





for 388 different teachers, as students, colleagues, parents and community members submitted nomination forms, based on educators who they thought were making a difference. From these names, an online ballot was created for teachers to vote on their top selections. A minimum of one teacher was selected to represent each school.

As the selection process moves forward, recommendations from school principals will be provided and the Teachers of Distinction will submit a personal statement describing their educational philosophy. The written materials identify ways these teachers inspire and motivate students, their use of innovative projects or programs, as well as their involvement in the community and their pursuit of professional development.

The final step will occur at the end of February when the Teachers of Distinction prepare a presentation for a selection panel comprised of leaders from area businesses who place a high value on an educated workforce. The final selection will be based on expertise (professionalism, knowledge subject matter); innovation (advanced classroom techniques, teaching methods); and leadership (student guidance and rapport, reputation colleagues, among community

involvement). Our 2024 Crystal Apple winners will be announced in each of their schools in early March. All Teachers of Distinction will be honored at the Crystal Apple Awards banquet to be held May 1, 2024, at Hotel Marshfield.



'Auction of Champions' concludes National Farm Safety and Health Week

MARSHFIELD -- The National Farm Medicine Center celebrated National Farm Safety and Health Week, Sept. 17 - 23, by hosting a three-day National Ag Centers Safety and Health Summit, culminating in the "Auction of Champions," the annual gala benefiting multiple Farm Medicine programs. Summit participants included Jennifer Lincoln, Ph.D., leader of the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) agriculture, forestry, and fishing program. Joining her were representatives from 8 of the 12 NIOSH-funded agricultural safety and health centers based in California, Illinois, Minnesota, Nebraska, New York, Texas, Washington and Wisconsin.

"This was an excellent opportunity to leverage the expertise of these visiting ag safety leaders as we try to ensure the success of all types of agriculture, forestry and commercial fishing now and in the future," said Casper Bendixsen, Ph.D., director of Farm Medicine.

Scientists from Farm Medicine and its largest program, the NIOSH-funded National Children's Center for Rural and Agricultural Health and Safety, facilitated meetings related to children and youth, technology and engineering, injury surveillance, policy, farm workers, and interdisciplinary and cross-institutional work. The agenda included field trips to Norm-E-Lane Farms and H&S Manufacturing Co.

Scientists and staff from several Marshfield Clinic Research Institute centers engaged with the NIOSH visitors to explore possible collaboration, including discussions about occupational industry in the medical record and the relationship between agriculture, the human microbiome and immunology.

Marshfield 150 for 150: Terry Wahls

Dr. Terry Wahls joined Marshfield Clinic in 1987, when there were only a handful of female physicians on staff. She helped launch a monthly dinner meeting that fostered collegiality among the growing cadre of female physicians and actively mentored female residents, staff, and physician leaders. She was instrumental in working toward equal pay for equal work at Marshfield Clinic.

Dr. Wahls grew up on a farm in Iowa. She loved outdoor activities such as skiing, hiking and biking. Her background and interests and the presence of a world-class medical center attracted her to the Marshfield community.

Terry was a remarkable physician, an internist, and was truly in demand by the women of Marshfield, many of whom had never had the opportunity to be cared for by a female physician. Her schedule was always full.

Dr. Wahls was known for achieving justice. As a lesbian, she was a frontrunner in our community in advocating for the LGBTQ community in ways big and small. She said, "I grew comfortable with living my life as an out lesbian in Marshfield. And the town grew comfortable with me." She eventually decided to have a child, but her parents worried that the community would disapprove of her decision to undergo IVF (she was unable to find a fertility clinic in Minnesota, Wisconsin or Iowa that would treat a single woman and received care in San Francisco) and raise a child as a single parent. Happily, her experience was generally positive from patients, colleagues and friends in Marshfield.

However, she tells the story of birth announcements. "After I gave birth, I searched the newspaper for the



birth announcement, but it wasn't there. I called the newspaper, who said they were never notified. I called Labor and Delivery, who said they didn't bother notifying the paper because I wasn't married, and the newspaper never published birth announcements for single mothers. That was July 1991. I called the paper again, asking for the editor-in-chief. His response was terse."

"We don't publish announcements unless the mother is married."

Later that day, the editor called back, apologized, and agreed to publish her son, Zack's birth announcement, and, furthermore, changed their policy on publishing, not only birth announcements, but also including married women's first names, rather than referring to them under their husband's names. The newspaper published an editorial about the change in policy. Terry received many thank you letters from local residents. Back in her department in Internal Medicine, she was amused to learn that there was a betting pool to wager whether she would win her case.

A few years later, Dr. Wahls recognized through her personal experience that there was a great need for quality day care for children in this community. Through a lot of hard work and persistence, she was able to achieve what others had been trying to do for twenty years - the establishment of a daycare center for clinic employees'

Dr. Wahls moved to the University of Iowa in 2000 and has since become an internationally-recognized scientist investigating the role of diet and lifestyle to treat multiple sclerosis-related symptoms. She is the author of books which detail her recovery from severe disability due to progressive multiple sclerosis using a diet and lifestyle program that she created. Incredibly, she was able to move from using a tilt wheelchair to riding her bicycle to work each day.

Through her intelligence and persistence, Terry Wahls made a place for herself in the Marshfield community for many years, and through her advocacy, made the community a more welcoming and better place for all of

Bras for a Cause

Annual donation drive to benefit women's shelters

CENTRAL WISCONSIN - A central Wisconsin woman is once again working to collect new and lightly-used bras for women in need, to be delivered to women's shelters in the area by Valentine's Day.

Jacquelyn Tolksdorf has been running bra drives since 2020, when she noticed that bras are often forgotten by even the most well-meaning donators.

Though that year's goal was 500 bras, this year, Tolksdorf's aspirations are higher.

"More and more shelters and hospitals are in need of new and non-used bras," said Tolksdorf. "Bras are often something women forget when quickly fleeing a domestic abuse situation or when they end up in the hospital without the safety to go back home and collect their belongings from their abuser. It's a highly-needed item to donate to shelters that most donors feel weird about donating.'

Loyal company reaches settlement over alleged water pollution violations

MADISON -- Attorney General Josh Kaul on Nov. 22 announced a \$100,000 settlement with Paul Bugar Trucking, Inc., Loyal, and owner Paul J. Bugar. The settlement resolves a civil environmental enforcement action alleging violations of a Wisconsin Pollution Discharge Elimination System permit for the company's non-metallic mining operations

"Companies entrusted with WPDES permits must uphold their obligations under those permits," said Kaul. "When those obligations aren't met, Wisconsin DOJ is prepared to act to ensure that clean water is protected."

The state's complaint alleges five total violations related to discharges from one of the company's mining pits. One of the violations is for allegedly failing to collect representative water samples

for testing prior to discharging; one is for allegedly failing to treat wastewater before discharging; one is for allegedly exceeding pollution discharge limitations; one is for allegedly failing to submit annual inspection reports; and one is for allegedly failing to conduct sampling of the wastewater for oil, grease, and phosphorus pollutants.

The proposed agreement requires

the company to pay a total of \$100,000 in

forfeitures, surcharges, court costs, and

attorney fees. The Order for Judgment was signed by Clark County Circuit Court Judge Lyndsey Brunette on Nov. 21. The Legislature's Joint Committee on

Finance approved the proposed resolution on Oct. 18.

Assistant Attorney General Zachary B. Corrigan represented the State and worked closely with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to obtain this result.
