WHITEWATER MUSIC HALL

DOWNTOWN WAUSAU— Whitewater Music Hall opened in the former Masonic lodge building across the street from Whitewater Park right before the pandemic - and now it's one of Wausau's go-to music venues. And it's a great place to hang out even when there's no bands. The completely renovated space sports huge windows facing Rib Mountain, a beautiful concert hall and a coffee shop/beer hall. The music venue offers large, ticketed shows about once a week, bringing in bands from an array of genres, often catching nationally touring acts traveling between Minneapolis and Chicago.

The music hall has also featured local musicians, open mics or jam sessions, and smaller acts in the coffee/beer hall or beer garden outside. That includes an open blues jam twice a month on Wednesdays. Current hours are Wednesday-Friday 3-11 pm; Saturday 8 am-11 pm. LAMPLIGHT SESSIONS

DOWNTOWN MOSINEE — This cozy new music venue launched in 2022 with Daniel Donato, a rising country music star now playing large theaters. Since then, Lamplight Sessions has brought in some incredible talent to Mosinee, and many of its shows sell out.

Upcoming shows include Melissa Carper (w/ Dandy L. Freling) on Sept. 12. More shows are added all the time.



CLASSICAL/ ENSEMBLES

CENTRAL WISCONSIN SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

WAUSAU COMMUNITY THEATRE

Dozens of volunteers work their hearts out to produce each show—yes, you should consider auditioning or lending a hand backstage. Recycling guide

HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING

What can and cannot be recycled changes due to upgrades in technology and equipment, and market ups and downs—because yes, your Earth-conscious efforts are part of a global for-profit industry. What goes into your recycling bin is transported to a regional material recovery facility (MRF), which uses sensors, blowers, conveyors and other mechanics to separate plastics, paper, cans, etc. MRFs then sell the material to processors.

Recycling guidelines vary because it depends which MRF a municipal hauler uses. Each facility has different sorting equipment and customers who buy the bales of material. Aseptic cartoons, for example, can be recycled only in regions with a nearby processor that can reclaim this multi-layered material.

One big problem lately is contamination. People are "wishcycling" too much dirty and/or unrecyclable stuff, which creates problems at the MRF (clogged machines, etc.) and can render an entire batch of material unusable.

The Marathon County Solid Waste Department is releasing a more regional and simplified Recycle Right set of guidelines. If you're unsure if something can be recycled, contact your municipality directly or Marathon County Solid Waste at 877-270-3989 or marathoncountysolidwaste.org. Here is basic information:

HOW NOT TO SUCK AT HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING

No bags, ever. Plastic bags can wrap around rollers on equipment, and force entire processing lines to shut down. You can take plastic bags to retailers like Target, Walmart or Pick'n Save to be recycled.

Dirty cardboard/paper goes in the trash. Waste Management, the largest recycler in the country, is pushing for better quality in what it picks up. Its website points out that one water-soaked cardboard box can cause the rejection of a whole load. Greasy pizza boxes cannot be recycled — but recycle the top half if it's clean.

Rinse, empty, scrape any plastic recyclable container. Partially filled shampoo bottles make an especially gooey mess in the recycling process. So do food scraps—in fact food waste is one of the most common contaminants in the recycling process. Do not "wishcycle" your dirty stuff. A quick rinse or scrape is good enough.

A container's recycling arrow is not the final word. Beware the triangular "chasing arrows" when deciding where to toss it. The chasing arrows tell us one part of the story. It tells us the item has recyclability. However, the item may not be able to be recycled in your area. Always check with your local program.

Trust that mingled recyclables do indeed get recycled. Some people are convinced it all goes into the trash—maybe because single stream recycling looks like trash. But material recovery facilities today have impressively sophisticated mechanical systems that quickly separate plastic, paper and metal. For example, blowers knock off lighter paper, magnets pick up metal, other rollers can separate plastics.

Do always recycle: Office paper, junk mail, paper bags, catalogs and magazines, phone books, paperback books, newspapers, envelopes. Also paper egg cartons and containers, cardboard boxes, rolls and tubes. Glass jars and bottles; aluminum, steel or aerosol cans; plastic jugs and bottles.

Do not recycle: Plastic bags, plastic film, shrink wrap; plastic straws, plates or silverware, drink pouches; Styrofoam #6 plastic such as egg cartons, hot beverage cups, packing peanuts. Do not recycle aluminum baking pans, foil; metal or plastic liners; mirror or window glass; motor oil containers, light bulbs, ceramics or clay pots, soiled papers, foam, CD cases, aseptic containers.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING AND MORE

Wisconsin's law prohibits the landfilling and incineration of computers, laptops, printers, televisions, DVD players, computer peripherals, fax machines, VCRs, and more. Here are several places around Wausau that accept electronics for recycling. Beware of online resources, as they're not always up to date or accurate.




