THE PECAN PLANTATION LADIES GOLF ASSOCIATION a driving force for 50 years

Founded in 1974, the Pecan Plantation Ladies Golf Association celebrates 50 years this year. It cannot be overstated what an accomplishment this is, and how key the club has been to the members.

This year, all the activities of the association have transpired with a special nod to the history of the group and a fond remembrance of all they have shared. The club's fall golf tournament and luncheon was a joyous celebration with many past presidents and longtime members in attendance.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Mary Queen of Scots is credited with being the first female golfer, and actually one of the first golfers of either gender to play the game as we know it. During her reign (1542-1567) the famous St. Andrews Links Golf Course of Scotland was built, now considered to be the home of modern golf.

The St. Andrews Links Golf Course would also become home to the first ladies golf club in 1867. A club founded by women local to the area, most were wives and daughters of the men of the Royal and Ancient Club of St. Andrews.

The Royal and Ancient Club of St. Andrews was exclusively open to men until 2014, when the membership overwhelmingly voted to open membership to women for the first time in its 260-year history.

By the late 1800s, women were gaining respect as golfers in the United States though their garments were still restrictive. In 1917 the Women's Tournament Committee of the United States Golf Association was formed.

PECAN PLANTATION

A group of families led to the site in the 1920s by John B. Christenson formed a community known as Kristenstad, but the community had failed by 1938.

In 1949, O.P. Leonard bought the property and named it Leonard Bend. The Leonard Bend Pecan Farm grew to be home to 3,300 acres of orchard on the peninsula.

The building of the DeCordova Dam in 1966 literally changed the landscape of the county, changing entirely the future of the area.

The Leonard family began development plans to turn the farm into a residential community. The country club, golf course, airport and recreational areas were opened in 1971.

In 1974, just three years after the opening of the golf course, the Pecan Plantation Ladies Golf Association was formed.

PECAN PLANTATION LADIES GOLF ASSOCIATION

The Pecan Plantation Ladies Golf Association was created for the purpose of stimulating interest and promoting among its players the true spirit of keen and friendly competition.

PPLGA established three types of membership: full mem-





bership, social membership and honorary membership for those who have made an outstanding contribution to the PPLGA and are approved by the executive board.

Over time, the group became home to two divisions: the 18-hole group and a nine-hole group for beginners and newcomers. The purpose was to establish regular playdays and occasional tournaments for competition.

In the early days, they played from silver tees which were farther than the green tees they play from today.

The Pecan Plantation Ladies Golf Association was formed before the Pecan Plantation Men's Association which was formed in 1981.

PPLGA PRESIDENTS WEIGH IN

"Many of the men with homes in Pecan only lived or visited here on weekends, as they were still working (in the metroplex). They came out to play on weekends.

"Most of the wives, however, were not employed and either lived here full time with their children or could come to Pecan all week to play golf.

"These lady golfers formed friendships that led to them forming several social organizations including the PPLGA," shared Wynette Burns, PPLGA president, 2020.

"The LGA gave homemakers in Pecan both social interaction and competition and encouraged the development of the golf program at Pecan," Burns said.

It was the friendships among the ladies of Pecan Plantation that spurred the creation of the association, and the association continues to be a driving force in the community. PPLGA have sent care packages to members of the armed services, supported area high school girls golf, made donations to local charities and more.

"PPLGA is one of the most vocal and influential groups at Pecan and has been instrumental in supporting improvements and maintenance of our golf course and in welcoming and encouraging new players," offered Burns.

Betty Morgan, PPLGA president 1998 concurs. "PPLGA has been a source of joy for the entire 30 years that I have lived here. I have found the most supportive, kindest and joyous friends of my whole life."

Carol Bishop, PPGLA president 2023 explains it this way: "As a new member of the community, I was delighted to find out such a large group of ladies were members of the PPLGA. "That made for the perfect way to make new friends and link up with ladies with the same abilities that I had. "I am thankful for this organization and the opportunities it provides for the ladies of all ages and abilities."

PPLGA has remained loyal to its goal of encouraging friendly competition.

"It not only provided me with the knowledge of the rules of golf, but also the importance of playing in a competitive environment," said 2021 PPGLA president Kim Teague.

Teague explains, "The LGA has devoted members to keep us updated on all PGA rule changes, which assures we are all playing the same game — as we are all trying to improve."

"Competition breeds excellence. Good instruction (is) available to improve one's game," expounds Burns.

"New residents of Pecan from all over the country and all walks of life find community when they become part of our LGA. I knew one person when I joined 14 years ago but was immediately part of a loving, supportive group," said Burns.

PPLGA members experience camaraderie, friendship, competition and the challenge to remain active.

As Burns shares, "The last 14 years, when many my age

resign themselves to a rocker, have been so enriched by golf and our LGA. "I have had back surgery, and both knees replaced but have worked hard to get recovered so I could get back on the course and reunited with my golfing friends. Invaluable!"

PPLGA has even contributed to mental health with the forming of relationships, along with the physical and emotional wellbeing of members, such as the opportunity to socialize outdoors during COVID-19.

LOOKING FORWARD

Many traditions have been established and maintained through the years, such as the member/guest tournament which has grown from La Tee Esta to the 50th celebration held this past September.

"Pecan Plantation is a golfing community and as such, all lady golfers have and continue to contribute to Pecan's history and esteemed reputation," offered Clara Garcia, PPLGA president 2013.

"It has been such an honor to serve as this year's president. It is even more special that this is the 50th anniversary of the PPLGA. We have geared every activity to that theme, with the history of our club in the forefront," shared Marilyn Neely, current PPGLA president. "I am proud to celebrate the past 50 years and be a part of the next 50 years – our centennial."

GARDEN TIP

Using a fork for pulling weeds. Who knew?

A fork is actually a great tool for pulling weeds when they are small because of its thin prongs. The fork prongs can easily get into the soil and reach the roots - as long as you insert the fork near the base of the weed. Then, simply push down on the handle and lift. Be sure to wear your garden gloves when weeding.

BROWN BUTTER SAGE SAUCE

What better time for sage advice? This herb is often considered a main ingredient for stuffing. But here is a yummy recipe that can be used over vegetables, pasta, chicken, or white fish.

8 Tbs unsalted butter

1 large garlic clove, crushed and finely chopped

1/4 cup coarsely chopped fresh sage leaves

1/8 tsp ground black peper

fine salt to taste

Melt the butter in a medium saucepan over medium-low heat. When the butter begins to bubble, add the garlic. Stir for about one minute. Then add the sage leaves and continue stirring until the butter has turned very light brown, about two to four minutes.

WILDLIFE COMMITTEE REPORT

River ecology and deer count

Deer were counted over three Mondays last summer, and numbers were submitted to Texas Parks and Wildlife Department regional biologists for recommendations.

Their recommendations are based on what's considered "typical" habitat. Pecan Plantation is far from typical habitat.

There is one deer per each 6.14 acres. The buck-to-doe ratio is 2.77 does to each buck. Bucks make up 17.7% of the population, does are 48.9%, and fawns are 33.4%. Statistically, the estimate is 733 deer here.

Recommendations are to remove 60 bucks from the population, using non-selective means. It's been recommended to remove 200 does as well.

The PPOA Board of Directors has been advised of the recommendations.

The annual Dr. Barna kid's Trout Fishing Tournament is set for Dec. 30. Mark your calendar. Catchable-sized rainbow trout will be trucked in from a southcentral Missouri trout farm, much to the delight of those kiddos who will wrangle some of them. The pond at Hole #10 will be the site of this annual event.

The Pecan River Ecology Program (PREP) is gaining traction. A trainer with the Texas Stream Team came to Pecan Sept. 14 to teach volunteers how to collect and analyze river water samples, using special water testing kits. Sixteen of our neighbors participated in the training, which took most of the day. Each participant is now a certified citizen scientist, qualified to collect and analyze water samples from the river around Pecan.

On Sept. 28, volunteers Bob and Cindy Taber, Jason and Julie Hodges, Mark Barnes, Doug McDaniel, and myself traipsed around the river, gathering water and checking temperature, conductivity, pH, dissolved oxygen, along with field notes for six of the seven designated sites. The data was uploaded to the Texas Stream Team website, sponsored by the Meadows Center in San Marcos.

Monthly data collection will give us a baseline to begin understanding the river and then sharing it with the community.

Master Naturalists Tim Eschbach and Jason Hodges are collaborating on the riparian plant part of the ecology program. The goal is to have volunteers catalog plants along both sides of the river to see what types of plants and plant communities exist and watch how they change over the years. We'll report progress as it happens.

I am is spearheading the fisheries part of this program. We're awaiting the finalizing of a scientific collectors permit from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. Once that happens, we'll set a date for gathering fish and analyzing fish populations of the river.

- Never accepted at this location: refrigerators, TVs, tires, paints or other hazardous materials. Call the Operations office 817-408-3511 for more info.





PECAN PIE MAKES A PERFECT DESSERT THIS THANKSGIVING

A Thanksgiving dinner table can be a sight to behold. For foodies and others who love the array of comfort foods on display come the second Monday in October (in Canada) or the fourth Thursday in November (in the United States), Thanksgiving is a day to circle on the calendar each year.

While a mouthwatering turkey and sides like mashed potatoes and stuffing garner the bulk of the attention on Thanksgiving, the dessert table also can be a tempting place to direct one's eyes. - 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup light corn syrup
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon molasses
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F.
- 2. Spread pecans along the bottom of the prepared pie shell.
- 3. In a large bowl, mix the remaining ingredients and pour over pecans. The pecans will rise to the surface of the pie. 4. Bake for 60 to 65 minutes until the filling has set. Pie is done when the center reaches 200 F. Pie center when lightly tapped should spring back. Remove pie from oven and let cool on a wire rack for at least 2 hours.
- 5. Serve.

Total time: 3 hours, 20 minutes
