

# Kirksville Arts Association showcases the local area's culture and diversity

n a city filled with talented artists, the Kirksville Arts Association's Sue Ross Arts Center, just off the square in downtown Kirksville, is the cultural hub of the local art community.

Throughout the year the arts center provides a home to local painters, quilters, photographers and craftsmen that live locally or have a connection to Kirksville.

In addition, the Arts Center sponsors performing arts, notably the Summer on the Square concert series on the lawn of the Adair County Courthouse, with popular local bands performing on Friday nights when the weather cooperates.

The organization, which traces its roots back to the first Red Barn Arts and Crafts Festival held in 1974, will celebrate its "Golden Anniversary" — 50 years — on Sept. 28 when Red Barn returns.

With approximately 200 members, Kirksville Arts Association President Linda Treasure can recall the very

first festival, which has become a city tradition and set in motion a course, through tragedy and triumph, that resulted in the organization's current residency in the "artistically" designed Sue Ross Arts Center.

"Red Barn was really the event that initially brought people together — and it was just a group of people who were interested in having an arts and crafts festival. It was originally held near the red barn on Truman campus," Treasure said, noting that from those roots, the Red Barn "name just stuck."

At one time Red Barn was a twoday festival but with that came many obstacles. Today it is a one-day affair coinciding with Truman State University's Family Day and the Kiwanis

Club's Farmer's Market, with dozens and dozens of artists and craftspeople selling their wares at locations around the courthouse square and the surrounding streets.

But from that one successful festival, the Kirksville Arts Association has greatly expanded their offerings, with year-round exhibits and shows for 2024.

They opened the year with the Regional Artist Exhibit that continues to run through Feb 23. From March 4-22, they will host Clifford Lewis Warner's "The Roaming Artist" with an opening reception on March 7 from 5:30-7 p.m. The KHS Exhibit opens April 1 and runs through the 11th with a closing reception on April 11 from 5:30-7 p.m. The Regional High School Showcase will run from April 16-25 with a closing reception and awards presentation on April 25 from 5:30-7 p.m.

Other events include the Truman Graphic Arts Capstone in May; the Walker Family Exhibition that runs from May into June. The annual "Thank You for Your Service Photography Exhibit" in July and August; the annual "Hands of Friendship Quilt Guild" show in September and October; and the Holiday Marketplace that takes place during the holiday season, November/December.

Several more events planned for 2024 include the Barn Quilt Painting Workshop on Feb. 17; a Basket Weaving Workshop in either March or April; Tea to Remember on April 21; and the Summer on the Square concert series that kicks off in June and runs through August.

According to Treasure, the mission of the Kirksville Arts

Association is to "celebrate, foster and share the arts" with a vision that residents and visitors to the community become engaged with and develop an interest and an appreciation for the arts.

"People may not recognize the importance of the arts in their life until it's no longer there," Treasure said, noting the time the organization's original building burned down and with it a lot of valued works. Saved though, was much of tile mosaics that graced the outside facade of the building. These works line the hallway walls of the Sue Ross Arts Center, between the main floor and the stairs leading to other showcase rooms.

"I think when people saw there was the possibility of that all being gone, then I think people realized, 'Hey, I like that. You know, I may not have spent a lot of time going in and seeing the exhibits or being involved with the arts, but I want it there in case I do want to become involved."

The Sue Ross Arts Center is open Monday through Friday, 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. They can be reached at 660-665-0500 or kirksvilleart@gmail.com.

According to John Gardner, an organizer of the event, members of the community from the city of Kirksville, Truman State and A.T. Still University, all came together as a part of the city's Think 2040 strategic plan, which is made up of groups that address community issues. This particular subcommittee was exploring more community cultural events and thus was born the Diversity Festival, a way to bring community members together.

"The idea is to share the breadth and depth of the diversity of our Kirksville community," Gardner said in a 2022 interview.
