

COMPLIANCE CORNER

During October 2024, the compliance office received 66 calls and 35 emails reporting possible compliance issues, 41 calls and 19 emails regarding vacant property maintenance, plus 633 calls and 127 emails requesting ACC, plat/lot, rules, C&R or construction information.

HOME SALE NOTE Upon the sale or transfer of home ownership by any other means, Section-15 of PPOA Rules & Regulations requires residential property to be in compliance with all applicable elements of PPOA's governing documents. If ownership is transferred with an existing noncompliant issue, the new owner will be responsible for bringing the property into compliance. When it is requested by a title company, lending institution or prospective buyer, PPOA will perform a compliance inspection and return a report stating whether or not the property is in compliance and detail any deficiency if it is not. Since compliance certification requests are frequently received only a few days before the scheduled closing date, we remind members contemplating the sale of their home to help avoid any last-minute surprises or delays by contacting membership services at the PPOA business office to arrange an early inspection of the property to identify any existing issue that may require corrective action.



WILDLIFE COMMITTEE REPORT 'Tis the season. For hogs, that is

When winter rolls around, so do feral hogs. Folks along the river usually see the first wave, with porcine creatures foraging for food. When they hit your landscaped yard, you'll know it. They'll tear up turf, looking for grubs, crunching pecans, or whatever morsels they can root up.

Did you know that feral hogs live in every county in Texas? Yep, they do. According to Texas A&M's researchers, wild pigs do more than \$500 million in crop damages in Texas yearly. That number doesn't include damage to your yard.

Pecan's Daniel Van Patten reports that hog activity is a little bit down this year compared to years past. He's always on point to hear from any Pecan resident and as long as he can drive a truck with a trailer where the pigs are, he's good at trapping them.

Send him an email at hogs@ppoaweb.com. Give him your contact information and where the pigs are, and he'll get in touch and figure out a plan.

He said, "Typically, we see pigs first along Ravenswood, Bellechase and Bontura along the river. But we've seen serious hog damage in the Air Park and Nutcracker Golf Course over the years. They've even come up on the golf course near the club house and done some damage there."

Be sure to mark your calendars for Dec. 30 for the Dr. Barna Kid's Trout Fishing Tournament. Rainbow trout from Missouri will be stocked and ready for action. The annual event will be held at the pond on #10, starting that morning. Watch email blasts for updates.

The Pecan River Ecology Program is gaining traction, too. Water quality checks are occurring, with trained volunteers collecting samples from seven different sites, gathering data on water chemistry and water quality, and uploading them to the Texas Stream Team site for review from the public as well as TCEO.

A meeting is planned for January for everyone interested in volunteering to assist the ecology program. Riparian plant cataloging, water quality assessment, and fisheries assessment of the river are the primary goals for 2025, educating folks along the way about how the river works and what it vields.

While there are no plans to trap and harvest deer in 2024, the herd is being observed as new construction continues in the orchard. Their behavior patterns are definitely changing as deer adjust to the new conditions. In parts of Pecan Plantation, there are resident herds, but a significant number migrate back and forth across the river.

A report was made to committee members that someone in a golf cart was chasing Canada geese. Don't chase geese with a golf cart. Heck, don't chase geese on foot, skateboard, bicycle or unicycle. They are federally protected from harassment. Besides, have you ever had a goose turn around and chase you? They have been known to do that.

COUNTING DOWN IN TIMES SQUARE

Each New Year's Eve, thousands of revelers gather at the intersection of Seventh Avenue, Broadway and 42nd Street in the heart of New York City's "Time Square" to count down the final moments of the year. Millions more watch the festivities on television. This annual tradition is something people look forward to each December, with many making pilgrimages from far and wide to stand outside for hours just to be at the crossroads of the world. According to the official website of Times Square, people began celebrating New Year's Eve in Times Square in 1904. However, it wasn't until 1907 that the New Year's Eve ball made its first descent from a flagpole atop One Times Square. The first ball was made of iron and wood and featured 100 25-watt light bulbs. Designed and operated by signmaker Jacob Starr, the initial ball weighed 700 pounds and was five feet in diameter. A ball has been lowered every year since 1907, except for in 1942 and 1943 in response to a wartime "dimout" of lights in NYC. Today's Time Square ball is much larger than its ancestor. The modern ball is a geodesic sphere, 12 feet in diameter, weighing 11,875 pounds. It's also covered with 2,688 crystal triangles that have a special sparkling pattern and are bolted to modules containing 32,256 LEDs. The Times Square ball was born out of the tradition of using a ball "dropping" to signal the passage of time. The first ball of this type was used at England's Royal Observatory at Greenwich in 1833, dropping at one o'clock every afternoon so that ship captains could set their chronometers.






