in his message.

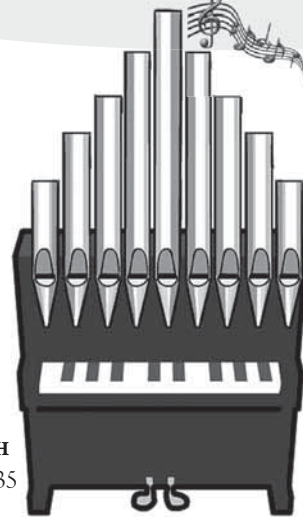

'I don't give up'

Thanks to determined chaplain, World War II veteran receives medals after 72-year wait

Peggy Lovinsky doesn't give up easily. Three years ago, the chaplain set out to help World War II veteran James O'Rear get the medals he earned through his service in the Navy.

O'Rear was a seaman, second class, in the U.S. Navy from 1944-46.

He provided naval gunfire support from the Battleship Texas off of Iwo Jima and Okinawa. "You got used to all those guns going off. You weren't scared," he said.

Lovinsky, a Granbury resident, had known O'Rear's family for years through Lake Granbury Christian Temple church.

Eventually, he began mentioning to Lovinsky the medals he never received for his time in the military.

"He kept saying, 'Through all the wars, all the recent wars like Iraq and Afghanistan, I never got my medals,'" she said. "As he became older, he became very adamant about that.

"It was on his heart."

Finally, Lovinsky set out to track down the medals.

She didn't know what a challenge it would be. She started by calling the service officer in O'Rear's hometown of Emory, Texas.

According to Lovinsky, the Emory service officer told her O'Rear should have already received the medals. He assured her it would be taken care of.

When the medals never arrived, she called him again six months later and was told the same thing. This went on until 2015, when she contacted the Navy Personnel Command.

The person she spoke to said they had no record of O'Rear.

Lovinsky said she was holding his discharge papers in her hand even as she spoke on the phone and was baffled that he wasn't in the system.

After faxing O'Rear's information to the Navy Personnel Command and requesting O'Rear's Entitlement to Awards document, she was a small step closer.

Eight months later, she received the document that listed his awards: the World War II Victory Medal, American Campaign Medal, Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal, Navy Occupation Service Medal, Philippine Liberation Medal and the Combat Action Ribbon.

She was told, however, that the Navy Personnel Command didn't disperse awards.

They gave her the number to the National Personnel Records Center.

When a representative there also told her they didn't handle the disbursement of awards, she didn't know where to turn.

"I didn't think it was going to happen," she said. "It was very discouraging."

Nevertheless, she didn't quit.

"I don't give up. I'm just not that kind of person," she said. "I promised him."

"The man deserves respect for what he did."

Finally, she contacted fellow VFW member Bill Pooler. He drove to the Fort Worth airbase and picked up the medals O'Rear had earned.

"This man waited 72 years to get his medals," Lovinsky said.

Last week, O'Rear was presented with his six medals at the Waterview retirement center where he lives.

Lovinsky had told him they wouldn't come for weeks, so he didn't know he would receive them that day.

"He was a little overwhelmed by all the people. I said 'James, you're getting your medals today,'" Lovinsky said. When he got back to his room, Lovinsky said, he wept.

"I didn't figure I'd ever get them... I really didn't expect anything like this," O'Rear said. "A long time ago, I said all I wanted was my medals... I wanted them for myself."

Julie Rhoden, the commander of the American Legion, Post 491 in Granbury, presented the awards to him.

"It was very beautiful to have another veteran present those to him," Lovinsky said.

After a 300-hour quest to bring O'Rear his medals, Lovinsky felt emotional. "It's emotional for me because of what I did," she said.

You Called Me One of Your Athletes!

Language matters. It really does. What we say and how we say it can be life changing. A female police officer confided in me that more than one citizen in the community she served asked if she could send for a "real police officer" to handle their concern. She took their comments in stride and proceeded to do her job, but such comments can't help but be hurtful.

At a wedding rehearsal several years ago, I was told by a member of the wedding party that "it didn't look like I was missing any meals." It was a not so subtle way to communicate that I had put on a few pounds. Such language does little to help people make better choices in their lives. I know that I was uninspired.

And I fully realize that in the name of "being honest" I have said some terribly hurtful things to others over the years. Being overly blunt and direct is not usually the best path to choose. Language matters.

Recently, I heard one of the best stories regarding language choice that I have ever heard. A friend and ministry colleague owned a gym in another life. It was a place to work out and get fit. I am quite sure she had quite an array of clients. No doubt there were men and women that could bench press their weight and then some! There were likely clients that were preparing to run marathons or triathlons. And then there were other

clients who were trying to make significant and needed lifestyle changes.

Heather was on the phone one day in her office at the gym when a client came in searching for a Band-Aid. This particular client in all likelihood had not been bench pressing her weight. And I don't think she had been preparing for a marathon either. This woman was about 75 pounds overweight. She was in the gym simply trying to shed the excess pounds that had accumulated. That is really not a great position to be in when you are surrounded by those who are in a serious athletic training mode. In fact, it takes a lot of courage.

When she saw her bleeding client, my friend said to the person on the other end of the phone conversation, "I have to go. One of my athletes needs a bandage." The lady seeking a bandage did not miss that comment. She heard it and her response was immediate. She said, "You called me one of your athletes." A simple gesture made a difference in her life. She was not the overweight lady over there in the corner lifting weights. She was not an embarrassment to the gym. She was one of Heather's athletes. The spontaneity of Heather's reference to her being "one of the athletes" no doubt added to the meaningfulness of the dialogue.

Watch what you say today. Someone needs a good word. A word of encouragement could make a difference. People often see themselves in the most negative way possible. Find an athlete to speak to today. Language matters.

Census count

Texas gains the most people

The U.S. Census Bureau puts Texas in the number one spot for the states with the largest numeric gain in population since the 2010 Census count. The Census Bureau released numbers this week for state-by-state comparisons. Later this year, the Census Bureau will release estimates of the 2016 population of counties, cities and towns, and metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas.

Texas had 25.1 million people in 2010. The Census Bureau is now listing the 2016 population at 27.8 million.

Utah's population crossed the 3 million mark as it became the nation's fastest-growing state over the last year. Its population increased two percent to 3.1 million from July 1, 2015, to July 1, 2016, according to U.S. Census Bureau national and state population estimates released this week.

MOST LIVE IN SOUTH OR WEST

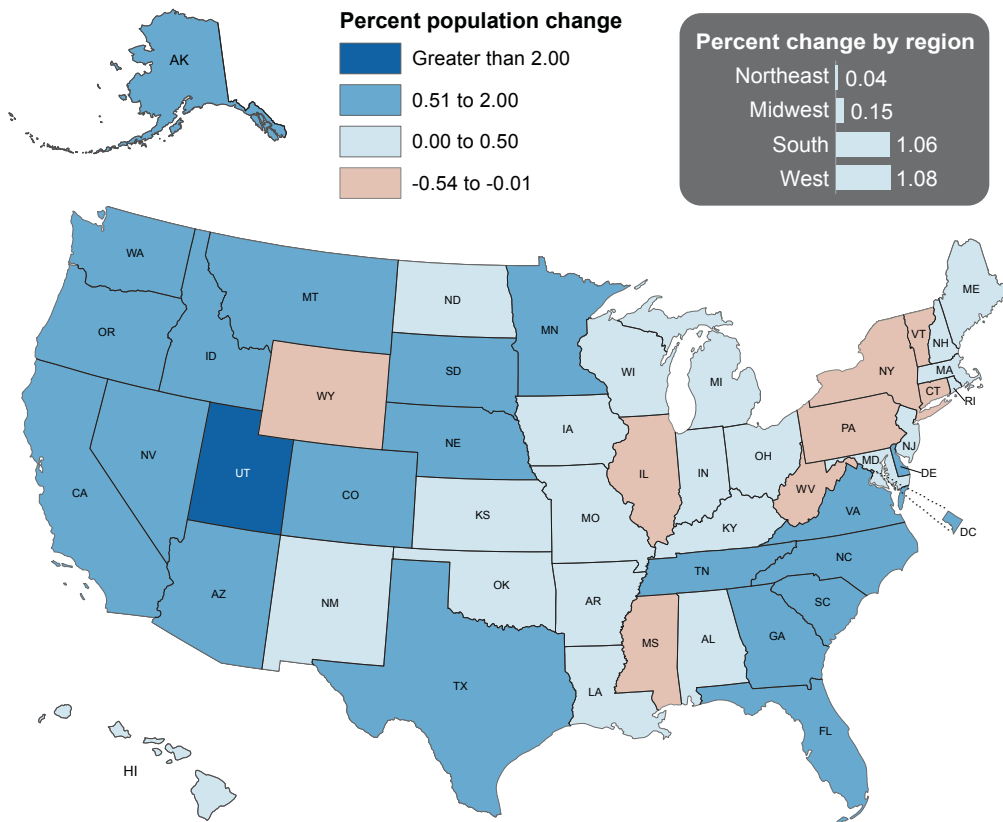
"States in the South and West continued to lead in population growth," said Ben Bolender, Chief of the Population Estimates Branch. "In 2016, 37.9 percent of the nation's population lived in the South and 23.7 percent lived in the West."

Following Utah, Nevada (2.0 percent), Idaho (1.8 percent), Florida (1.8 percent) and Washington (1.8 percent) saw the largest percentage increases in population.

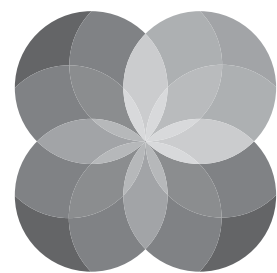
