Short Term Rental Occupancy Tax Info Only: County Clerk Brandon Stafford asked the commissioners for their help in informing the community that a business license and payment of occupancy tax is required by law in order to lease short term rentals, such as hotels, motels and AirBnB's. Currently, the county has received \$14,423 from the tax this year. County Clerk Stafford informed the commissioner that a business license is \$15 for the first year.
