
Merrill Ice Reflections Figure Skating Club will be "Spinning Through the Hits" this weekend





Sidewalk snow and ice removal in the City of Merrill

As a reminder, if you live within the City of Merrill, Sec. 32-91 of the Code of Ordinances requires that anyone who owns, occupies, or is in charge of any land within the city that abuts any sidewalk must keep it clear of snow and ice. Snow and ice must be removed within 48 hours of when the snow stops falling and, if ice is such

that it can't be physically removed, it needs to be "sprinkled with material to accelerate melting or prevent slipping" (i.e., ice melt or sand).

None of that snow and ice can be pushed, shoved, or otherwise deposited onto a public street, alley, sidewalk, or public use land unless it directly abutts a premises, the ordinance says.

Property owners will be notified to remove sidewalk snow and ice if they fail to do so, but if they don't after receiving that notice, then the City will take charge of the removal and charge the property owner a special assessment for doing so, at a much higher rate than typical snow and ice removal would normally cost. The reason? The Street Department isn't staffed or in the business of clearing sidewalks and driveways, so the intent is for property owners to take care of it on their own, in a timely manner.





Bluejays win one and lose one but Coach Pieper calls it a good week for Boys Varsity Basketball

On Thursday, Feb. 2, 2023, the Merrill Varsity Basketball Team traveled to Northland Pines for a match-up between the Bluejays and the Eagles.

"Pines is one of the best teams in Division 3," said Troy Pieper, Merrill Varsity Boys Basketball Head Coach. "They have a real shot to make it to State this year, and are one of the more complete teams in the area. It was a good test for us on the road, and while we didn't get the win, I am very happy with our effort on defense and executing what we wanted to execute on the defensive side of things.'

"We took a different approach with them from others this year," he said. "We played them this summer, and they didn't have their PG Nolan Lurvey, and we beat them. So our plan was to do whatever we could to take Lurvey out of the equation, and we did just that. He's one of the best allaround players in the area and a 1,000-point scorer. We held him to 0 points, so we did exactly what we wanted to do."

"The plan on defense gave us the best chance to win," Pieper said. "Just two nights earlier, they put up 80 points and beat Wausau East 80-39, who we had beaten in overtime the week prior. So holding a team like Pines to just 56 points is what will give you a chance to upset them."

"The only issue is we had is this was by far our worst shooting game of the year," he said. "We managed just 36 points, and just 14 in the second half. We got good looks, we were patient on offense and made them play defense for long possessions; however, we just couldn't get the shots to fall."

"We shot our worst % of the year," Pieper said, "And it's unfortunate, because if we shot even close to our season averages, we probably could have pulled off the upset."

"But there will be nights when shots don't fall, and our defense did their best to keep us in the game for as long as they could," he said.

"It looks like a blowout loss; however, we were down just seven at the half, and the first half was a back-and-forth game until the final stretch of the half when they went on a little run. We talked about the first five minutes of the second half and how important that was, but Pines again went on another run to start the second half, and we just couldn't get a run of our own at any point."

High scorers for Merrill were #23 Tyson Glisch (14 pts. 1 FT, 3 3pt, 1 ast), #3 Bradyn Pieper (8 pts, 2 3pt, 1 ast), and #35 Troy Mootz (4 pts, 2 FT, 3 ast).

But on the defensive side, EJ Weix was the standout player of this game. "EJ Weix showed he can handle guarding the best players tonight," Pieper said. "I gave him the assignment to shutdown Lurvey, and he answered the calling and really dominated on the defensive end. It was fun to watch EJ accept and deliver on the challenge. He will have more of those opportunities down the stretch for

Stewardship **Friends Grants** approved for two **Council Grounds** State Park projects

On Friday, Feb. 3, 2023, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) announced the approval of Stewardship funding for Friends Grants to 25 non-profit organizations for improvement at DNR properties across the state. Governor Evers' State Building Commission approved the funding, which includes 29 projects for a total of \$326,600 in Stewardship grants, leveraging \$371,500 in matching contributions and \$3.4 million in total project

Two of those approved projects are local to Lincoln County and will take place at Council Grounds State Park near Merrill. The following projects were approved and will move forward in the grant award process:

- Friends of Council Grounds State Park Brown Trail Loop Invasive Species Removal
- Friends of Council Grounds State Park Develop Blue

The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Fund was created in 1989 to preserve important natural communities, protect water quality and fisheries, and expand opportunities for outdoor recreation. Within this program, a portion of Stewardship funds from the state's biennial budget is used to support important recreational projects and improvements at state properties. Many construction and property development projects at DNR's state parks, trails, forests, and other state lands are made possible with the Stewardship Program's annual funding.

Stewardship funds support several DNR-administered grant programs, including grants to DNR Friends Groups. Through the Stewardship Friends Grant Program, the DNR partners with Friends Groups and nonprofit conservation organizations to improve facilities, build new recreation projects, and restore habitat on state properties.

Each year, \$500,000 from the Stewardship Program is set aside for grants to Friends Groups and nonprofit conservation organizations. The DNR recognizes the important role Friends Groups play in meeting the development and restoration needs of state properties.


