- · If cell phones are allowed at school, program them with emergency contact numbers.
- · Review safety information shared by your school, including school bus safety, evacuation procedures, and how students will be reunited with families if there were to be an emergency or other incident during the school day.
 - · Talk to your student's teacher














Merrill Adult Diploma Academy announces 2023 Grads

Former Merrill Fire Chief's death recognized as line-of-duty death

Chief Adlord Talbot remembered in Line-of-Duty **Death Legacy Ceremony**

Merrill Fire Chief Josh Klug recently announced the death of former Merrill Fire Chief Adlord Talbot has officially been recognized as a line-of-duty death.

On the morning of October 7, 1941, 60-year-old Chief Talbot failed to join his crew for morning shift change at the now former number one fire station, which still stands at 701 E. First St. in Merrill. When his fellow firefighters went to check on him, they Former Merrill Fire Chief found Talbot dead in his bed Adlord Talbot died on Oct. 7, of an apparent heart attack.


Klug noted at that time deaths such as Talbots were not considered line-of-duty deaths.

However, while doing research on another matter, local historian Michael Caylor came across Talbot's death record and noted the place of death was listed as the fire station. Caylor spoke with Talbot's daughter, 93-year-old Monica Talbot. She confirmed the details of her father's death with precise memories from that fateful morning.

Caylor was able to produce Talbot's death certificate and obtain copies of the activities of Talbot on the day before his death from the historical records of the Merrill Fire Department. Those records, which are preserved at the Merrill Historical Society, included a fire call and, according to his daughter's memory, doing fire inspections.

The information was submitted to the Wisconsin Fire and EMS Memorial (WFEM), and after review, WFEM President James Luty informed Chief Klug that he had declared Talbot's death as having occurred in the line of duty.

Talbot's daughter and extended family were informed of the change in status and on Aug. 15, 2023, a Line-of-Duty Death Legacy Ceremony was held for Chief Adlord Talbot at the Merrill Fire Station. Talbot's name was added to the memorial at both the Merrill Fire Station and in Wisconsin Rapids at the Wisconsin Fire and EMS Memorial.

Church Mutual extends voluntary retirement incentive to eligible employees

Church Mutual Insurance Company, which is headquartered in Merrill, announced last week that it was making "Voluntary Retirement Incentive (VRI) offers to eligible employees throughout the Church Mutual Group nationwide."

While Church Mutual representatives declined to define specifically how employee eligibility for the program is determined, one representative said, "In general, eligibility is based on age and years of service."

Eligible employees were notified last

Dog rescued from Merrill house fire

On Aug. 25, 2023, at approximately 7:15 p.m. the Merrill Fire Department (MFD) was dispatched to a house fire at 1910 Water St. in Merrill's Sixth Ward.

"Engine-61 and Med-63 responded immediately from the fire station as Medic 61 was responding to an ambulance call about the same time," Fire Chief Josh Klug said in a press release. Merrill Police Department (MPD) was already on scene when firefighters arrived and "reported heavy smoke in the kitchen area and possibly extending into the walls of the home."

Dispatch advised the caller said the fire had started on the kitchen stove.

All human occupants of the residence had evacuated the home, but it was reported the family dog might still be inside.

Firefighters began extinguishing the fire in the kitchen area. After the fire was contained to the kitchen, they located the dog inside the home and brought the pet outside where it was reunited with the owners.

According to the MFD, the home suffered moderate damage to the

kitchen area.

Mutual aid was requested from Russell, Corning, Pine River, and Wausau Fire Departments and Tomahawk EMS, the MFD reported; however, "the fire was quickly contained" and the departments cancelled their response except for the Pine River Fire Department. MPD

and Wisconsin Public Service also assisted at the scene.

While the cause of the fire remains under investigation, preliminary investigation suggests "the fire likely started in the kitchen area of the home and was unintentional in nature" a press release from the MFD said.

Wednesday, Aug. 2023, and a companywide announcement was made later that same day.

"The offer includes a payment tied to service as well as an additional lump sum, all credited to the employee's Cash Balance Plan, a/k/a pension plan," a press release from Church Mutual said, although they declined to be any more specific than that. "In the interest of protecting our employees' personal information, we are keeping the value of the offer confidential," a representative said.

"Employees have several weeks to consider the offer. Accepting or declining the early-retirement VRI offer is entirely at the discretion of each eligible employee. Those who accept the offer will work with their supervisors to determine a mutually agreeable date to end their employment, no later than Dec. 31, 2023," he said.

"Those who decline the VRI offer can remain in their current roles."

"We are encouraging eligible employees to speak to their financial, tax and legal advisors to make the best decision for their personal circumstances and retirement goals," the representative said.

Church Mutual stated the goal of offering the VRI at this time is "to better align our staffing levels with current and future customer needs, as well as our long-term business strategy."

significant, "Our ongoing financial strength enables us to able make this generous VRI offer," the press release said.

The company did not share specific goals aligned with the VRI offer but did emphasize that "the VRI action is voluntary" and "Eligible employees may accept or decline the offer, doing what's best for their needs and plans."

"In regard to overall

staffing, Church Mutual has not implemented a hiring freeze," the press release said.

"Church Mutual Group is continuing to recruit and hire talent for positions nationwide," the spokesperson for the company said. "...Rather it is making strategic workforce adjustments to support current and longterm needs."

"Workforce adjustments do not imply any other Church changes Mutual's business footprint," geographic the press release said. "We remain committed to the communities where we have offices: Merrill, Madison, and Milwaukee, Wisconsin; Denver, Colorado: Mechanicsburg, and Pennsylvania. We will continue to support their local economies with attractive employment opportunities as well as donations from our CM CARES foundation and volunteer service from our employees.



TO THE EDITOR

Last week, Lincoln County's Board rejected voter choice regarding Pine Crest's future. Credit goes to the nine members who listened to the 100 plus present in support of keeping Pine Crest, along with the hundreds of signatures, a multitude of phone calls and contacts, and voted for the referendum.

The referendum offered a brief overview of projected costs. One testimony calculated that the annual tax impact of \$85.14 per \$100,000 of equalized value works out to less than \$8/month on a property of that equalized value.

Supervisor Calvin Callahan felt compelled to personally point out that he is not a "Pine Crest Killer," but supports the nursing home. One can understand the confusion over his statement when Supervisor Callahan has consistently voted to sell Pine Crest and against a voter referendum.

The claim that supplemental State subsidies all went to Madison nursing homes and not to us because of Governor Evers is false. Lincoln County simply did not qualify for those funds because of an earlier County decision regarding projected deficits.

Certain Supervisors tried to muddy the issue by claiming that the annual cost should be \$4.5 million rather than the proposed \$3 million. When pressed about the source of that higher figure, it was determined that the higher figure was based on older, outdated Covid projections.

One Supervisor apparently felt that since three accountants were involved, (credentials not offered), we should just accept that higher projection. No disrespect intended, but too many bookkeepers become bean counters who do not excel at solutions and can only see the sky falling.

As one Supervisor pointed out, that much higher figure was thrown in to put off voter support. And indeed, fear was used. At one point the claim was made that if the referendum was voted down by the electorate, the County would be forced to close Pine Crest. No, if a referendum to keep Pine Crest failed, the Board could return to the option to sell.

The question of placing more taxes on the taxpayers was brought up. But not the fact that all taxpayers, and some donors, have consistently contributed to Pine Crest over the decades and have a vested interest in continuing ownership.

Unfortunately, throughout the entire process, neither the Board nor its Ad Hoc Committee spent much time on solutions to keep Pine Crest. It became painfully evident that the intent to sell was present from the very beginning with little to no effort on keeping it a County service.

If Pine Crest is sold, what will happen to the Social Services/Health Department building and their services?

And that is the crux of this issue-County services. Since this Board was seated in 2022, their obvious agenda was to eliminate as many County-supported services as possible. The old saying of "penny wise, but pound foolish" applies to many of this Board's decisions. Unfortunately, we, the residents of Lincoln County, will ultimately pay the price.







about participating in ReadyWisconsin's Student Tools for Emergency Planning (STEP) program. This free curriculum for fourth and fifth grade classrooms helps teach students about being ready for disasters. Educators can find enrollment information at https://readywisconsin.wi.gov/step/.

• If you have a student heading off to college, pick up or put together an emergency kit for their vehicle and dorm room or apartment. Vehicle kits should include items like a cell phone charger, snacks, blankets and jumper cables. For home kits, add items like non-perishable foods, a flashlight, portable radio and extra batteries.

Get savvy with school bus safety

Each school day, 25 million children ride a bus to school in the United States. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) says that school buses are the safest way for children to travel to and from school. The majority of school bus-related injuries occur while students are boarding and getting off the bus. Over the last 10 years, the NHTSA says nearly two-thirds of school-age pedestrians who were fatally injured by school buses or other vehicles were hurt after being struck while entering or exiting the bus.

Riding a school bus can be a novel experience no matter a student's age or grade. Kindergarteners may be introduced

to the school bus on their first day of school, while older students are no doubt familiar with life inside a school bus. But all students and families can benefit from a refresher course on school bus procedures to ensure this school year begins on safe footing.

- Be a smart pedestrian. Riding the school bus is very safe, but injuries can occur walking to and from the bus stop. Watch for cars backing out of driveways and always look both ways multiple times before crossing streets.
- Stand away from the curb. The National Safety Council advises keeping six feet, or three to five giant steps, away from the curb or road while waiting for the bus. Young children should be carefully supervised.
- Be visible. Always cross in front of the bus, making eye contact with the driver so that he or she knows your intentions before crossing. Better yet, wait for the driver to give the OK to cross. If you drop something, do not bend down to pick it up. Tell the driver instead. When leaving the bus, students should make sure there is no oncoming traffic and wait for a signal from the bus driver before crossing busy streets.
- Remain seated. Find a seat promptly and remain seated for the duration of the ride. Do not stand up and proceed down the center aisle until the bus has stopped. Observe the rules on the bus, and keep the center aisle clear of backpacks.
- Minimize distractions, speak quietly, and behave so that you do not distract the driver.

Walking/biking safety

Students may walk or bike to school if the school permits. School tends to begin during the morning rush hour, so



students must exercise extreme caution when walking or biking to school. Stick to sidewalks whenever possible when walking. Cyclists should follow the rules of the road, including riding in the same direction as traffic. Choose the safest route as a family and practice it before the first day of school, advises the security company ADT.

Backpack safety

Choose an ergonomically designed backpack to enhance safety and comfort. Backpacks should weigh no more than 5 to 10 percent of the child's body weight, advises the National Safety Council. Rolling backpacks should be avoided since they are a tripping hazard.

With a new school year on the horizon, students and their parents can discuss all aspects of school safety so the year starts off on the right foot.
