Senator Blackburn Calls On VA Secretary

Senators Jerry Moran (R-Kan.), Dan Sullivan (R-Alaska), and Thom Tillis (R-N.C.) urged Secretary Denis McDonough to work with Congress, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Department of Defense (DoD) to find solutions for veterans who were exposed to toxic substances during their service.

During the 116th Congress, key provisions from Sen. Blackburn's K2 Veterans Toxic Exposure Accountability Act included in the National Authorization Defense Act for Fiscal Year 2021 and Sen. Sullivan's legislation, the K2 Veterans Advocacy Act, were signed into law to collect more research regarding the long-term health of servicemembers who were stationed at Camp Stronghold Freedom at Karshi-Khanabad base (K2) in Uzbekistan. In addition, the fiscal year 2021 National Authorization Defense Act (Public Law 116-283) contains provisions relating to veterans who served at K2. Specifically, section 751 directs the Secretary of Defense to conduct a study on exposure to toxic substances by those deployed to K2, including identification of all substances present, an epidemiological study of the health outcomes of the K2 cohort, and any association between identified exposures and observed health outcomes.

These laws, coupled with Executive Order No. 13892 signed on January 19, 2021, which mandates a detailed assessment by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, in consultation with the Secretary of Defense, of the conditions at K2 between October 1.

I slid through the backdoor of the coffee shop and found Sarge discussing the lease with four new guys -- homeless veterans moving into the upstairs dormitory.

"And now we come to the most serious clause of this lease agreement," he was saying. "Theft. I'm a real hard case about theft, and I have my own definition of it."

He looked around the room and the guys were watching him warily.

"If you take a magazine off another guy's dresser, read it and put it back, you've committed theft, in my eyes. Theft of trust. You do not touch another man's stuff, ever."

Half an hour later, we all piled out the back door to a rental truck full of furniture and hauled bed frames, mattresses, dressers, lamps, nightstands and large cartons up the narrow staircase.

Sarge stood at the top of the stairs like a drill instructor interior deco-

rator, ordering the furniture placed in exact spots he'd marked out on the floor with blue duct tape. I popped open the boxes and the men took sheets, blankets, pillows and towel sets. In short order, the room was...beautiful. Three of them flopped onto their beds, groaning with comfort. One guy refused: "I won't touch it until I have a shower." Sarge cocked his thumb at the bath at other end of the finished attic and the guy took off, cradling his armload of towels like they were gold.

Later, Sarge and I stood in the cold outside the back door, the first snowflakes of the next storm swirling around us. "I hope I selected right," he said. "I originally thought I'd bring in six guys, but I wasn't sure about two of them. These four seem like the best combination for success. I hope they get along."

We heard thundering on the stairs as his formerly homeless renters came down to the kitchen to fix themselves some dinner. There was a lot of loud chattering -- and laughter. Sarge smiled.

How To Prepare A Garden For Spring

The final weeks of winter, and even the first and other debris may few weeks of spring, are have gathered in the still chilly in many parts of the world. Despite those last vestiges of the growth of plants and winter chills, late winter is a great time to begin preparing gardens for the coming planting season.

to withstand months of harsh weather each winter, and such conditions can take a toll. Gardeners can consider the following tips as they try to restore their gardens and get them ready for spring planting.

Disinfect Your Tools It's common to clean tools in late fall or whenever they're typically placed in storage for the winter. But cleaning and disinfecting are not necessarily the same thing. If tools were not disinfected at the end of Loosen Compacted Soil the previous gardening on the garden. Doing so can ensure any lingering bacteria or fungi on tool surfaces are killed prior to the beginning of gardening season. According to the University of Minnesota Extension, plant pathogens, including bacteria and viruses, can be transferred to and infect plants through bits left on shovels and pruner blades. Thoroughly disinfecting such tools prior to using them in the spring is a great way to reduce the risk of disease in your garden. **Clear Debris From**

Garden Beds

Leaves, twigs, sticks, garden over the winter. Such debris can inhibit vegetables, so make sure all of it is removed prior to planting. Weeds might even begin to sprout up Gardens may have in late winter and early spring, so remove them before they go to seed.

Test The Soil

Testing the soil prior to planting can help gardeners determine what their gardens will need to thrive in the coming months. Garden centers and home improvement stores sell home testing kits that are effective and easy to use. Once the results are in, speak with a professional at your local garden center about the best time to amend the soil.

Soil can become season, disinfect them compacted over winter. before doing any work If compacted soil is not loosened prior to planting, plants will have a hard time getting the water and nutrients they need to thrive. Loosening the soil also provides another opportunity to inspect the garden for any underlying issues, such as fungi or weed growth, that you may have missed when clearof soil and plant debris ing debris or testing the soil.

> Late winter is a good time to assess a garden and address any issues that developed over the winter so plants and vegetables can thrive come the spring planting season.
