A Message from Mayor Dave Hanson

HOW YOUR CITY WORKS

This is your city's 25th anniversary. Some of the highlights of the last 25 years are:

- Most importantly, DeCordova was created to have no city tax and may not be annexed by another city.
- The city purchased the original marquees in 2008 and updated them with modern technology in 2021.
- Our city was instrumental in obtaining the stop light at the front gate.
- Your city has provided enhancements for our security including gates, cameras, radios and multiple security vehicles over the years.
- Additionally, our city financially partners with the DCBE/Acton Volunteer Fire Department and EMS as noted in our financial report.
- Lastly, the city held the election to become a wet city.

We need to thank our past city councils during the past 25 years for actions, too many to mention, that have benefited our city.

We are a Class B city that is governed by a six-person city council consisting of five council members and a mayor. Council meetings are open to the public and are held at 7 p.m. on the third Tuesday of each month. The agenda as well as all reports can be viewed on the website citydecordovatx.org.

CITY INCOME AND EXPENSES As noted, the city does not tax its citizens. The income for the city is derived from franchise fees paid for by United Coop Services for their utility access. We collect this fee for electric as well as Internet annually. We recently renegotiated a 10-year contract. The city also collects sales taxes based on liquor sales that are collected by the owners' association and paid by the state of Texas. Investment

interest is another source of income. As noted in the budget, the city funds Hood County Animal Control for services in our city, DCBE Security, DCBE/Acton Volunteer Fire Department and EMS.

As we look to the future, the city will work with the owners' association to make safety for all citizens, children, walkers, bikers and skateboarders a priori-

The owners' association also collects revenue from Spectrum, a private compa-







WHAT IS CONGESTIVE HEART FAILURE?

By Lake Granbury Medical Center

"Congestive heart failure (CHF), often referred to simply as heart failure, is a chronic condition in which the heart's ability to pump blood effectively is diminished," mentioned Dr. Levi Rice, general and interventional cardiologist at Lakeside Physicians. "This leads to inadequate blood flow to meet the body's needs, resulting in a buildup of fluid in the lungs, legs and other tissues."

CHF is a serious and progressive condition that requires medical attention and lifestyle management.

CAUSES OF CONGESTIVE HEART FAILURE

CHF develops when the heart becomes too weak or stiff to function properly. Common causes include:

- Coronary Artery Disease (CAD): Narrowed arteries reduce blood flow to the heart muscle.
- High Blood Pressure: Over time, increased pressure can strain the heart.
- Heart Attack: Damage to heart muscle can impair its pumping ability.
- Valvular Heart Disease: Faulty heart valves can lead to inefficient blood flow.
- Cardiomyopathy: Diseases of the heart muscle, often from genetic factors, infections or alcohol abuse.
- Arrhythmias: Irregular heart rhythms can reduce pumping efficiency.

SYMPTOMS OF CONGESTIVE HEART FAILURE

CHF symptoms can vary depending on the stage and severity of the condition but often include:

- Shortness of breath, especially during physical activity or lying flat.
- Fatigue and weakness.
- Swelling (edema) in the legs, ankles and feet.
- Rapid or irregular heartbeat.
- Persistent coughing or wheezing, often with white or pink-tinged mucus.
- Sudden weight gain from fluid retention.

TYPES OF HEART FAILURE

- Left-Sided Heart Failure: The left ventricle fails to pump blood efficiently, leading to fluid buildup in the lungs.
- Right-Sided Heart Failure: The right ventricle cannot pump blood effectively, causing fluid to accumulate in the lower body.
- Biventricular Heart Failure: Both sides of the heart are affected.

TREATMENT AND MANAGEMENT

While CHF is a chronic condition, treatment can help improve quality of life and slow progression:

- Medications: ACE inhibitors, beta-blockers, diuretics and other drugs can manage symptoms and improve heart function.
- Lifestyle Changes: A low-sodium diet, regular exercise, quitting smoking and managing weight are critical.
- Medical Devices: Pacemakers or implantable defibrillators may be used to regulate heart rhythms.
- Surgical Options: In severe cases, procedures like coronary bypass surgery or heart transplants may be necessary.


"Congestive heart failure is a complex condition requiring a comprehensive approach to treatment and management," Dr. Michael Ibe said, general and interventional cardiologist at Lakeside Physicians. "Early diagnosis and adherence to medical recommendations can help individuals live longer, healthier lives despite the challenges of CHF."






ARTICLE XI - VOTING PROCEDURES

The Board of Directors shall designate the time, place, and methods for voting, in accordance with current Texas Property Code Laws requirements. The Board shall publish and provide notice and procedures for voting to each member of the Property Owners' Association, for purposes of an Association-wide election or required membership vote, or each member of the Property Owners' Association entitled under the Dedicatory Instruments to vote in a particular representative election, for purposes of a vote that involves election of representatives of the Association who are vested under the Dedicatory Instruments of the Property Owners' Association with the authority to elect or appoint Board members of the Property Owners' Association. (Item 3-May 2006)

A member may vote on any issue properly presented by the Board or designated in a Notice of Meeting, as set out in Article VI, Section 4, for any Annual Meeting or Special Meeting as required in this Article. No less than ten (10) days before the Annual Meeting or any duly called Special Meeting, the Association shall prepare and mail to all properly designated members an official ballot describing the issues to be voted upon at such meeting and shall provide a place for the member to register the members' vote relating to such issues. Each member shall receive one ballot for each Lot or Multifamily Lot owned by the member.

Notice of the proposed voting and elections shall be communicated as follows:

- (1) Mailed to each member not later than the 10th day or earlier than the 60th day before the date of the meeting in which the voting or election is to occur; or
- (2) By posting the notice in a conspicuous manner reasonably designed to provide notice to Property Owners' Association members:
 - (a) In a place located on the Association's common property or, with the property owner's consent, on other conspicuously located privately owned property within the subdivision; or
 - (b) On any internet website maintained by the Association or other internet media; and
 - (c) Sending the notice by e-mail to each owner who has registered an e-mail address with the Association.
- (3) For an election or vote of members not taken at a meeting, the Association shall give notice of the election or vote to all owners entitled to vote on any matter under consideration. The notice shall be given not later than the 20th day before the latest date on which a ballot may be submitted to be counted.
