Local advocacy group, Lincoln County Board Chair Boyd react to Pine Crest sale agreement's termination

A local group that has advocated against the sale of Pine Crest Nursing Home in Merrill, as well as the Chair of the Lincoln County Board of Supervisors, recently reacted to the termination of the facility's sale agreement.

lawsuit brought against Lincoln County by Donald J. Dunphy, who serves as District 7 Supervisor on the Lincoln County Board, led to the facility's buyers, Merrill Campus LLC and Senior Management Inc., ending Purchase Asset Agreement with County.

2024, Α June 28, letter to Lincoln Administrative County Coordinator Renee Krueger from the buyers' Richard attorney, Summerfield, said the buyers chose to terminate the agreement due to language in the agreement that states that should there be litigation brought against the County or the facility, the County would be in default of the agreement.

With the sale of the facility now off, "People for Pine Crest" and Lincoln County Board Chair and District 10 Supervisor Jesse Boyd voiced their views on the issue and are looking ahead to what's in property taxes for five

"People for Pine Crest" laud termination of sale agreement

"People for Pine Crest," a group that has advocated against the sale of the Merrill facility, lauded the news of the sale agreement's termination.

Dunphy is a member of People for Pine Crest.

In a release from the group, Gene Babel, a Merrill resident group member, said the termination of the sale agreement is "great news for the people of Lincoln County.'

"Selling Pine Crest to an out-of-state corporation like Senior Management Inc. was never a good idea," Babel said. "As a County nursing home, Pine Crest has been taking care of Lincoln County residents for 70 years, and we should be investing in Pine Crest so it will continue to do so for the next 70 years."

The group called the sale of Pine Crest "widely unpopular" and highlighted an Oct. 2023 public opinion survey Lincoln County residents conducted by the Tomahawk Leader and the Merrill Foto News that found that more than 80% of the nearly 800 respondents would have supported an increase years or more to keep the nursing home Countyowned.

Over the course of more than a year, People for Pine Crest collected more than 800 signatures on a petition opposing the sale, while group members have utilized public comment periods during numerous County Board meetings to speak out against that County's sale of the nursing home.

The group also pointed to the Board's Aug. 2023 rejection of a potential referendum that would have put the future of Pine Crest funding in the hands of Lincoln County voters.

"As the supervisors moved forward in their efforts to sell the nursing home, Pine Crest's finances continued to improve," the release said.

Pine River resident Eileen Guthrie said in the release that "one of the hollow arguments that the proponents of selling Pine Crest often made was that it cost too much money."

"However, Pine Crest's operating budget is in very good shape," Guthrie said. "In fact, through the end of May 2024, Pine Crest is running a net positive operating budget balance of \$555,000.00, according

Lahti sentenced in drunk driving homicide

At a July 8, 2024, sentencing hearing in Lincoln County Court, John James Lahti, age 43, of Merrill was sentenced to 15 years in prison plus 10 years of extended supervision in the Sept. 17, 2022, death of an 8-yearold Gleason boy and the injuries to his family members, sustained when Lahti was driving drunk and crossed the center line on Hwv. 17 north of Merrill causing a head-on crash. Lahti struck a vehicle

ccupied by a family of four, and the collision resulted in the death of eight-vearold Ian Skaar and serious injury to his mother, Leah Skaar, both of whom were passengers in the vehicle. Ian's sister and his father, Tom Skaar, who was driving, also sustained minor injuries.

Lahti was treated for minor injuries at Aspirus Merrill Hospital, and then arrested. He has been held in the Lincoln County Jail on a \$500,000 cash bond since.

The Complaint in the case said Lahti displayed impaired by alcohol use and a preliminary breath test taken approximately 30 minutes after the crash put him at .290 Breath Alcohol Concentration (BrAC) at 7:55 p.m., more than three times the legal limit at the time of the crash. A second test registered .223 BrAC at 11:45 p.m. The legal limit in Wisconsin is .08 BrAC or Blood Alcohol Content (BAC). Law enforcement also found an open, halffull bottle of brandy in the vehicle.

Hot summer days have already claimed the lives of at least 10 children this year in the United States due to heatstroke, often caused by being left unattended in



itself quickly enough, leading to a dangerously high body temperature. Young children particularly vulnerable, as their bodies heat up three to five times faster than adults. According to NoHeatStroke.com, since 1998, at least 976 children in the United States have died from heatstroke in vehicles.

"A car can become dangerously hot very quickly," warns Amanda

Tabin, Safe Kids & Injury Prevention Coordinator at Aspirus Wausau Hospital. "Cracking a window doesn't lower the temperature in a vehicle as much as people think it will, so the best practice is to make sure you don't leave any kids (or pets) in a vehicle unattended – even for a minute."

We can prevent these deaths and near misses by remembering to ACT:

Avoid heatstroke-

related injury and death by never leaving a child alone in a car, not even for a minute. Always keep your car locked when not in use so children cannot get inside on their own.

C: Create reminders. Place a stuffed animal or other memento in your child's car seat when it's empty and move it to the front seat when your child is in the back. You can also place your phone, briefcase,

or purse in the back seat to ensure you check the back before leaving the car.

T: Take action. If you see a child alone in a car, call 911 immediately. Emergency personnel are trained to handle these situations. Your call could save a life.






Presenters from Germany come to Merrill

The Merrill Historical Society recently announced that on Thursday, July 25, 2024, Board Members of Film Museum Bendestorf, Andreas and Sven, will be visiting Merrill and giving a presentation about the history of Studio Bendestorf, German film, and local filmmaker Bill Rebane's role in getting American film producers to make their movies in Germany.

In 1947, after World War II ended, Studio Bendestorf was one of the first film studios to start making movies again. In the 1960's and 70's, Bill Rebane was the U.S. representative for the studio and helped convince the makers of Dollars (1971) starring Goldie Hawn and WarrenBeatty, How I Won the War (1967) starring John Lennon, and The Odessa

Reckless Injury, six of the counts were dismissed but read in as part of a plea agreement whereby Lahti pled No Contest to the Homicide by Intox Use of Vehicle (2nd+) and OWI Cause Injury (2+) charges. The plea agreement saved court time and expense and spared the victims the ordeal of a trial in the

The plea was entered during a Feb. 20, 2024, Plea Hearing before Judge Robert Russell during which the Court accepted the pleas and found Lahti Guilty Due to No Contest Plea on the two charges. Sentencing was scheduled for July.

Sentencing details

Judge Russell imposed the 15 years in prison plus 10 years of extended supervision sentence on the charge of Homicide by Intox Use of Vehicle (2nd+), and Judge Russell additionally imposed a sentence of 1 year in prison plus 1 year of extended supervision on the charge of OWI Cause Injury (2+); however, the sentences concurrent run and, with credit for time already served, Lahti may

be released from prison in 2037.

Lahti was also sentenced to an order of absolute sobriety, prohibited from being on any premises where the main purpose is for the sale of alcohol, prohibited from contact with the victim's family except that he will write a letter of apology to the victims which must be pre-approved by the Court's agent, alcohol and drug assessment and treatment, revocation of his driver's license for five years and then restriction operating vehicles equipped with an ignition interlock device for five years after that, and

restitution was left to be determined.

During the sentencing hearing, a number victims made statements for the court's consideration, which the Court balanced with references character submitted by Lahti's attorney on Lahti's behalf and a pre-sentence investigation filed in the weeks prior to the hearing.




She was preceded in death by her father Martin Natzke father-in-law Robert 'Bob' Seidl, grandparents, many aunts and uncles and one cousin.

TO THE EDITOR:

Let us clear the air regarding the cancellation of the purchase of Pine Crest Nursing Home by a for profit, out of state corporation.

First, the County maintaining ownership of Pine Crest is good news for the families of Lincoln County. The sale of our County nursing home would have ended a nearly century-long commitment between the residents of Lincoln County and our elderly and most vulnerable citizens.

This has been People for Pine Crest's position all along. We have collected petition signatures, held meetings, conducted and shared our research, testified at the County Board meetings, and even hosted our own town hall when the County Board refused to hold its own.

When the county government is not responsive to the people, when the local media refuses to ask the hard questions, the only recourse for a concerned citizen lies in the courts. It is the venue of last resort. We are grateful to Mr. Dunphy that at least someone is trying to hold County

officials responsible for following their own rules and adhering to the legal requirements for county government.

Second, maintaining County ownership of Pine Crest presents us with the opportunity to come together to keep Pine Crest strong and to serve the people of the County for another 100 years.

What we have learned over the past several months is that the future for Pine Crest is sound and improving. Changes in the Medicaid reimbursement rate have put Pine Crest operations on a financial path that will not require greater investment from the County.

Like every other building in the County, Pine Crest does need capital improvements and we have known this all along too. This is something that we can solve, both for today and the long term. What it requires is the will and the courage of the County Board to sit down with members of the community to get down to the business of figuring out a long-term plan to keep Pine Crest a high-quality, affordable, and local County-owned nursing home.

It's time to stop looking backwards and start planning for a better future. We are here to do that work and we hope the Lincoln County Board is ready to do the same.

to the latest figures from Central Care.'

Frederick Renea Merrill said in the release that the group is "ready to get to work so Pine Crest can continue to provide high quality, affordable, and local care."

"All of the effort that went into trying to sell Pine Crest would have been better spent on saving it," Frederick said. "That said, we see this moment as an opportunity to bring people together to make Pine Crest even better. We are ready to roll up our sleeves and invest in Pine Crest for the long haul and we expect the County Supervisors to do the same."

Board Chair Jesse Boyd: Sale agreement's termination "came as a surprise"

Wednesday, On July 3, Lincoln County Board Chair and District 10 Supervisor Jesse Boyd said the termination of the sale agreement "came as a big surprise."

"All parties involved knew during the process that Supervisor Dunphy filed notice of a lawsuit, but during our conversations regarding the extension, the lawsuit was never discussed," Boyd said.

Boyd said the resolution that Dunphy's lawsuit is based on "is not binding County Board Supervisors, only acting as a recommendation."

"Nor do we believe the Forestry Department has any knowledge regarding a nursing home," he said.

Looking forward, Boyd said he doesn't know what the Board will do regarding how Pine Crest will impact the 2025 County budget.

July 18 & 25, 2024

Boyd said he assumes Dunphy "has come up with a plan," but noted that Dunphy "has not shared this information."

"However, I've heard of discussion regarding another referendum," Boyd said. "What that amount will be, I would urge any Supervisor or concerned citizens to look back at the last legislative session. When you do look back, the numbers were laid out in the resolution for the cost of maintenance, debt service, and operational cost. That came to just under \$4 million per year. However, the resolution was only for \$3 million, and it's guessing to factor in inflation."

Boyd said he feels like "we're beating a dead horse when we talk about Lincoln County's finances."

"We depleted to critical levels all fund balances and Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) funds," he said. "We've used those monies for operational expenses, which has left us in a critical situation."

Boyd pointed to a situation involving the Waste Solid County's Department, saying that the only way to keep the Lincoln County Landfill open was to bond a new cell and a new compactor, which Boyd said was "no fault of the Solid Waste Department."

For years, Boyd explained, the Department set aside \$200,000 per year to use when a new cell would be needed, but those funds were ultimately allocated to operational expenses.

"We are all doing our best to stay optimistic and forward-thinking," said. "To put it simply, we cannot afford to run or have someone else run a nursing home without increasing taxes or bonding for operational expenses. Let me remind you that the majority of our tax base is on a fixed income."



Crime Stoppers Tip vs 911 Call

If you see a crime actively being committed CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY. Officers will be dispatched to intervene.

911 is for emergencies, while submitting a tip is for nonemergencies.

If you know of a crime that has already happened, submit a tip. If you know of someone that has been breaking into cars or buildings, deals drugs, or is taking advantage of another. Information regarding unsolved crimes or Instances such as this would be reasons to submit a tip verses calling 911.

When you send a tip, you must remember the number you entered when you submitted the tip. You will use this number to log into the app again. Be sure to check the tip periodically. Officers will contact you through your tip to ask clarifying questions. This is how they will let you know if you received a payout if the tip resulted in an arrest. You will never receive a notification if there is a response through the app. That is why it's important to check back periodically.

Pictures and videos can be incredibly helpful to law enforcement. You can upload both through the P3 app.

When you call or send a tip you should not indicate your name. Both are completely anonymous.

Selling stuff online? Here's how to avoid a scam

Selling stuff online can be a great way to make some extra cash. Craigslist, Facebook Marketplace, and other sites attract a lot of buyers — and scammers. Here are some ways scammers try to cheat you and what to do about it.

Fake payments and bogus refund requests

A scammer posing as a buyer says they want to buy the thing you have for sale. When it comes time to pay, they insist on paying through a mobile payment app. They send you a fake payment notification and hope you send the item before you realize it's a


Or they say there was an issue with the payment they sent. For example, they might say they accidentally paid you twice and ask you to refund one of the payments.


Fake check overpayment

The scammer offers to give you a check for more than the selling price. They tell you to deposit the check and send the difference back to them.


The check is fake, but if you deposit it, it'll appear in your account balance. That's because banks must make your money available quickly, usually within two days.



Is the P3 app anonymous?

The multi-lingual P3 Tips App is a secure, anonymous, and efficient means of safely communicating with Crime Stoppers.

When to call 911 vs. reporting to Crime Stoppers - When someone is in immediate danger, a drunk driver, active criminal activity happening **CALL 911**. Time is of the essence in such matters. When you are aware of criminal activity or have details about a crime, you can send the tip through to Crime Stoppers either through the P3 app or a phone call to the anonymous line.

Tips on Tips By Tom Berg

Crime Stoppers' basic principle has always been to provide the public with a method to anonymously assist law enforcement in solving crimes. This began with the anonymous tip telephone line and has progressed to include electronic submission of tips via the p3tips.com site.

Where telephone calls are answered by a trained dispatcher or volunteer that can help the tip provider to provide as much useful information as possible, the tipster does not have this opportunity with the electronic submission, so some guidelines and suggestions are in order.

People have various motivations for providing a Crime Stoppers tip. While the opportunity for a reward might motivate some, others simply want to see justice done, a wrong righted, and order in society. All want to see crimes solved, and the best tip possible gives the best chance. P3 provides various prompts, such as location. It is helpful if these are filled out completely. A number of states have Lincoln Counties, and it is surprising how many tips we get for Crime Stoppers of Lincoln County, Nebraska, and vice-versa. In providing details of a tip, try to answer as many of the questions "who, what, where, why, and how" as possible, and in enough detail as possible to allow police to work with the tip. Insufficiency is frustrating to police, sometimes making a tip unworkable, which then frustrates the tipster who would like to see results. P3 offers the opportunity to write a reply where police can leave a message for the tipster. Establish this site for receiving questions and notifications. Own your tip and check occasionally (for security reasons, p3 will not message you) - some investigations take longer than others. Both phone and electronic tip recipients provide a tip number. WRITE IT DOWN! This is your ticket to receiving messages or questions from police and notification of a reward. Not all callers are interested in a reward but all callers are interested in seeing their crimes solved.

Lincoln County achieves record tourism numbers for 2023

Tomahawk, Merrill Chambers highlight successes, look to future

Lincoln County had a record year for tourism in 2023.

The Wisconsin Department of Tourism, on Tuesday, June 11, 2024, released economic data for 2023, showing that tourism had a record \$25 billion impact throughout Wisconsin, making it the best year for tourism in state history.

Wisconsin topped a record year – in 2022, the Badger State saw a \$23.7 billion economic impact from tourism.

Lincoln County also had its best year for tourism to date. A total economic impact of \$109 million was generated by tourism in Lincoln County in 2023, beating the county's previous record of \$103 million, set in 2022.

A release from the Merrill Area Chamber of Commerce said Wisconsin's historic year in tourism was fueled by economic impact growth in all 72 counties, a record number of overnight visitors for a second consecutive year, and investments tourism businesses made in goods and services.

Last year Lincoln County tourism supported 665 partand full-time jobs across various sectors of the industry, part of the more than 178,000 jobs sustained by tourism across the state, according to the Merrill Chamber.

Tourism in Lincoln County also generated \$6 million in local and state tax revenue in 2023. Statewide, tourism generated \$1.6 billion in local and state tax revenue last year.

"Without this revenue, each Wisconsin household would pay an additional \$660 to maintain the current level of government services," the Merrill Chamber said.

"We have really seen a benefit as a Chamber and Visitor's Center in developing stronger strategic partnerships with the City of Merrill, Lincoln County, and the Tomahawk Area Chamber to drive tourism to our local communities," said Clyde Nelson, Executive Director of the Merrill Chamber.

The Tomahawk Regional Chamber of Commerce said in a release that it is "thrilled to see the effort of so many organizations in Lincoln County paying off."

"Lincoln County is a gateway to the Northwoods," the Tomahawk Chamber said. "Seeing the efforts garnering a return is success in the best way. Tourism is a large portion of our economic success in the Tomahawk area. As the Chamber, we strive to support our local businesses by driving those tourism dollars to our region."

The Tomahawk Chamber added that the relationships the organization has with Tomahawk Main Street Inc. and other local partners have helped drive the success of tourism in the area, noting that without those partnerships working towards a similar goal, "these numbers would not be as high as they are."

"We share the successes within Lincoln County with the Merrill Chamber," the Tomahawk Chamber said. "Efforts by both Chambers are showing greater returns every year. We look forward

to growing our partnership with the Merrill Chamber and continuing to promote Lincoln County together."




