An elephant out of the ashes

A historic elephant ear stand was burned by arson; now the community is rallying to bring it back

In early August, an arsonist struck the Rothschild area, burning several items in the Rothschild Pavilion area.

One of those was the Wausau Noon Optimists Elephant Ear Stand, which sold thousands of elephant ears to fairgoers every year.

The stand, decorated to resemble an elephant, has been around for 45 years and has served three organizations. It was a total loss.

Now, Noon Optimist officials say, the community is rallying to rebuild the stand. Wausau Noon Optimist member and former city council member and former entrepreneur center leader Romey Wagner tells City Pages that people have been coming out of the woodwork to support the purchase of a new stand.

"The community outreach has been amazing," Wagner told City Pages. "People in the community have been asking me what they can do to help."

Wagner said the elephant ear stand was used to sell roughly 5,000 elephant ears — basically a sugared bread — to fairgoers over the several days of the fair each year.

Wagner said they also allowed youth groups to operate the stand and sell elephant ears, and keep the proceeds for their organizations. And the ears were an affordable treat for families, he said.

The community seems to agree. Wagner told City Pages they've already received about \$2,500 to help rebuild the stand. That's without any kind of solicitation or fundraising efforts. Wagner says an official fundraiser is coming.



A new stand would include a trailer that costs about \$45,000, and another \$20,000 to \$25,000 to equip it.

Besides money, though, organizations have already committed to donating equipment and labor for the elephant ear stand. With in-kind donations, Wagner estimates the Noon Optimists have received something like \$5,000 in donations, all before any official fundraising efforts have begun.

Police believe they have the suspect responsible. Police say they observed Kenneth Taylor, 53 of Rothschild, near the scene holding a lighter while the Riverside Fire District responded to the blaze. When he saw the squad car, police say, he changed direction.

Police reports say he admitted to setting the fires upon further questioning. Taylor is currently in custody at Marathon County Jail on a \$25,000 cash bond. Taylor is facing multiple arson charges that carry a potential penalty of 40 years in prison.

But meanwhile, Wagner tells City Pages he's working on setting up an official fundraiser to help rebuild the stand, and put the Wausau Noon Optimists once again in the elephant ear business.

Stevens Point man killed in motorcycle crash

A Stevens Point man has died from injuries sustained in a crash in Stevens Point.

The 47-year-old man was killed when his motorcycle left the road and drove into the ditch on Wilshire Boulevard near North Point Drive on the north side of Stevens Point Thursday. The man was not wearing a helmet, police say.

Police have not released the name of the man who was killed pending the notification of family members.

Milwaukee brewery suing Minocqua Brewing Co over trademark

A Milwaukee brewery is suing Minocqua Brewing Co. over a name it says infringes on its trademark, bringing further legal troubles for the northwoods brewery's owner.

Ope! Brewing Co. out of West Allis filed a lawsuit in Milwaukee County Court alleging that Minocqua Brewing Co.'s new beer, called Ope, infringes on their brewery's copyright.

Minocqua Brewing Co.'s owner, Kirk Bangstad, took to Facebook to mock the brewery for enforcing its trademark, claiming the brewery was greedy and unreasonable. Ope!'s owner also posted on Facebook, saying he tried to contact Bangstad and ask nicely that they not use his name for their beer, only for the brewery to release it anyway.

According to Milwaukee Court records, a judge issued an injunction against selling the beer until the matter can be resolved.

City's share of proposed bike bridge is \$10 million

The city's share of a proposed bike bridge between Wausau and the metro south municipalities will come to \$10 million - but a lot of that could be covered through grants and donations, a consultant said.

A bike bridge over the Eau Claire River has been talked about for some time, but recently a grant helped fund a study that looked at how much a bridge would actually cost. Property owners and the railroad are ready to cooperate, a consultant with MSA told city officials last week.

The total project is expected to cost around \$20 million and wouldn't start construction until 2029 and be completed in 2031. Schofield, Weston and Wausau would split the cost.

The bridge would utilize existing railroad infrastructure, with safeguards to protect the railroad's property.

The next steps would be to agree to a cost split between municipalities and start looking for potential funding.

Lead service line replacement halfway to its goal

A project to replace lead service lines in the city is about halfway to its goal, representatives say.

Equiflow project manager says 257 lines have been replaced — roughly half of the city's goal to replace 553 this year. Officials have identified nearly all of the lines that need replacing, Jones says.

The city contracted with Equiflow to replace lead lines in the city using federal funding in grants and loans. Lead pipes are known to have numerous negative health consequences for humans, especially children.

The replacements include on the city side and the public side leading to the entrance of the home, and Equiflow is handling the private side of the replacement. A feature on City Pages revealed that the replacements can take about four hours, and even in situations where there are complications, the projects usually are completed that day.

Dem advantage

Marquette poll finds uptick for Harris following debate



The new Marquette University Law School Poll found a narrow advantage for Kamala Harris in Wisconsin's presidential race amid a rise in Dem enthusiasm to vote.

Meanwhile, the spread in the U.S. Senate race in head-to-head questions closely matched the presidential race for the first time this year after Dem incumbent Tammy Baldwin has consistently run ahead of the top of the ticket in previous Marquette polls.

The new poll, conducted after the Democratic National Convention, found 52% of likely and registered voters favored Harris, while 48% backed Donald Trump in head-to-head matchups. Harris also led Trump when minor candidates were included.

The last survey, done after the Republican National Convention, found a 1-point gap between Trump and Harris.

Poll Director Charles Franklin said it's hard to say whether Harris is seeing a bounce in Wisconsin since the movement was within the margin of error. He also noted national polling hasn't picked up a significant upswing for her post-convention.

But he said other findings suggested things have improved for Harris. That includes Dems being more excited to vote than Republicans for the first time this year.

Ninety-one percent of Dems said they are very or somewhat enthusiastic to vote this fall, compared to 82% of Republicans who said the same.

Last month when Joe Biden was still in the race, 81% of Dems were excited to vote, while 64% said the same in June.

Last month, 86% of Republicans were enthusiastic to vote, compared to 76% in June.

Republicans call on Senate Dems to pass bill prohibiting non-citizens from voting

U.S. Sen. Ron Johnson, R-Oshkosh, this week joined fellow GOP senators in urging the Dem-controlled chamber to pass a bill seeking to prevent noncitizens from voting in federal elections.

The SAVE Act would require states to check voters' citizenship status before registering them to vote. Dems argue the bill is unnecessary, since noncitizens are already prohibited from voting in federal elections.

Johnson at the Washington, D.C.,

press conference said while Dems and the "mainstream media" claim elections are perfect and totally secure, that's "simply not true."

"There's one side of the political spectrum that does want to make it easy to vote, but wants total election integrity. There's another side that wants to make it easy to cheat, and I think you know who that is," Johnson said.

Donald Trump this week urged Republicans against passing a bill to extend federal funding at current levels for six months without the SAVE Act attached despite a looming government shutdown on Sept. 30. Said Trump in a post on Truth Social: "DON'T LET IT HAPPEN – CLOSE IT DOWN!!!"

Van Orden calls out Biden-Harris for admitting violent gang members

U.S. Rep. Derrick Van Orden, R-Prairie du Chien, this week argued the Biden-Harris administration is allowing violent gang members to "wander around the nation at their leisure" after a non-citizen was arrested in his city last week.

Alejandro Jose Coronel Zarate of Venezuela, 26, was arrested in Prairie du Chien last week on charges of domestic disorderly conduct, two counts of domestic battery, strangulation/suffocation, physical abuse to a child, disorderly conduct and two counts of second degree sexual assault.

According to the Prairie du Chien Police Department, Zarate is suspected to be affiliated with Tren de Aragua, a criminal organization based in Venezuela. The gang is involved in various criminal activities, including human smuggling and trafficking, gender-based violence, money laundering and drug trafficking.

Van Orden, a former Navy SEAL, spoke to reporters on a virtual press call this week with Crawford County Sheriff Dale McCullick and Prairie du Chien Police Chief Kyle Teynor. Zarate has "prominently displayed" tattoos indicating his gang affiliation, according to police, which Van Orden claimed were visible when he entered the country.

"If you have this tattoo and you're not a member of that gang, the other members of the gang will physically cut it off your body while you're living. It's a death sentence if you're not a member of that gang," Van Orden said. "So the big question is, why is the Biden administration allowing known members of violent criminal gangs from foreign nations into the country and essentially paroling them to allow them to wander around the nation at their leisure?"

Senator calls for consequences for MPS filing late paperwork

Sen. Van Wanggaard, R-Racine, says there should be consequences for Milwaukee Public Schools after the district failed to turn in its district aid certification two weeks ago amid ongoing financial issues.


MPS has been working with DPI to address its financial challenges since failing to submit key financial data on time. The district is projected to receive \$81 million less in general aid for the school year, more than half of that due to reporting errors. "Superintendent Underly must impose consequences on MPS. She can't just ignore the problem like she did before Milwaukee's \$256 million referendum that hurt most every district in the state," Wanggaard said in a statement Thursday.

More than 80 other districts are also still working with the DPI to submit their aid certifications, which were due Aug. 30. Such delays are "normal," according to DPI Executive Director Sachin Chheda's email to Wanggaard Wednesday confirming the delay.

"We must note that this amount of delay from the August 30 deadline is normal, and we are actively in communication with all of these districts, and in fact have meetings scheduled with approximately 25% of them to engage in dialogue and help local districts comply," Chheda said in the email, obtained by WisPolitics.





Chicago Stylez is providing a soul food option on the UWSP-Wausau campus, while its owner overcame personal tragedy

Loss can wear the greatest rock into the thinnest nub. When someone leaves our life, we can forget who we are, but Rochelle Brown carries on thanks to the fun had with her son and family.

The retiring medical professional with experience in behavioral health owns and operates Chicago Stylez. The eatery on the University of Wisconsin – Stevens Point's Marathon County campus is open to the public. It serves Chicago-style culinary creations and soul food like collard greens and cabbage.

Chicago Stylex opened its doors in June. While the flow has been steady and everyone who comes in favors the food, at first, Brown did not have pep in her step.

"My son Anthony who was in college and graduating this year passed away," she says. "This was discouraging, I was not excited about doing this anymore but I went on and did it all anyway."

Brown learned how to cook from her mother, grandmother, and aunts and passed this knowledge on to her son and his siblings. Had Anthony Brown not died in May, he would have handled the business management portion of the project, and as he shared the dream of operating a restaurant with his mother, this was fuel for her fire to go on. Now, Brown adds he is watching with pride.

"He is super excited [about where we

are now]," Brown says. "We are going to come up with a meal he liked to cook and have this as a tribute to him. It was a special cake he liked to make."

Other ideas on the horizon besides Anthony Brown's legacy cake include getting Chicago Stylez products

into stores, prisons, and vending machines. Brown's sister April is helping their mother carry on alongside one of Rochelle Brown's grandchildren when she is in Wausau, and, if reviews are anything to go on, Anthony will carry on in the hearts and minds of many for years.

"Stopped in tonight for the first time," Keegan J. Wolfgram of Weston writes in an August Facebook post. "Small lowkey establishment, very clean inside, and nice friendly employees. We tried the Vienna dogs and they were very good by far the best hotdogs in Wausau. Also tried the Italian beef (get it dipped) with the hot peppers. Super good also 10/10. Highly recommend."

Chicago Stylez is open 11 a.m. through 7 p.m. Mondays to Fridays. It is closed on
