Hood County government is probably going to change considerably over the next few years, and it may involve musical chairs among some current officeholders.

Behind-the-scenes groundwork is reportedly already taking place.

Affected seats will include district judge, possibly the county court-at-law judge, county judge, the Commissioners Court and maybe even three of the county's four constables.

The first domino will fall later this year, when the filing period opens for the spring 2018 primaries.

He has stated with certainty that he will not seek re-election to the precinct 4 seat that he was elected to three times.

"I do believe in term limits," he said. District Clerk Tonna Hitt said she is "thinking about" running

for the county judge post. Hitt was first elected district clerk in 1990 and took office in January 1991.

"I just started my 27th year," she said Monday.

Regarding serving as county judge, Hitt said: "I've been here long enough. I've put in my dues as district clerk. I know

how every office in the county runs."

Hitt noted that she has observed many Commissioners Court meetings over the years.

"There are a lot of areas where there could be improvements," she said of county government, adding that she feels she could put her knowledge to work to "try to change a few things."

Dallas attorney Ron Massingill, owner of the 'R ranch off Highway 4 and a member of the Hood County Sheriff's Posse, said he definitely intends to run for the office.

Plantation Inn to change ownership

After more than 23 years under the ownership of Dutch and Brenda Wilkerson, the Plantation Inn is changing hands.

Dutch Wilkerson said the deal is expected to become final at the end of the month.

The new owners. Wilkerson said, are J.C. and Sheba Stone who moved here with their two children, ages 10 and 6, several months ago.

Though retiring from the motel business, Wilkerson will still be in Granbury, and he'll still be in business.

He said he intends to build storage units on property he

Former Mayor David Southern said Wilkerson, who once served on the Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB), always took an interest in tourism and economic development.

"He has bent over backwards to try and support tourism and to be sure that that was part of our thinking at City Hall,' Southern said. "He's been a real asset.'

Southern noted that when the Chamber of Commerce has scheduled bus trips to Austin to visit the Legislature, the buses have left from the Plantation Inn - where the Wilkersons provided a free breakfast to those going on the road trip.

"He's a very friendly guy," Southern said of Wilkerson. "He

Taylor Branson's grand champion pig draws record \$18,000

Amber Branson was trying to hold back the tears. Tears of joy.

Daughter Taylor Branson's grand champion pig drew a staggering \$18,000 in Saturday's auction at the 62nd **Hood County Junior Livestock** Show.

The record bid shattered the previous high pig bid of \$15,000 four years ago.

Another record fell with \$7,000 for Tristan Hawkins' grand champion rabbit. The pervious high was \$5,000 five years ago.

The overall sale was down about \$9,000 from last year, but Hood County Livestock Raisers Association President Lonnie Johnson believes the final tally might be close to last year when all of the money starts to trickle in.

"All in all, I thought we had a quite decent show," Johnson

said. "I think we had a good, supportive crowd."

The auction drew \$333,550 for the Hood County 4-H and FFA exhibitors.

Last year's auction drew \$343,000.

Youngsters averaged \$1,610 per sale, down \$170 per sale from last year.

It was pointed out that many county shows draw only about \$500 per sale.



That's up 12 percent from last year's January payment.

These allocations are based on sales made in November by businesses that report taxes monthly.

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar said statewide sales tax allocations for January are up an average of 4.9 percent compared to last January.

"The cities of Dallas, Fort Worth, Austin and San Antonio continue to see significant increases in sales tax allocations," Hegar said. Houston, however, is down.

"Everything's on the table at this point in time," he said.

No elected officials can publicly state an intention to seek another office without having to resign. In order to keep their jobs, they have to wait until the filing period opens.

OTHER POSTS

Berry noted that three con-

stables will soon "age out" and be eligible for full retirement benefits from the county.

If they do retire, the door will be open for newcomers in county government.

Berry and Hitt said that District Judge Ralph Walton will be able to seek re-election for just

one more term before "aging out" of that elected position.

Low rain clouds make smoke almost invisible from residential fire

Light gray smoke billowed out of a residential structure fire Friday afternoon, rising to mingle almost indiscernible with the low-hanging rain clouds.

No one was injured in the fire off Paluxy Highway southwest of Granbury and south of Peak Road, said county fire marshal Ray Wilson.

At least three fire departments responded to an emergency call for a fully engulfed structure fire.

No one appeared to be home when the fire started, Wilson said, but one person was living in the house.

The fire was called in by drivers passing the residence, according to dispatchers.

Arriving on scene, fire crews found a grill-style propane tank near the house, but were able to move the tank away from the house, Wilson said.

The fire was reported under control by 1:50 p.m.



ago when she had the grand champion steer in San Antonio, and two years ago she had the reserve grand champion steer in Houston.




Two titles in one
