'Horrific' crash kills 2 drivers

Two drivers died in a "horrific" head-on crash late Monday afternoon on Highway 377 in western Hood County, according to the Texas Highway Patrol.

Carylane B. Bogan, 59, of DeCordova, and Robert Earl Buttrey Jr., 36, of Stephenville, were pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace Danny Tuggle.

There were no other passengers in the collision west of Tolar near Campbell Road.

Bogan was driving a Toyota crossover SUV eastbound and "for an unknown reason cut across into the westbound lane" and hit Buttrey's Ford passenger car head-on, according to Highway Patrol Staff Sgt. Dub Gillum.

Gillum said troopers were investigating the cause of the "horrific" crash. A third vehicle may have been involved, Gillum said.

"A third vehicle was struck by debris and left the scene,"

Gillum said.

The crash occurred about 5:50 p.m. Bogan apparently was returning home from a relatively new job in Brownwood.

Highway 377 traffic was closed over four hours with traffic rerouted to Campbell Road.

Postings on social media after the accident claimed that Buttrey was the same Robert Earl Buttrey who in July 2009 pleaded guilty to murdering Granbury teenagers Thomas Steele, 19, and Casey Tiner, 16, with a samurai sword in August of 2000. The teens bodies were discovered in a field in Somervell County in December 2005.

Social media postings said that the name and birthdate of the man killed in the crash is identical to the man who was sentenced to two concurrent five-year prison sentences for the murders of Steele and Tiner. Gillum, however, said he was unable to confirm whether the two men were one and the same.

Man found dead in lake

Authorities are investigating the death of a Granbury man whose body was found in Lake Granbury Saturday morning.

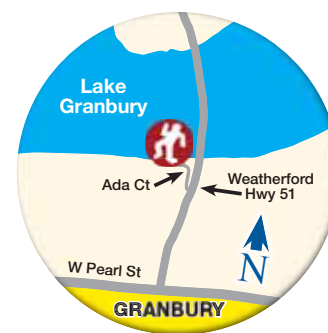
Brazos River Authority rangers and Granbury police retrieved the body of John Kenneth Woolsey, 41, after it was spotted by a resident, according to a press release from the city of Granbury.

"There is no apparent evidence of foul play," stated the press release.

Ranger Randy Johnston was sent out to investigate a call that came in at 8:12 a.m. Saturday three docks west from the Highway 51 bridge at Ada Court, according to the release.

"A minor at the residence had spotted what was thought to be a body in the water near the dock," the release stated.

The body was retrieved from Lake Granbury at 9:46 a.m., according to the release. Justice

of the Peace Danny Tuggle pronounced the man dead at the scene.

The cause of Woolsey's death will be determined by the Tarrant County medical examiner, the release stated. Meanwhile, Granbury police continue to investigate, assisted by the Brazos River Authority.

Back to school

Harris a class act as GISD truancy officer

Deputy Constable Monica Harris thinks that truancy problems can be solved before they ever start.

That's why she makes it a point to be seen by students at events and in contexts that have nothing to do with being in trouble.

One such event was Saturday's Splash Day at the public swimming pool in Oak Trail Shores - a last hurrah for kids who are starting a new school year today.

The deputy chatted with kids and their parents and laughingly posed for photos at a makeshift "jail." She carries that same law-enforcement-is-your-friend attitude to the 12 GISD campuses she visits throughout the school year.

"Sometimes I like to just walk down the hall and give them a high five," Harris said of students.

This will be her third school

CASA founder: Hood County among first to privatize foster care

The region that includes Hood County will be the first to eliminate Texas Child Protective Services (CPS) and privatize the entire foster care system, according to Jerry Prather, founder of Hood County CASA.

CASA stands for Court Appointed Special Advocates. CASA volunteers serve as a voice for children in the court system, helping to ensure that their needs are served.

Prather spoke about the Legislature's changes to the foster care system at Monday's monthly meeting of the Texas Democratic Women of Hood County.

Prather, a retired American Airlines pilot who spent time in Austin during the legislative session, said that "Region 3" - which includes Hood County as well as Tarrant, Parker, Erath, Johnson and Somervell

counties - will be the first to go under a "single-source contractor" in the revamping of the foster care system.

"It's a bucket of worms right now," Prather said. "The system is broken. It's just a bureaucratic mess."

Prather stated: "The jury's still out on how it's going to go and how it's going to work, but in my opinion, it's the way to go."

He said that state legislators decided to emulate Florida's "community-based foster care" system.

"It's not going to happen overnight," he said, but added that the groundwork for Region 3 is already underway.

Prather told the group of about 45 who had gathered in the meeting room at Spring Creek Barbeque that the single-source contractor will be a 501(c) nonprofit and will have sub-contractors.

Miniature cane sparks debate

A Hood County man's mystery object sparked some interesting conversation but no sure answers.

Dan Floyd bought an item that looks like a miniature walking cane from an estate sale years ago, but despite all his research in antiques, he wasn't able to determine exactly what it was.

The item is only about a foot tall. The shaft narrows to a point covered by a metal cap while the curved end is wider, with the letters "GT" scratched into it.

The item is made of a steel or brass rod tightly wrapped in leather with metal rings that have corroded to a green color on the shaft.

Hood County readers suggested several options.

"I determined that the handle is a doll's umbrella minus the fabric and ribs," said Kenneth Dees.

He found an image of an umbrella with similar markings and shape to Floyd's object.

Mary Lou Jones thought the stick might have been for instructional purposes.

"I believe this is an antique pointing stick, used by teachers or professors to point to items on a black board. Some can be very ornate and made of various materials. This one looks more utilitarian but still a great find," she said.

A popular guess was a prod for showing livestock, especially pigs.

"May be a cane used to show hogs at a fair or stock show. My husband is a cowboy, and that's his guess," wrote Facebook profile user Debbie Henson.

"I've always called it a pig's stick to use when you're showing livestock," wrote Facebook profile user Chad Oakley.

Another caller from Hood County suggested the item may be a bull penis cane. Ranchers or other western figures would have a cane made from the tanned skin from a bull or buffalo's genitalia wrapped around a steel rod, the caller said.

He had seen one or two when he was a child, the caller said.

"This is one is smaller so it may have been made for a child, a rancher's son or grandson," he said.

"CPS will actually go away," he said. "Those jobs will all be privatized."

Following his presentation, Prather answered several questions from the audience.

A couple of people, including a former foster parent who said she is gay, expressed concerns about whether LGBTQ

foster parents may be discriminated against.

One woman voiced unease about the Legislature's "Religious Freedom Law."

"Doesn't it bother you that the door is open to discrimination?" she asked.

Prather said the county currently has two gay foster par-

ents and that, while churches may not be vocal in their support of gay rights where foster parenting and adoption are concerned, "you would be amazed at how many churches are okay with it."

Prather's presentation followed a brief speech by retiring CASA Director Jean Cate, who

led the program at Mission Granbury for 14 years.

Cate will still help with outreach and recruiting.

It was noted during the meeting that Hood County needs additional CASA volunteers as well as more foster parents.

year as a truancy officer.

Harris started out as a Granbury police officer. She had been on the job just a few months when a sheriff's deputy noticed her outgoing, kid-friendly personality and suggested she apply for the truancy gig.

She was interviewed by representatives of the Granbury school district, as well as Precinct 4 Constable Chad Jordan and Precinct 4 Justice of the Peace Danny Tuggle. All were in agreement that she was the one.

"We all saw that she was the right person," said Jordan, whose office has always handled truancy cases.

So what does it take to be a truancy officer? In Harris' view, it takes someone who is friendly and compassionate, but who

can also lay down the law.

"I believe that a (truancy) officer needs to be assertive and outgoing, and I believe I am both," she said.

Though she visits with students at all campuses and even has lunch with them sometimes, Harris also makes home visits to warn parents and kids that unexcused school absences are about to land them in a courtroom.

She has even caught kids red-handed and hauled them, not to the pokey, but to campus.

"I bring them back to school if I find them skateboarding down the street," she said.

Not every kid with a truancy problem has an attitude problem. Sometimes, Harris said, they are dealing with tough issues that they cannot con-

trol, such as abuse, neglect and poverty.

"I call CPS a lot," Harris said. "I've had to have kids removed from homes. They've gone into foster care, and I never saw them again."

TRUANCY LAWS

Last year, unexcused school absences resulted in 128 court cases. Fifty involved students at Granbury High School, 54 from the Behavior Transition Center, 14 involved Granbury Middle School and 10 were centered around students at Acton Middle School.

It's difficult to compare Harris' success at curbing truancies to that of the truancy officer before her because she said the law changed just as she was coming aboard.

Under the current law, 10 unexcused absences mean an appearance before a judge.

Schools are mandated to mail warning letters to parents after a child's third unexcused absence, Harris said.

If a student is 12 or younger, a parent must accompany them to court, the deputy stated.

If the student is older than 12, it is possible that they, but not a parent, will receive a court summons. It depends, Harris said, on whether the parent is believed to be responsible for the student's absences.

For parents, truancy is a criminal matter, but for students, it is a civil case, Harris said.

Parents face Class C criminal charges, with the judge determining punishment.

According to Harris, the pun-

ishment for parents may be deferred, with the charge being dismissed if there are no more unexcused absences. However, there can also be a fine, community service and/or driver's license suspension.

Students can also have their driver's license suspended, even if they are not yet old enough to drive, Harris said. The suspension kicks in once they apply for a driver's license.

Parents are supposed to contact the school if their child is going to be absent, but that is not the only thing they are required to do.

Those phone calls must be followed up by a note from the parent or a doctor once the student returns to class.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

In addition to her work with students, Harris has been tapped to assist Trooper Dub Gillum in the child safety seat program. The program, which requires instructors to be certified, educates parents on the proper way to install children's car seats.

Harris said that a child safety seat event is scheduled for 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 23, on the Walmart parking lot.

Jordan said that Harris has been a plus not only as a truancy officer but in community outreach programs such as the child safety seat initiative.

"We get lots of feedback from parents and kids," he said of the deputy. "Parents say they really appreciate her."

Multiple-car accident creates traffic nightmare

An accident involving at least four vehicles including a cement truck shut down Highway 377 at Old Acton Highway on Monday afternoon. The accident was reported at about 12:30 p.m., according to emergency scanner communications. No injuries were reported. East and west-bound traffic on 377 were diverted for almost two hours until wreckers moved the vehicles off the road. The road was reopened around 2:15 p.m.

Hood County man indicted for sexual abuse of a child

A Hood County man has been indicted on seven sexual abuse of a child charges spanning more than 30 days.

David Marin Tijerina, 29, of Indian Harbor, was indicted for continuous sexual abuse of a child, four counts of aggravated sexual assault of a child and two counts of indecency with a child.

Indictments are formal charges.

If he is convicted of the most serious charge, continuous sexual abuse of a child, Tijerina would receive a sentence of between 25 and 99 years in prison, said District Attorney Rob Christian.

According to the indictment, Tijerina is accused of committing all of the offenses against the same child over a period of at least 30 days.

The child first spoke up about the abuse while at a Granbury elementary school, Christian said. While talking with a Paluxy River Children's Advocacy Center interviewer, the child gave a detailed account of multiple acts of sexual abuse committed by Tijerina, Christian said.

Hood County District Attorney's Office investigators interviewed and arrested Tijerina the same day, he said.

Tijerina remains in the Hood County Jail on a \$100,000 bond.

Traffic stop leads to methamphetamine arrest

Sheriff's deputies arrested a man caught with methamphetamine on Friday, said Public Information Officer Lt. Johnny Rose.

Around 9 p.m., deputies conducted a traffic stop at California Court and West Virginia Trail in Lake Granbury Harbor, Rose said.

found Kyle Jameson Hand, 34, of Walnut Springs in possession of just under 4 grams of methamphetamine, he said.

Fraud callers mimic city utilities

Granbury city officials are warning residents not to fall for scam calls claiming to be from the city utility department.

Businesses and residents should be wary of all unexpected calls about city utility accounts, according to a press release from the city.

"In this operation, scammers call businesses and residents and falsely claim to represent the utility department of the City of Granbury," the releases

stated. "They threaten account holders with a cancellation of services if an immediate payment is not made. If you receive a similar call, hang up and contact City of Granbury at 817-573-1114. After hours you may contact us at 817-588-0488."

Residents who have filed reports about fraudulent calls have not reported how scammers wanted the payments delivered, said city public information officer Bethany Kyle.

CONFUSED STORY LEADS TO STABBING INVESTIGATION

At approximately 12:13 a.m. on Thursday, Granbury Police were dispatched to Lake Granbury Medical Center for a possible stabbing, said Granbury Police Department Sgt. Cris Brichetto.

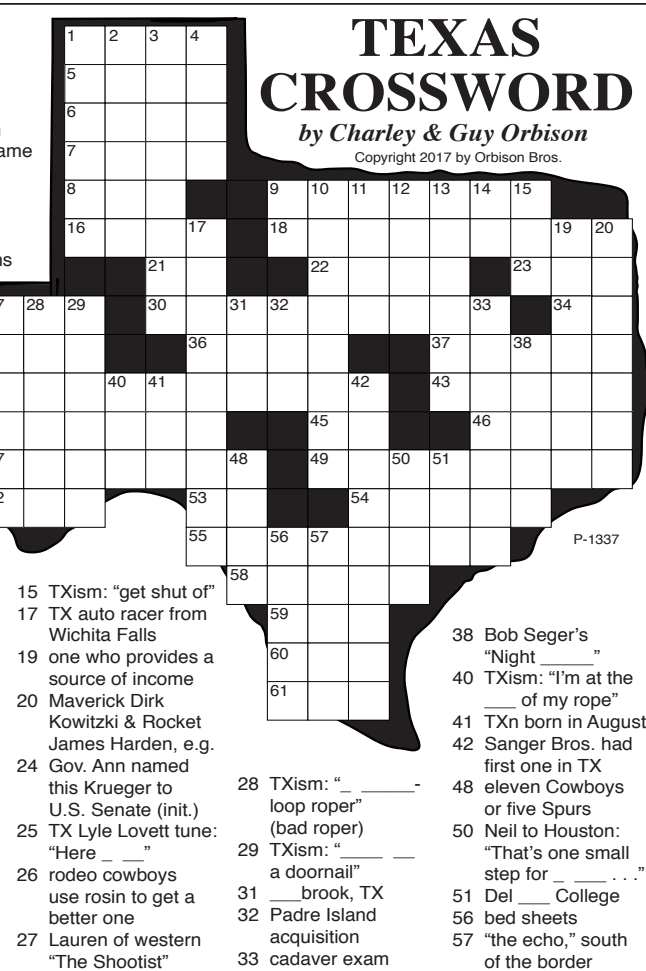

Great expectations

Pirates filled with enthusiasm for new season

This Monday was the first day of football practice for the Granbury Pirates, which for any high school football team is normally a day filled with a level of excitement and anticipation that is much higher than normal.

That wasn't the case on Monday morning when the Pirates began their official practice schedule.

No, it's not because there wasn't any excitement or anticipation - there was plenty of that in the air.

It's just that the Pirates have felt that way the entire summer.

Coming off a 2-8 season, Granbury is fired up and ready to improve in head coach Chad Zschiesche's second year. And that enthusiasm spreads all the way from the coaching staff to the players.

"We had a really good offseason, from December to the end of school, and then this summer," Zschiesche said. "Our numbers were way up, and the culture certainly has changed."

"The expectation is to be here in the summer. We averaged about 75 kids a day, and that's just sophomores through seniors."

While the players were grinding in the weight room, the coaches were working just as hard.

"The kids have put in a lot of work, and the coaches have put in a lot of work," Zschiesche said. "We demanded a bunch out of the coaches and the kids."

That work comes in many forms. "Well, we're prepping for the opponents, because it's the same opponents as last year," Zschiesche said. "We're holding our kids accountable, and we're making any changes to our schemes that we see fit."

INVESTING AND EXPECTING

Asked to name any players he was

specifically excited about, Zschiesche gave a bit of a grin.

"All of them," he said, and he didn't mean it as a form of coachspeak. "I say that not to be funny, but we're expecting big things from a lot of them, and that's just where we're at."

"Here's my deal, they put in a lot of work," he said. "It's our philosophy that the more you invest, the more you expect."

"And so the majority of them are expecting great things because they put in a great amount of work. There are some that didn't put in as much work, and so they're probably not going to

expect as much, because you can't lie to yourself."

The Pirates return several players who received accolades last year.

Senior offensive lineman Raul Sandoval was an all-district second team selection last season. Kevin Moore earned a second team selection as a junior wide receiver last year but played as a quarterback in the spring game.

Linebacker Braden Derouen, a senior whom Zschiesche mentioned in the spring as a player who was having a stellar offseason, also returns from a second team selection.

Junior defensive end Kody Krause

had a fumble recovery for a touchdown in the Pirates' spring game and figures to be a major part of the Granbury defense in 2017.

HOW THEY'LL WIN GAMES

Still, expecting greatness from everyone doesn't mean Zschiesche hasn't seen areas that excite him perhaps just a tiny bit more than the rest of his team.

"We've got some skill kids, but I think the strength of our team this year actually is going to be our offensive and defensive line," he said. "We're going to be a lot better up front, and

any time you're better up front, you've got a chance to be better all the way around."

Granbury will line up in a base 4-3 defense, using a cover-2 or cover-4 scheme. Essentially, this means that four linemen and three linebackers will take the field on nearly every down, and at least two defensive backs, normally the safeties, will be in zone coverage.

On offense, the Pirates will be in a one-back spread offensive scheme, with a quarterback and running back in the shotgun on nearly every play.

Granbury kicks off their season against Fort Worth Western Hills in a Thursday game at 7:30 p.m. on Aug. 31.

New management, same dedication: Under new head coach Mullins, Rattlers still focused on playoff run

New Tolar head football coach Jeremy Mullins has quite a bit on his plate heading into this season.

He just moved to Hood County this summer, for example, so he and his family are settling down. He's preparing for his first season as a head coach, which is a big step in a young coaching career.

So how's he getting started in Tolar?

By learning everyone's names. "One of the biggest things we did as a staff was try to meet and get to know these guys," Mullins said. "We've been fortunate enough that a bunch of those guys were here in this last month and the summer for workouts, and so we've gotten to know them through that."

Those summer workouts were doubly important for Mullins and his Rattler players and coaches. Not only could the players get stronger and faster, but the coaches could get their first glance at what they were working with.

They liked what they saw. "Every kid that shows up here shows up ready to work," Mullins said. "There's a work ethic that's been instilled in these guys already, and they're not scared to get after it."

PUTTING IT ALL TOGETHER

Now that Mullins and his staff know their players - or at least, know more names than they did coming in - they've started to piece together a roster.

"We're in the process of forming a roster," Mullins said. "We started off with very few in that varsity locker room."

"We're going to get an idea of who we have and what roles they're going to play."

The biggest factors determining who makes the varsity ros-

ter are position and knowledge of schemes.

"A lot of it has to do with the position, and who we have where," Mullins said. "The biggest thing for these guys is that they're learning a whole new offense, a whole new defense and a whole new special teams, and so a guy that knows what he's doing is helping himself out."

Those new offensive and defensive philosophies include a no-huddle offense and a 3-4 defense.

Although the offense will be a no-huddle spread system, it won't necessarily be the quick-snap offense popularized by teams like the Oregon Ducks. Mullins said the Rattlers "have the ability to go pretty fast," but that quick snaps "won't be our bread and butter."

Tolar's offensive strength lies in their run game, Mullins said, which features "a couple of guys" that have the ability to make plays out of the backfield. The Rattlers won't seek to be run-heavy or pass-heavy, how-

ever.

"We're going to do our best to take advantage of what the defense presents," Mullins said. "We've got a couple of skill kids that we need to find ways to get them the ball in open space."

For now, outside of all the work teaching the new schemes, the coaching staff has focused on maintaining a commitment level from the players.

"Our motto right now is 'all-in,'" Mullins said. "This is all new stuff, but you're only going to help yourself if you buy in."

"And they have. That's what excites me the most about this year, is the kind of kids we have in Tolar, and the community and administration support is great."

PLAYERS TO KNOW

The Rattlers' depth chart is still a long way away from being finalized. The first full-pads practice took place last Friday, and there's still two scrimmages left before the opener against Crawford.

However, some players have begun to separate themselves from the pack.

Jacob Sparks, a senior running back and linebacker, was the first name Mullins said when naming standouts.

"I'm looking forward to seeing what he does with pads on," Mullins said. "I've seen him on film from last year, and it's good to have him back."

Another senior, wide receiver and safety Clayton Deaver, figures to be a weapon for Tolar this season.

Junior Mason King was on varsity last season, and though his primary role is as a big inside linebacker, "we'll find a role for him on offense," Mullins said.

James Henderson, a senior, earned the "athlete" designation from Mullins.

"He's one of those guys where we need to get him the ball in some space and let him do what he does with it," Mullins said.

Outside of the skill positions, junior Ethan Cooper figures to

be an anchor on both lines.

"He's had a great summer, I've seen him up here every day. I'm really excited to see what he can do for us offensively and especially on the defensive line," Mullins said.

Junior Jacob McNab started at center as a sophomore last year and didn't have a bad snap all season.

The battle for starting quarterback is wide open.

"We've got a few guys, a few candidates," Mullins said.

Brian Morgan played wideout last season but may convert to quarterback in his senior year.

"He's taken that role on and done some good things with it," Mullins said.

"There's a couple of other guys, (senior) Ty Taylor and (junior) Kannen Adams, who have also been doing some really good things."

Tolar is coming off of a 7-4 season and an appearance in the bi-district round of the 3A DII playoffs.

Hey, Mr. DJ

There are two things I'm good at in this world.

The first is playing Trivial Pursuit, which I would argue is indeed a sport but would take about 4,000 words to do so, so let's set that aside for now.

The second is picking what music to play in what situation for a large crowd. I commandeer the auxiliary cord for the speakers- or the AUX cord, for the younger crowd - at every available opportunity, be it a party, a sporting event, a car ride or what have you.

And because of this, I've come to appreciate good DJ-ing at different events, and also come to have a deep disdain for people that misuse AUX cord privileges. But, as with most everything in life, most events have a DJ that falls somewhere in the middle.

I take almost as many notes on the pregame playlists and timeout music of a game that I cover as I do the action itself. Most of my pregame routine is spent tweeting out peculiar song choices by the people controlling the tunes.

I used to be able to time my walk to TCU's Lupton Stadium in college for baseball games based on where they were in the pregame playlist, which never once changed. This spring, following Granbury, Tolar and Lipan basketball around, I experienced a massive variety in choices from neutral-site DJs.

I loved every minute of it. I urge you, the next time you're at any game, pay a bit more attention to the pregame and mid-timeout music selections from person holding the AUX cord.

It's the world's least important hobby, but it might be one of the most entertaining.

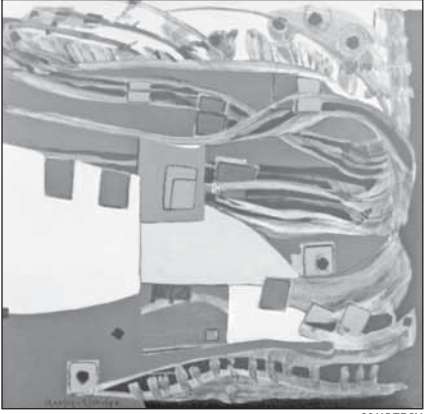

There can be as many layers as you want or need to do. It is only done when you say it's done.

The goal is to complete the work with transparency, opaqueness, bright and neutral colors, all working together with a limited palette. The end results are the surprise and the reward.

Judy Mason is from Abilene where, for her, exposure to the arts was minimal. She loved to draw and color but never thought about being an artist.

After marriage and children, she began painting in a very traditional manner. Mason thought she had to make the paintings look exactly like what she was seeing to be considered talented. She struggled with this for years.

In 1986, M. Douglas Walton from Louisiana went to Arlington to teach a two-week workshop. Mason was reluctant to give two weeks toward something that she felt would just perpetuate the struggle. She went, and it turned her world around.

She learned that she could be a creative artist who could have a great time drawing and painting as she saw things - different from the ordinary. Mason was hooked and took every class she could from Walton for the next 16 years. Since Mason has learned creative art in a very unique way, she now teaches using Walton's methods. She teaches the students to create using the “Elements of Design” as a platform. It is not about “what it is” but rather “how it is done.”

When the creative process is used, there are endless possibilities in producing a piece of artwork.

Cooking up career ideas

Local chef donates time to teach Foster's Home teens the ins and outs of restaurant culinary arts

With a bit of knife safety out of the way, the chef of DeCordova Bend Estates Country Club set out to give 10 young pupils a taste of culinary greatness.

Ten teens from the Sherwood & Myrtie Foster's Home for Children in Stephenville traveled to the country club Thursday to learn how to make salads, bake breads and pies, and add garnishes.

The life skills class was organized by the country club's executive chef, Ed Fenko.

The four kitchen staff members he had on hand were barely enough to keep up with the teens' curiosity, he said.

"There were a lot of questions," Fenko said. "There were only four of us so we were pretty tired afterward. But my staff is still talking about it. These kids are like sponges; they are so willing to learn anything."

The group's only male student was particularly interested in the session.

"He said he wants to do this for a career," Fenko said. "He said he didn't want a Christmas present. He just wants to come back and work for another day."

Spending time in an industry-standard kitchen with a professional chef is important for the teens at Foster's, said Glenn Newberry, president and CEO of the home.

The children, who live in residential groups with full-time caregivers, help with the daily food preparations but

have limited exposure to the business side of food preparation, he said.

Parents choose to place their child at Foster's as a safe place for them to heal and grow while tough family situations are resolved.

"Most of them, because of their backgrounds, have a very limited view of what is possible for careers to go into beyond childhood," Newberry said. "We like to give them real-life experiences and see what piques their interest."

Fenko and the staff at DeCordova

County Club went all-out to welcome the teens, said Tammy Asbill, development assistant for Foster's.

"As soon as they came into the kitchen they put monogrammed chef's coats on them so they felt official," Asbill said.

The teens worked on preparing creme brulee, apple pie, a Cobb salad and different herb garnishes, among other tasks, Fenko said.

The teens were "awesome" and "so polite" during their time in the kitchen, he added.

He first learned about Foster's through donations made by the restaurant. He regularly takes the extra food to the Granbury Church of Christ, he said. The church gives donated food to several organizations, including Foster's, Fenko said.

One day he met and spoke with the Foster's Home representative who had come to pick up food. She suggested some of the children might like to see the kitchen.

Local businesses donated the chef coats and spatulas for the children to take home with them.

After the class was over, the teens were treated to peaches and ice cream.

From Winter To Spring
