Merrill Fire Department hosts fourth graders

On Thursday, March 16, 2023, the Merrill Fire Department (MFD) hosted a lunch and tour for Mrs. Lisa Hass's fourth grade class from Washington Elementary School in Merrill. The tour was part of a bigger fire prevention and fire safety education program.

"In October, Merrill Firefighters visited every kindergarten to fifth grade class in Merrill to provide them with fire safety education," Mrs. Hass said. "Each class was assigned homework to complete with their families, with tasks ranging from checking smoke detectors to practicing a home escape drill. If all the students in class completed their fire safety homework, the class was entered into a drawing to win lunch and a firehouse tour."

That homework is important, and working with young students who share what they are learning about fire prevention and safety with their families expands the reach of fire education in the community. It increases the number of families in the Merrill area who are taking critical steps-like ensuring there are working smoke detectors throughout their homes, having home evacuation plans and a meeting place established and known by all family members, and taking other fire safety measures. It also helps children become comfortable with fire fighters and emergency personnel so that, in the case of an emergency, they do not fear them but recognize them as being the people who are there to help.

"We utilize these firehouse tours and lunches as a way to motivate the students to complete their Fire Safety homework," said John Kraegenbrink, MFD Division Lead for Public Education. "We give students tasks including a

Home Safety Checklist, smoke detector checks, and fire evacuation plans as a vital way to keep our community safe. The students work their way through fire safety education and they become our Jr. Firefighters. They bring our message into their homes to their families. When we ask students to create a home evacuation plan and practice it with their families, moms and dads are happy to jump in and do it with their kids."

Mrs. Hass's class was thrilled to learn they were the winners of the drawing for lunch and the MFD tour.

During the tour, kids got the opportunity to explore and learn more about the life of firefighters and emergency medical personnel who serve the Merrill community and surrounding area, as well as the equipment they wear and use to perform their duties. They got to see and learn more about the jaws of life, and they explored fire trucks, ambulances, and emergency vehicles at the station. They got to see, explore, ask questions about anything and

everything, and learn in an up-close and personal way, the way most kids learn and retain information the best.

"The students were interested to see where the firefighters sleep and eat while they are on duty," Mrs. Hass said. "They were really impressed when they were allowed to crawl through the emergency vehicles in the truck bay."

"The fire station was awesome," said Christopher, a fourth grade student in the class. "They let us get in the emergency vehicles. My favorite was the giant ladder truck!"

Students also learned that firefighters and EMT's respond to more than just fires.

Firefighters demonstrated how the jaws of life can crush something huge or be very precise and crush a little pop can. "The kids thought it was very cool!" said

Friske appeals to Evers for Pine Crest Nursing Home support

County being asked to pay \$1.1 million+ 2022 operating shortfall due to changes in State revenue TINA L. SCOTT EDITOR

On March 17, 2023, Lincoln County Board Supervisor Don Friske sent a letter to Gov. Tony Evers in Madison appealing to him for support for Pine Crest Nursing Home.

Friske's letter explained that on March 3, North Central Health Care (NCHC) submitted a request to the Lincoln County Finance Committee for more than \$1.1 million to cover 2022 calendar year losses incurred operating Pine Crest Nursing Home.

While Lincoln County maintains actual ownership of Pine Crest, on Sept. 17, 2019, the County passed a resolution to outsource the administration and management of the nursing home. Lincoln County subsequently contracted with NCHC to manage the nursing home's operations starting in 2020. As part of the arrangement, Lincoln County as the property owner is still responsible for maintaining the building and grounds and must also make up any budgetary shortfall incurred in operating

Arraignment for Merrill man set for March 28

Lahti charged with felony Homicide by Intoxicated Use of Vehicle (2nd+) and other charge related to crash that took the life of an 8-year-old Gleason boy in Sept. 2022


John James Lahti, age 42, of Merrill will be formally arraigned in Lincoln County Court on Tuesday, March 28, 2023, charged with Homicide by Intoxicated Use of Vehicle (2nd+) and Causing Injury/Operating While under the Influence (1st) (PAC<0.15), the first a felony charge and the second a misdemeanor. The charges are the result of a crash that occurred early the evening of Saturday, Sept. 17, 2022, when the truck Lahti was driving hit another vehicle head-on, on State Hwy. 17 near Sunset Rd. in the Township of Merrill. That second vehicle was occupied by a family of four, and the collision resulted in the death of an 8-year-old Gleason boy and serious injury to his mother, who were

an emergency situation better."

Tomahawk man, 93, facing four felony charges related to child sexual assault

A Tomahawk man is facing four felony charges related to child sexual assault.

Glenn C. Wagner, 93, was arrested on Tuesday, March 7, 2023, as part of a Tomahawk Police Department investigation into incidents of sexual assault that reportedly occurred at a private property near Birchwood Ave. in the City of Tomahawk.

Wagner is charged with felony counts of first degree child sexual assault, repeated sexual assault of the same child, child enticement, and exposing genitals to a child.

According to court records, the offenses occurred on June 1, 2018.

Wagner appeared in Lincoln County court on Wednesday, March 15, where Judge Robert R. Russell determined that there is enough evidence for the case to proceed to trial.



In a post on the Tomahawk Department's Facebook page, Chief Al Elvins said several other victims have been identified, department "seeking additional information regarding those incidents and victims.'

Elvins said his "primary goal" is to "always protect Tomahawk residents and provide a safe community."

"The Tomahawk Police Department would like to thank everyone for their continued support

cooperation," the post stated.

Individuals with information regarding these incidents or similar activity that has occurred within the City of Tomahawk are asked to contact Detective Matt Gorell at the Tomahawk Police Department.

Wagner was scheduled to be back in court at 9:45 a.m. on Wednesday, March 22, for an arraignment.

passengers, along with minor injuries to a sibling and the boy's father who was driving.

Lahti sustained minor injuries from the accident. was treated at Aspirus Merrill Hospital, and was then arrested by the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office.

Lahti made his initial appearance on Sept. 19, 2022. At that time, Lahti appeared from the Lincoln County Jail via video conference and Judge Robert Russell ordered Lahti be held on \$500,000 cash bond and cited additional restrictions in the event he is able to post bond and be released.

Since that time, Lahti retained legal counsel and petitioned the court for a modification of his bond, but in a Dec. 21, 2022, hearing on the matter, the Court denied Lahti's request. On March 13, 2023, Lahti waived his preliminary hearing. On March 17, 2023, Judge Russell granted a motion for Lahti and his attorney to appear remotely at the March 28

arraignment. If convicted of the first charge, Lahti faces a fine of up to \$100,000 and up to 40 years in prison, or both, plus revocation of his operating privileges for five years. The penalties, if convicted of the misdemeanor charge. include a fine of not less than \$300 or more than 2,000 and not less than 30days or more than 1 year in county jail.

Complaint on record said **LAHTI** from page 1 an eye witness saw Lahti's truck cross the center line, coming straight at the vehicle it struck, and while the driver of the second vehicle took evasive action, trying to swerve into the other (oncoming) lane to avoid a crash with Lahti's truck, the front passenger side of both vehicles took the brunt of the impact.

The Complaint also said Lahti displayed many signs of being impaired by alcohol use when questioned on site, but declined to participate in standard sobriety testing and at times failed to respond at all. Ultimately, consented to a preliminary breath test, registering .290 Breath Concentration Alcohol (BrAC) at 7:55 p.m., approximately 30 minutes

after the crash, which put him at more than three times the legal limit at the time of the crash. A second test taken later registered .223 BrAC at 11:45 p.m. The legal limit in Wisconsin is .08 BrAC or Blood Alcohol Content (BAC).

The Complaint also stated, "In John's vehicle, Law Enforcement located a 1 liter Korbel Brandy bottle that was slightly over half full. The cap was unsealed and the liquid inside was dark and appeared to be brandy. Law Enforcement the unscrewed and smelled the liquor inside and it appeared to be consistent with intoxicating beverages."

Lahti was previously convicted of Operating While Intoxicated, first offense, on February 24,

Merrill former owner and CEO/CFO of recycling company sentenced to 33 months for federal tax crime

MADISON, WIS. - Timothy M. O'Shea, U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Wis., announced that Kevin Shibilski, 61, of Merrill was sentenced on Feb. 21, 2023, by Chief U.S. District Judge James D. Peterson to 33 months in federal prison, followed by three years of supervised release, for failure to pay \$858,101 in employment taxes to the IRS for tax years 2014-2016. On May 16, 2022, Shibilski pleaded guilty to failing to pay over employment taxes to the IRS from Pure Extractions Inc. and Wisconsin Logistics Solutions LLC.

Shibilski was a minority owner and CEO/CFO of 5R Processors (5R), which had locations in Ladysmith, Catawba, Glen Flora, Wis., and Morristown, Tenn. 5R was involved in the recycling of electronic equipment and other assets. Pure Extractions Inc. (Pure Extractions) was created by Shibilski in June 2014 to handle 5R's recycling operations. Pure Extractions took on all of 5R's recycling customers, warehouses and equipment, income flows from recycling, most of 5R's recycling employees, but none of 5R's debts. Wisconsin Logistics Solutions

LLC (Wisconsin Logistics) was created by Shibilski in February 2015 to handle 5R's trucking and logistics operations. Wisconsin Logistics took on most of 5R's trucks and equipment, drivers, dispatchers, pick-up routes, licenses, and all of 5R's income flows from trucking and logistics, but again, none of 5R's debts.

At sentencing, Judge Peterson found that the government presented overwhelming evidence showing that Shibilski had been in charge of 5R's operations and finances since March 2013, and had been the primary decision maker on which bills to pay and not pay, including not paying the employment taxes for 5R, Pure Extractions, and Wisconsin Logistics. Judge Peterson found that Shibilski had not sincerely accepted responsibility for his actions, noting that Shibilski kept blaming everybody else, including the IRS, his co-defendants, and other 5R employees for the nonpayment of the employment taxes. Judge Peterson added that as the CEO/CFO and part-owner of 5R, Shibilski was the person in charge

Reserve Component Maternity Leave (paid) available to **Wisconsin Soldiers**

"In a big win for Soldiers, Reserve Component Maternity Leave (RCML) is now available to Wisconsin National Guard Soldiers," said Staff Sgt. Alice Ripberger, in a press release on March 20,

"RCML authorizes traditional Soldiers to be paid for 12 unit training assemblies (UTAs) post childbirth, and they may use it flexibly in the year that follows. This leave is available for future drills and can be applied retroactively back to June 9, 2022, for any Soldiers who gave birth, did not attend drill, and did not get paid by their unit," she said.

Sgt. 1st Class Savannah Wanek — a state training manager and Parenthood, Pregnancy and Postpartum (P3) noncommissioned officer in charge - said she is excited to see this policy implemented into the day-to-day operations of units. On the surface, this change may appear to be minor in the grand scheme of policy changes, but the Wisconsin National Guard has never been able to pay its traditional Soldiers for maternity leave until now. By providing paid time off from drill requirements, the Wisconsin National Guard better supports Guard families, alleviates some financial strain, and reduces stress on its female Soldiers.

Shameless

A peculiar thing about gerrymandering is its shamelessness. Its shamelessness is underrecognized and underappreciated in the sense of refusing to see itself for what it is, how proud it is of its morality. Its very morality exudes shamelessness.

But how did shamelessness get to be so moral?

Gerrymandering is inherently undemocratic. It stacks the electoral deck. Wisconsin is so thoroughly stacked as to be a scientific experiment in political engineering.

What can possibly justify a deliberately imposed constriction of a more inclusive and participatory democracy?

Here we need to swing back to shamelessness itself in order to assess its morality. That is, gerrymandering is so patently immoral that the only way to deflect its immorality is to use political descriptors that portray gerrymandered voters as evil.

This shamelessness-and the strut and swagger that celebrate shamelessness—is what happens when a deeply immoral thing is "justified" (and therefore made "moral"). when those who want the immoral thing call themselves moral.

Gerrymandering is most immoral when it protects minority rule, neo-aristocratic wealth, and racial dominance. Understanding this evil requires careful examination. But advocates of the immoral thing call their effort good and

at 5R, which had a brother-sister relationship with Pure Extractions and Wisconsin Logistics.

Judge Peterson explained that a sentence of imprisonment was necessary in this case to send a deterrence message to two groups. One, business owners who willfully fail to pay their employment taxes and need to know their actions will have consequences and they will go to federal prison. Two, the general public who need to know that prison is not just for the impoverished or drug dealers, and that people who willfully fail to pay the IRS and use the tax funds for other purposes, will go to prison.

As part of the plea agreement, Shibilski agreed to pay monies towards the remediation of the leaded glass storage sites for 5R in Wis. and Tenn. in the amount of: (1) \$100,000 to the Wis. Department of Natural Resources, and (2) \$100,000 to Paint Oak LLC, Knoxville, Tenn.

Shibilski's co-defendant, Bonnie Dennee, pleaded guilty to conspiracy to defraud the U.S., relating to 5R's illegal storage of leaded glass. On Jan. 26, 2021, Dennee was sentenced to five months in prison. Shibilski's codefendant, James Moss, also pleaded guilty to conspiracy to defraud the U.S. relating to 5R's illegal storage of leaded glass, as well as conspiracy involving the failure to pay over 5R's employment taxes. On Nov. 23, 2020, Moss was sentenced to 18 months in prison.

The charges against Shibilski, Moss, and Dennee were the result of an investigation conducted by the Wis. DNR, Bureau of Law Enforcement, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Criminal Investigation Division, and IRS Criminal Investigation. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Daniel J. Graber.

Pine Crest Nursing Home. The Nursing Home Management Agreement specified everything is "done on behalf of the County and all related obligations incurred shall be at the ultimate expense of the County."

Gary D. Olsen, MPA, NCHC Executive Director, explained the reason for the \$1,126,328 (unaudited) shortfall for 2022: "This loss was due to the State changing how the Supplemental Payments were distributed and the reduction in the Certified Public Expenditure (CPE) payments," he said. "Without the loss of these revenue sources, Pine Crest Nursing Home would have ended the year with a gain."

"There is currently an effort to request the State reimburse county nursing homes the amounts of Supplemental and CPE funding as was received the previous year," Olsen said.

Friske's letter to Evers signifies Lincoln County is enjoining this effort.

"The request for over a million dollars from NCHC was generated from the elimination of an annual payment from the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS), Certified Public Expenditure payment (CPE), as well as a substantial reduction in the Medicaid Supplemental Payment program (SP)," Friske wrote to Evers.

"The budgeting process for county run nursing homes operated on a calendar year," he said. "Thus, the 2022 budget operational budget, as well as the 2023 budget, was contingent on anticipated funding based on prior years and anticipation to increased Medicaid reimbursement and no additional communication regarding any foreseeable impact. The loss of these funding streams this late in the calendar year left the nursing homes unable to make necessary adjustments to remedy the operational loss."

Friske said NCHC and Lincoln County are making adjustments to absorb this loss for 2023, but that still leaves the County with the more than \$1.1 million dollar loss for 2022.

"A request for an additional \$1,126,328 million dollars out of our (tax) levy of just \$15 million will be nearly impossible for our local taxpayers to cover," Friske said, "especially given the inflationary strains on all of the other services provided by counties on behalf of the state."

"Pine Crest Nursing home is home to over 85 individuals, each with specific care requirements and families counting on our staff to provide that care," he said. "Lincoln County has provided a nursing home facility for over 60 years positively impacting thousands of families. The cost of providing that care is becoming increasingly difficult and the elimination of the CPE payment and the reduction in the SP funding to rural Lincoln County makes it next to impossible."

"County-operated nursing homes are required to provide care under payment from Medicaid," Friske said. "The supplemental payment is intended to address low reimbursement rates and help make up shortfalls to the county budget ensuring continued operation of county owned nursing homes. The counties who had to make substantial changes to operations during COVID due to the financial inability to supplement losses through other means, were penalized as a result of the increased rates to the supplemental payment formula."

"To add a little salt to the wound, Dane County Nursing Home received a \$7 million dollar increase," he said.

"I do not believe it was the intent of your administration to target rural Wisconsin nursing homes," Friske wrote to Evers, "but intended or not, it impacts us the same."

He went on to request Evers' help with the dilemma this presents to Lincoln County, asking Evers to direct the Department of Health Services to reallocate the Supplemental Payment or in some other way make Lincoln County whole for the 2022 and 2023 annual county budget cycles.

"Additionally, I am asking that you provide clear guidance in an urgent timeframe on what counties can expect so we, as a county board, can make well-informed decisions regarding the feasibility of continuing to provide care for our residents," Friske said.

Olsen said NCHC is requesting payment from Lincoln County if these funds are not received from the State by July 2023.

"If the State does not increase the amounts of Supplemental or CPE funding by the July notice, then NCHC requests that Lincoln County pay \$1,126,328 (or the final audited amount) by July 31, 2023," he said.

Ad Hoc Committe on Pine Crest to report at March County Board meeting

On June 21, 2022, the Lincoln County Board created an Ad Hoc Committee on Pine Crest, as recommended by the Administrative & Legislative (A&L) Committee, to "1) Review the existing financial obligations concerning Pine Crest, and to review the prudence of any future contractual obligations concerning Pine Crest made by either signed contact or County Board resolution; 2) Review the original and current use of the Pine Crest building and grounds; 3) Review the Nursing Home Management Agreement and the Memorandum of Understanding (repair and maintenance of durable medical equipment and removal/ rearrangement of furniture) between Lincoln County and North Central Health Care as such documents relate to the building and bed licenses; 4) Provide a report to the Lincoln County Board of Supervisors outlining the past and current successes, failures and status of Pine Crest Nursing Home; and 5) Provide recommendations to the Lincoln County Board of Supervisors for consideration, detailing areas of improvement for Lincoln County's overall position concerning Pine Crest Nursing Home."

The Ad Hoc Committee, comprised of Ken Wickham (Chair), Marty Lemke, Bill Bialecki, Greg Hartwig, and Angela Cummings, has been reporting to the County Board monthly and was scheduled to present their findings at the March 21, 2023, County Board meeting.


