





## **5 FUN FACTS ABOUT JULY**

July is synonymous with fun in the sun. In the northern hemisphere, July is typically characterized by sunny days, warm weather and long hours of daylight, making it an ideal month to enjoy a little rest and relaxation. Though it might be a great time for some R&R, July also boasts an interesting history. As revelers soak up some sun this summer, they can ponder these fun facts about the month of July.

July is named after a person whose been famous for thousands of years. According to the Farmer's Almanac, Roman dictator Julis Caesar developed the precursor to the Gregorian calendar used today. Though that made him worthy of a month named in his honor, it didn't do much to protect him during his life, as Caesar was famously assassinated in 44 B.C.


July is a celebratory month for fans of revolution. American Independence Day (July 4) and Bastille Day (July 14), which commemorates the storming of the Bastille and the dawn of the French Revolution in 1789, are among the notable revolutionary moments celebrated in July.

Baseball historians know that many significant events in the game have taken place in July, and some records set in the month have withstood longer than others. On July 12, 1931, Mel Ott of the New York Giants hit his 100th career homerun, becoming the youngest player to reach that milestone. Ott was 22 years and 132 days old when he set the mark, which still stands today.

One of the more famous statements in United States history was uttered in July, though it wasn't within American borders or even on the planet Earth. On July 20, 1969, American astronaut Neil Armstrong, after stepping onto the surface of the moon, declared, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."

Two men who played integral roles in the American colonies gaining their independence from Great Britain both passed away on July 4th, the day that celebrates that very independence. On July 4th, 1826, former presidents John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, who were once friends, then political rivals and, finally, friends again, passed away within hours of each other.



# **SIGNS YOUR** DOG MAY BE **DEHYDRATED**

Water is essential for mammals' bodies to operate at peak capacity. The American Kennel Club says water is necessary to lubricate joints, facilitate digestion, regulate body temperature, and cushion internal organs, among many other functions. Similar to humans, pets that fail to consume enough water can face dire consequences.

Dehydration is a medical term for when the body has lost more fluid than it has taken in. Dehydration can occur at any time, but it is even more common during the warm weather months. Dogs quickly can become very sick from dehydration. That is why every pet owner should learn how to recognize the symptoms of dehydration in their dogs.

The Veterinary Emergency Group says symptoms of mild dehydration can include:

- Dry nose, although this also can be a signal of other problems, like fever.
- Excessive drooling occurs as the dog tries to cool down its
- A dehydrated dog can exhibit signs of fatigue, including a reluctance to move around much.
- Sticky gums


As the dog becomes more dehydrated, the following symptoms can develop:

- Loss of elasticity of the skin.
- Loss of appetite.
- Thickening of the dog's saliva.
- Gums may go from sticky to dry.
- Excessive panting may begin.
- Vomiting or diarrhea also may occur.
- Dehydration causes the body to redistribute fluid lost, and fluid may be pulled from the eyes, causing the eyes to appear

If a dog appears to be dehydrated, you can start offering small amounts of water to slowly rehydrate the animal, says Northeast Veterinary Referral Hospital. It's important to call the veterinarian and get further advice regarding how to address dehydration. Some vets may suggest offering an electrolyte-enhanced fluid like Pedialyte so electrolyte loss does not affect organs. The vet may want you to come into the office so the dog can receive intravenous fluids, says the American Kennel Club.

The best way to treat dehydration is to prevent it in the first place. Provide dogs with a constant supply of clean, clear water at all times. The amount of water needs to increase if the dog is spending time outdoors in hot weather or exercising.

Cats also are prone to dehydration and can exhibit the same symptoms as dogs. So cat owners also must be diligent in checking for dehydration symptoms in their pets.

# NAKED CATS

Many of you know about The Dragon House. Well, inside there are totally different, amazing, beasts. The Canters got King Tut, a hairless sphynx, a couple of years ago to keep their fuzzy kitties, Kiki and Keen, company. That didn't exactly work to plan. The older cats were NOT amused by rambunctious little Tut. There was much hissing and tussling until achieving uneasy detente.

Poor Tut seemed lonely and needed a playmate. Enter Prince Hairy, who is pink with just the barest of ginger fuzz. The King was not happy. He tolerated the young 'un, just barely. Then, just as things settled, the Canters got wind of a sphynx needing rescue. Her owners said Violet was jealous, aggressive and clingy. Their house, at 68 degrees, felt miserably cold. No wonder she clung to Suz!

She was indeed rude. Steve and Suz spent a lot of time training her to be nice to the other "nekids." Turned out Violet had been a breeding cat and wasn't given much love and attention. The vet said her bad teeth were due to chewing on an aluminum cage. She was underweight because all her calories were used to keep her warm.

The sphynx breed is quite unique. Many owners call them dog.monkey.cats. They are loyal like a dog, do tricks such as fetch, and are very affectionate. The monkey moniker comes from their propensity to climb to the highest spot they can find. Sphynx kitties love to ride on your shoulder. It's a bit of a shock when Hairy jumps from the desk onto a visitor. They really enjoy cuddling, but their favorite thing is sunbathing on the screened porch. They can't stay out too long because they sunburn.


There are negatives. Sphynx cats cost between \$2,000 and \$3,000. They are somewhat more susceptible than other breeds to HCM, a fatal heart condition. Diagnosis requires a \$900 ultrasound done by a heart veterinarian. They need special (read expensive) food because many have allergies presenting as skin or stomach issues.



#### TIPS FOR STAYING HYDRATED THIS SUMMER

Summer is marked by hot and humid conditions. After all, the band The Lovin' Spoonful didn't sing, "Hot town, summer in the city. Back of my neck getting dirty and gritty" because the summer weather is crisp and cool. Although summer temperatures can make a day at the beach or in the pool ideal, that rising mercury also can contribute to dehydration.

The Mayo Clinic advises that water is critical to every cell, tissue and organ in the human body. The body relies on water to function properly. Water helps to regulate body temperature, flush waste from the body, lubricate and cushion joints, and promote healthy digestion. And that's just the start. So when temperatures climb and the body begins sweating to cool off, it is vital to replenish lost fluids at a faster rate. The U.S. National Academies of Science, Engineering and Medicine says women should consume 2.7 liters of fluid per day, while men need 3.7 liters. These amounts increase if one is exercising, sweating, has an illness like a fever, or is vomiting.

The following are six ways to stay properly hydrated to avoid adverse reactions during hot summer days.

Consume a glass of water when you wake up. Start the day off with some water to give you an energy boost and get your metabolism moving.

Coffee and tea count toward fluid intake. Drinking your favorite tea or coffee is another way to take in fluids. A ■2016 meta-analysis published in the Journal of Science and Medicine in Sport found that caffeine doesn't contribute to dehydration for healthy adults, so having a cup or two should be fine.

Certain foods are hydrating as well. Hydrating foods include cucumbers, celery, tomatoes, watermelon, strawberries, grapefruit, and peppers. The Mayo Clinic says the average person gets 20 percent of his fluid intake from food.

Make water more fun. Add unsweetened flavoring to water if you find plain water too bland. You can squeeze **I**in lemon or lime juice, or float cucumber or apple slices in the water for some flavor.

Reach for calorie-free beverages before food. It's easy to mistake the signs of dehydration for hunger. By drinking a glass of water or another unsweetened beverage prior to every meal, you can stay hydrated and reduce the amount of food you eat. This can be part of a healthy weight loss plan.

Occasionally consume electrolyte powders and drinks. Working out in the heat or sweating profusely can unbalance electrolytes in the body. The Cleveland Clinic says electrolytes are substances that help the body regulate chemical reactions and maintain balance between fluids inside and outside of your cells. They include sodium, calcium and potassium. An electrolyte-infused beverage can help replenish these lost substances.


Staying hydrated is essential at all times, but it's especially important when summer temperatures can make loss of body fluid more significant.

There's no shortage of ways to impart flavor to foods when cooking at home. Smoking food is one method that has grown increasingly popular in recent years.

Smoking imparts unique flavor to a wide variety of foods. Like other approaches to cooking, smoking involves a learning curve that may include some trial and error. Grilling enthusiasts who want to try their hand at smoking food can keep these tips in mind.

- **REMEMBÉR THE MANTRA "LOW AND SLOW."** Low and slow is the preferred method among cooks experienced in smoking. The method involves cooking foods at low temperatures for long periods of time. When smoking, unlike with traditional grilling, cooks want to ensure the food is not directly over a flame. Smoking stones can be used to absorb and deflect heat, and similar products can accomplish the same. That absorption and deflection allows foods to cook slowly, which in turns helps impart the smoky flavor people love.
- CONSIDER ADDING WATER TO CREATE MOISTURE.
   A water pan inside the smoker can ensure foods remain moist while smoking. Long cooking times can dry foods out, but the water in a water pan can make the environment inside the grill more humid.
- ADD FLAVOR WITH WOOD. Seasoned wood chunks and wood chips can add flavor to foods, and such products are readily available at many grocery stores and home improvement retailers. Choice of chunk or chips depends on which type of smoker individuals have. The grilling experts at Weber advise using chips when light

smoking for less than an hour. If smoking for an hour or more, Weber advises using chunks.

- **CONSIDER ACCESSORIZING AN EXISTING GRILL.**Smokers or grills that can accommodate smoking can be expensive, and cooks who already have reliable charcoal or gas grills may not be able to justify such an investment. In such instances, smoker boxes, which sit right on an existing grill grate and make it easy to transform grills into makeshift smokers, can do the trick. In addition, smoker attachments that can be attached to gas and charcoal grills can enable a less expensive introduction to smoking foods.
- MONITOR TEMPERATURES. Temperature is important when smoking foods. If temperatures rise too quickly, foods can quickly become dry and overcooked. If temperatures do not rise, foods can sit on the grill for hours on end. Each recipe is unique and will suggest an ideal temperature range when cooking foods slow. That may require staying home and monitoring the grill temperature, periodically adjusting vents to maintain a steady temperature. Many smokers now enable users to monitor temperatures via a smartphone app, and those can be useful for cooks who cannot stick around the house for the duration of the smoking.

Smoking is a popular way to cook foods over an open flame. Smoking may involve some initial trial and error, but the results are well worth navigating one's way through the learning curve.
