Merrill house fire displaces occupants of two apartments

On Saturday evening, Aug. 3, 2024, the Merrill Fire Department (MFD) was dispatched for a report of smoke coming from a house on Genesee Street in Merrill. According to the MFD, while en route, dispatch advised that there was an occupant "upstairs" in the building.

Visible smoke could be seen in the air area from several blocks away, the MFD and area residents reported.

"Upon arrival, MFD was met with significant fire and smoke coming from the first and lower levels of the home," a press release said. Engine 61 approached the back of the house from the alley where dark gray/black smoke was coming from both the garage door and garage service door and the first-level roof and windows of the house and a significant amount of fire was also visible, the MFD incident report said.

MFD went into rescue mode and, while preparing to enter the home, learned that all



A&L, Finance Committees to discuss potential Pine Crest funding referendum in joint meeting

In a special joint meeting this week, two Lincoln County committees will discuss a potential referendum related to the funding of Pine Crest Nursing Home in Merrill.

The County's Administrative and Legislative (A&L) and Finance Committees are scheduled to meet at the Lincoln County Service Center, 801 N. Sales St., Merrill, on Friday, Aug. 9, 2024, at 7:30 a.m. The meeting may be attended virtually at *tinyurl.com/2edcsd9f*.

The agenda includes discussion regarding Pine Crest financials, possible action on a resolution seeking to authorize a binding referendum, and the potential approval of the official referendum question language.

The proposed resolution, authored by District 10 Supervisor and Board Chair Jesse Boyd and co-sponsored by District 12 Supervisor Julie DePasse, seeks to exceed levy limits each year from 2025 to 2029 to fund Pine Crest operations, maintenance, and debt services.

The amount by which levy limits would be exceeded if the resolution were to ultimately be approved by the Lincoln County Board of Supervisors was not provided

in the resolution and is expected to be discussed during Friday's joint committee meeting.

The resolution's proposal comes roughly one month after Merrill Campus LLC and Senior Management Inc., the organizations which were previously set to buy Pine Crest, terminated the Asset Purchase Agreement with Lincoln County in response to a lawsuit filed by Donald J. Dunphy in May.

Under the agreement, the buyers could terminate the agreement in the event that Lincoln County or Pine Crest faced legal action that would "adversely affect the operation or the financial condition" of the Merrill facility or "restrain or prohibit the consumption of the transaction" of Pine Crest.

In the lawsuit, Dunphy, who represents District 7 on the Lincoln County Board and is a member of People for Pine Crest, a group that has advocated against the sale of the Merrill facility, alleged that Lincoln County had failed to follow best practices set forth in a Lincoln County resolution related to the sale of high-value property. By failing to follow these best practices, Dunphy claimed, the County ultimately agreed to sell Pine Crest and the County's Health and Social Services building for less than they are worth

Dunphy also alleged that, under Lincoln County Code, the County's Forestry Committee has jurisdiction over the sale of the properties.

Dunphy also claimed that the "operating deficit experienced by the nursing home in the years prior to 2023" was a "substantial consideration" in the County Board's decision to sell Pine Crest and alleged that "an increase to the Medicaid reimbursement rate paid to public nursing homes eliminated Pine Crest's operating expense deficits beginning in the first quarter of 2023."

people were out of the house, so they switched to an offensive attack on the fire itself, beginning with the garage. An open entry door to the home was closed to reduce the amount of oxygen supplying the fire and gas was shut off at both meters; however, smoke was seen exiting around the

Fire crews also attacked flames in the kitchen area they found the where concentration

was in the stairwell that came up from the garage, according to MFD's report.

"With the assistance of several area departments, crews were able to quickly extinguish the fire and prevent any damage to surrounding homes," the MFD release said. Mutual aid fire departments from the City of Antigo, Town of Russell, Village of Maine, South Area Fire and Emergency Response District (SAFER), City of Tomahawk, Town of Pine River, and Town of

Corning all responded to the scene, and staging was set up on W. Main Street near Brooke's School of Dance.

Multiple fire crews were employed to monitor the lower level for possible rekindling of extinguished fire, look for additional fire within the house on all

floors and in the attic, and perform overhaul.

A member of Corning Fire Department was utilized as the Safety Officer, a Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) was readied, and Pine River Fire Department served as staging officers. Upon arrival of Chief Finke

over scene command to him. After witnesses were interviewed and mutual aid departments were released from service, fire watch continued for 1-2 hours to watch for new hotspots or possible rekindles "due to elevated heat levels inside of the structure due to its construction as well as exposures on both sides of the involved structures," MFD's report said.

individuals, Three including two occupants of the house that were inside the home when the fire was discovered and one police officer, were evaluated onscene for smoke inhalation, with two of the three transported to Aspirus Merrill Hospital for future treatment.

Due to extensive damage to the house, no one was permitted to re-enter the building. The occupants of both apartments in the home have been displaced.

The cause of the fire is currently undetermined, the MFD said.

Employment/position: Lincoln County Clerk since January 2013. Before that I spent 23 years in the paper industry gaining project management and supervision experience which has translated well to this office.

Past or present elected offices held, dates served: I won the 2012 County Clerk race and have been uncontested until now. I have not aspired for other offices since then and do not intend to aspire for other offices while serving as our Clerk. This position commands my full attention and is not a 9-5 job like people might think. I cannot just leave my work at the office. I am always on the clock, which is not easy. I attend many evening meetings and work some very long days, whether it is an election or we are training our election

Membership in religious, service, fraternal, etc., clubs or organizations, and offices held dates served: I have been involved with community organizations since moving back to Merrill from college in 1989. I became the assistant high school hockey coach

and have been coaching pretty much since. I was the program's head coach on two different occasions and coached regional and state hockey teams where I earned a bronze medal at the USA Hockey's U17 Girls National Tournament. I was a board member for the Merrill Youth Hockey Association and served as vice president, president, player development coordinator. In 2012 I was elected to the Silver "M" Board of Directors and served on our executive committee as both the secretary and then president guiding the program's investment changes which has accelerated the clubs proceeds from our investments. I was a member of the St. John School Board when my children were attending.

Professionally and while in the Clerk's office, I became the District 7 Chair of the Wisconsin County Clerks Association (WCCA). I am currently the treasurer for the Wisconsin County Constitutional Officers (WCCO) which all county constitutional officers are eligible for membership. I am also the president of the WCCO Legal Defense Fund. I have a strong voice at the state level and am regarded as a leader amongst my state peers whom have been very supportive as well as outside election integrity groups. I am not the only election official being targeted in the

Why have you chosen to run for the office you seek and what makes you qualified to fill the office you seek: I really didn't know what I was getting into when I first answered the call to run for the office. It has changed my life and career path immensely. I do not ever regret the fact that I became an elected official and take great pride in being the Lincoln County Clerk. I fully respect the position, the people I serve, and even my opponent and his right to run against me. The Clerk's office is an integral part of our local government. The almost 12 years now has allowed me the time to fully learn the position and hone my professional management skills which I believe the County benefits from. I have a new Deputy who is still learning the position, but is doing great. I hired her last year and owe it to her to fight for my job. It would be less than ideal to change our County Clerk at this time. I feel I have done a good job in office and there is not a reason to make a change.

In office I have drastically affected the delinquent tax totals that in 2008 began to climb and then climaxed in 2014 at \$2.1 M. I have worked very hard to determine which of our delinquent properties needed to be taken by the County. I take pride in the fact that I work with our delinquent property owners to find ways to manage their debt, offering payment plans and/or identifying state and federal aid available to them. This has allowed me to positively affect the lives of others, which is something that I focus on in all aspects of my life. I can honestly say that since 2014 that the total delinquent tax amount at the end of 2023 is down roughly 70% from where it was then. The 2013 number is roughly \$650 K which still sounds high but it is the best place we have been in at least 23 years. I only have the number from

2001 forward but would be willing to say we are in the best place we have been in 50 years. Our delinquent tax amounts are now at a manageable state, and I will continue my efforts in hopes of lowering that number even more. The Tax Delinquent Collection Process involves many county offices and is a group effort that I am tasked with leading.

Our election integrity is second to none in my opinion. We have great municipal clerks and election inspectors who diligently adhere to state law and are very detailed in their work on Election Day. We train face to face here at the Lincoln County Service Center. On July 30 we held two election refresher trainings and had roughly 130 of our 200 election workers in attendance.

Many of the things that I have cited are centered on the Merrill area where I have lived almost my whole life. I have many friends in the Tomahawk and rural towns. For many years I coached against Tomahawk Youth Hockey and High School Teams. I have the utmost respect for their hockey program and the people involved. I will be at the State Tournament when they win the high school state championship, which they are poised to do this year or in the near future. I also played old-time pickup hockey with the boys for years at Sara Park. I have made a lot friends that way and in the past 12 years have made a ton more working with our local town governments and the Tomahawk School District on their Re-Apportionment





An open letter to Lincoln County supervisors:

On Aug. 20, 2024, we will be asked to vote on a resolution authorizing a binding resolution to raise the tax levy for the period 2025-2029. I have read the proposed resolution and my takeaway is that the proposed additional taxes are to pay the following items:

- · An annual obligation to pay \$440,000 from the tax levy under our management contract with NCHC.
- \$400,000 yearly in salary and benefits for the four maintenance personnel permanently assigned to Pine Crest.
- \$630,000 yearly to service the debt for the 2017 addition to Pine Crest.
- \$1,200,000 per year to build up a reserve fund to repair and replace the elements of Pine Crest's physical plant as they age.

These four items total an annual expense of

\$2,670,000. I believe we can fully fund Pine Crest for much less. The debt service is being paid out of Pine Crest's operating revenue. This was true even when Pine Crest was running operational deficits in years past. Thus, there is no need to ask the taxpayers to foot this bill. Also, the salaries of the four permanently assigned maintenance workers have always been paid out of the County's coffers without the need to increase taxes. The contractual obligation to pay \$440,000 annually to NCHC was meant to bolster the operating budget of Pine Crest when it was running operating deficits. Now that Pine Crest is consistently operating in the black, we can and should negotiate with NCHC to eliminate this expense.

That just leaves the \$1,200,000 annually to build up a reserve fund. Since we know that everything eventually wears out and must be replaced, I think putting aside money in a reserve fund makes sense. I also think that this expense is the only one we need to consider when voting for the proposed binding referendum.

In a written answer filed

in Lincoln County Court in June, Lincoln County Corporation Counsel Karry acknowledged Johnson that the Merrill facility's operating deficit was one of several factors considered by the County Board in reaching the decision to sell Pine Crest and denied Dunphy's claim that the facility's first quarter 2023 operating expense deficits were eliminated by a Medicaid reimbursement rate increase.

Johnson also refuted Dunphy's allegation that the change in circumstances as a result of the Medicaid reimbursement rate was ignored by the County and said the Board was not required to follow the best

practices laid out in the resolution referenced by Dunphy.

Dunphy's allegation regarding jurisdiction of the properties being vested in the Forestry Committee also refuted Johnson

said in an Dunphy interview with the Merrill Foto News that the lawsuit was his "vehicle to keep Pine Crest from being sold."

"I was opposed to the decision to sell Pine Crest the beginning," from Dunphy said. "When I ran for (Lincoln) County Board, I told everyone I talked to that I would do my best to reverse that decision. ... My goal is to have the Court declare the sales contract

null and void." According to records, Dunphy's lawsuit was dismissed on Monday, July 29.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at an election to be held in the several towns, villages, wards, and election districts of the State of Wisconsin, on Tuesday, August 13, 2024, the following questions will be submitted to a vote of the people pursuant to law:

2023 Assembly Joint Resolution 6 Enrolled Joint Resolution

To create section 35 of article IV of the constitution; relating to: the appropriation authority of the legislature and the allocation of moneys Wisconsin receives from the federal government (second consideration).

Whereas, the 2021 legislature in regular session considered a proposed amendment to the constitution in 2021 Senate Joint Resolution 84, which became 2021 Enrolled Joint Resolution 14, and agreed to it by a majority of the members elected to each of the two houses, which proposed amendment reads as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 35 of article IV of the constitution is created to read:

[Article IV] Section 35 (1) The legislature may not delegate its sole power to determine how moneys shall be

(2) The governor may not allocate any federal moneys the governor accepts on behalf of the state without the approval of the legislature by joint resolution or as provided by legislative rule.

SECTION 2. Numbering of new provision. If another constitutional amendment ratified by the people creates the number of any provision created in this joint resolution, the chief of the legislative reference bureau shall determine the sequencing and the numbering of the provisions whose numbers conflict.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution is agreed to by the 2023 legislature; and, be it further

Resolved, That the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution be submitted to a vote of the people at the election to be held on the second Tuesday of August 2024; and, be it further

Resolved, That the questions concerning ratification of the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution be stated on the ballot as follows:

QUESTION 1: "Delegation of appropriation power. Shall section 35 (1) of article IV of the constitution be created to provide that the legislature may not delegate its sole power to determine how moneys shall be appropriated?

QUESTION 2: "Allocation of federal moneys. Shall section 35 (2) of article IV of the constitution be created to prohibit the governor from allocating any federal moneys the governor accepts on behalf of the state without the approval of the legislature by joint resolution or as provided by legislative rule?"

EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS AS TO THE TWO QUESTIONS

Explanatory statement regarding Question 1:

The Wisconsin Constitution requires the legislature to appropriate funds from the state treasury only by passing a law, which requires a vote by both houses of the legislature. Wis. Const. art. VIII, § 2. Question 1 would add a new provision to say that the legislature cannot delegate this "sole" power to appropriate funds.

A "yes" vote on Question 1 would vote to create a new provision of the Wisconsin Constitution—Wis. Const. art. IV, § 35(1). That provision would prohibit the legislature from delegating its duty that it pass a law in order to appropriate money from the treasury under Wis. Const. art. VIII, § 2.

A "no" vote on Question 1 would vote not to add Wis. Const. art. IV, § 35(1) to the Wisconsin Constitution.

Explanatory statement regarding Question 2:

In times when Wisconsin receives undesignated federal funds from the U.S. government, the Wisconsin Constitution does not limit the ability of the governor to choose how the funds he accepts are divided among state and local agencies. Question 2 would add a new provision to the Constitution to prohibit the governor from choosing how to allocate such federal funds he accepts unless the legislature, through a joint resolution or some other process to be developed by the legislature, agrees with the governor's proposed allocation of those funds.

A "yes" vote on Question 2 would vote to create a second new provision of the Wisconsin Constitution—Wis, Const. art. IV, § 35(2), which would prohibit the governor from choosing how to allocate undesignated federal monies he accepts unless the legislature, by joint resolution or other process, agrees with the governor's proposed allocation of such funds.

A "no" vote on Question 2 would vote not to add Wis. Const. art. IV § 35(2) to the Wisconsin Constitution. Sincerely

Notice of Partisan Primary and Sample Ballots August 13, 2024 OFFICE OF THE LINCOLN COUNTY CLERK TO THE VOTERS OF LINCOLN COUNTY:

Notice is hereby given of a partisan primary to be held in Lincoln County on August 13, 2024, at which the nominees for the offices named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office under the appropriate party, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, if any, in the sample ballot below.

Information to Voters

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall state their name and address, show an acceptable form of photo identification and sign the poll book. *If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles. If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word "exempt." If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence. Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked. A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter. If a voter is unable to state their name and address, an assistant may also do so for the voter.

At the partisan primary, the voter shall select the party of their choice.

Voting for candidates of more than one party may invalidate the ballot. The voter must cast a vote for individual candidates.

Where Optical Scan Voting is used

- If a party preference <u>is designated</u>, and votes are cast for ballot candidates
 of another party or write-in votes are cast in another party, only votes cast
 in the designated party will count.
- If a party preference <u>is not designated</u>, and votes are cast for candidates (or write-in votes are cast) in more than one party, no votes will be counted Within the party of their choice, the voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall

fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device (Express Vote)*" to mark an **optical scan** ballot, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the party of their choice. The voter shall then touch the screen at the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question. **Spoiled Ballots**

If a voter spoils an **optical scan** ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place. **After Voting the Ballot**

After an official **optical scan** ballot is marked, it may be inserted in the security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter shall then insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

DATCP accepting applications for Buy Local, Buy Wisconsin grants through Sept. 9

MADISON, Wis. – The 2024 Buy Local, Buy Wisconsin (BLBW) grants are open to applicants until 11:59 p.m. on Sept. 9, 2024. The Wisconsin Department Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection (DATCP) will award a total of up to \$200,000 in BLBW grant funding in 2024.

BLBW is a competitive grant program designed to strengthen Wisconsin's agriculture and food industries by helping farms and businesses more efficiently process. market, and distribute locally grown food products. BLBW grants provide consumers with access to more Wisconsin-grown food products, including organic vegetables, hops varieties, hazelnut products, locally grown grain, and other value-added products.

Qualified applicants include individuals, groups, businesses involved in Wisconsin production agriculture, food processing, food distribution, food warehousing, retail food establishments, or agricultural tourism operations. Funded projects must report on increased local food sales, created and retained jobs, and new

Projects can receive grant funds for up to three years. Grant requests must be between \$5,000 and \$50,000.

investments.

Eligible project expenses include compensation for personnel, consultant services, materials, and supplies. Projects must show a one-to-one match of cash or in-kind support accounting for at least 50% of the total project budget.

DATCP will use a competitive review process to select the most qualified projects. Selected project contracts and work may begin in November 2024. Grant information and application materials are available at the DATCP website.

Since its inception in 2008, 584 applications have been submitted for BLBW grants, requesting a total of more than \$20.3 million in funding. Previous grant recipients have generated more than \$14.49 million in new local food sales, created and retained more than 500 jobs, and benefited more than 5,400 producers and 5,289 markets.



August 13 Partisan Primary Election

TINA L. SCOTT **EDITOR**

Tuesday, Aug. 13, 2024, is Wisconsin's Partisan Election, and Primary voters will head to the polls to pick their poison, so to speak. In other words, this is a Partisan Primary Election, so voters will need to choose up front whether they want to vote for candidates who are on the Democratic or Republican

in more than one party. Technically, voters could opt to vote for candidates from either the Democratic, Republican, Constitution, Libertarian, or Wisconsin Green party; however, there are no candidates from the Constitution, Libertarian, or Wisconsin Green parties listed on the Aug. 13 ballot, so that becomes a non-issue.

For the purpose of a

over and pick candidates from more than one party. And, since it is a Primary, the "primary" purpose of this election is to narrow the field of candidates to one on each party's ballot for the Nov. 5 election.

In many cases, candidates are running unopposed on their respective partisan tickets in this August election, meaning no other

party has stepped forward to challenge their run for office. Come November, a single party in each party will go head-to-head against their competitors from the other political party.

> Follow the instructions

It's important to really follow the instructions when you vote in a Partisan **Primary Election. Up** front, first question, you'll need to decide is in which party you plan to cast your votes. Because you

can only vote in one party's primary - if you want your votes to count.

After you pick your party for this election, you'll need to only

vote for candidates in that party on this ballot. Only votes cast in that party will be counted. Votes cast for any candidates in any other party will not be counted. If you don't choose a party up front and then you vote for candidates in more than one party, then none of your votes will be counted.

Voters to decide constitutional amendment questions

WISCONSIN -Who should be tasked with spending Wisconsin's share of billions of federal dollars?

In Wisconsin's partisan Primary elections on Aug. 13, 2024, Tuesday, voters will decide the fate of two referendum questions which - if approved – would change the state Constitution to

allow the legislature to have more authority over how money which comes from Washington, D.C. is doled out. Currently, that authority lies with the governor's office.

The two questions will appear statewide as follows: Question 1: "Delegation of appropriation power. Shall section 35 (1) of article IV of the constitution be created to provide that thelegislature may not

delegate its sole power to determine how moneys shall be appropriated?"

Question 2: "Allocation of federal moneys. Shall section 35 (2) of article IV of the constitution be created to prohibit the governor from allocating any federal moneys the governor accepts on behalf of the state without the approval of the legislature by joint resolution or as provided by legislative rule?"

"Effectively, the two questions - if ratified by the voters - would give the legislature authority by rule or by joint resolution

of the two houses (Senate and Assembly) to make a determination on approval of federal funding that comes in," Bob Lang, a spokesman for the nonpartisan Legislative Fiscal Bureau, told MMC. "Right now, that is under the discretion of the Governor, and it was prominently used during the CARES (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) Act and ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funding that came in during the pandemic by the Governor, when there were discretionary funds that he

could use, which he did.

"In some instances, federal monies currently go to a specific purpose identified in legislation, but the passage of these would basically - rather than having the Governor unilaterally determine the use of those funds - the legislature would be able to do so by joint resolution and by rule," Lang added.

Wisconsin The Governor's current authority dates back to the 1930s, when the office was given the power during the Great Depression.

"Whenever the United

States government shall make available funds for the education, the promotion of health, the relief of indigency, the promotion of agriculture, or for any other purpose other than the administration of the tribal or any individual funds of Wisconsin Indians, the Governor on behalf of the state is authorized to accept the funds so made available," that law reads.

If approved by voters on Tuesday. Aug. 13, 2024. the constitutional changes would go into effect in Jan. 2025, prior to the start of the next legislative session.
