# 'Our Dream Park' groundbreaking ceremony held at Washington Square Park

TOMAHAWK - A local group's dream more than two years in the making took a huge step closer to coming true last week.

On Thursday, Oct. 19, a groundbreaking ceremony for "Our Dream Park" was held at Washington Square Park on N. 4th St. in Tomahawk.

The event was attended by members of the public, as well as representatives from numerous organizations involved with the project in a variety of capacities.

Christi Lobermeier, Cathy Schmit, Steve Kahle and Sue Hawkins spoke on behalf of Tomahawk Together and the Our Dream Park Committee, which have spearheaded the project in conjunction with the City of Tomahawk. Other committee members on hand included Patti Hilgendorf, Carlie Myers and Kathy Tobin. Committee member Kay Kissinger Wolf was attending a State Historical Society conference in La Crosse and was unable attend the groundbreaking ceremony.

Tomahawk Mayor Steve Taskay made remarks on behalf of the city, and Dan Schuller, representing the city's Parks and Recreations Committee, addressed the crowd gathered in the gazebo.

Kahle also spoke on behalf of the Getty-Sue Foundation and noted a \$1.5 million donation from the Bierman Family Foundation.

Hawkins introduced Julie Weber, President of The ARC of Lincoln County, on behalf of the Walter Ristau Memorial Fund, which contributed \$30,000.00 early in the fundraising campaign.

Micah Cyrkus, a fifth grad-

er at St. Mary's School, represented local children with his comments.

Other groups in attendance included Tomahawk Middle School students, Hatchet Pride representatives and St. Mary's School student ambassadors.

Dave Bethel and several Bethel Excavating crew members were on hand. The company brought equipment to the site and will donate the excavation work.

Park stakeholders Harley-Davidson, Hilgy's Gas, Wurl-Feind-Ingman VFW Post 2687 Auxiliary and Tomahawk Pharmacy were also acknowledged during the ceremony.

After the speeches, attendees broke out the shovels to break ground on the new playground site.

#### A dream two-plus years in the making

The groundbreaking ceremony marked a major milestone in a process that began more than two years ago.

In June 2021, Tomahawk Together, a nonprofit organization that has worked to support families and youth in the community for 30-plus years, approached the City of Tomahawk with a dream of building a new, all-inclusive playground in Washington Square Park. The group's idea was for the playground and its equipment to be accessible by children of all ages and abilities.

Meanwhile, an Outdoor Recreation Plan survey conducted by the city showed overwhelming community support for a local splash pad.

"The idea had been placed on a back burner, but when Tomahawk Together's proposal was presented, the two dreams became one," a joint release from Tomahawk Together and the City of Tomahawk said. "The projects melded, and a partnership was formed."

Tomahawk Together began raising funds for the playground, and the city hired MSA Professional Services to pursue a rejuvenation of the city-center, square-block park, complete with a splash

"Thanks to generous monetary and in-kind donations, large and small, local and beyond, from individuals, businesses, organizations and foundations, Tomahawk Together raised nearly \$1.67

million, including a phenomenal \$1.5 million gift from the Bierman Family Foundation and \$30,000,00 from one of the Dream Park's earliest supporters, the Walter Ristau Memorial Fund," the release

A large federal grant, written by MSA and finalized earlier this month, provided the final nod to proceed.

The release said that after researching longevity, safety, customer service and community support, Tomahawk Together began working with Wisconsin-based playground company Lee Recreation LLC. The city contracted with Vortex for the splash pad project.

Along with the playground, the park transformation will also include Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements, infrastructure, lighting, fencing, walkways, seating and a redesigned 5th St. for extra parking, according to the re-

The scope of the project will fit entirely within the current park footprint and will not disrupt the Tomahawk Area Historical Society's log museum, the histor-

ic locomotive, the Tomahawk boat displays or the Tomahawk Regional Chamber of Commerce building.

The release said the summer flea market will be able to continue at its same location, and the park's adjacent basketball hoops will be improved. The gazebo will remain, and changing rooms will be added to the current ADA-compliant bathroom facilities.

"One of the largest expenses with the project was the decision to go with a pouredin-place surface that will extend beneath the playground equipment," the release stated. "It is an industry-standard that is designed deep below play apparatuses to soften any falls. The surface is also designed to be wheelchair accessible.'

Nearly half of the playground's \$760,000.00 price tag is directly tied to the base, something Tomahawk Together deemed crucial for allinclusive usage.

Other planned amenities include a duo zip line, a serenity area, musical components, a multi-user swing and modular play structures for ages two to five and five to 12, as well as

an adult fitness area.

The current playground equipment will be removed and repurposed as allowed at another park location, according to the release.

A major unknown associated with the site excavation involves the remains of the Washington School, which was demolished after a fire in 1978. Some playground equipment will be placed over buried remnants of the structure. The release said contingencies are in place to help address any related unanticipated problems.

Site preparation work done this fall will allow the ground to settle over the winter, helping final preparation and installation of equipment next spring.

A tentative park opening is anticipated around July 2024, according to the release.

#### **Donations still** being accepted

Donations of \$100.00 or more to Our Dream Park will be memorialized within two-foot-by-two-foot graved pavers along one of the park's pathways. The

cal Advisor, Wisconsin Division of Public Health.

Aspirus explained that Wisconsin's integrated system of trauma identifies hospitals as trauma care facilities by using four levels.

"This system recognizes

that all hospitals in Wisconsin play an important role in providing optimal treatment to the injured patient," Aspirus stated. "It is imperative that patients are delivered in a timely manner to the closest appropriate hospital matching resources to the needs of the severely injured patient." The primary role of a

Level IV facility is to pro-

vide stabilization and advanced trauma life support prior to transfer to a higher-level facility.

Aspirus Tomahawk Hospital's Level IV Classification is good for three years.

"Providing high-quality trauma care is a true team effort and demonstrates the ability of our facility and local EMS partners to provide this level of care to people in our area when they need it most," said Teri Theiler, President, Aspirus Tomahawk Hospital and Aspirus Health's North Division.

"Our Emergency Department clinicians and associates regularly complete additional training and certifications in emergency medicine and trauma care to support the care and treatment of trauma patients," said Carmen Viegut,



Readers are invited to submit questions about God, the Bible, and religion. I shall try to answer them for you, using the Bible as the authority for my answers.

Today, we continue our look at the book of Romans and the Gospel of God. We are not looking at every verse, but we will walk through the first eleven chapters as they define the Gospel of God.

Last week we looked at Romans 1:18 which says: For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness. Jesus stated the same principle in John 3:19, James also saying the same in James 4:17. God is not angry about our individual sins, but the fact that we know what is right but do not obey what is right. Following Romans 1:18, Paul explains, in the rest of chapter one, how we have done this with the knowledge of God.

Many like to blame the mess in our culture upon a biased media, crooked politicians, the theory of evolution, and other things. But to do so would be missing the main picture. In Matthew 5:13-16, Jesus said His people are the salt and light of the world. But, are we today? We take a stand on the big ticket items like abortion, but what about the everyday items like respect for others, modesty in fashions, and other ordinary, everyday things? In Romans 1:19-32, Paul says the problems in the culture are the product of what is happening in the churches. An Old Testament discussion on this same concept can be found in Hosea 4:1-9.

In Romans 1:19-32, there are two parallel thoughts: what people who know God are doing, and God's judgment on them through the culture. There are three sets in these verses.

Romans 1:19-24 is about religious people not obeying what God tells us about Himself (Bible). It says they do not honor God according to what He has told us about Himself (verse 21), replacing what God has said with their own ideas that they can feel more comfortable with (verses 22,23). Because they no longer accept God as the God He defines Himself to be, God judges them by letting the culture around them become more tolerant of sinful behavior (verse 24).

Romans 1:25-27 is about religious people not obeying the moral teachings God has given to us in the Bible. Because they want to fit in and be accepted by those around them, they adjust what God has said (Bible) to make allowances for their own desires; choosing to live according to their desires rather than the what the Creator desires (verse 25). God's judgment on them is to let the culture around them sink deeper into relational sins (verses 26.27).

Romans 1:28-32 is about religious people no longer caring about what God says because it interferes with the life style they have chosen (verse 28). God's judgment is to let the culture around them sink even deeper into accepting more selfdestructive sins as normal and celebrating them (verses 28-32).

This whole process starts with those who claim to know God. not honoring God as He has revealed Himself to be. Instead, they adjust their beliefs to allow for their chosen life style.

#### Is There a Purpose for Suffering?

For we rejoice in our suffering, for suffering produces perseverance, perseverance produces character and character, hope; and hope does not disappoint for God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit whom he has given us. Romans 5: 3-5

Many people in today's society question the existence of God because they see so much suffering in the world. They ask, "How could a loving God allow such suffering?" The above passage from Romans, Chapter 5, gives us a very different perspective on suffering. Paul suggests that suffering can actually cause improvement in our personal strength. In other words, when we "hang in there" and persevere through our suffering, relying on God to strengthen us, our ability to endure other challenges in our life improves. Have you ever commented on someone else's difficult situation, saying something like, "I could never handle that!" Then perhaps months or years later, you find yourself in a similar situation and find that your only choice is to handle it. And by handling that challenge, you develop the confidence to know you can handle other challenges, as well.

So your perseverance does produce character...that inner strength, fortified by God, to be strong in difficult circumstances. We are wiser and stronger on the other side of suffering. We KNOW what it is to suffer...we KNOW we can get through it. Joni Earickson Tada, a quadriplegic due to a diving accident in her teens, came to understand that God had drawn her closer to Him through her suffering. She said, "I'd rather be in a wheel chair with Jesus, than out of a wheelchair without him." Today, she uses her experience with suffering to

We love this quote from Nick Vujicic (a young man born with no arms or legs who has become a very successful motivational and inspirational speaker and pastor), "I found the purpose of my existence, and also the purpose of my circumstance. There's a purpose for why you're in the fire. If God can use a man without arms and legs to be His hands and feet, then He will certainly use any willing heart!

So, there is hope that is produced from perseverance and character. God CAN and DOES use our suffering to strengthen us, refine us and mold us into his image so that he can use us for HIS purpose.

God sends this message to us through his creation. Grass grows greener after the brown, dead ugly stuff is burned off. Trees that bend in the winds are stronger than those that don't. The analogy of refining silver comes to mind. When a silver smith was asked how he knew when silver had been in the refining fire long enough, he replied, "Oh, that's easy. When I can see my image in the shining surface of the silver, I know the silver is completed." And so it is with God. Our life challenges are the refining fire that eventually allows God to see his image in us...that allows us to "be completed."

So, in essence, we CAN be thankful for our suffering, for suffering DOES produce perseverance, perseverance, character and character, hope...hope that God IS using us or WILL use us to be his completed hands and feet in a world that needs our message of hope.

Thanks be to God for this indescribable gift! (2nd Corinthians 9:15)



# More than \$134 million in quarterly transportation aids allocated to Wisconsin municipalities

#### FOR THE TOMAHAWK **LEADER**

WISCONSIN - Governor Tony Evers and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (Wis-DOT), on Wednesday, Oct. 18, announced that Wisconsin municipalities received more than \$134 million in fourth quarterly payments for 2023 for General Transportation, Connecting Highway and Expressway Policing Aids.

According to a release from Evers' office, for calendar vear 2023, local governments will receive more than \$526 million in General Transportation Aids financial assistance to support transportation-

related projects, a 2% increase over calendar year 2022 allocations provided by the 2021-23 biennial budget signed by Evers.

Total funding for all local programs makes up almost one-third of the state transportation budget.

**General Transportation** Aids (GTA) help cover the costs of constructing, maintaining and operating roads and streets under local jurisdiction.

Connecting Highway Aids (CHA) reimburse municipalities for maintenance and traffic control of certain state highways within municipalities.

Expressway Policing Aids help the Milwaukee

# 'The Shining' further proves Jack Nicholson holds the Going Insane Championship Belt

If you were to ask me what my favorite Stanley Kubrick movie is, I might tell you it's 2001: A Space Odyssey. Ask me tomorrow and there's a good chance I'll say it's Barry Lyndon. Next week it'd probably be Dr. Strangelove or: How I Learned to Stop Worrying and Love the Romb

But there's one Kubrick film that has a critical element the others don't, which ultimately makes it not only my true favorite movie of his, but my favorite horror film. It's something that might even help it earn the distinction of being Kubrick's crowning achievement. This crucial factor is "Jack Nicholson going insane."

In Kubrick's 1980 horror masterpiece The Shining, based on the Stephen King novel of the same name, Nicholson plays Jack Torrance, a writer who signs on to be the over-winter caretaker of the Overlook Hotel in the Colorado Rocky Mountains while it's closed for the season. During his first visit to the hotel to discuss the job, Jack is informed that the previous caretaker committed a horrific crime on the premises, to which Jack responds with an odd level of calm.

I feel like such information would give most people pause. "Hey, the guy who used to have the gig you're going for went completely berserk and did something heinous beyond belief. Wanna take his place and hang out here for like four months?" "What? No. I'm good, man. Thanks, though. Take care!"

But Jack accepts the job, figuring it'd give him time to get some writing done. I gotta tell ya, I enjoy his naïve optimism. I don't think there's a single place on this planet where a writer could not find a way to procrastinate. If I were stuck in an empty hotel for several months with nothing but my laptop, I'd be counting the ice machines within an

hour and a half.

Jack, along with his wife, Wendy, and son, Danny, hole up in the huge, remote hotel, and as winter drags on, the vibes seriously begin to deteriorate. Danny, who possesses psychic abilities referred to as "shining," sees unsettling visions. Meanwhile, Jack's cognitive state, seemingly affected by isolation, boredom, a severe case of writer's block and otherworldly forces within the hotel, begins to slip. As Jack declines psychologically, he grows increasingly menacing toward Wendy and Danny. At a key point in the film, Jack, who had quit drinking a few months before arriving at the hotel and had injured Danny in a drunken outburst years earlier, bellies up to the bar in a large ballroom, knocks back a bourbon or two and shoots the breeze with Lloyd, a bartender who may or may not be there. Watching a man evidently oblivious to his cataclysmic mental break, and subsequently considering the danger he poses to his family, is truly chilling and accentuates a feeling of claustrophobia, despite the hotel's massive size. The fact that Wendy and Danny are trapped in the snowdrifted building with Jack

all but reduces the colossal resort to a single-family home. There's nowhere to run. Nowhere to hide.

Jack's descent into madness is among the most entrancing and horrifying things ever put to film, and it's intensified by Nicholson's remarkable ability to convey his emotions in a physical fashion. Nicholson has one of the most expressive faces in the history of Hollywood, and the singular combination of his eyes, eyebrows, smile, voice and laugh - and when and how he utilizes them - are invaluable traits when he's letting a few screws come loose.

The superb 1975 drama One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest showcases Nicholson at the top of his game. Playing a man who motivates his fellow patients at a mental institution to defy the iron fist rule of a dictatorial nurse, his stellar performance is propelled by his manic physicality. In Tim Burton's 1989 Batman, Nicholson shines as The Joker, the infamous villain also known as The Clown Prince of Crime not a description typically applied to a fellow known for Being Normal. Running amok clad in a purple suit and makeup seems like the

kind of thing only Nicholson could've truly pulled off. One of the most electrifving vet mystifying performances of Nicholson's career is in Martin Scorsese's astounding 2006 film The

Departed, in which he plays an aging, eccentric Boston Irish mobster. I'm honestly not sure if Nicholson's even particularly good in the

# Fishing Report: Walleye hitting in deep water

#### BY GEORGE LANGLEY

NORTHERN WISCON-SIN – We're getting some typical fall weather right now, albeit a bit warmer than we're used to for this time of the season. Water temperatures remain in the 50s - we're seeing both upper and lower 50s, depending on the body of water. Turnover is imminent, and we've heard of some smaller lakes where it has started. We'd love a good stretch of colder days and nights to get us past

ally good at this point, al-

though just like the water temperatures, we're getting very different reports from different lakes. Fish are being caught on the deep flats and in the holes on many bodies of water. This makes them pretty easy to find, and these deep spots will be exactly where you'll want to be after turnover, too. Jigs and minnows have been doing the trick, with walleye suckers or large fatheads working well. On the bigger lakes, vou may have luck looking off the breaks, at hard bot Walleye fishing is gener- tom areas in water from 20 feet to 35 feet or so. Again, larger minnows seem to be the most common bait.

Bass action has slowed, and other than a few large smallies being caught in very deep water, we just haven't heard much from those anglers. Some largemouth are still being caught in deeper weeds on plastics.

Northern action is good, with a lot of musky anglers reporting catches of northerns on musky baits while fishing in or near weeds. As usual, the deeper the fish.

Musky action is decent,

even with the warm weather we've recently had. The sucker bite has been getting good now, and we've also seen some great action on bucktails and jerk baits. It's not yet time for a super slow retrieve or giant plastics. We're just basically waiting for turnover to get to some of that really great late fall action.

Enjoy the warmer weather while you can. Those cold days on the water when it's 40 and rainy - or worse vet. snowing will be here soon enough.



# Our General: A Tribute to Tomahawk Mayor Bob Lee

The General was the most charming man in Lincoln County, and possibly the world.

If Bob had lived in esteemed town-founder William H. Bradlev's era. and it came time to select the first mayor for our beloved hamlet, I'd have kicked Bill off the stage and voted for the General, no question about it.

Nothing beat the General's laugh. In person, if something quietly funny happened, he'd shoot a stealthy sidelong glance to see if you'd caught it the beginnings of a mischievous smirk twitching his mustache. Then, if you could really get him giggling, he'd turn red, and redder, dabbing at tears. Bob would actually jiggle, like a bowlful of jelly.

When he mentioned he was often Santa Claus for our town's children, I recall nodding at him gratefully and telling him, "That's obscene." And him just exploding laugh-

But he really was Santa Claus. Every time he strolled into our local radio station was like a little present. He'd bring laughter and chaos, demand-



ing giant boxes of Peanut M&Ms from my joyfullyexasperated boss.

To my apocryphal recollection, the Mayor consumed nothing but Northwoods-style, militarygrade cocktails and Twizzlers. It seems obvious in hindsight that if Bob had been fed nothing but movie-candy from birth, he'd still be alive.

As the retired Lincoln County Sheriff, Bob halted most conflicts with a serious-scowled, "Okay, now, settle down now." Fall Ride mayhem? Wrestling vendetta? All quelled by a stern look. If the General had been around for an "okay now settle down now" in 1804. Alexander Hamilton would still be

I produced the high school wrestling broadcasts for WJJQ for 20 vears, which means I

played commercials and told the most repulsive jokes I could think of to get the guys to bust up right before they went back on the air.

The General taught me everything I know about Greco-Roman wrestling, which is nothing. I recall phrases like "Russian Arm Bar" or "Backwoods Hammer-Tie." These moments are pictured as though entered into an AI Image search bar: grimacing, acne-dripping faces, a singlet...way-too-many sweat-covered arms. No idea what's happening.

A half-dozen times every broadcast, the General would yell, "THERE IT IS!" And then things would simply proceed as normal. Or Gregg - the play-by-play man and station owner - would murmur: "back points."

Sometimes, however, the General would *whoop*: "BACK POINTS!" and those back points were worth more? I know on my scorecard they were.

The first words out of Bob's mouth every premeet show were: "No question about it, Gregg!" The intro was of no consequence.

"Think the Hatchets have what it takes today, General?"

"Are we gonna get Heads

on the coin toss, Bob?"

"Bob, is the cat alive or dead in Schrodinger's Box?"

"NO **QUESTION** ABOUT IT" should be etched on the base of the statue we erect in the Mayor's honor. Every time the General said it, I shrieked with the joy of the righteous. Meanwhile, Gregg struggled not to laugh on the air, knowing at that moment I'm losing my mind. One time I screamed so loud in the control room I almost scared off the Sammy's Subs delivery dude.

As his producer - in the mistaken belief that a cleaner broadcast meant a better one - I once mentioned all of this to Bob, while praising him as the greatest, which he was. He took it all in, nodding sagely.

"Yes. That just makes good sense. I'll do it!"

Grateful I'd shared with him. That's what a man is: knows he isn't perfect, and doesn't pretend to be. That was Bob.

And he did everything just like I said for about 15 seconds. Then he forgot everything and went back to being him, which was way better.

When a big match ended with a victory-pin for the Hatchets, the General

would just start bellow-Straight-hollering, ing. zero play-by-play. Pandemonium.

Listening to a big wrestling broadcast featuring the General was like when they choose a pope. You see the smoke, you know something definitely happened – no question about it - but you're gonna have to wait a while to find out exactly what.

Moving up from Milwaukee, the only thing I knew about wrestlers was never to get in a fight with one. But when the best Mayor and finest radio station owner in America broke down into puddles of emotion on the air at State in Madison every year, so did I.

Driven wrestlers, eternally sacrificing. Wisconsin Wrestling Hall of Fame-inductee Coach Bob Garrou, Hall of Fame Coach Bob Skubal, legions of dedicated Assistant Coaches, parents, and more toiling in service of greatness - with Gregg and Bob bringing it all home.

Cozying around the radio like in the old days for the big matches. A family. A community waiting, waiting. Did you hear? Did they win?

During State, grandparents would call me from Arizona, Florida, or just down the street sobbing. It's their grandson's last year of wrestling, and they're just glad grandpa could hear it, before he... and he can't talk right now, but thank you. Tell them - Gregg and Bob - it just meant everything to

Therefore, I hereby request that WJJQ's Gregg Albert and Bob "The General" Lee be considered for immediate honorary induction into the Wisconsin Wrestling Hall of Fame. No one in the Northwoods of Wisconsin could have been finer ambassadors for the sport. They made me a fan. That's not "good PR," that's a miracle.

I simply cannot picture the General alone. In every memory, he's either with Bev, the love of his life, or Gregg, his longsuffering spouse. And Bob's either smiling, or he's about to.

God, what a scoundrel. What a man. I would have voted him Mayor for life. I'm so grateful for the respect he and Bev always paid to me, and the love. Our hearts go out to his family.

God bless our Mayor, our most robust champion, our friend.
