omecoming in Kirksville! With Kirksville High School and Truman State University both celebrating Homecoming, local folks can enjoy two parades and two really great football games.

According to a story in Wikipedia, both the board game "Trivial Pursuit" and the popular game show, "Jeopardy!" claim the University of Missouri's 1911 football game was the first Homecoming in the country, a battle that pitted Mizzou against its border rivals, the Kansas Jayhawks. According to the legend, the event was dubbed "Homecoming" when Mizzou Athletic Director Chester Brewer invited all alumni to "come home" for the game in 1911. The celebration also included a parade and spirit rally with a bonfire.

Researchers at the Adair County Historical Society found the first mention of Homecoming at Kirksville High School in the 1948 Yearbook. There may have been a Homecoming prior to 1948, but due to the country being at war in Europe and the Pacific since 1941, the school district did not print a yearbook due to all resources being routed to the war effort. With most young men joining the U.S military, it was rumored that Kirksville didn't even field a football team during the war years as the young men of that era left school to join the troops in battle.

For many years Homecoming served as a call to alumni to return to the campus and reunite with old friends and teammates. There were pep rallies at school, bonfires held prior to the game, a parade in the streets, the crowning of the Homecoming Queen, King and their court, the football game and a dance to cap it all off. Many came to their class reunions held during Homecoming.

Other activities included the snake dance, where a long, long line of dancers holding

hands would follow the leader across a field, zig-zagging their way around and often running in circles.

**Activities then were** held on a Saturday, as was the game. Robinson Field, where many activities would take place, was on the land east of where Hy-Vee currently sits, though the games would be played at Stokes Stadium on what was then the Northeast Missouri **State University.** 

Games were played during the day because there were no stadium lights back then and Homecoming lasted all weeked with the dance at the armory wrapping things up.

While it was aimed at supporting the football team. some say Homecoming began in Kirksville as a way to welcome back the soldiers from WWII.



# Daily Express Fundraiser helps feed families

irksville's Hope's Kitchen will continue strong into its 25th year of operation with the help of The Daily Express' annual fundraiser, which traditionally begins in November and runs through early December. Since the Daily Express began organizing the fundraiser in 2001, it has raised more than \$136,000 for the kitchen.

The fundraiser is the main source of donations that Hope's Kitchen, which is run by ATSU medical students, receives. All of the money is used toward buying food and supplies.

The kitchen began in 1999 when Kirksville High School students Rachel Higgins and Megan Lesczynski started the volunteer effort.

The students make the free meals two Saturdays a month during the school year, August through May. About 150 meals are made and can be picked up or delivered. More than 100 ATSU students volunteer to cook, man the phones taking orders and delivering the meals.

To donate, people can bring money by or mail it to the Daily Express office, which is located at 705 E. LaHarpe Street, Suite F. With a minimum donation of \$1, donors can have their names published in each week's Daily Express fundraising summary, as well as in a giant Christmas card that appears in The Daily Express.

and comedy for the whole family.







Kirksville's Oscar Mayer plant has been part of the community for nearly 40 years. A \$250 million expansion of the


facility was completed in 2017, and the plant now employs more than The Kirksville plant produces 1,000 people in northeast Missouri.
