## Arson Investigation Results In Arrest

An investigation by special agents with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and the Jackson County Sheriff's Department has resulted in the indictment and arrest of a Murfreesboro man on charges including theft and vandalism.

On May 5, 2019, TBI Special Agents and Jackson County deputies began investigating a fire involving tractors and other equipment on Bethel Park Road. During the course of the investigation,

agents determined that the fire was deliberately set. Agents developed information that tied Kevin Dyer to the fire scene and identified him as the individual responsible for the theft of equipment.

On Aug. 17, the Jackson County Grand Jury returned indictments charging Kevin Dyer, 39, with two counts of burning of personal property, one count of vandalism over \$250,000, one count of vandalism \$2,500 - \$10,000 and two counts of theft over \$1,000. Dyer was arrested on Aug. 30 and booked into the Jackson County Jail on a \$10,000 bond.

## Sheriff's Dept. Warns of Scam

The Jackson County Sheriffs Office warns everyone about a recent scam across the nation. People are receiving text messages from people claiming to be from (CJNG) Carten Jalisco Nueva Generacion.

The text usually threatens you with violence if you don't contact them, and they attach photos of mutilated human remains. They have been known to send a photo of your home or names of your children. This puts the person receiving the text in great fear. The reality is that this is just a scam to get you to agree to send them money.

The information they

get on you comes from the internet to include photos of your home from Apps like Google Earth and other media. The phone numbers are generated over the internet and do not actually trace back to any individual. These type scams are perpetrated overseas and are almost impossible to prosecute the offenders if they can be tracked.

Don't fall for this or any other scam. The first thing you should do any time you receive communication out of the ordinary, threats, money offers or any other unsolicited communication is to do a web search of the issue. Usually you will find that it is a common scam.

## Two Arrested For Burglary

On Aug. 17 the Jackson County Grand Jury returned indictments against Danny Garcia and James Wallace for multiple felony counts. Captain Dennis Thrasher presented the cases to the grand jury after an investigation of burglary and theft over \$60,000.

The investigation culminated into identifying Garcia and Wallace, with the assistance

of Tennessee Highway Patrol Criminal Investigations Unit and the Putnam County Sheriffs Office. Both individuals are from Putnam County. During the course of the investigation, Captain Thrasher learned that Danny Garcia knew the deceased victim and



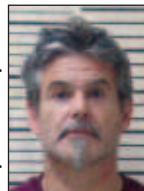

knew he had a large amount of expensive tools in the Big Branch area of Jackson County.

After the death of the property owner, Garcia and Wallace made trips to the property, taking expensive tools as well as a motor vehicle. Captain Thrasher worked with the executor of the property to identify over a \$60,000 loss to the estate in stolen property. Captain Thrasher was

able to recover the stolen vehicle and a large amount of tools at the home and shop of Garcia.

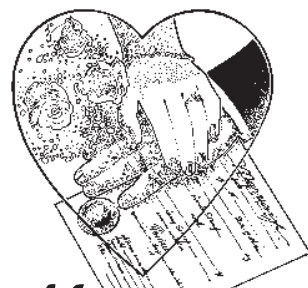

## Betty Jane "Janey" Dudney

Mrs. Betty Jane "Janey" Dudney of Gainesboro, age 81, passed away peacefully at home on August 28, 2020, surrounded by her family. She was born on September 25, 1938 in Rockwood, Tennessee and graduated Rockwood High School in 1956. She was a retired History and English Instructor at Tennessee Tech University and a member of St. Michael's Episcopal Church in Cookeville.

Mrs. Dudney earned her BA in English with honors from Tennessee Tech in 1963, where she was initiated into Phi Kappa Phi and served as President of the Sigma Tau Delta English Honor Society. She married Dr. Elijah Morgan Dudney on December 7, 1963 and the couple made their home in Jackson County. Mrs. Dudney returned to TTU in the 1980's and obtained Master's degrees in History and English while earning her 2nd degree black belt through Jack Scott's United Karate Studios. She taught both English and History at TTU during the 1990's. Mrs. Dudney was a gifted writer and a precise scholar. The last student to earn a Master's degree through the TTU History Department, her thesis advisor Dr. Larry Whiteaker encouraged her to write about the Civil War in White County. Whiteaker knew Mrs. Dudney was the great-great-granddaughter of Confederate General George Dibrell and thought the subject would be a good fit. Her resulting master's thesis "Civil War in White County, Tennessee: 1861-1865" would provide future scholars a valuable resource for their research of Upper Cumberland guerilla warfare and the Appalachian Civil War experience.

TTU History Professor Dr. Troy Smith cited her work in his narrative

history and also relied on it in his historical fiction work "Good Rebel Soil: The Champ Ferguson Story." Dr. Smith stated, "Her work gave me a genuine feel for what life was like in White County during that time. It remains the best source for that kind of information." University of Virginia at Wise History Professor Dr. Brian McKnight cited Mrs. Dudney's work extensively in his book "Confederate Outlaw: Champ Ferguson and the Civil War in Appalachia." Dr. McKnight stated, "Her work has played a major role in shaping how we view the Civil War in the Upper Cumberland." Mrs. Dudney authored a chapter on Jackson County's musical heritage in Dr. Lynwood Montell's Grassroots Music in the Upper Cumberland in 2006. She and Dr. Calvin Dickinson contributed a chapter on early medical professionals to the anthology "People of the Upper Cumberland: Achievements and Contradictions," named the Tennessee History Book of the Year in 2015.

Mrs. Dudney was active in civic affairs in Jackson County and the Upper Cumberland region. She was instrumental in starting the Girl Scout program in Jackson County in the 1970's and served in leadership roles with the Scouts both locally and regionally. A long-time volunteer for the Jackson County Election Commission, she worked on behalf of St. Jude Children's Hospital and served on multiple committees to benefit the public in Jackson County. She was appointed to the Highlands Residential Services Board of Commissioners in 2004 and served for twelve years, retiring in 2016. Mrs. Dudney served as Chair of the Highlands Board from 2012 to 2015.

Mrs. Dudney was preceded in death by her parents, U.C. Fulmer, Sr. and Katharine Mary Fulmer; her sister Mary Katherine Martin; and her brothers, Harold Young Fulmer and U.C. Fulmer, Jr. Survivors include her husband of 56 years, Dr. E. M. Dudney; daughter Jane Morgan Dudney Roberts (husband Jeff) and step-daughter Dr. Tina Dudney (husband

Mike); son Mark Dudney (wife Laurajane); brother, George Fulmer; two sisters-in-law; one niece; and six nephews. She had four grandchildren: Hannah Claire McCormack, Sarah Jane Dudney, John

Morgan Dudney and Rachel Katharine Dudney.

A private burial service will be held and **Anderson Upper Cumberland Funeral Home** is handling the arrangements. Due to the pan-

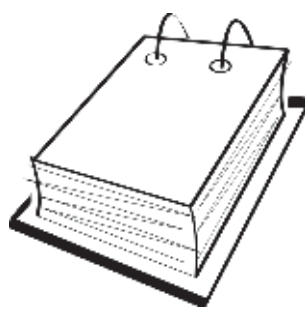

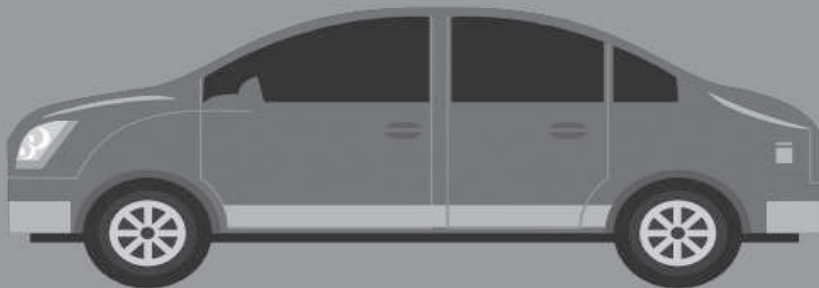

# Get Ahead Of Chimney Repair This Season

Woodburning fireplaces or fuel stoves can add warmth and ambiance to a home. These appliances are particularly coveted in the cooler months when people spend more time indoors. Maintenance is necessary in order for fireplaces and stoves to function safely, and that upkeep must include paying close attention to the functionality of the chimney.

Chimneys are designed to last for decades. Cracks and spalling in brick chimneys are common concerns that can cause significant damage if left unchecked.

Chimney maintenance involves more than cleaning the flue. Rather than running the risk of costly repairs, which can cost several thousand dollars, homeowners can

take some simple steps to keep their chimneys in tip-top shape. Certain components of chimney maintenance are do-it-yourself tasks, while others may be better left to the professionals.

### Start From The Inside And Ensure That Dampers Are Working Properly

When using fireplaces and other appliances, dampers need to be open to allow smoke to vent outside; otherwise, smoke will be trapped in the home and could lead to carbon monoxide buildup. Dampers need to be fixed or replaced if they are not operational. Replacement fireplace dampers should be snug and not have any gaps, states Vertical Chimney Care.

### Conduct A Visual

### Inspection Of The Chimney To Check For Any Cracks Or Spalling

Spalling is the wearing away of masonry due to water, weather and time. If enough of the material erodes, that erosion can adversely affect the structural integrity of the chimney. Some repairs can be made by patching up cracks or replacing missing bricks. Chimney tuckpointing is the process of repairing mortar.

### Think About Waterproofing The Chimney To Prevent Damage

A water sealant applied to the outside of the chimney can prevent moisture from breaking down the masonry.

### Inspect And Replace The Chimney Cap If It

Is Worn Out  
A chimney cap is a contraption that sits atop the chimney to allow the smoke to vent while also preventing critters and water from going inside the flue, helping to extend the flue life. The chimney cap attaches to the flue liner, so outside dimensions should be taken to ensure the cap is the right size for the chimney.

### Have The Chimney Swept

Sweeping helps remove the soot and debris that clings to the inside of the flue, known as creosote. The amount of time the fireplace is used will determine how often the chimney must be cleaned. Generally speaking, the chimney liner needs to be cleaned if it has 1/8-inch or more of soot.

Regular inspection

and maintenance can help keep a chimney working safely for decades. For those who do not like working at such an elevation, leave exterior chimney repair to a certified professional.

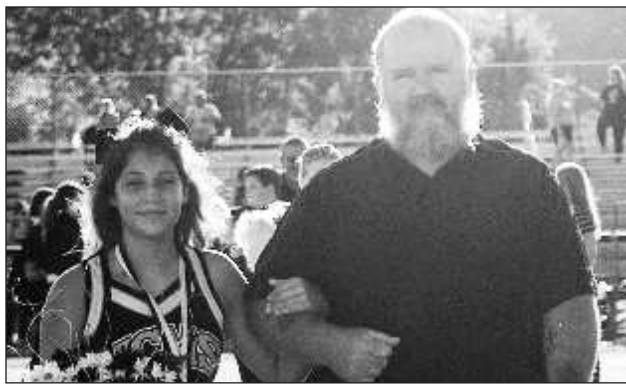

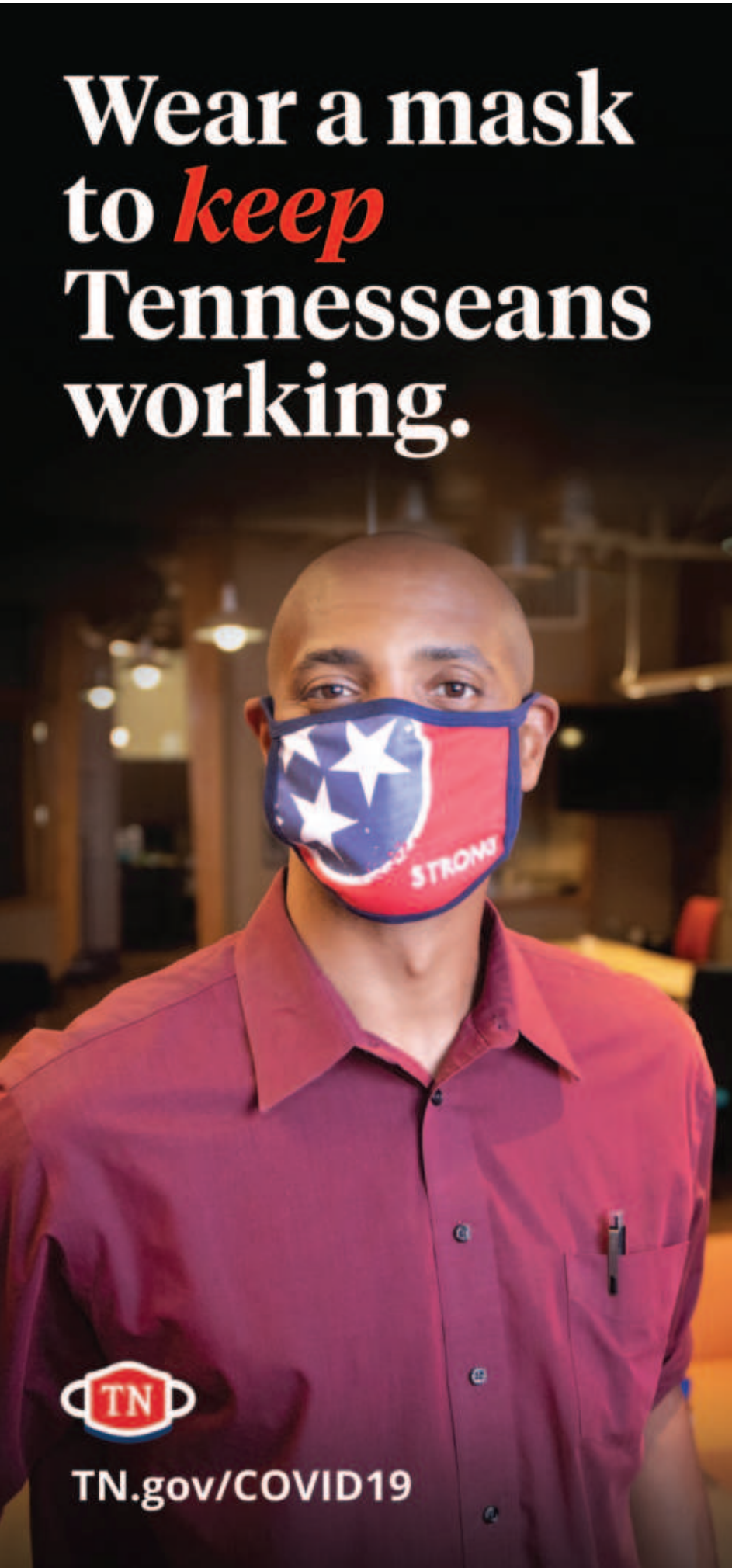

# Economists Expect To See Expansion Of Soy Exports

One might question how COVID-19 and U.S. Soy exports are related. For many, this might be a far stretch, but not for Tanner Ehmke, an economist with CoBank Knowledge Exchange.

While coronavirus continues to grow around the world, especially in the United States, some areas of the world appear to have gotten it contained.

While those economic forecasts look much brighter, unfortunately, we can not say that for the United States, Ehmke said during his presentation that was part of the opening session of the U.S. Soy Global Trade Exchange and Specialty Grains Conference.

“This has a huge impact on the outlook for the economic recovery for the United States,” Ehmke said. “This means many areas will remain closed, or are reclosing ... severely clouds the outlook.”

Going forward, Ehmke said this means we can expect a struggling U.S. economy until a vaccine is developed and deployed across the masses.

As such, the U.S. Federal Reserve has injected an unprecedented amount of liquidity into the world economy, he explained, noting that the Fed has led the world in its quantitative easing.

“All of this added together (gloomy economic outlook, increase in liquidity, political gridlock, 2020 election) — all this uncertainty has created a depressing outlook for the U.S. dollar,” he said. “Some economists even have a 30% drop in the value of the U.S. dollar.”

“Therefore, it stands to reason if we have a weakening of the U.S. dollar, it means we could have a more bullish outlook on soybean exports and soybean prices.”

Outside of the United States, Ehmke pointed to the Baltic Dry Index (BDI), which has been recovering and is a positive signal of global economic expansion. Ehmke believes the world economy outside of the U.S. has seen the worst of COVID.

He said the Brazilian Real has been strengthening; whereas, in Argentina, the Peso has been weakening along with Paraguay’s Guarani.

“The fact that the Brazilian Real is strengthening while the U.S. dollar is weakening, this is an advantage to U.S. exports and a headwind to Brazilian exports going forward,” Ehmke said.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s most recent report, it expects record high soybean production around the world and unprecedented availability.

Ehmke said global soybean trade is also seen as moving to a new record, much of which is due to the United States.

USDA expects U.S. Soy exports to rebound 29% year over year, while Brazilian exports are expected to be down 10% year over year.

China has increased imports from the United States just over last year, but still well down, Ehmke added, noting that a lot of soybean sales remain on the books for China as they close out the marketing year.

“We anticipate that China will continue to buy more soybeans from the United States as we move into the new crop and shipping season,” he said.

During the presentation, Ehmke presented with Will Sawyer, who spoke on the animal protein outlook and its impact on soybean demand. Stay tuned for Part II.
