



## Galella and Raddatz charged with threats, intimidation of witness

Two Merrill residents, 22-yearold Vincent Anthony Galella and his 51-year-old aunt, Tia R. Raddatz, were each charged last week with two felony counts of threatening to accuse someone of a crime and intimidation of a witness, and a misdemeanor count of defamation, all as a party to a crime. They were each additionally charged with a misdemeanor count of obstructing an officer, and Galella was also charged with two counts of bail jumping. They have both been summoned to appear in court on July 28, 2023, at 1:30 p.m. to face the

If convicted of all these charges, Raddatz faces up to \$55,000 in fines and up to 12 years in prison or both, while Galella faces up to \$75,000 in fines and up to 24 years in prison or both.

The new charges relate back to Galella's May 9, 2023, arrest on charges of attempted first degree sexual assault and possession of a firearm while intoxicated.

According to the Criminal Complaint citing probable cause for the charges filed last week with the Lincoln County Court against Raddatz and Galella, Raddatz contacted the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) on July 11, 2023, "to report a historical

sexual assault" she alleges happened the evening of March 10, 2023, around 10:00 p.m. at Galella's birthday party. Raddatz told deputies a woman, who happens to be the victim Galella is charged with assaulting at gunpoint in May, was at the party, intoxicated, and kept knocking into her and slapped and grabbed her butt. She said she ignored the behavior and that it wasn't a big deal at the time "until she figured out who the individual

At that time, she alleges she told Galella about the incident, he told his attorney, and Galella said his attorney "urged" Raddatz to report the incident because the lawyer allegedly said it would "help as far as her character and credibility."

When the deputy advised Raddatz that it appears she was wanting to report this alleged incident in order to discredit the victim in Galella's case and asked her if she would be reporting the alleged incident if it had occurred where some other random female did this, Raddatz replied "probably not" three times. Yet, when she was asked what her wishes would be, if deputies could establish probable cause for her claim, "she indicated that she would like the victim arrested."

An investigator phoned Raddatz on July 12 with follow-up questions and learned Raddatz "did not know who the victim was at the time of the incident," but after her nephew was accused of crimes, she "viewed a photograph" of the victim in that case and then identified her as the person who had assaulted her in March. She decided to come forward to report it because Galella told her to, allegedly at the urging of his attorney.

The investigator then made contact with the victim in the original case that resulted in the initial charges against Galella and also met with her in person. During those contacts the victim said that "during the 4th of July weekend, she had overheard Vincent's aunt was asking around to people if they had talked with [her] about the incident ... and what [she] had said." She identified Raddatz as the person who was asking around about her and said she didn't know her or why she was doing that. The investigator noted he had not previously informed her of the name of the complainant in this current investigation.

The victim was asked about the incident Raddatz alleged, and she denied it had occurred and denied even being at the bar on the date Raddatz alleged she had been assaulted. Further, the investigator said the "victim went through her phone and provided evidence that suggested she

was most likely not at the bar on March 10."

The charges against Galella are in relation to Raddatz's report which was deemed an attempt to "knowingly and maliciously ... dissuade a witness ..." by virtue of the language in the charges, because she said Galella told her to report it to discredit the victim and her character. He is further charged with two counts of felony bail jumping because conditions of the cash bond he signed related to his intial felony charges includes the standard conditions that "Defendant shall not commit any crime" and "Defendant shall neither directly nor indirectly threaten, harass, intimidate or otherwise interfere with victim or witnesses in this action.'

## EAA AirVenture **Cross Country Air** Race celebrates 25 years on July 23

This year the flyover finish line is in Merrill

On Sunday, July 23, 2023, the 25th annual EAA AirVenture Cup Race will take to the skies.

The air race, which will begin at 9 a.m., weather permitting, will start when planes take off from the Wausau Downtown Airport and will end at the Merrill Airport.

Approximately 70 unique aircraftin 29 race classes will race more than 400 nautical miles following a route from Wausau around and up into Michigan's Upper Peninsula and around back to cross the finish line at the Merrill Airport.

Flyovers (and some landings) will include the airports in Manistique, Menominee, Escanaba, Shawano, Land Lakes, Sawyer, Wausau, Tomahawk, and Merrill.

Merrill residents will notice the heavier air traffic flying low over Merrill throughout the entire day.

Some of the fastest aircrafts will complete the course in about an hour, while others will take most of the day, crossing the finish line in Merrill in mid- to late-

Aircraft recovery will be at the Wausau Downtown Airport.

The purpose of the EAA AirVenture Cup Race is to provide pilots and aircraft builders an opportunity to race their aircraft in a safe and fun nvironment, all while promoting aviation in and over the communities where the races are held, organizers said.

From the very first EAA AirVenture Cup Race that took place in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, in 1998 with 10 aircraft, the race has now grown to be "major aviation event." It was created "in the spirit of recreating the old Bendix Trophy Race" and is dedicated to aviation advocacy and preserving

cross-country air racing, organizers said.

These days the event draws thousands spectators, including those standing out in their front yards and those gathering at the airports for a closer look at the planes where they fly low to clock their progress and may land, fuel up if necessary, and take off again as they compete in the race.

The EAA AirVenture Cup Race is held annually in advance of EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh, World's Greatest "The Aviation Celebration," and EAA's yearly membership convention. For more information, go to www. airventurecuprace.com, www.airventure.org, and www.eaa.org, or find them on Facebook.

A new furniture and mattress outlet opened in Merrill on Saturday, July 15, 2023

Merrill Furniture & Mattress Outlet, at 730 E. Second St. in Merrill, opened as a showroom for an economical line of furnishings and will follow a new business model.

"We will focus a lot on mattresses as well as a range of recliners, lift chairs, stationary and reclining sofas and sectionals, and power reclining furniture," said business owner Grace Weaver.

"There is a market demand for economy furniture in Merrill," she said. "While the other stores [in town] may offer some economy options, the economy market is not their primary market; they appear to focus a bit more on name brand furniture, so I saw the opportunity to offer some quality furniture at discount prices. I am especially focusing on mattresses, offering great prices on a quality range all American-made mattresses."

Weaver isn't new to the furniture market. Together with her husband, Tom Cimino, they operate a furniture and gun store in Tomahawk, but the Merrill store is Weaver's personal endeavor and will operate differently than most traditional furniture stores.

"I have always had an appetite for business," Weaver said. And "I have been formulating a mental plan for a while for a furniture store that would allow customers to shop without the assistance of a

sales person if they wished ... More of an internet shopping experience with a try-before-you-buy option." She is excited to see her dream coming to fruition.

Customers can mattresses purchase and furnishings directly from the store's website [merrillfurnitureoutlet. com] but, as many online shoppers know, it can be frustrating to order furniture they haven't had an opportunity to see, touch, and try out in person. That's

where Weaver's showroom comes in.

Customers can come to the store's showroom to view, touch, and sit in the furnishings available on the website. The actual furnishings in the store are not for sale but are samples of what customers can order online.

"All items in the store will have QR codes that link to the web listings, and customers can purchase entirely online and schedule delivery or pickup all

online," Weaver said. They can do all that while sitting right there in the store trying out the very item they want to purchase, for comfort, size, and fit, or when they get back home after they've pondered their purchase for a while. Pricing and other color options will be clearly posted.

"There will be wifi at the store and customers will be able to connect their devices to it if they are unable to use cell service," she said. "I am also investigating options

to place a kiosk where customers can place their orders,"

A visit to the Merrill store/showroom be a largely self-guided experience. Weaver said her experience working in the furniture business suggests customers like to browse and try out furniture without a salesperson hovering too closely, so they don't feel pressured. Her new showroom allows customers to browse at their leisure, try out and look at all the options, and complete their purchase according to their own timeframe.

"We have discovered in our business in Tomahawk that a large portion of our customers do enjoy without the shopping

assistance of a sales person," Weaver said. "I have also connected with people at the furniture conventions I attend every year who have successfully implemented this type of concept. Some of my reps actually find increased business at stores implementing this concept due to the unstressed shopping experience where the customer does not feel pressured to make a decision, as they might when dealing with a sales person."

"I am attempting to offer the online shopping experience that is popular among many of us younger people, as well as a






In 2021, Winona Avenue released their self-titled debut album on digital platforms. The album's sound is characterized by electric guitars and synthesizers along with lyrics



I did choose 911 with hopes that "they" would get here quickly. I knew we did not have much time. Dispatch was AWESOME, I said please HURRY, she said they were on their way! In about five minutes, two separate Sheriff Deputies arrived who assessed the situation. And within minutes I had THREE First Responders from the Town of Russell in my home and they immediately went to work. Then the ambulance arrived. We had HELP in our home in less than 10 MINUTES. THANK YOU to EACH AND EVERYONE OF YOU involved in helping my husband. He had a mini stroke, thank GOD it was not a "full" stroke, and is doing ok. To EVERYONE, know the signs of a heart attack and signs of a stroke. Call quickly, because we have some GREAT people out there from the LINCOLN COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT, "VOLUNTEER" FIRST RESPONDERS, and MERRILL FIRE DEPARTMENT to help you!.



## **QUESTION AND ANSWER**

#### Q: What is Crime Stoppers?

A: Crime Stoppers of Lincoln County, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit Wisconsin corporation with a board of directors of 11 Lincoln County citizens. Its sole purpose is to provide anonymous methods for citizens to assist law enforcement in solving crime.

#### Q: How does it work?

A: Since inception of Crime Stoppers of Lincoln County (CSLC) in 1997, an anonymous tip line has been provided for the reporting of crime information. In 2018 CSLC expanded to utilize new anonymizing computer software to allow tips to be reported to a tip center (p3tips.com) by e mail or smart phone app, and by use of a special button on the CSLC Facebook page. The original telephone tip line is now answered at a national tip center with anonymizing software. All three methods guarantee anonymity of the tipster. Tips are then forwarded electronically and immediately to appropriate law enforcement agencies in Lincoln County for action.

#### Q: How does Crime Stoppers benefit law enforcement?

A: There are two ways that Crime Stoppers tips can benefit law enforcement. First, soon after a crime it can help them with a prompt solution, apprehension, and recovery. In one recent incident a tipster witnessed a crime and promptly reported, which led to apprehension and recovery. Even long after an event, if a case goes cold, republicizing might trigger memory of someone talking about the crime or processing evidence of it, and a tip can solve the crime.

#### Q: What is the Crime Stoppers tip number?

#### Q: What is the Facebook address?

A: www.Facebook.com/CrimeStoppersOfLincolnCounty

#### Q: Is there another way?

A: Best contact is via the p3 App for your Smart Phone. It is a free app that can be downloaded from Google Play or Apple Store. Using your phone you can submit a tip and also send photos, video or documents.

#### Q: How is a reward authorized?

A: By the Crime Stoppers board reviewing the tip and its success with law enforcement and voting a reward.

#### Q: Will anyone ever learn my identity if I give a tip?

A: No, you will always remain anonymous. Those who call Crime Stoppers can never, will never, be identified.



traditional shopping experience during staffed hours that certain populations prefer," she said.

Initially, Weaver or her store manager, Amelia Cimino, will be on-site at the store to help customers and to get a better feel for the Merrill market. "The plan for this store is to have open hours 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., seven days a week, in order to allow adequate shopping time for all consumers," Weaver said. "It will be fully staffed for the first week at least 'til we determine when it would be best

After the first couple of weeks, the store may be unstaffed at times, but customers can still come into the showroom to shop at their leisure. Cameras will provide security surveillance.

Weaver said she will "have the store staffed over some of the more popular, busy times and also staffed over pickup days so that I can still offer the traditional sales person assistance."

"The store will be staffed over peak times," she said. "The unstaffed portion will simply be to give customers a longer shopping time for those whose schedule prohibits shopping over normal hours of operations such as 9-5. We plan to experiment a bit and will probably be staffed fulltime until we determine peak hours."

"Anyone can receive traditional customer service during staffed hours, and there will be customer service available via phone or Facetime anytime the store is open," she said. "Even during times when this location may be unstaffed, customer service will always be available via phone call or video and even, if needed, in person, since my store manager lives nearby."

'Cash or checks will be accepted during staffed hours, and if someone purchases online, we can collect cash or check payment at time of pickup or delivery," she said. "We are also able to process orders over the phone and accept card, cash, or check payments."



## Merrill Baseball HOF honors new inductees

On July 7, 2023 at Merrill's Athletic Park, past legendary players for the Merrill High School Baseball Team, inducted into the Merrill Baseball Hall of Fame.

Three individual players, one of whom was also a coach, were recognized: Eric Dayton, Erik Finanger, and Roger Wendorf.

In addition, the Merrill High School (MHS) Baseball Team of 1965 was honored and inducted into the Hall of Fame.

Eric Dayton made the high school pitching record book in 2004 going 5-1, pitching 44 innings in five complete games, after breaking the growth plate in his pitching arm at practice in 2002 and being told he would never pitch again. He was named to the All-Conference Team as Pitcher in 2003, All District 2nd Team Pitcher, Hurler of the Year for Merrill Senior High, and named Athlete of the Week by the Merrill Foto News, all in 2003 as well. In 2005, he set a single season pitching record and took second in the school's history for 8 wins and 1 loss in a single season with 66 innings pitched, in 7 complete games, with an ERA of 1.89, and 62 strikeouts.

In his career at MHS, Dayton's career pitching record is 17-2, having pitched 110 innings with an overall ERA of 2.73, with 98 strikeouts. He was third highest in the school's stat books.

Dayton went on to play for the Wisconsin American Legion All Star North Team, as starting pitcher during the game at Miller Park; at Marian University; for the Wisconsin Woodchucks;

and for the Sheboygan A's. Erik Finanger started

## Estimated state school aid for MAPS reduced by 3.35%

On July 1, 2023, the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) released an estimate of the general school could anticipate receiving for the 2023-24 school year. Wisconsin statutes require the figures to be published by July 1 each year. General school aids are the largest form of state support for Wisconsin public schools, offsetting local property taxes under stateimposed revenue limits, a release from DPI

According to DPI, Merrill Area Public general aid for the 2022-23 school year as of the Oct. 15, 2022, general aid certification. For the 2023-24 school year, MAPS is anticipated to receive \$17,642,664.

That's a decrease of 3.35% and more than \$600,000 ... \$610,881 to be exact.

The current estimate is based on the biennial budget as passed by the Wisconsin State Legislature and pupil count data reported by school districts to the DPI, the release said.

This data was released prior to the finalization of the state's 2023-25 biennial budget and is based on budgeted data as opposed to audited data. "This means the estimated amounts are subject to change by the time the DPI certifies general school aids for 2023-24 based on audited data by October 15, 2023," the release said.
