## Couch to pay back taxes Councilman says he was unaware of dual tax breaks

Granbury City Councilman Gary Couch will be back-assessed by the Dallas Central Appraisal District for years of having two homestead exemptions - one for a home in Addison, the other for a house in Granbury.

Couch said he was unaware that he was still receiving a

Claiming more than one homestead exemption is a Class A misdemeanor punishable by up to one year in jail and a fine of up to \$4,000.

homestead exemption on the house in Addison that he purchased in December 1997.

"That should have been changed," Couch said. "So, if there's an error in that, I'm sure the appraisal district in Dallas will take it off. I can't have two exemptions."

Hood County Appraisal District Chief Appraiser Greg Stewart

notified the Dallas County office after the Hood County News contacted him last week about the dual homestead exemptions.

The HCN has submitted an Open Records request to the Dallas appraisal district for any homestead applications signed by Couch since he took over the Addison property, but has not

yet received those documents.

On Monday, the HCN filed a separate Open Records request with that agency seeking documentation of the amount of taxes that Couch will be back-assessed.

Both Stewart and County Attorney Matt Mills said that cases of dual homestead exemptions are rarely prosecuted. Most of

the time, they said, an appraisal district simply bills the homeowner for back taxes on the home that is not their primary residence.

Records show that Couch began taking a homestead exemption on the Addison property in 1999.

## Man charged for threatening 'hit' on elected official

County officials had worried that having to pay two separate tax bills at two locations might anger people - and they were right.

A Lipan man is now facing the possibility of up to 10 years in prison and a fine of up to \$10,000 after failing to control his fury over that situation.

Late last week, Charles Holley Rowney, 64, was arrested for allegedly threatening employees at the Hood County Appraisal District and the Hood County Tax Assessor-Collector's office and for threatening a "hit" on an elected official.

Rowney reportedly was agitated over an agricultural exemption and having to pay taxes at two different locations.

Lt. Johnny Rose, public information officer for the sheriff's office, declined to confirm whether the threatened "hit"

was against Tax Assessor-Collector Teresa McCoy, stating that the case is under investigation.

However, Sheriff Roger Deeds said: "(McCoy) was

threatened, but an employee was the one that got threatened directly."

McCoy recently ended a decades-long arrangement with the Hood County Appraisal District (HCAD) and began collecting the county's portion of property taxes through her office.

City and school taxes are still being paid through the HCAD.

This means that property owners are receiving bills from both McCoy and the HCAD and are having to pay them separately.

According to Rose, Rowney

## Trial begins for cop who shot man

The trial of an Arizona police officer charged with murdering a Granbury man began this week.

Daniel Shaver was in Mesa

when he was shot and killed by former Officer Philip Brailsford who was responding to a report of someone pointing a rifle out a window at his hotel.

Shaver was 26 when he was killed on Jan. 18, 2016, and left behind two young children and his wife Laney Sweet.

Brailsford was later fired for violations of departmental policy and pleaded not guilty to the charge of murder in Shaver's death.

Police said Brailsford shot Shaver five times with an AR-15

## TxDOT: Sinkhole should be fixed by end of year

Repair of the sinkhole on South Morgan Street/Highway 144 should be finished by the end of the year, weather permitting, according to Natalie Galindo, public information officer for the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). Galindo said that remaining work includes construction of

the retaining wall, waterline and culvert, as well as curb and parking lot pavement.

Piles of dirt nearby will be backfill for the waterline, Galindo said.

The sinkhole opened up on the Brookshire's parking lot during heavy rains on Mother's Day weekend in May 2015.

The current market value for that house is listed on the Dallas Central Appraisal District's website at \$308,820. The website shows his homestead exemption to be \$60,986.

### GRANBURY PROPERTIES

In 2009, Couch purchased a home in the 1900 block of Harbor Lakes Drive in Granbury and was granted a homestead exemption for that property.

Its current assessed value, according to the HCAD's website, is \$490,290.

Couch said the Granbury address is his primary residence. It is the address listed on his Texas driver's license. The HCN obtained through Open Records the homestead exemption forms he filed with the HCAD for the Granbury property.

On those applications, the signer must acknowledge that he/she is not claiming a homestead exemption on any other property.

After filing the initial application, Couch submitted another one in 2013. Stewart said new applications were required at that time because of changes in the law.

Couch submitted another application in 2016 stating on the form that it was for "tax year 2015, 2016," even though, according to Stewart, a new application was not necessary.

Unlike the Dallas Central Appraisal District's website, the HCAD's website does not provide detail on individual homestead exemptions - only that an exemption has been granted.

Under "Homestead Exempt" on the page listing Couch's property, it says: "For property owner confidentiality reasons not all exemption details are available online."

A complication to any Open Records request is that the county is now collecting its portion of property taxes through the Tax Assessor-Collector's office, not the HCAD.

In April, officials with the HCAD said that Couch would be back-assessed for apartment units he owns at The Lodge of Granbury just east of the square.

In a 2012 remodel, Couch turned two units into four,

and about 330 square feet from each unit was missed by the appraisal district.

At the time, Deputy Chief Appraiser Eddie Roe told the HCN that Couch had been informed that he would be back assessed and that he was "perfectly fine" with that determination.

# Deadly comedy earns laughs

Insanity was galloping on the Granbury Opera stage during the opening night of "Arsenic and Old Lace."

Granbury Theatre Company's performance of the play, part of the Broadway on the Brazos season, evoked laughter at the proper moments and relief at others.

The script follows a young man's desperate attempts to protect his family from each other and the consequences of their secrets.

Matt Beutner, as Mortimer Brewster, successfully held onto his own sanity and his fiancé through a revolving door of dead bodies in the window seat, uninvited guests and excitable police officers.

Beutner's energy and range of emotion, radiating even around a gag, added a cohesiveness to the performance and helped align and moderate the characters' relationships to each other.

For their parts, Tonya Laree

and Drenda Lewis donned gray wigs to play Abby and Margaret Brewster. As a convincing duo of sincere, compassionate spinsters, they sent a stream of bod-

ies into the Panama Canal.

While their tag-team deadpan charmed the audience, their indignant huffing made them delightfully impossible to manage.

Complementing the main action, Bentleigh Nesbit, A. Solo-

mon Abah Jr., Kevin Baum and Jordan Houston portrayed four members of Brooklyn's police force.

Though their characters may have been unable to grasp the truth in the wild tale under their noses, the actors played their roles with grace.

In his first Granbury Theatre Company role, Tim Herndon's quivering portrayal of Dr. Einstein was noteworthy for his consistent accent and physical comedy.

Brian Lawson's performance as Teddy Brewster certainly kept the audience on edge but never quite prepared for his Teddy Roosevelt impersonations and thunderous clamoring up and down the stairs.

Together, the cast performance blended with the scenery and artistic props to make the audience feel they were a fly on the wall of the Brewster family's living room.

as Shaver was on his knees outside his hotel room and begging police, "Please don't shoot me."

According to a Mesa police report, Shaver made a movement with his hands near his waistband.

Sweet filed a lawsuit in January seeking \$75 million in damages from the city of Mesa. The lawsuit claims Mesa officers' reckless tactics contributed to Shaver's death.

Shaver's parents filed a wrongful-death and gross-negligence lawsuit.

If convicted of second-degree murder, Brailsford would face 10 to 25 years in prison.

was arrested by sheriff's office investigators around 11 p.m. Friday and charged with terroristic threat of a government employee - a third-degree felony.

A prepared statement from Rose said that Rowney threatened to "bring a shotgun with him to fix his taxes and made threats of a 'hit' on an elected official."

Rose said that Rowney was released from jail on a \$15,000 bond around noon Saturday.

McCoy did not return a phone message by press time. Chief Appraiser Greg Stewart declined comment.

The Commissioners Court did not support McCoy's takeover of property tax collections, but could not stop her.

McCoy insisted on the move out of concern for her own legal liability for county money

that was being held by the appraisal district. Also, she said she believed she could save the county money.

Several members of the Commissioners Court, as well as Stewart, had expressed concern about confusion and frustration among taxpayers.

"It's not a good situation when people do these kinds of things," County Judge Darrell Cockerham said Monday of the situation involving Rowney. "He must have been highly frustrated."

The Lipan man may pay dearly for that frustration.

"Rowney's arrest sends a strong message to would-be troublemakers that this kind of behavior will not be tolerated in Hood County," Sheriff Roger Deeds said.

# Deputies check in on registered sex offenders in Hood County

Ahead of the Halloween festivities, Hood County deputies and the U.S. Marshal's Office spent three days locating sex offenders registered in Hood County.

As part of Operation Verify, 17 teams of three officers went out on Wednesday through Friday to make contact with the 148 sex offenders who have registered in Hood County, said Public Information Officer Lt. Johnny Rose.

The operation was intended to confirm the addresses in the registration and to remind them of the restrictions placed on them by the courts, he said. They visited the home and work addresses of those on the list.

While compliance checks are routine, the timing of this check was specific, said Sheriff Roger Deeds.

"I am pleased with the outcome and appreciate the assistance from the U.S. Marshal's Office," Deeds said. "I feel it's important to make that one-on-one contact with the sex offender around Halloween to ensure the safety of our children in Hood County, which is always a high priority year around."

Approximately six sex offenders had violated the registration law and will be arrested in the near future, Rose said. The cases are under investigation by the Hood County Sheriff's Office.

Sex offenders are required to register in the city and county where they reside and have strict guidelines to follow after being convicted.

# Intoxicated man charged with three felonies

About 7 a.m. Friday, deputies responded to Sky Harbour north of Granbury because an intoxicated man was causing a disturbance, said sheriff's office Public Information Officer Lt. Johnny Rose.

They discovered Travis Matthew Austin, 36, was acting strangely and had kicked in the front door of a relative's home on Venus Court, Rose said. Austin lives on the same street, he said.

Austin told deputies he thought his relative's home was being robbed, Rose said, but deputies believed he was hallucinating.

He was arrested for public intoxication and transported to the jail where he was found to be in possession of less than a gram of methamphetamine and a set

of brass knuckles, Rose said.

Austin is charged with third-degree felonies for possession of a prohibited substance in a correctional facility and possession of a prohibited item in a correctional facility.

He is also charged with possession of a controlled substance, a state felony, in addition to the misdemeanor public intoxication charge.

It wasn't long ago that our boats were dry-docked, retaining walls were collapsing and our tourism industry was suffering. It is vitally important that we continue to fight for lake levels that are fair to Granbury and the entire Brazos River Basin. I have represented our City in this fight by serving as the City liaison on the Lake Granbury coalition. By fighting the fight, we were able to reduce the BRA requested 1,000,000 acre feet to less than 500,000 acre feet. Maintaining a legal seat at the table for BRA's additional requests is a must!!! It takes a long time to develop relationships with BRA's board members. We have made great strides in cultivating these relationships. I have attended many of the BRA board meetings over the past 6 years. My opponent has yet to attend **EVEN ONE**. **Experience** and these relationships does matter when protecting our lake, it is absolutely crucial. The fight isn't close to being over and it is imperative to have someone on the council that understands the complexity of these issues and has the **experience** and **history** of fighting for it.



## Pirates can't overcome missed opportunities in Everman loss

Granbury head football coach Chad Zschiesche didn't waste any time diagnosing what went wrong on Friday evening. "Missed opportunities," he said after the game.

Those two words do a pretty decent job of summing up Granbury's 41-7 loss to the Everman Bulldogs at home.

Granbury fumbled on the first play from scrimmage. On their next drive, they were stuffed at the goal line on back-to-back plays.

Granbury had the Bulldogs facing a fourth down after the Pirates' initial fumble, but Everman converted and scored. The Pirates had the ball for nearly 10 minutes in the second quarter; Everman won that quarter 14-0, scoring on a punt return and a 51-yard run shortly before the half.

The statline and scoreline from Friday night look like they could be from different games. Granbury only had 100 fewer yards than the Bulldogs and ran 15 more plays.

But the Pirates were 2-11 on third-down conversions, and they couldn't get a good drive going without losing momentum in some form or fashion. "We're gonna look back at the stats tomorrow and wonder how we only scored seven points," Zschiesche said on Friday. "When you play good ballclubs, you've gotta capitalize inside the red zone, and you can't turn it over."

"The biggest deal is, we gotta capitalize when our number is called, whether we're on offense, defense or special

teams."

Running back Ty Williams had his best game since the season opener. The senior had 143 yards on 20 carries.

The Pirates fell to 4-3 (1-3 District 9-5A) with the loss. Everman improved to 4-3 (4-0 District 9-5A).

### CONTROLLING DESTINY

Granbury's attention now turns to Burleson Centennial, a team that is coming off an emotional 31-28 loss to arch-rival Burleson.

The Centennial Spartans are 3-4 (2-2 District 9-5A). They've beaten Cleburne and Seguin in district play, but their only common opponent with the Pirates is Burleson.

Centennial will trot out the

triple option on offense. The Spartans will be the second straight ground-and-pound team Granbury has faced.

On defense, Centennial runs a 4-3 scheme that is very similar to the Granbury defense. The Spartans are "very disciplined" on the defensive end, Zschiesche said, and have a good front seven that could pose problems.

But this game carries extra weight for the Pirates because, as Zschiesche said, they "control their own destiny" for the postseason. They need no help from other teams, no luck of the draw in other games.

If Granbury wins out, the Pirates will play in the postseason. And rather than shrink from that responsibility, Zschiesche thinks his team will rise to the challenge.

"We look at it as an opportunity to go beat someone, and hand them a district loss," Zschiesche said Monday. "It's not like we need any help from anyone."

"The kids are happy that we control our own destiny. They understand the magnitude of this game, and we had a really good practice this morning."

The Pirates, Zschiesche said, were especially excited for some special circumstances during practice.

"They're pretty excited about practicing (Tuesday) morning, in what for us will be cold and windy. They didn't want to change their routine."

Granbury will kick off against Centennial at 7:30 p.m. on Friday at Burleson Stadium.



## Tolar blows out Bangs

The Bangs Dragons were missing their starting quarterback, playing on the road and hadn't won a game before playing Tolar on Friday night.

But even with all those caveats, the Rattlers' 63-6 win was more than impressive.

Tolar ran for over 500 yards against Bangs. Two players, Mason King and James Henderson, crossed the century mark on the ground.

The Rattlers held a 41-6 lead at the half. It was exactly the type of blowout they needed.

Tolar head coach Jeremy Mullins credited his running backs for their performance, but made sure to heap praise on his offensive line.

"I thought our O-line played by far their best game of the year, and did a good job of coming off the ball," Mullins said.

"We always say when you're not running the ball well, everyone's yelling, 'come on, O-line!' But when you are running the ball well, it's, 'man, that's a good running back.'"

Despite Bangs facing some internal challenges, Mullins said his team wasn't overlooking the Dragons. Tolar still had to go out, play the game and prove why they were predicted to win on paper.

"Good teams show up and play good no matter who the opponent is," Mullins said. "I feel like we did a good job start to finish of playing a full game."

"Whoever was in did a good job of executing and flying around, so it was good to see." The win moved Tolar to 4-3 (1-1 District 4-3A Division II). Bangs fell to 0-7 (0-2 in district).

### DUELING WITH DUBLIN

Tolar's next opponent, the Dublin Lions, are an interesting

case study in scheduling.

The Lions are opening up their district schedule with the three toughest teams in District 4-3A Division II in Cisco, Eastland and Tolar. They lost their first two games and come into Friday at a deceiving 2-5 (0-2 in district).

"I know people like comparing things - they played Hico first game, and Hico put it to them pretty good, and then we beat Hico," Mullins said. "But heck no, they're a different team than what I saw against Hico."

Dublin's main advantage is their size on the line of scrimmage.

"Up front, they will be bigger than us, so it'll be important this week that we do a good job on both fronts of getting off the ball and being a little quicker, hopefully, than they are," Mullins said.

The Lions also have a good,

mobile quarterback in Josh Haynes that Tolar will have to prepare for. Mullins said the Rattlers will be practicing scramble drills to get the defensive backs used to covering receivers for long periods of time.

This game carries plenty of weight for both Tolar and Dublin. If the Rattlers win, they'll be in a prime position for a playoff spot; if Dublin wins, it'll show that the Lions are better than their record indicates and put them back in the postseason race.

"We're approaching it as though playoffs are now on the line right here," Mullins said. "If you win this one, it doesn't mean anything for sure, but it definitely puts you in a better spot than the opposite."

Tolar and Dublin will start at 7:30 Friday night from Memorial Stadium in Dublin.

Friday night had an unexpected ending for the Granbury Lady Pirates as they fell to the Everman Lady Bulldogs in five sets.

The match was tense all the way through. The final score read 29-31, 25-19, 19-25, 25-19 and 15-12 in favor of the Lady Bulldogs.

Sophomore Payton Bell had 22 kills to lead the Lady Pirates. She also had a team-high 24 digs, edging out junior McKenzie Scott, who had 23.

# Student-built plane takes first flight

It was hard to tell who was more thrilled, the students or their mentors.

An airplane built by Granbury High School students took its maiden flight Saturday morning, and the Granbury Regional Airport was buzzing with excitement.

Students and the community mentors who coached them through the build were all smiles when the plane was unveiled.

Through the Eagle's Nest program, 21 students built a two-seater aluminum airplane under the guidance of 15 mentors last school year. Another plane is already under construction.

The first flight was part of the breakfast fly-in benefit for the Eagle's Nest. The community turned out in large numbers to purchase raffle tickets and breakfast tacos as part of the fundraiser.

The Eagle's Nest nonprofit was founded in 2010 to inspire future aviators. Not all who enter the program dream of becoming a pilot. Many will pursue work in maintenance, dispatch or engineering.

GHS senior Ryan Wood joined the Eagle's Nest this year. "My grandfather worked at

Lockheed, and that's how I became interested in airplanes," Wood said.

He plans to begin college at Tarleton State University and continue at Texas A&M for an engineering degree.

For those who want to pursue a pilot's license, 20 hours of flight training are available to students in the Eagle's Nest program. It's free.

Michaela Nadason, also a senior at GHS, said her exposure to the Air Force through her dad and brother led her to pursue the Eagle's Nest Project. She plans to pursue a career in engineering.

The idea of actually constructing an airplane is of course the biggest draw for students.

"How many people can say they actually built an airplane in high school?" quipped Maxwell Call, a junior at GHS.

The Eagle's Nest Project provided a Van's RV-12 all-alumi-

num airplane kit.

Students learned to read and interpret the instruction manual and thousands of assembly drawings. They used basic metal working tools and developed hands-on metal working skills.

The Eagle's Nest organization was founded to inspire future aviators. It is providing the seed money for the cost of the first two aircraft kits.

The school program becomes self-supporting as planes are sold to purchase new kits for future class projects.

Airport Operations Supervisor Pat Stewart said the Eagle's Nest Project came about after some guys were talking about ways to get more young people involved in aviation.

"Granbury is fortunate to have a large number of people who have built airplanes," Stewart said. In fact, the Granbury program drew 15 mentors for the initial build.


When addressing the crowd gathered at the airport Saturday, GISD Superintendent Jim Largent had nothing but praise for the program.

"This is real life learning," he said. The volunteers get a lot out of it, and the kids get a lot out of it too, he noted.
