### Marshfield Heritage Museum displays come to life

MARSHFIELD – If you have not yet visited the Marshfield Heritage Museum, now is the perfect time. If you have, you'll want to return soon.

Thanks to the efforts of a recent Leadership Marshfield team, the museum's seventeen major displays can now be brought to life through recorded histories.

Andy Wilkins of Dental Crafters Network, Trisha Mayer of Weiler's Convenience Stores, Donald Pierre from Prince Corp. and Nikki Lossman of Nelson-Jameson got together with Marshfield Broadcasting and museum founder Shirley Mook to create the recordings and add them to the museum over the better part of the past year.

"Ashley Winch from the United Way actually provided us the idea," Wilkins told us, during our Oct. 11 visit to the museum, located on the lower level of the 2nd Street Community Center, 212 E. Second St. "I think it's fair to say that once we had the idea and we came down and talked to Shirley, the mission was clear. We all rallied around this concept from that point," Wilkins added. "You know, Shirley's the matriarch of the museum and has put countless years and hours into developing what's down there, so capturing her voice for the benefit of future generations made the most sense."

"She had the scripts and other speeches on each of the dioramas already figured out and printed out and ready," said Pierre. "She really made this project super easy for us to accomplish. She had everything pretty much written out already."

"You will not find anybody as passionate as her about

anything," Mayer added. "You could just listen to her for hours and hours and hours and she's never done with information. But it's not boring. That's the fun part."

"We talked about recording this on our own at first," Wilkins recalled.

That's when the group contacted Tom Loucks and David Ballerstein at Marshfield Broadcasting. "They seemed pretty keen on helping us, and then it

"They seemed pretty keen on helping us, and then it would also be beneficial for them where they could get stuff to put on their channel," Pierre added. "They had a recording room and everything for us already."

### Two teens killed in early morning crash

Victims were from Marshfield and Stratford

WOOD COUNTY - For the second time in as many weeks, a Marshfield teenager was killed in an early-morning traffic accident because someone ignored a stop

The latest crash was reported at 3:45 a.m. on Oct. 9, and happened at the intersection of Highway 73 and Polish Road in the Wood County Town of Wood.

According to the Wood County Sheriff's Department, the initial investigation showed that a vehicle - driven by 14-yearold Quinton T. Plucinski of Marshfield was traveling southbound on Polish Road when he failed to stop at the stop sign at Highway 73. As a result, the southbound vehicle was struck by a semi tractor trailer that was traveling eastbound on State Highway 73, driven by Ravinder S. Dhillon, 36, of Abbotsford, British Columbia, Canada.

Plucinski and his passenger - 16-yearold Conner K. Ostricki of Stratford - were pronounced dead at the scene. Plucinski was not a licensed driver.

There was no word on any injuries suffered by Dhillon and his passenger - Gagandeep S. Sidhu, 28, of Abbotsford, British Columbia, Canada.

The crash remains under investigation by the Wood County Sheriff's Department and the Wisconsin State Patrol. State Highway 73 was closed for several hours following the crash.

Agencies assisting the Wood County Sheriff's Department were Wood County Dispatch, Pittsville Fire Department, Pittsville Ambulance, and the Wood County Coroner's Office.

A similar accident occurred on Sept. 22. Sophia Smrz, 17, of Junction City, was on her way to school for swim practice at Marshfield High School, when she was killed at Highway Y and Shady Road in the Town of Auburndale. In that crash, Jason Peterson, 46, of Arpin, was traveling north on Shady Road, when he neglected to stop for a stop sign, killing Smrz.

A Celebration of Life for Plucinski will be held at a later date. He was born on June 20, 2009, in Marshfield, to Brent and Krystal (Darr) Plucinski.

Memorial services for Ostricki were held Oct. 17 at The Mill Church, Stratford. He was born on Nov. 14, 2006, in Marshfield, to Kurt and Courtney (Crawford) Ostricki.



Dear Reader.

Last summer while on a family trip to Quebec City, my 16 year old grandson Dylan asked me if I would zip line

over the waterfalls. Before they strapped on the zip-line gear, they asked me if I would step on the scale. I was 4 pounds over the weight limit, so Dylan went with his father Mike. I was relegated to taking a video of them as they zipped across. That was disappointing.

When I got home I decided to lose weight. Instead of relying

on any of the multitude of diets on the market, I based my vision on a simple two word philosophy: "Consume less." And instead of getting a personal trainer and hitting the gym, I based exercise on a simple one word philosophy: "Walking." Things don't happen in a day or even a week, but little changes can lead to a big difference, such as no breads, butter, creamy sauces, and snacking; vegetables and proteins limited to an 8 hour a day window; and walking consistently each day.

Actually, that's a lot of changes. But it's working - I've already dropped a lot, with a ways to go until I'm at my college fighting weight.

If this interests you, my advice is to make your own plan. You'll feel much better in so many ways because you're not carrying around that extra bag of oats that your body never needed in the first place. As a bonus, you probably will live a longer and healthier life.

Gordon was born in


Marshfield and grew up



"Nowadays, when they create a new uniform or logo, there's always a press release; there's a big to-do. There is nothing about this. They just showed up and were playing this inter-squad game and everybody had the 'G' on their helmet. Lombardi doesn't mention it at all in his post-game press conference. It's the iconic 'G' that we've now had for the last 60 years.

"The original 'G' was shaped like a football, but it has been modified to the current oval 'G."

Gordon taught art at Parkview Middle School and developed a home study art program — Gordon School of Art. After retiring from the Ashwaubenon School District, he worked as an adjunct professor at St. Norbert

The group captured Mook's narrations over a handful of recording sessions, then did final edits.

"I think we picked a good project and I think it's going to have a lasting impact and I think that is what defines a good Leadership Marshfield project," Wilkins added.

Shirley Mook's narratives of the major displays at the museum are accessible by scanning QR codes hanging by each one. If you don't have a smart phone, loner tablets and

disposable ear buds are available at the museum.

"Those audio files aren't available to navigate to from the public website," Wilkins noted.

"Because we want them to go down there," Mayer added.
"These guys, they're fantastic," Mook told us Oct. 11, as
we sat in the museum during its normal Wednesday hours.
"We had a lot of fun. It's been a wonderful relationship that
we've had here."

They all agreed Mook's telling of the 1887 fire story was their favorite.

To add the recordings, the group had to update the museum's website. They worked with Garrett Frankwick at Mueller Publishing, who donated much of his time and talents for the project. The group also received donations from Prevail Bank and the Marshfield Area Community Foundation.

There are now recorded histories at each of the museum's major displays. They are: Agriculture, City Hall, Early Lumbering 1874 & Ada McMillan, Early Marshfield Businesses, Foundation of a City, Fred Beell, Iron Lung & Epidemic, Marshfield Banks, Marshfield Clinic, Marshfield Schools, Roddis Dress Exhibit, Saint Joseph Hospital, Saint Joseph School of Nursing, The Fire Fiend, Roddis Lumber & Veneer, The Hobo Jungle; The Railroads.

The museum is open to the public Wednesdays and Saturdays from  $1\!-\!4\,\mathrm{p.m.}$ 

"We love what we do," said Mook, who had the original vision for the museum, which first opened in 2013. "It gets engrained in you. When I came here, this became my city," the Lancaster native added. Mook adapted Marshfield as her hometown when she moved here in 1979 to run the city's Community Development Department, which merged with the Housing Authority in 1981 to form the Community Development Authority.

Wanting give something back to the community Anne and Bette Adler provided the impetus that led to the creation of the Marshfield Area Community Foundation in 1993. As they envisioned, the foundation continues today to enhance the quality of life here in their home community.

Anne and Bette Adler were the daughters of John Peter (J.P.) and Rosamond Victoria (Bille) Adler. They were born in Marshfield -Anne on June 1, 1917, and Bette on June 2, 1919. They attended St. John's Catholic School and McKinley High School - Anne graduating with the class of 1935 and Bette a year later with the class of 1936.

both attended Milwaukee-Downer College for two years before transferring to the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Anne graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology in 1939 from Madison, and then earned a Master of Arts degree in economics at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Anne accepted teaching position on the economics staff of the University of Toledo where she established a course in personal finance in addition to teaching economic theory. Among her first students were returning GIs coming home from World War II.

One of the first women to earn a stockbroker's Securities and Exchange Commission License, Anne was extremely proud to have been the first, and for some time only, woman account executive with the Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Beane office in Milwaukee. At the time, this firm was the world's largest brokerage house.

An April 1955 news article in the business section of Sunday's Milwaukee Sentinel featured Anne's success in the financial field under the title "A Woman in a Man's World.'

Like her sister, Bette

continued her education after Milwaukee-Downer College at University of Wisconsin-Madison. June 1941 she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in home economics. She then worked as a chemist for Kimberly Clark at Neenah, before returning to Marshfield to assist with the family business, a job her father had been grooming her for all her

After her father's death in 1959, Bette took over as president of the Adler Theater businesses and ran the company until selling to her close friend Paul Rogers in 1972.

Bette was an integral part of many local civic organizations. She was involved with the UW Alumni Association; Business & Professional Women's Club; Marshfield Historic Preservation Association; North Wood County Historical Society, Ruffed Grouse Society; Knitter's Guild; Marshfield Art Commission; Altrusa; Marshfield Women's Club; the Palm Sunday Chorus; the Marshfield History Project; and the Marshfield Area Genealogy Group. A 1993 graduate of Leadership Marshfield, Bette was later named a Leadership Class Alumnus of the Year for her

community involvement.

Also in 1993, Anne and Bette pioneered the creation of the Marshfield Area Community Foundation -wanting to give back to the community that they loved, and that Bette had always called home. Offering a challenge grant of \$25,000, they established the Adler Family Fund within the Foundation. It provided the motivating force from which Marshfield Area Community Foundation, Inc. emerged. Joe Lang, shortly thereafter, came forward to establish the Joe Lang Fund; thereby "matching" the amount required by the Adler grant, and Marshfield Area Community Foundation, Inc. was officially underway.

In 1999, the Foundation's assets reached \$1 million and had thirty-one funds. Since then, assets have grown to over \$14 million and two hundred funds. These funds include unrestricted funds. designated funds, field of interest funds, scholarship funds, donor advised funds, project specific, fiscal sponsorship funds and

Among the many funds the foundation administers is the J.P. Adler Community Improvement which provides funding for brick and mortar projects. This fund became a springboard for the building of an enhanced bear habitat at Marshfield's Wildwood Park & Zoo. The improvements made it possible for Marshfield to acquire its two Kodiak cubs, Munsey and Boda.







### The roots of the Green Bay Packers

W-Green Bay began the inaugural session of its "History of the Green Bay Packers Certificate" program on Sept. 6. The virtual, eight-week, two-hour

class allows participants to "uncover the team's storied history and get an inside look at the Packers Hall of Fame." Over the next few months, we will provide a glimpse of the class experience through Titletown 101.

The program's first meeting started with a get-to-know session, led by Hall of Fame Curator Brent Hensel.

The 88 members from across the country got to know a little about each other, including one member from overseas - Stephen O'Brien, co-founder of the UK and Irish Packers group.


After a dive into beginnings of football, Hensel brought in Tom Pigeon who has served as a tour guide for 20 years. "Tom honestly knows more about Packers history

than just about anyone I know," Hensel said, adding that Pigeon had been there from the start. Pigeon took the class back to the early days.


"It was on a scale of just amateurism and local teams, and communities had their own team. They played each other; and then of course, with the high school football with East and West, that's where a lot of the players came from in the early Packer teams," Pigeon recalled, "because (Curly) Lambeau knew a lot of these people.

"They had to go to a more national recruiting and he

Kiermaier came to Toronto this season after ten seasons with Tampa Bay. He hit .265 for the Blue Jays, with eight home runs and 36 RBIs. Toronto observers feel that the Blue Jays will allow Kiermaier to leave, then move Daulton to center field, and pursue a power hitter to play left field. Daulton hit .220, with 20 home runs and 61 RBIs in his first season with Toronto.

The Blue Jays finished with a record of 89-73. In the playoffs, they were swept in the AL Wild Card round by the Twins in Minnesota.

### On the Road with Alice

Wisconsin wines and vineyards

'ere's a juicy bit of information: . Wisconsin's first grape vineyard was planted in 1846, two years before Wisconsin even gained statehood. According to UW-Madison, Agoston Haraszthy—a Hungarian immigrant-planted that vineyard "on the east bank of the Wisconsin River and founded the community that would become Sauk City." He relocated westward just three years later, settling in Seminole, CA, where he established the famous Buena Vista Vineyard. His vineyard lands in Wisconsin would later on become the site for one of Wisconsin's oldest wineries.

The grape variety traditionally used in winemaking did not grow well in North America, a fact realized only after many failed attempts in the British colonies along the Atlantic coast during the 1600s and 1700s. UW-Madison states, "It was not until the 1740 discovery of the Alexander grape in Philadelphia that North American wine production became feasible." This viable new option piqued an interest in hybridization, which 100 years later resulted in grapes that are able to thrive in Wisconsin.

Starting in 1943, Elmer Swenson began breeding grapes at his 120-acre farm

near Osceola. He started crossing French hybrid grapes with selections of the local wild species in the hopes of creating a great-tasting grape that could grow in Wisconsin's climate. He eventually began doing some of his work at the University of Minnesota while working as a gardener there, but the bulk of it remained at his home farm. Throughout his life, he developed numerous cultivars that are still used today, including five patented cultivars that became key contributors to the growth of Midwest winemaking.

The first licensed winery in Wisconsin, von Stiehl Winery, opened in 1967 in Algoma. According to their website, there were no wineries in Wisconsin at that time, so a local physician, Dr. Charles Stiehl, "asked the state to create a winery license to legally sell his Door

County Cherry Wine." Five years later, in 1972, Bob Wollersheim purchased the land that had been Agoston Haraszthy's vineyard—which had been serving as a conventional Wisconsin farm since 1899—and established Wollersheim Wineries on the site. By 2007, Wisconsin was home to 41 wineries utilizing about 480 acres of grapes.

As more cold-hardy varieties were developed, the number of wineries grew exponentially, tripling in the 10-year period after 2007. Currently, Wisconsin's more than 100 wineries utilize 800 acres of vineyards for grapes, plus many additional acres for other fruits used to produce wines including apples, cherries, rhubarb, and more.

Whether using grapes or some other fruit, wine is formed when yeast consumes the sugars of fermenting fruit, which produces ethanol, carbon dioxide, and heat. Wineries will press the fruit to extract the juice, then add that juice and their other ingredients into a fermentation tank. These tanks are where the real magic happens. This process can take a handful of days or several months, depending on the fruit and the specific type of wine being made. Sweet wines are typically produced when the fermentation period is stopped before the yeast has consumed all of the sugar, whereas letting all of the sugar be consumed by yeast produces a dry wine. After fermentation, wine is usually filtered, stored, and aged. When ready, wines will be bottled, labeled, and sent to tasting rooms or stores across the country.

The other top Alice candidates and I were able to tour Staller Estate in Delavan as part of the 76th Alice in Dairyland Finals back in May. We started our tour where all good wines begin—in the vineyard—learning about the maintenance of the crop. We then went to their processing area to see just what is needed to turn those grapes into wine. Fittingly for Alice in Dairyland, their fermentation tanks are actually repurposed bulk tanks from dairy farms. Everything from harvesting to bottling and labeling is done on-site for Staller Estate Winery, before their products are sold in their

store, sampled in their tasting room, or sent to

local grocery stores. If all of this reading about vinting has left you thirsting for a new brand of wine to try, visit the Wisconsin Winery Association at wisconsinwineries. org. They have more information about the history of winemaking in Wisconsin, a product locator for different varieties of wine, and a directory to all of the wineries in Wisconsin. As you responsibly enjoy your next bottle, raise a glass to the dedication and commitment of the former and current growers, processors, and groundbreakers of Wisconsin wines.


