

SATURDAY GANGSOME

What is it?

What is the Saturday Gangsome? It's one of the oldest golf games here at DeCordova. It was created to help new members have a place to play and meet other members. You can sign-up in the Pro Shop or on ForeTees. So how does it work? The Pro Shop will make teams based on the A-B-C-D method of creating teams where the A-Player has the lowest handicap & D-Player has the highest handicap.Players will play their ball under the USGA rules of golf with a few exceptions. The A-Player typically records the scores for all players.Sounds simple enough right? Now how does the betting work? The cost to play in the Gangsome starts at \$16 paid in cash to the Pro Shop.



Entry breakdown

This entry is broken down as follows 2-Best Net scores - \$1 Front, \$1 Back, \$1 Total 2-Best Gross scores - \$1 Front, \$1 Back, \$1 Tota Individual Net Skins - \$2 Individual Gross Skins - \$2 Merchandise Rabbit - \$2 Cash Rabbit - \$2 Beautification - \$2

There are some qualifications to play in the Gangsome. You must have a verifiable GHIN handicap. Playing tees are as follows: Men will take your age + 1/2 handicap index for a total. If that total is 85 or over you play the RED tees. If that total is 75 to 84 you play the GOLD tees. All other men will play the WHITE tees. All Ladies play the RED tees.

This is a GREAT way to meet other golfing enthusiasts, golfing junkies, or just great members looking to have a good time on the weekend! So come on out, give it a try. We'd love to have you!

FALL GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE

As we transition out of summer and head into the fall, we will be starting the process of overseeding the tees with perennial ryegrass, as well as re-seeding the heavily shaded areas with fescue. We will also start our fall preemergent program in the coming weeks to prevent any winter weeds, such as annual bluegrass. The scientific name for annual bluegrass is poa annua, which is why most in the golf industry just refer to it as "poa." This pesky little weed is known for its ability to quickly become resistant to herbicides. Therefore, we will be thinking outside the box and trying some different methods than what has been done in the past. We were already limited to only a few options for herbicides — especially on greens — so we are going to have to get creative with how we control this weed.


Lastly, we will be preparing our greens to transition into the cooler months by applying fertilizers to help drive root growth and pumping them full of potassium to "harden" the turf so it can withstand the extreme swings in temperatures that will soon be coming and be able to survive throughout whatever kind of weather the winter brings us.

AGING INDIVIDUALS' CALORIE NEEDS AFFECTED BY THEIR ACTIVITY LEVELS

Healthy aging is a multifaceted process that involves an array of variables. Diet and exercise are two such variables, and each are intertwined. According to the National Institute on Aging, the amount of calories individuals over 60 need each day depends on their physical activity levels. Though all adults should aspire to be physically active each day, some aging adults may experience mobility issues that make it hard to move around. But activity levels can serve as a measuring stick for daily calorie intake. The NIA notes that the more active men and women over 60 are, the more calories they will need to consume.

INACTIVE

The NIA recommends that women over 60 who are not physically active consume 1,600 calories per day. Men over 60 who are not physically active are urged to consume between 2,000 and 2,200 calories each day.

MODERATELY ACTIVE

What qualifies as moderate physical activity is best defined by an individual's physician, who may recommend various exercises or activities based on each person's condition. Daily walks may qualify as moderate physical activity, but aging adults are urged to keep track of the length and intensity of such walks so they can work with their physicians to determine how they might affect their daily caloric intake. Women over 60 who engage in moderate physical activity each day are urged to consume 1,800 calories per day, while men in that category should consume between 2,200 and 2,400 calories.

VERY ACTIVE

Aging men and women can probably determine on their own if their lifestyle can be described as very physically active. Women over 60 who qualify as very active should consume between 2,000 and 2,200 calories per day, while the NIA advises very active men to consume between 2,400 and 2,600 calories per day.

Of course, it's important that men and women over 60 choose the right foods each day as well. The NIA advises against choosing foods that have a lot of sugar, saturated fat and sodium. Fruits, vegetables and whole grains are examples of healthy foods that can help aging individuals reach recommended daily calorie intake without compromising their overall health.

- Contractors must enter through the front gate unless they have purchased a gate sticker.


DCBE REWARD POLICY:






