GTC's gifted prop mistress relies on divine inspiration

Gaylene Carpenter's pies are literally Great Stuff.

They're made with the insulating spray foam sealant that bears that name.

Carpenter, a Granbury school teacher and prop mistress for the Granbury Theatre Company, stayed up all night on Easter making a dozen assorted fake pies, all of which appear in a scene of "Seven Brides for Seven Brothers."

The romantic comedy is on stage through May 27 at the Granbury Opera House.

Since there was no school the next day, Carpenter was able to sleep in. She teaches the Preschool Program for Children with Disabilities (PPCD) at Mambrino School.

The wife and mother of four grown kids (including a set of triplets) has a reputation among the GTC crew for having an amazing ability to find just the right props, even pieces from different time periods. But she also has a talent for figuring out how to make things, such as realistic-looking, mouth-watering pies.

"The most frustrating thing is they smell like cinnamon, and it's like, *man!*" said costume designer Drenda Lewis.

The pies smell that way

because they have real cinnamon on them, Carpenter said, though she covered the aromatic spice in sealant so that it won't get on

actors' costumes.

Carpenter said there is "no recipe" for how to make fake pies that look real.

"Not to be funny," she said, referring to the pun, "but, really, I just think of stuff in my head."

She figured out that Gorilla Glue might be just the thing to give a pretend pecan pie the right "caramelly" look, and it was.

"The pecans are real," said Carpenter, who lives with her husband Dan in Pecan Plantation. "They're from my yard."

Carpenter said that Great Stuff expands and that "you have to play with it but you can get it to look different ways."

She said she used a serrated knife to make carvings that made the chess pie look real.

Former Granbury resident 'Chewbacca' dies

Former Granbury resident Peter Mayhew, the English actor who played Hans Solo's Wookiee sidekick Chewbacca in the original Star Wars trilogy, died of a heart attack Tuesday at his North Texas home, surrounded by family.

He was 74.

Mayhew's family tweeted the announcement of his death, which came just days before the annual May 4th holiday recognized by Star Wars fans.

The Fort Worth Star-Telegram reported that Mayhew was living in Wise County

near Boyd at the time of his death.

He leaves behind his wife Angie and three children.

The statement on Twitter from Mayhew's family said that he was a philanthropist who was "heavily involved" in the 501st legion, Wounded Warriors, the Make-A-Wish Foundation and other charitable causes. His Peter Mayhew Foundation has provided support for people in crisis situations.

The original Star Wars

movie was released in 1977.

Creator George Lucas was in search of a tall actor to play the Chewbacca character when he discovered Mayhew, who stood 7'2". At the time, Mayhew was working as an orderly in the radiology department of King's College Hospital in London.

Mayhew played Chewbacca in the original Star Wars trilogy and also appeared in the more recent Star Wars films.

He became a naturalized citizen of the United States at a ceremony in Arlington in 2005.

At that time, Mayhew was living in Hood County.

Public hearings Tuesday on annexations

Two public hearings will be held Tuesday regarding five sections of land that the city of Granbury may involuntarily annex.

The five sections of land encompass about 2,470 acres and 29 homes.

One public hearing will be held from noon until 1:30 p.m. in council chambers at City Hall, 116 W. Bridge St.

The other will take place at the same location during the council's regular meeting that night. The meeting will start at 6 p.m.

City Manager Chris Coffman said at a council meeting last month that such takeovers are a way for the city to control development and transportation corridors, preventing "urban sprawl."

City staff began preparing a service plan after the council approved a resolution at that meeting that green-lighted the annexation process.

The land sections are:

- Approximately 341 acres located north of the square, south of Loop 567 and west of SH 51 (Weatherford Highway);

- Approximately 800 acres located north of U.S. 377, along Old Granbury Road and Meander Road;

- Approximately 455 acres on multiple separate tracts located south of Business U.S. 377 and west of SH 144;

- About 537 acres of land located south of Granbury at SH 144.

- Approximately 335 acres located north of Loop 567 at and around the FM 4/Loop 567 area.

Development agreements for property owners have an agricultural exemption will stay annexations for up to 10 years provided the property owners don't develop or subdivide their property and maintain the ag exemption.

About 1,700 acres of the 2,470 acres proposed for annexation are tied to ag exemptions, according to Planning Director Scott Sopchak.

Detailed maps of the areas proposed for annexation are posted information on the city's website, www.granbury.org.

All voting for Lipan will take place in the library at the Lipan ISD building, located at 106 Osage St.

Sheree Reynolds and Joel Taylor are competing in Place 1. Place 2 incumbent Todd Tuggle is unopposed.

Rating our presidents and Congress

Every four years 100 historians are asked to rate our 45 presidents using a report card, the results of which are then published in book form. The presidents are graded in 10 categories:

- Public persuasion
 - Crisis leadership
 - Economic leadership
 - Moral authority
 - International relations
 - Administrative skills
 - Relations with Congress
 - Vision/setting an agenda
 - Pursuing equal justice for all
 - Performance within the context of their time
- The top five this year were:
1. Abe Lincoln
 2. George Washington
 3. Franklin Delano Roosevelt
 4. Teddy Roosevelt
 5. Dwight David Eisenhower

Only modern-day president making the Top 10 was Ronald Reagan at #9. Followed by Obama #12, Clinton #15, George H.W. Bush #20 and George W. Bush #33. Trump will be rated at the end of his term in office in the next book.

I would like to see a similar ratings book or study by the same historians on Congress, for the education of future Congresses just as this book, and the two before have been of educational value to those who would be president.

If I were an incumbent or a challenger, of either party, I would be paying more than a little attention to the Gallup Polls (oldest and most reliable) on what the people are thinking currently and how it has changed from month to month and issue to issue.

As to party affiliation since last November, Republicans have dropped from 29% to 27%. Democrats have dropped from 35% to 29%. In-

dependents have risen from 36% to 44%.

In short, the people aren't buying, for good reason, what our political leaders are selling. Including the president.

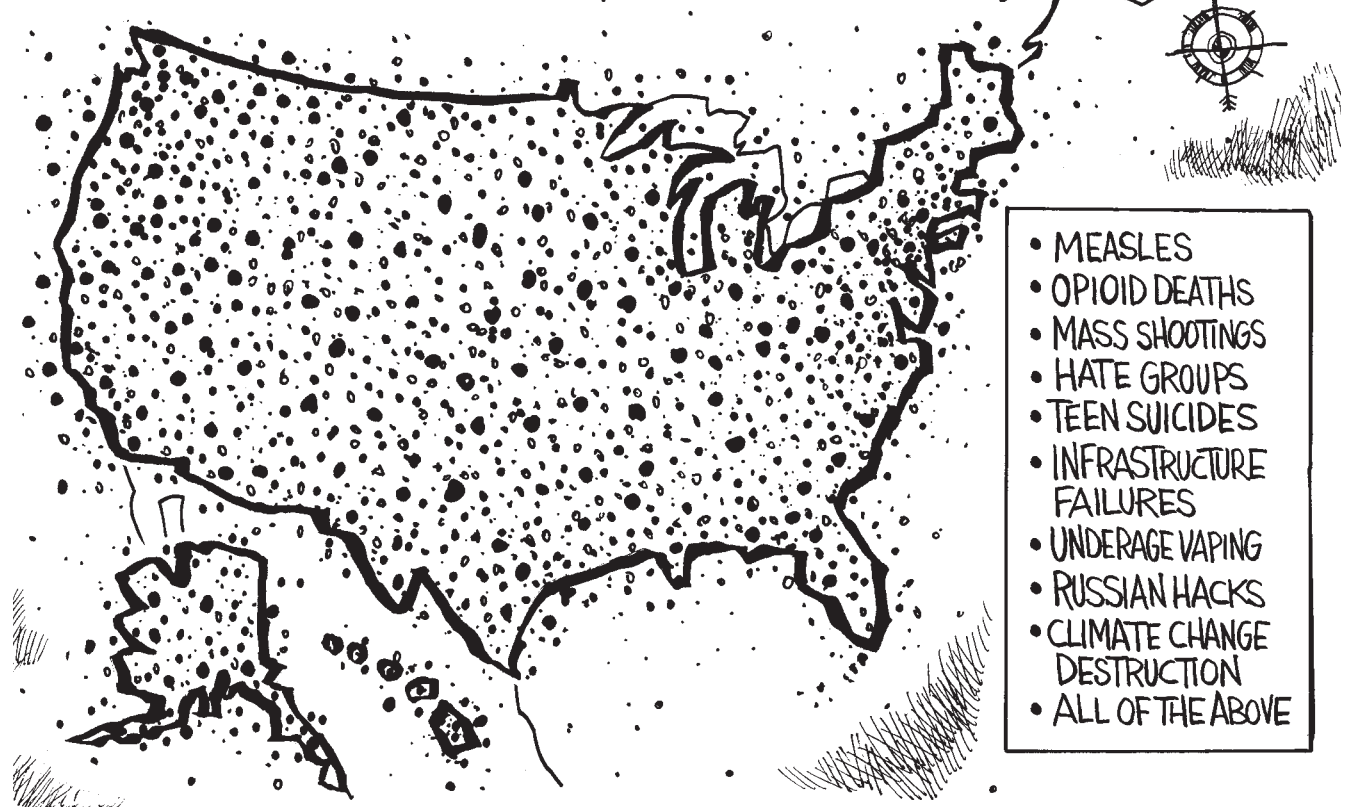
Infrastructure is important, but show us how we are going to pay for it. An additional \$2 trillion borrowed and added to the debt needs to be thoroughly explained.

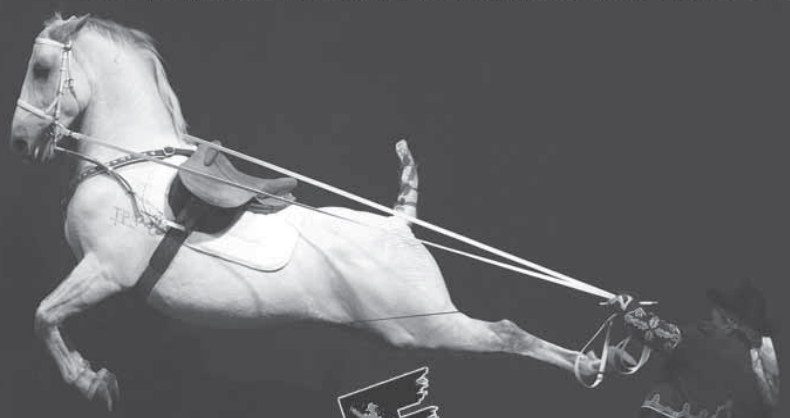

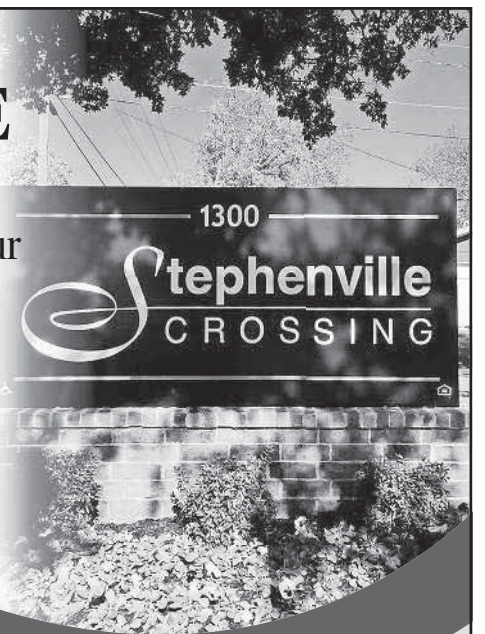

The Granbury Lady Pirates ran up against a tough team in The Colony Lady Cougars, losing 8-1 Thursday at Kennedale High School in the first game of an area round series in the UIL Class 5A playoffs.

From the opening play, The Colony showed why it's ranked No. 6 in the state of Texas. Shortstop Jayda Coleman, a top recruit in the Class of 2020 who is already committed to Oklahoma, robbed a line drive from Ali Cooper. Then pitcher Karlie Charles, who will attend Iowa State next year, had the first of her 14 strikeouts on the night.

After Coleman led off with a triple, Granbury pitcher Ali Cooper had the bases loaded with no outs. She was able to induce a groundout and a strikeout to keep the game scoreless, but The Colony's Michelle Tillapaugh hit a three-run double to give the

Lady Cougars the lead.

The Colony added another run in the second inning and three more in the third. All of the Lady Cougars' runs in the game came with two outs.

Cooper was replaced in the circle by Kelby Been, who was charged with one earned three earned runs over 4.1 innings.

At the plate, Granbury couldn't get anything going. Taryn Mathews made it to third base on an error in the top of the fourth, but the Lady Pirates couldn't bring her home.

Cooper drew a one-out walk in the top of the sixth, and Lani Hickey finally broke through with Granbury's first hit to score Cooper and prevent the shutout.

Catfish stocking ongoing

The Texas Parks and Wildlife department's "Neighborhood Fishin'" program is stocking channel catfish in 19 clean, well-lit sites in city and county parks near picnic tables, parking and restrooms.

New anglers, this is your chance to catch a keeper close to home. Please remember the rules: five fish per day, pole and line only, two or fewer poles per person.

FISHING REPORT

Granbury water temperatures have risen to around 70 degrees.

Water is extremely stained due to heavy rains and fishing has been slow for most species except catfish. Creeks with flowing muddy water are producing good catches of catfish on cut bait and worms.

Largemouth bass fishing is fair in the backs of creeks on banks where the water is clearing some. Stripers are slow in the muddy water. Crappie can still be caught in the back of creeks and sloughs on small minnows.

Squaw Creek black bass continue to be good on spinners and soft plastics fished near creek channels and points. I do not have a tilapia report.

Striper limits to 14 pounds are common on Lake Whitney. Whitney lake levels rose considerably; however, the water is still clear on the main lake. Possum Kingdom is similar, the river above the lake and many feeder creeks are muddy but the main lake has clear water.

Stripers to 17 pounds are being caught on top water plugs near main lake points near the Peanut Patch to Broadway.






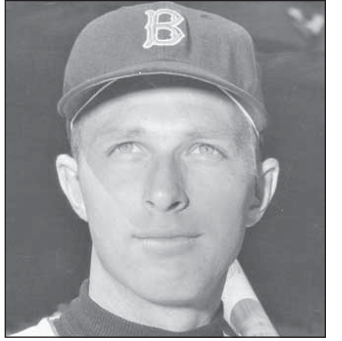
