Stuff the School Bus serves hundreds

RAPIDS WISCONSIN -- Thanks to hundreds of donors and volunteers, 946 local students will begin the academic year with essential school supplies provided through Stuff the School Bus/Stuff the Desk events. On Aug. 1, community members donated school supplies at the Stuff the Bus event during Lunch by the River, and on Aug. 16 and 17 the items were distributed to students who registered to receive supplies.

2024 Statistics:

• Of the students served, 97 percent qualified for free or reduced school meals.

 Over 100 volunteers lent a hand during collection, set up, pre-packing and distribution.

• A sampling of some of the items collected during Stuff the School Bus include: 240 backpacks, 341 boxes of colored pencils, 390 boxes of crayons, 1,602 folders, 996 glue sticks, 1,304 notebooks, 350 scissors, 55 rulers and 301 boxes of markers

Artuso, 35, suffered fatal injuries and was pronounced dead at the scene.

A law enforcement report stated Artuso's vehicle was southbound on Co. Hwy Z, left the roadway, entered the ditch, struck a culvert and overturned. He was not wearing a seatbelt. The report notes alcohol, speed and failure to maintain control of the vehicle appear to be con-

tributing factors.

This crash remains under investigation and no further information will be released at this time. The Adams County Sheriff's Office was assisted at the scene by the Town of Rome Police Department, Lifestar EMS, Big Flats Fires, Adams County and Rescue, Adams County Medical Examiner's Office, and Murray's Towing.

Several common natural products can interact with medications in significant ways. For instance, activated

charcoal, used for various purposes, can reduce the absorption of medications, potentially affecting the efficacy of birth control or Prozac. supplements Additionally, like turmeric, bitter orange,

and ashwagandha, while beneficial for general health, may lower blood sugar levels when taken with diabetes medications. Similarly, ginger, ginkgo, and high levels of fish oil can increase bleeding risk for those on blood thinners such as Eliquis, Xarelto, or Warfarin.

To ensure that your medications and supplements work together harmoniously, Bishop advises consulting with your health care providers. "Before starting any new supplement, talk with your doctor or pharmacist. They can check for potential interactions and help you make informed decisions," she says. "Always inform them about all the medications and supplements you're taking."

It is also important to understand that natural supplements are regulated differently from prescription drugs. "Unlike prescription drugs, which require FDA approval, natural supplements

are primarily the manufacturer's responsibility," Bishop notes.

For added safety, look for quality certifications, such as the United States Pharmacopeia (USP) mark on the label. This certification verifies that the product's contents are as stated and safe for use.

"The biggest advice I have is to talk to your doctor or pharmacist before starting a new product," advises Bishop. "We want to make sure your medication is working the best it can and that the natural supplements are helping you as well."

By taking these precautions, vou can confidently use natural supplements to support your health while minimizing the risk of adverse interactions.

DOJ investigating shooting in **Rapids**

Suspect, law enforcement exchanged gun fire

WISCONSIN RAPIDS - The Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) is investigating an officer-involved shooting in Wisconsin Rapids that occurred on the morning of Tuesday, Aug. 20.

At approximately 12:32 a.m., Wisconsin Rapids police officers responded to a report of domestic violence at residence on the 900 block of 14th Street south. The subject fled the scene in their vehicle. Soon after, a Portage County Sheriff's deputy located the subject's vehicle and attempted a traffic stop. The subject fled and a pursuit ensued heading westbound on State Highway 54. During the pursuit, the subject fired a handgun multiple times at law enforcement. The subject's vehicle became disabled near 8th Street and east Grand Avenue. The subject fired additional shots at law enforcement, striking law enforcement vehicles and fled on foot

Shortly thereafter, the subject was located by a drone on the roof of a residence near 9th and Grape Street in Wisconsin Rapids. The subject fired additional shots at the drone and law enforcement; law enforcement returned fire and struck the subject.

Law enforcement began lifesaving measures, and the subject was transported to a local hospital and is undergoing treatment. Officers involved in the incident have been placed on administrative assignment, per agency policies. The officers were wearing body cameras. DCI is leading this investigation and is assisted by the Wisconsin State Patrol Technical Reconstruction Unit, DCI's Digital Evidence Unit, and a DCI Crime Response Specialist. All involved law enforcement are fully cooperating with DCI during this investigation DCI is continuing to review evidence and determine the facts of this incident and will turn over investigative reports to the Wood County District Attorney when the investigation concludes. Wisconsin Rapids.



Do you like a great sunset? Chances are, you're not going to like this one

One of the services that we offer to our clients is a financial planning analysis of their tax returns. In my written reports I remind my clients that the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 (which took effect in 2018) brought lower tax rates and a higher standard deduction to all of us, as well as numerous other provisions having significant positive impacts. With the complication of our tax laws and changes from year to year that affect us on an individual basis, many people simply do not understand or have taken the time to compare their current tax situation to their pre-TCJA status.

Many of the provisions of the TCJA are scheduled to "sunset," meaning they will go back to their pre-TCJA rates at the end of 2025. Take a look at vour 2023 return. What was your taxable income? What was the marginal rate? What was your standard deduction? Take a look at how that compares to what your 2026 tax return would look like under similar circumstances. For one couple's recent analysis, we found that in 2023, they were in the 22% marginal federal tax bracket. Their same income would put them in the 25% bracket, with the sunset. Additionally, the standard deduction for married couples filing joint in 2023 was \$27,700. Under the sunset, it would revert back to \$12,700, indexed for inflation. That alone subjects an additional approximately \$15,000 of their income to taxation. Furthermore, as a small business owner, the wife of the couple qualified for \$21,732 of Qualified Business Deductions. The QBI is also scheduled to disappear. Added to the standard deduction, that is an additional approximately \$36,732 of taxable income with the TCJA sunset, which then bumps them into the 28% tax bracket.

In other analyses for single clients over age 65, we see that their 2023 standard deduction was \$15,700. With the sunset, that standard deduction reverts back to \$7,600, indexed for inflation. Taxpayers who are subject to Required Minimum Distributions from their retirement accounts often feel the hit hard, as they have little control over their taxable income.

Nearly every analysis that we've done shows that we'll all be paying more in taxes with the sunset.

The examples above are just a few of the provisions that are scheduled to sunset: there are more. The federal government, meaning the presidential administration and congress, make these decisions, directly impacting your taxes. We all like a good sunset, but if the TCJA sunsets, chances are, we are not going to like this one.
