If you're looking for talented yet affordable entertainment, the Truman State University Music Department is your ticket to some of the best shows locally available. They present a multitude of concerts and recitals by students, ensembles, faculty, and guest artists throughout the year and at the various great venues on the school campus.

"We have a calendar of events that fills up pretty quickly each semester," said Victor Marquez-Barrios, Chair of the Music Department.

The program offers free concerts by school ensembles, including the symphony orchestra, several concert bands, jazz bands and combos, as well as several choirs and chamber ensembles, all with regularly scheduled concerts. Students also have to play recitals as part of their requirements. “All of these events are open to the public and they’re free,” Marquez-Barrios said.

He said that the large ensembles usually have better attendance, but faculty and student recitals are well attended as well when they are promoted actively and with enough time in advance. Most of the Truman State concerts are live streamed on YouTube, something that most Music schools do, especially after COVID.

Marquez-Barrios said that throughout the year they also organize a number of festivals, with one

of the most popular ones being the Jazz Festival, usually held in February and which also features a Lyceum event series special guest who usually works with the students as well. There is also a Piano Festival and student competition, with the winner receiving a full ride to study at Truman. There’s a Truman Brass Day in March, as well as an annual contemporary music festival in the fall: The North Star Music Festival.

“I often run into people that just didn’t know we had this to offer,” Marquez-Barrios said, noting that guests he has invited to attend a concert often stated they never realized it was this easy to listen to live music in Kirksville. “There’s a place in town that offers those performances on a pretty regular basis, at a really high level, and for free,” he said. As for the caliber of performances, Mar-

quez Barrios said that it is “super high quality.”

“Our faculty is fantastic and really has a lot to offer,” he said. “I mean, our faculty members often go and perform at national and international festivals and conferences, and they often present that same program here — so you get to see pretty high-level performances here. “Our student ensembles are great, too, and often featured at important national conferences and events.” He complimented the students’ work ethic and their commitment to the various department activities.


Torrey Court is currently a 35-bed Neighborhood with both private rooms and semi-private rooms. It also has its own dining room and courtyard.

Make sure you come and CHEER! May 29-June 1, Kirkville will be the site for the 2025 Special Olympics Missouri State Summer Games.

"We are elated to bring the State Summer Games to Kirkville for a weekend full of athletics, fun and community support" said Sharon Swehla, Kirkville Tourism Director.

The Special Olympics of Missouri announced Kirkville as the host in August after a statewide bid process.

Representatives of the city collaborated with Truman State University for Kirkville's proposal, which received letters of support from multiple entities.

"This was truly a community effort, and we should all feel a sense of accomplishment in coming together to make this happen," Swehla said. "Now we want to show that level of community support to the athletes and their families, so they know everyone in Northeast Missouri is rooting for them."

The Special Olympic Summer Games consist of powerlifting, swimming, track and field, and volleyball.

All events will take place at Truman. In addition to the competitions, the games will include the traditional opening ceremony, featuring the parade of athletes and the lighting of the torch.
