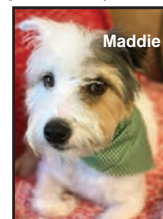

Hood County Hospital District Proposes To Increase Its Tax Rate 2 Cents

On the November 5 ballot, the following referendum appears, allowing for a FOR or AGAINST vote.

Approving the ad valorem tax rate of \$0.02 per \$100 valuation in the Hood County Hospital District for the current year, a rate that is \$0.02 higher per \$100 valuation than the voter-approval tax rate of the Hood County Hospital District, for the purpose of providing indigent healthcare and emergency medical services. Last year, the ad valorem tax rate in the Hood County Hospital District was \$0.00 per \$100 valuation.*

*Official ballot language mandated by state law.

Proposed Tax Rate To Cover Costs of Healthcare for the Medically Indigent and Dependable EMS Services for All.

Hood County Hospital District is a "special district" established by state law. Every county in Texas MUST provide healthcare for the medically indigent persons who are legally defined as those for whom medical bills would threaten the household's financial viability. In 1976, Hood County created the Hospital District, with the responsibility to levy a property tax to meet these costs. Costs associated within the healthcare system are increasing, thus increasing the District's budget.

Contrary to public opinion, the District does NOT fund or operate Lake Granbury Medical Center of Lakeside Physicians Group (whose parent organization is Community Health Systems, or CHS, one of the largest for-profit healthcare networks in the nation).

In 1996, the District Board of Directors dropped the property tax rate to ZERO, having entered into a 30-year agreement with the predecessor of CHS to lease and operate the District's hospital. This \$15 million lease was providing the funding necessary for the District to meet its statutory responsibilities. With the monies associated with this agreement reaching an end, there are no government grants or contributions coming from the private sector to fund the District.

Ensuring ALL Hood residents have access to ambulance services regardless of where they are and the time of day can only be realized by additional funding in support of Texas EMS and the EMS provider in Pecan Plantation.

SATURDAY GANGSOME

What is it?

What is the Saturday Gangsome? It's one of the oldest golf games here at DeCordova. It was created to help new members have a place to play and meet other members. You can sign-up in the Pro Shop or on ForeTees. So how does it work? The Pro Shop will make teams based on the A-B-C-D method of creating teams where the A-Player has the lowest handicap & D-Player has the highest handicap. Players will play their ball under the USGA rules of golf with a few exceptions. The A-Player typically records the scores for all players. Sounds simple enough right? Now how does the betting work? The cost to play in the Gangsome starts at \$16 paid in cash to the Pro Shop.

Entry breakdown

This entry is broken down as follows:

- 2-Best Net scores - \$1 Front, \$1 Back, \$1 Total
- 2-Best Gross scores - \$1 Front, \$1 Back, \$1 Total
- Individual Net Skins - \$2
- Individual Gross Skins - \$2
- Merchandise Rabbit - \$2
- Cash Rabbit - \$2
- Beautification - \$2

There are some qualifications to play in the Gangsome. You must have a verifiable GHIN handicap. Playing tees are as follows: Men will take your age + 1/2 handicap index for a total. If that total is 85 or over you play the RED tees. If that total is 75 to 84 you play the GOLD tees. All other men will play the WHITE tees. All Ladies play the RED tees.



This is a GREAT way to meet other golfing enthusiasts, golfing junkies, or just great members looking to have a good time on the weekend! So come on out, give it a try. We'd love to have you!

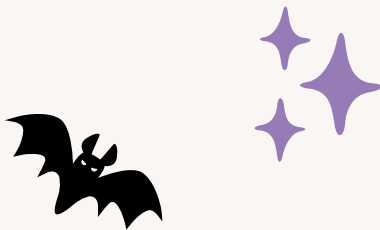
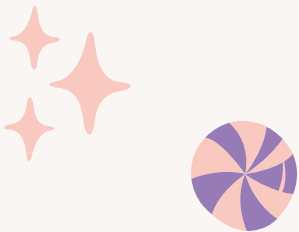

DONKEY THERAPY PARK

T.E.X.A.S. Rescue is extremely proud of our recently donated Donkey Therapy Park! This was a class project from Leadership Granbury to help us with our support of Veterans, children, first responders, autism, reading and art programs, or anyone needing time to heal. And, we use it a lot!

A private and secure area where one can sit under the shades and observe the donkeys, or reach over the fence to pet them, depending on your comfort level. Or... we bring a donkey or two into the park for an up close and personal encounter. The donkeys encourage petting, hugging and conversation with all who visit. Folks who have had reservations about opening up to a therapist find it very easy to open up to our Therapy Donkeys. The major factor here is that there is no judgement from the donkeys, no matter what you tell them (although, they do like to be told that they look great today and that you love them).

We offer visits from schools, retirement facilities, special

needs programs, and so much more! Donkeys are referred to as 500 pound puppy dogs, and for good reason. Their intelligence level is equivalent to that of dogs and dolphins! They have an innate sense of knowing who is having a bad day and their natural ability is to comfort you! You have to personally experience these animals to understand why they are praised by human therapists for what they can accomplish with those that may be struggling.

A huge Thank You to all who contributed to our Donkey Therapy Park in an effort for T.E.X.A.S. Rescue to offer such a unique program to our community!

ABOUT T.E.X.A.S. RESCUE

T.E.X.A.S. Rescue is not only a rescue for horses, donkeys, and mules in Texas.
