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
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DCBE BOARD BRIEFS

BOARD BRIEFS Meeting held April 29, 2024 *All board and committee meetings are open to all DeCordova members.

GOLF COMMITTEE

The board of directors approved unanimously by recommendation of the golf committee that for one year's time: a member/member tournament will be paid out in credit book only and member guest tournaments will be paid out in cash.

The finance committee denied a BAR from the golf committee regarding the elimination of guest fees on the Durant Par 3 course. It was the finance committee's determination that eliminating the charge would lead to the elimination of guest charges in all other recreational amenities. The golf

committee felt the Durant Course is not monitored and does not generate enough funds monthly by the self check-in to require a fee. A motion was made by Larry Cordell to eliminate the Durant Nine guest fee; seconded by Cathy Permenter; with

three in favor and four opposed the motion was denied. Larry Cordell, Cathy Permenter, Rick Phillips voted in favor; Bennie Hudgins, David Zunker, Sean Grizzell, Scott Mitchell voted in opposition.

Cathy Permenter updated the board of directors on information pertaining to the November City Election process for becoming a "wet" city. This is a major issue for the food and beverage operation in the restaurants affecting guests purchases, deliveries and being able to negotiate pricing with vendors.

STEPS NEEDED TO GET ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT:

- 1. DCBE must obtain a minimum of 10 signatures from registered voters in the City of DeCordova to complete the application. COMPLETED
- 2. DCBE has five days to file an announcement in the local paper stating the intent of the application. TARGET DATE MAY 4
- 3. DCBE files the application and a copy of the newspaper announcement with the City Secretary, Marla Frye. TARGET DATE MAY 6
- 4. After the application has been approved, Marla Frye, the City Secretary of DeCordova, will provide blank petition pages to DCBE representative and legal committee Chairman, Cathy Permenter. TARGET DATE MAY 7.
- 5. City Secretary, Marla Frye, has five days to notify TABC that petition pages have been issued. TARGET DATE BY MAY 10
- 6. Once DCBE receives the petition pages for the registered voters and residents of the City of DeCordova to sign, each signature page must be marked with the city's official seal. No photocopies can be made of these pages, each one must be an original.
- 7. DCBE has 60 days from when the first petition page is received by Cathy Permenter. DCBE has a committee formed and must obtain 685 signatures of registered voters in the City of DeCordova to complete the petition for filing. The number of signatures required is based on turnout in the most recently held general or gubernatorial election and is not based on the current number of registered voters in the City of DeCordova. TARGET COMPLETION JULY 6
- 8. The city employees and the City Council members are not allowed to solicit signatures during this campaign. They can sign the petition as a reg-

istered voter, but they are not allowed to participate in soliciting the signatures.

9. We are currently governed under a private club permit. Upon receipt of the election results and this passes, DCBE will request a mixed beverage permit to govern under. This will allow DCBE to open our bars to more people for service without being in the presence of a member. F&B management is excited to see this passed and change how we are currently purchasing liquor and how it will affect our costs.

Cathy Permenter made a motion that the DCBE legal committee be granted permission to go door-to-door to request signatures on an economical campaign for the November election. Once approved the committee will outline rules and regulations for the campaign. The motion was seconded by David Zunker and with all in favor the motion was approved.


The board of directors unanimously approved by recommendation of the finance committee to upgrade and replace the Country Club computer servers as an emergency expenditure up to \$18,000.

The board of directors unanimously denied a recommendation of the finance committee to purchase the currently leased ice machines at their approximate budgeted cost of the lease expense up to \$28,000. This was denied at the request for additional information for the terms of a service agreement, more knowledge on the depreciation of the units and the possibilities for some type of water treatment

David Zunker announced that as of this week the association accounts have been consolidated and will be reflected in the April financials. The committee is continuing to work toward a cash flow statement that can be easily viewed by the membership on a monthly basis.

Discussion was held about credit card processing fees and if the club should be absorbing them or charging them





back to the consumer. The board of directors agreed the percent charge back was an operational decision and will be left to club management to implement. An announcement will be sent to the membership that beginning June 1, 3% will be charged for online payments made through the website using credit cards. This will not apply to a purchase using a credit card for fuel, in the dining areas or ProShop.

Sean Grizzell updated everyone on the resurfacing project of the west parking lot and golf parking area of the clubhouse. They will need to evaluate the work before moving forward with the larger street projects. The clubhouse roofing will need to have the committee define the full scope of work before proceeding. The Durant Course pumphouse and skid replacement will begin once the previously approved emergency pump replacement arrives. Club staff is working to receive bids for bridge inspections for our roadways and golf course. The committee has asked for a "deaf child" sign to be placed at member request on Fairway Circle cautioning members to be alert and help to prevent a potential accident. Terry Stamper is working with our Precinct Commissioner on drainage along North Gate Road that creates flooding on Seminole Drive.

I wanted to get a second dog, but my husband was hesitant; he said he wanted the addition to our family to be special. I went on the hunt. We adopted Flower from Second Chance Farms in Granbury, an amazing facility run by Sandi Walker.

The day Sandi brought her to us we introduced her to Lucy, and they accepted each other instantly. We took Flower into the house, and she wandered around and seemed to be comfortable, so Sandi shed a couple of tears and said goodbye to Flower. She was now a part of the family.

Living with a blind dog is an amazing experience. Flower was born blind and due to an injury as a young pup, one of her eyes had to be removed. She maneuvers around the house perfectly, knows where everything is and the only time she bumps into anything is when she gets excited.

Flower is extremely affectionate, loves to be touched and is always close to us. She loves to run zoomies in the yard and gets

She informs us when another dog is coming down the cart path for their morning walk. She warns us when mail, UPS, FedEx and Amazon are in the area before they get near the house. She can be sound asleep in the back of the house and the minute we quietly open a package or the pantry door, she's next to our side. She is food motivated and if we want her to do anything, we just say the word "cookie" and she'll do almost anything.

We had her DNA tested and she is 70% Great Pyrenees, 30% German Shephard — what a combination. The only negative about her is she loves wintry weather; we don't! Eighty pounds of dog that doesn't want to move, and bears her weight down, won't be moved. It's a struggle to get her inside during the cold weather, even with a "cookie" offering.

The committee will be asked to review the permit charge for a concrete addition that is currently being billed by the square foot.

Doug Jones informed the board of directors there have been several distant projects discussed that will be shared with the next chairman.

Additional Meeting Notes / Board of Directors Doug Jones addressed concerns of the membership regarding a tanning ledge area of the swimming pool. The board of directors agreed to discuss the topic and report back to the membership their decision before moving forward with the project.

Heidi Weaver appeared to request a waiver of an initiation fee.

Kay Bailey appeared to propose the replat of a member-owned lot on Santa Elena Court and to classify it as unbuildable. This would assist the neighboring properties from any worries that a new home build would bring from the altered water flow onto their lots. The approved replat could bring in additional monthly assessments as well as initiation fees upon their sale.

Wayne brought into question a financial statement that included a variance to a monetary gift presented to board President Doug Jones for his services during tenure as interim general manager. David Zunker stated that the decision was made by the board of directors in a closed session as it pertained to personnel. Doug submitted a 1099 as an employee of the Country Club. Cathy Permenter added that the association's legal counsel was questioned prior to any contribution and informed the board of directors they were in good standing of the bylaws in doing so.

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



SECURITY REPORT

April 2024

During the month of April 2024 security responded to 97 calls for service and issued 15 Notice of Rules Violations (NORV)

We continue to have people drive up to the gate that are not called in, I have instructed my officers to turn them all around. We do not have time to call each member and it is your responsibility. We are still turning around people "Mostly Contractors" who do not have a valid driver's license, we do not accept passports or ID's for driving in DCBE.

When calling in a guest using Gate Sentry, please make sure you can receive notifications and they are turned on, we have also found that some notifications have gone to members spam folders. I have also been working on making sure all the officers are trained and using the tablet correctly, security makes mistakes at times but will always strive to do better.

Security personnel are usually the first responders to emergencies in DCBE and sometimes have a difficult time finding the right address due to missing numbers or numbers that are completely gone. If your home and/or mailbox doesn't CLEARLY show your address, if it is not lit up or reflective and or unreadable, it can delay vital emergency help to you or your neighbors. Minutes will seem like hours when you are waiting for help! Please make sure your address

is complete and visible from all directions of approaching vehicles.

The golf courses may not be used for any purpose other than a game of golf. Practicing on the golf courses is prohibited. However, golf cart paths may be used for walking, jogging, skating, bicycling, etc., when it is not available to golfers, i.e., mornings before 7:30 a.m., after dark and when courses are closed for maintenance. Anyone walking their pets on the golf course should have their pet on a leash and remove any solid waste left by the animal.

Anyone driving a golf cart in DCBE must hold a valid driver's license and produce it upon request by DCBE Security or Management. Under no circumstance shall unlicensed children be allowed to operate golf carts.

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
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
