# Summer in the city


#### Downtown Green Bay, On Broadway announce summer programming

Representatives from Downtown Green Bay, Inc., On Broadway, Inc., Discover Green Bay and the city of Green Bay gathered on the CityDeck last week to debut this summer's event schedule, featuring more than 70 events to take place throughout the city's downtown districts.

Bringing many of these events to Green Bay requires a collaboration between the city and its downtown organizations.

"We're really fortunate to host over 75 events throughout the summer. If you think about the number of days within the summer, that's a pretty good percentage of activation that we have throughout the

entire summer and through the entire year," said James Andersen, assistant director of Green Bay Parks, Recreation and Forestry. "We love to host... And we work really collaboratively with all of these organizations to make sure that people experience Green Bay in a way that we're proud of."

"It's our principal responsibility to create these spaces and to create these facilities, but it's community organizations and individuals that make the great things happen," Green Bay Mayor Eric Genrich said. "I'm just thrilled about another great summer in the city of Green Bay."

The collaboration and hard work that goes into providing summer programming in Green Bay pays off in more ways than one, as Discover Green Bay CEO Brad Toll said events such as those hosted by Downtown Green Bay and On Broadway draw in visitors as well as locals.

"We've got lovely hotels — most communities have lovely hotels — but visitors don't get in their car from Iowa and drive to a destination just to stay in a hotel," Toll said. "They're looking for unique experiences and ways to find attractions and experience a community. Living like a local or visiting like a local is very important to a lot of people. They want to do the things the locals are doing. Everything you're doing in the downtown area is providing us with things that we can market to try and bring those visitors into our community... Visitors don't go to places where there aren't things to do, so creating these things is absolutely fantastic.. It's going to be another awesome summer in Green Bay."



**On Broadway** 

Many of On Broadway's signature events will return this summer, including the Farmers' Market on Broadway, igNight Market, Levitt AMP Green Bay Music Series and Fire Over the Fox.

The Farmers' Market on Broadway is already underway and will continue on Wednesdays from 3-8 p.m. through Sept. 25 with more than 100 vendors offering fresh produce, prepared and processed foods, ready-to-eat food options and more, plus live music on two stages.

New this year, select market dates will be themed to recognize and celebrate cultural holidays and last year's Mini Boss program will expand to include even more opportunities for young entrepreneurs.

"One of the cool things about this event that we did last year was our Mini Boss program," said Brian Johnson, president ▲ After three years and more than 50 murals added to the Broadway District, the Mural and Busker Fest will not be coming back this year.

and CEO of On Broadway. It allows kids to develop products of their own — sometimes we had bakers, sometimes crafts — but they sell them at the market and that was wildly successful for us last year. Sadly, we had to turn away a lot of kids for capacity reasons and so this year we were very intentional about not only doubling the number of days that we're going to host that kids' market this year, but also expanding the number of booths that we have... This year, we're going to have the capacity to accommodate 64 different young entrepreneurs."

will return this summer on June 15 and Aug. 17 — only two dates compared to last year's four.

"We've decided to reduce it to two this year because we're going to take the same amount of resources but condense it into two events and pack a bigger punch," Johnson said. "This is an artisan market, so it really involves areas and culture in our community and brings in artisans to sell their products at the event... This event, at Leicht Park, has the hot air balloon glow that's always a huge hit... Historically we've been right around seven, eight or nine [hot air balloons]. We're going to have up to 15 balloons at that event this year, so it should really be a spectacular sight."

The Levitt AMP Green Bay Music Series will continue this summer as well with weekly performances spanning a broad array of music genres and cultural programming between June 2-Aug. 4.

On Broadway will also continue to host Fire Over the Fox as a celebration of the Fourth of July with fireworks, live music, food and entertainment. VIP seating will be available for purchase as usual, but a Best Seats in the House contest will also take place this year, granting attendees an opportunity to win special seating for the fireworks show.

The Mural and Busker Festival, which ran in the Broadway District for the last three years, will not be returning to the Broadway District this year.

"When you do a lot of events like this, inevitable there are events that go away for different reasons. For us, that was the Mural and Busker Festival," Johnson said. "Our goal was to sort of paint the Broadway District with murals, right? To make it beautiful and add some of that design impact. We were really thrilled with the outcome of that event. We put up over 50 murals in three years and kind of hit a plateau and just said, 'Alright, our work is done here. Let's take a break and let's redirect those resources and try to do some new things.' And that's exactly what we're going to do this year."

#### **Downtown Green Bay**

CityDeck Family Shows, Theatre in the Park and ArtFest.

The Saturday Farmers' Market kicks off this Saturday, May 25, and will feature more than 100 vendors offering fresh produce, meats, cheeses, prepared specialties, flowers and more, plus live entertainment, yoga, family days, cooking demos and new farmers' market merch.

Fridays on the Fox will also return to the CityDeck each Friday from 6-9 p.m., June 14-Aug. 2, featuring a different music act each week and food served by Hagemeister Park.

Every other Monday, CityDeck will host CityDeck Family Shows, featuring free interactive children's shows and activities including a kids' collaborative mural.

Theatre in the Park, featuring performances of *Twelfth Night* by Play-by-Play Theatre, will also be back this year at Whitney Park on Sunday, June 23, with local food trucks and shows starting at 2 p.m. and 6 p.m.

New this year, Whitney Park will also be home to Children's Theatre in the Park, featuring free performances at 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. of *Going... Going... Gone with the Breeze* put on by Evergreen Theatre.


ArtFest, first held last year, will also return to the Downtown District, once again bringing art to the heart of the city with an art fair, music, theater, dance, food, demonstrations, color run, community art mural and interactive art.

"We were delighted by the turnout last year — in excess of 30,000 people attended — and we have more vendors who have signed up than last year — now over a hundred artists," said Jeff Mirkes, executive director at Downtown Green Bay. "What we learned from the artist community is they want to watch one year and see how it does, and they're responding by signing up... I'm sure as it grows, [ArtFest] can become one of Downtown's signature events."

# The Big Show

An exhibit of epic proportions is on display now through June 1 at Green Bay's Art Garage — a show filled with large-scale art pieces which Art Garage Programming Director Lindsay Olson said often don't find a place in typical shows.

'There are a lot of places that do small work shows," she said. "It's been kind of all the rage to do smaller work shows because it's more accessible. You can hang more and there are a lot of people that can see the artwork, but having a

For The Big Show, the only factor limiting the size of the pieces included was that it had to fit through the gallery's


Working on a large scale, Olson said, often allows artists to create more freely and viewers to take note of more


"There's an energy to large-scale work," she said. "What's able to happen in works like this is you can emphasize the

brush strokes and you can emphasize the different media that you're incorporating... So often we limit ourselves when we're working in certain scales, so I feel the larger sizes are freeing."

The Big Show will remain on display for viewing during the gallery's regular hours with a closing reception planned for June 1.

# A dream come true

# East's Duarte Castillo headed to New York for National High School Musical Theatre Awards

**In just a month,** Green Bay East High School's Jenny Duarte Castillo will take the stage at Broadway's Minskoff Theatre for the 15th annual Jimmy Awards after earning a nomination at last weekend's Center Stage High School Musical Theater Program.

The Center Stage program, hosted by the Fox Cities Performing Arts Center, is a regional awards program of the National High School Musical Theatre Awards — one of 51 regional programs which each nominate two local students to participate in the Jimmy Awards program.

Through the Center Stage program, high schools apply to have their shows attended and critiqued by judges, culminating in a selection of students to receive recognitions at a Tony Awards-style showcase where the Jimmy Award nominees are also announced.

As one of this year's Jimmy Award nominees, Duarte Castillo will join 101 other students from across the country in New York to showcase their talents on Broadway.

"I'm definitely looking forward to going to New York — it's amazing there — and also making a bunch of new friends and learning hands-on experience with Broadway professionals," Duarte Castillo said. "I'm very excited to be in the opening number of the Jimmy Awards. Every year, I try to look at the opening number and I'm always like, "That is so cool.' I'm just most excited to finally be in the opening number and meet a bunch of new people from all around the nation."

"The best way that I could describe it is that it's been such a dream come true," Duarte Castillo said. "This is not something that I was expecting at all, but I was very hopeful. Throughout the years of being involved in high school theater and working with my friends and director, I kind of built all these relationships and connections and I was driven to work harder and seek something bigger. All I can say is it was a surreal experience and I'm so grateful that I involved myself and involved myself through the Fine Arts Institute and always attended rehearsals and practices because without that, I don't think that this would have been possible."

Maureen Tjoflat, choir director at East, said it's been a joy to watch Duarte Castillo grow as a performer and earn this nomination.

"It's thrilling," she said. "It's very exciting to see the growth... [Music's] a unique thing that we have because we get to see these students for a number of years. We get to see them progress through their classes and their lessons and [Jenny] is in the Fine Arts Institute and she's done a lot of work and it's interesting to see those lessons and programs and all of those experiences that she's had and then all of a sudden to see things come together... I've definitely seen Jenny step forward and grow in these past years... This is just a great capstone for her. For me, I'm thrilled. We have a wonderful team of teachers here that work on the musical — it's definitely a group event that we work together in all different facets in the production and the music — we're super thrilled. We were in the audience and jumped right up, cheering along with the kids."

Without the support of her teachers and directors at East, Duarte Castillo said that growth wouldn't have been possible.

"Being at East and being involved in musicals and the music department as a whole and the Fine Arts Institute has allowed me to be vulnerable and do a lot of things that I could have never seen myself doing many years ago," she said. "It definitely has allowed me to grow resilience and perseverance and overcome small challenges and especially setbacks. There was a lot of time for the audition process where I was very doubtful of myself and didn't think I was capable of even having a good audition and there'd always be negative thoughts in my mind, and I remembered that I'm here for a reason and I am surrounded by all this support and there's no pressure at all or expectations that people have of me. At the end of the day, they are just going to love me no matter what."




