During October, two counties in the state had unemployment rates below 5%, 90 counties had rates of 5% or greater, and three counties recorded rates of 10% or higher.

Williamson County had the state's lowest unemployment in October with a rate of 4.6%, which is up 0.8 of a percentage point from its revised September rate of 3.8%.

Shelby County recorded October's highest jobless rate in Tennessee. At 11%, the county's unemployment increased by 0.7 of a percentage point when compared to the previous month's revised rate of 10.3%.

Regionally, Smith County had the lowest unemployment rate at 5.5%, a 1.1 percentage point increase from the previous month.

Overton County had a jobless rate of 6%, nearly two percentage points higher than September's rate.

Jackson County had an unemployment rate 7.4%, a 1.6 percentage point increase.

livery of the Pfizer Inc. COVID-19 vaccine now under development. This program is designed to address distribution challenges posed by requirements for ultra-cold storage of the vaccine.

"We have a robust plan in place for distribution of this vaccine, and we're honored to be chosen to help establish a model for other states in providing COVID-19 vaccine to their residents once it's approved," said Tennessee Health Commissioner Lisa Piercey, MD, MBA, FAAP.

Tennessee will participate in the pilot along with New Mexico, Rhode Island and Texas, states chosen based on their differences in size, population diversity and immu-

velopment of effective immunization programs for this COVID-19 vaccine.

Once the vaccine is approved, Tennessee and other states participating in the pilot will not receive vaccine doses earlier than other states by virtue of the pilot. Pfizer is working with Operation Warp Speed and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to ensure that following approval, their COVID-19 vaccine can be provided to those most in need as quickly and equitably as possible.

TDH in coordination with other state and local agencies submitted an initial draft of the COVID-19 Vaccination Plan for Tennessee to the CDC on

proved vaccines currently in development. Tennessee is preparing to begin distribution of COVID-19 vaccine as early as December 2020.

TDH is working to onboard hospitals, pharmacies, clinics and other partners capable of storing vaccine and administering it to priority populations. TDH will ensure distribution of vaccination sites across all 95 counties, especially in rural counties and areas with high concentrations of people in vulnerable populations. Presbyterian, United Methodist, and Episcopalians have all watched their church's doctrine change to follow the Supreme Court's ruling on same-sex marriage, while ignoring the Bible. When the apostles Peter and John were warned to stop teaching about Jesus by religious leaders, they responded in Acts 4:19 "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you more than to God, you judge. 20 For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard." Man's rulings went against God's commands. Peter and John said they have no choice except to follow God. Many churches do not feel the same way.

All churches are not the same. God wants us to teach the same thing. We can do it if we all commit to following the Bible. It may seem difficult, and sometimes it is, but God won't ask us to do something we can't do. 1 John 5:3: "For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments. And His commandments are not burdensome." Let us find the truth together. Come study the Bible with us and see what it says. Isaiah 1:18: "Come now, and let us reason together,' says the LORD."
