PUBLISHER'S NOTE Unrequited Love: A Timeless Muse In Poetry

Dear Reader,

To be straightforward with you, I have a consistent dialogue in my head regarding the concept of unrequited love.

Unrequited love has been a compelling theme in literature throughout the ages, touching the hearts of readers with its poignant and universal resonance. A long past conversation with my daughter about William Butler Yeats' poem "When You Are Old" brought this theme into sharp focus. Our discussion, enriched by insights from a University of Notre Dame professor, questioned whether Yeats' poem

truly deals with unrequited love, particularly by Patrick Wood Reflections is Now Available at Janke Book Store,

when compared to its inspiration, a French poem by Pierre de Ronsard. Yeats, an Irish poet, penned

"When You Are Old" in the late 19th century. The poem speaks to a future where the speaker's beloved, now old and gray, reflects on her past and the love she received. The

lines often cited are:

And nodding by the fire, take down this book, And slowly read, and dream of the soft look Your eyes had once, and of their shadows deep

The poem continues, suggesting that

although many loved her beauty and grace, only one man loved her "pilgrim soul."

According to the Notre Dame professor, "When You Are Old" may not be primarily about unrequited love. Instead, it can be interpreted as a reflection on true, deep love that transcends physical beauty. The speaker laments that while others loved the beloved for her outward appearance, only he cherished her inner self. This interpretation suggests a sense of melancholy and loss, but not necessarily unrequited love.

Yeats' poem is inspired by Pierre de Ronsard's sonnet to Hélène. Ronsard's poem, "Quand vous serez bien vieille," similarly envisions a future where the beloved, now old, reflects on her past. The French poem carries a tone of regret and unrealized love, which can be seen as unrequited:

Quand vous serez bien vieille, au soir. à la chandelle. Assise auprès du feu, dévidant et filant, Direz, chantant mes vers, en vous émerveillant: Ronsard me célébrait du temps que j'étais belle.

Ronsard's lines suggest a longing for a love that was never fully reciprocated or realized, aligning more closely with the theme of unrequited love.

Is Yeats' poem about unrequited love? The answer may lie in a nuanced understanding of both poems. While Yeats' version focuses on a love that sees beyond physical beauty and feels a profound loss, it does not explicitly state that the love was unrequited. However, when seen through the lens of Ronsard's influence, we can infer a deeper layer of longing and unfulfilled desire in Yeats' work.

In the end, both interpretations hold merit. Yeats' "When You Are Old" can be seen as a reflection on true love that transcends time and beauty, while Ronsard's original poem hints more strongly at unrequited love. This duality enriches our understanding of Yeats' work, allowing readers to appreciate the complexity of love in its many forms. Unrequited love remains a timeless muse, continually inspiring poets to capture its bittersweet essence.

Boxed out

Residents, city council members livid over mayor removing absentee ballot box

Rumors swirled Monday that Mayor Doug Diny had removed an absentee ballot box on Sunday afternoon.

By Tuesday, those rumors were confirmed. And residents along with members of the city council were livid.

An email thread between Diny and City Council President Lisa Rasmussen confirmed Diny had in fact moved the ballot box inside, putting it out of reach of voters. And Diny himself confirmed to City Pages that he moved the box, citing concerns. When asked about those concerns, Diny said the box was unsecured and was moved to a secure location. On Tuesday afternoon, the ballot box did not appear anywhere in the lobby of city hall, or outside on the steps, a visit by a City Pages reporter revealed.

A recent court ruling put the discretion to place the boxes on clerks. It's not yet clear whether Diny had the legal right to move the box, though clerks are typically the ones mandated to retain custody over ballot boxes and the ballots within them.

The aforementioned thread also contained a photo of Diny moving the box wearing a suit, a hard hat and work gloves, in what appeared to be a cell phone photo. In an email exchange with City Pages, Diny also sent along the photo.

City Pages, along with other media outlets, requested security footage of Diny removing the box. City Hall officials say they're working on getting the video out to media.

Rasmussen in the thread blasted the mayor for his antics. The city attorney was included on the thread. "Unbelievable.

Just when I think I've heard everything, stuff like this happens," Rasmussen responded when Diny confirmed he moved the box.

The ballot box's removal sparked a rally on the steps of City Hall Tuesday afternoon. And several speakers chastised the mayor at Tuesday's City Council meeting, calling for him to restore the ballot box to a place accessible for voters.

Others slammed the city clerk for not saying anything about the ballot box incident publicly, including not responding to members of the press who asked questions about the ballot box. And many criticized Diny for moving the box on a Sunday when no one was around, and for not notifying the public in any way that he would be doing so.

Diny on Tuesday claimed the kerfuffle was the result of a "mischaracterization" by a city council member, causing a brief dust-up between Diny and Rasmussen on the council floor ahead of a closed session.

MBC owner backs off trademark dispute

The owner of Minocqua Brewing Company is backing off on a beer named after another Wisconsin brewing company that sued because of trademark issues.

In a post on Minocqua Brewing Co.'s Facebook Page, owner Kirk Bandstad




Diny sent this photo of himself hauling the city's absentee ballot box off the steps of City Hall. City council members and residents are furious over the move.

posted that the Ope beer he created will no longer be called that: "The Ope beer logo dies because of trademark issues, but the man who inspired it lives on."

Minocqua Brewing Co. announced the beer earlier this month. But another brewing company, Ope! Brewing Co. out of West Allis, asked them to call the beer something else since it violates their trademark. After Bangstad refused, Ope!

filed a lawsuit for trademark infringement in Milwaukee County Court. City Pages obtained a copy of the lawsuit, which revealed Ope!'s owner's efforts to resolve the situation with Bangstad.

Bangstad in another post said the beer would become a collector's item since it only lasted on the shelves for a short time period, indicating that the beer's label would be discontinued.

Louis Molepske Jr., who serves as circuit court judge of branch 2 in Portage County, has been chosen for the new deputy chief role of the Ninth Circuit branch. Prior to being Portage County Judge, Molepske served as Portage County DA and before that was a state representative as a Democrat.

In the new role, Molepske will oversee 37 circuit and municipal judges, according to the news release.

Housing project in former Westside Battery holds groundbreaking

A new affordable housing project in a former cityowned building has broken ground after some delays.

The Westside Commons building broke ground Wednesday. The project will include 56 units of affordable housing.

The site once housed Westside Battery and L&S Printing, but the city bought the building in 2016. Urban Street Bistro at one point planned to open a restaurant there, and later Sixth Street Filling Station. Both of those projects fell through for various reasons, and the property remained vacant for a number of years.

Gorman and Company was awarded the project after the city requested proposals, but the project was delayed after the company missed out on a round of tax credits — they were awarded those tax credits the next year.

Gorman and Company recently completed the renovations of The Landmark building in Wausau, which was once a major hotel in the Wausau area whose opening drew prominent visitors from around the region.

Woman dies in e-bike crash

One woman is dead following a crash while she was riding her e-bike, Marathon County Sheriff's officials say.

The 54-year-old woman crashed her e-bike at 5:42 am Thursday at the intersection of Highway WW and Green Valley Road in the town of Texas, police officials say. No other vehicles were involved in the crash.

The woman was airlifted to a local hospital. She died the next day of her injuries.

Marathon County Sheriff's Office officials are still investigating the cause of the crash.

One man dead after Spencer crash

A 27-year-old man is dead following a crash in the town of Spencer Monday.

Marathon County Sheriff's Office officials say Anthony Peplinski, 27 of Spencer, was killed in a twovehicle crash that occurred at 7:51 am Monday at the intersection of Highway 13 and Merkel Road.

Sheriff's Office officials are still investigating the cause of the crash. No other injuries were reported in the crash.

City introduces AED device on 400 Block park

The city of Wausau has added devices on the 400 Block meant to help save lives in the event of cardiac arrest.

The AED device, which stands for Automated External Defibrillator, is used to help restart someone's heart if it stops. The city had them at the city pools, but this one on the 400 Block is the first in Wausau that's meant to be publicly accessible. They're automated with voice instructions to help people use them in the case of an emergency, officials say.

The Wausau Fire Department received a Community Impact Grant from the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin to purchase and install the device.

Block my ballot please

WI Supreme Court takes over Kennedy appeal in case to get his name removed from the ballot



The Wisconsin Supreme Court today took over Robert F. Kennedy Jr.'s request to be removed from the state's presidential ballot.

With thousands of ballots already in voters' hands, the court wrote in the order that it "will endeavor to issue a written decision as expeditiously as possible."

The state Department of Justice, representing the Wisconsin Elections Commission, yesterday asked the justices to take over the case.

That petition to bypass came after Kennedy went to the conservative 2nd District Court of Appeals seeking to overturn a Dane County judge's ruling. The Dane County ruling denied his request seeking to require the Elections Commission to leave him off the ballot and to prevent the mailing of absentee ballots until a ruling was issued on the merits of the case.

Today's ruling comes as the 2nd District Court of Appeals had set deadlines for the final briefs before it weighed in. The court wrote in its order that the expedited briefing schedule established by the appeals court will continue to apply.

Conservative Justices Rebecca Bradley and Annette Ziegler dissented on

procedural grounds. Typically, the court rejects petitions to bypass when the respondent has not yet filed a reply brief in the case. The Department of Justice yesterday asked the court to grant the petition to bypass even though its response to Kennedy wasn't due in the 2nd District until this morning.

Senate Dems refocus ad spend on close races


Senate Dems have dropped ad buys in two races that lean in their favor while bulking up the money they're putting on the air for seats in the Milwaukee suburbs, Green Bay area and north of Madison, according to AdImpact.

Earlier this month, state Sen. Brad Pfaff, D-Onalaska, had \$466,444 in ad reservations between Labor Day and Election Day in the 32nd SD and Dem Appleton Ald. Kristin Alfheim had \$863,187 reserved as she seeks the open 18th SD that runs from Oshkosh to Appleton. But neither had any air time reserved anymore as of Monday afternoon, according to AdImpact.

That money has shifted to boost Dem attorney Jody Habush Sinykin as she challenges state Sen. Duey Stroebel, R-Saukville, in the 8th SD; Dem

businessman Jamie Wall as he takes on GOP Allouez Village President Jim Rafter in the 30th; and nonprofit leader Sarah Keyeski as she faces state Sen. Joan Ballweg, R-Markesan, in the 14th.

Andrew Whitley with the State Senate Democratic Committee said the caucus has seen good polling out of both the 18th and 32nd and are confident in where they're at in both races

Trump to visit Prairie du **Chien on Sunday**

Former President Donald Trump will campaign in Prairie du Chien on Saturday, his campaign announced .

Multiple GOP sources told WisPolitics that Trump is also looking at stops in Madison and Milwaukee on Oct. 1.

The announcement about the stop focused on illegal immigration. Prairie du Chien was pulled into the national debate earlier this month after a noncitizen was arrested there.

Alejandro Jose Coronel Zarate of Venezuela, 26, faces charges of domestic disorderly conduct, two counts of domestic battery, strangulation/suffocation, physical abuse to a child, disorderly conduct and two counts of second degree sexual assault.

According to Prairie du Chien Police, Zarate is suspected to be affiliated with Tren de Aragua, a criminal organization based in Venezuela. The gang is involved in various criminal activities, including human smuggling and trafficking, genderbased violence, money laundering and drug trafficking.

Trump has announced plans to be in Tuscaloosa Saturday evening as Alabama hosts Georgia in a college football game featuring teams ranked in the top five of national polls. His remarks in Prairie du Chien are scheduled to start at 11:30 a.m. Saturday, according to the campaign.

Harris knocks Trump at Madison rally

MADISON — Kamala Harris told a rally here Friday night that the country is in "a healthcare crisis, and Donald Trump is the architect" due to the overturning of Roe v.

Harris referenced Trump's comments during their Sept. 10 debate that "every legal scholar" and politician, regardless of party, wanted to see Roe v. Wade overturned.

"These Trump abortion bans, they mean doctors may have to wait until the patient is at death's door before they take any action. Nobody wants that," Harris said.

Harris addressed a rally at the Veterans Memorial Coliseum, which her campaign said was at capacity with more than 10,500 attendees.

At the rally, Harris spoke about her encounter with the family of Amber Nicole Thurman, a 28 year-old Georgia woman who died after a wait to receive post-abortion medical care, which she eventually received after she developed sepsis. Harris said Thurman died as a result of doctors waiting until her condition worsened to give her medical care, out of fear of prosecution under Georgia laws that ban most abortion after six weeks.

A proposal on November's ballot to ban voting by noncitizens across Wisconsin would have little practical effect on who can vote under existing laws. But it would shut the door on an option that some advocates of wider voting access want to retain: letting municipalities open their local elections to noncitizens or younger voters.

Current laws already bar anyone who is not a U.S. citizen from voting in elections for federal or statewide Wisconsin offices. But supporters of the proposed constitutional amendment have pointed to municipalities in other states that let noncitizens vote in races for city council or school board, for instance. They say the amendment is key to making sure that such a thing doesn't take hold in Wisconsin.

They also say heading off noncitizen voting at the local level would free local clerks from having to prepare separate ballots for those voters without the federal and state races, which could complicate election administration and lead to more errors.

The proposed amendment is part of a movement by Republicans nationwide to raise concerns about large-scale illegal voting by noncitizens in state and federal elections, even though experts say that's not happening.

Similar measures are coming before voters in North Carolina, Iowa and several other states this November.

The measure is also the latest example of Republicans who control the Legislature using constitutional amendments to enact election-related policies and bypass Gov. Tony Evers, a Democrat. Unlike normal bills, constitutional amendments can't be vetoed by the governor.

"Practically speaking, it doesn't seem like there's going to really be an impact, other than to cut off the possibility that a locality would allow for noncitizens to vote," said Bree Grossi Wilde, executive director of the State Democracy Research Initiative at the University of Wisconsin Law School.

Experts say there are no Wisconsin municipalities that currently extend voting rights to noncitizens or people younger than 18.

Opponents of the amendment say it could be the first step toward future legislation requiring proof of citizenship to register to vote, a move that could disenfranchise some voters. Some also object to the state potentially blocking municipal experiments in extending the franchise to 17-year-olds and noncitizens who want to have a say in their community.

The current constitutional language on voting says that

"every" U.S. citizen 18 or older has a right to vote. Under the proposed amendment, it would instead say that "only" a U.S. citizen 18 or older can vote in national, state and local elections — language that opponents say is less inclusive.

Bans on noncitizen voting have been proliferating around the country since 2020, when false claims of widespread noncitizen voter fraud spread across conservative circles and to the highest levels of the Republican Party. Former President Donald Trump, the GOP presidential nominee, urged House Republicans recently to force a shutdown of the federal government if Congress can't pass legislation that would require all Americans to provide proof of citizenship to register to vote in federal elections.

The broad category of noncitizens can include immigrants who are in the country illegally, people on work visas, as well as legal permanent residents, some of whom have lived in the U.S. for decades. Some are brand new to the communities they live in while others raised their children and owned businesses in them.

Noncitizen voting in federal elections is already illegal, and rare, because of robust systems at the state and local levels to check the eligibility of potential voters and the high risks for anyone who tries: Noncitizens who attempt to vote illegally — including legal permanent residents — can face felony charges, loss of residency status and deportation.

A Brennan Center for Justice analysis found that election officials overseeing 23.5 million votes across 42 jurisdictions in the 2016 general election referred about 30 incidents of potential noncitizen voting for further investigation or prosecution. A Heritage Foundation analysis of election fraud cases found two dozen prosecuted cases of noncitizens voting in the last 20 years.

But some areas do allow noncitizen voting in local elections. Washington, D.C., for example, allows it, and over 500 registered to vote in a recent district council election, The Washington Post reported. In San Francisco, some noncitizens can vote in school board elections. Some cities in Vermont and Maryland also offer noncitizens the chance to vote in local elections.

In Wisconsin, some Democrats have voiced support for letting local governments allow noncitizen voting.

Christine Neumann-Ortiz, the executive director of the immigrant rights group Voces de la Frontera Action, also supports extending the franchise to noncitizens in some

local elections, saying, "it makes our democracy stronger, the more people are involved."

Supporters of the amendment argue that every ballot cast by a noncitizen's ballot serves to cancel out a citizen's.

Such measures "dilute the rights of United States citizens by extending the scope of qualified electors to non-citizens and discouraging the naturalization process," Jim Steineke, a Republican former lawmaker and Assembly majority leader, said in a public comment about the proposal.

"Addressing this issue now will ensure votes are not diluted in the future," he said.

Sen. Julian Bradley, R-Franklin, who was the lead Senate author on the measure for its latest passage, said, "It's best for the government to address this concern before it becomes a problem."

Bradley disagreed with the premise voiced by some amendment opponents that some noncitizens should be able to vote in local elections because they're tax-paying residents of their communities. Spending money in a place doesn't entitle people to voting in that place if they're not citizens, he said.

For 60 years after its founding, Wisconsin did allow noncitizens with a stated intention of becoming citizens to vote. In 1908, during one of the peaks of immigration into the U.S., voters approved an amendment rescinding voting rights for that demographic. That amendment didn't explicitly ban municipalities from allowing noncitizen voting in local elections, as the current proposal would.

So far, neither opponents nor supporters of the amendment have engaged in major mail or ad campaigns to publicize the issue. Without the public attention, many political observers predict the measure will pass, as constitutional amendment ballot questions typically do.

"I think it's very important that more be done," Neumann-Ortiz said. "In the absence of more public education, voters are going to vote against their own interests."

During its two passages through the Legislature, just one group, Wisconsin Family Action, registered in favor of it.

"Wisconsin Family Action, along with the vast majority of people, believe that voting should only be eligible for U.S. citizens," Daniel Degner, the group's interim president, said in a statement, referencing a 2021 poll.



Groups fear citizenship proof requirement to vote

Amid a broader debate over whether noncitizens should have any right to vote, opponents of the amendment are calling attention to how it could affect current voters.

The League of Women Voters of Wisconsin and Neumann-Ortiz said the measure could be laying the groundwork for a future proposal requiring proof of citizenship at the polls. Such a measure at a national level could disenfranchise up to 10% of U.S. citizens, who don't have readily available documents proving their citizenship, a Brennan Center analysis states.

In Wisconsin, people registering to vote are required to attest, under oath, that they are U.S. citizens and that they'll be 18 by the time of the next election. They're not required to show or send in proof of citizenship, but lying on the registration form is a felony. Wisconsin state agencies have additional checks designed to keep noncitizens from getting state-issued IDs to vote.

State law allows clerks challenging a voter's registration form to ask that person to provide proof of naturalization, Wilde added, but it doesn't require them to seek proof.

Proponents of the amendment dismissed the idea that the proposed constitutional amendment is a precursor to a stricter law on citizenship proof. And it's not clear the amendment would be required for such a law to pass.

Nothing precludes the Legislature from enacting a citizenship proof requirement even now, before the amendment is passed, said Rick Esenberg, founder of the conservative Wisconsin Institute for Law & Liberty.

"It is up to the (Legislature) whether and to what extent it wishes to require proof," he said. "And it will continue to be up to them once this is passed."

Bradley, the Senate author, said he believes that Wisconsin residents should have to prove their U.S. citizenship to vote, but that the amendment has nothing to do with that.

"We will address the next question in the next Legislature," he said.

Federal law does not require documented proof of citizenship to vote in federal elections. So any new requirement would set up a conflict like the one that has played out in Arizona for over 10 years.

Arizona passed a law that requires documented proof of U.S. citizenship when registering to vote, but the U.S. Supreme Court blocked Arizona's citizenship proof requirement from taking hold in federal elections. That means Arizona keeps a separate set of rolls for voters who haven't provided such proof and who can cast ballots only

in federal contests — for president and Congress.


A Votebeat analysis found that federal-only voters are disproportionately young adults living on or near college campuses — many of them likely college students from out of state who don't have documents proving their citizenship readily available.

Would the new language weaken voter protections?

Some groups promoting voting access have raised another concern — that the new constitutional provision, if Wisconsin voters approve it, would weaken voter protections. They point to the language of the proposed amendment, which would say "only" U.S. citizens can vote, compared with what they see as more inclusive language in the current constitution stating that "every" citizen can vote.

"From there, there could be further limitations to the right to vote, and if there's any legal challenges on those limitations, we won't be able to go back to the constitution and say, 'Well, the constitution guarantees that every citizen can vote.' So it will not have the protection that it currently has," said Eileen Newcomer, voter education manager of the League of Women Voters of Wisconsin.

Dan Lenz, staff counsel at Law Forward, a group that seeks more inclusive voting policies, said there are other constitutional provisions that protect voting rights in Wisconsin. But he said the potential change to this one "makes it exclusive. And, however you look at it, that is something less than what we have now."



Lenz said constitutional amendments are an improper vehicle for passing election policy because subsequent legislatures can't quickly fix unintended consequences since the policy is enshrined in the constitution, not just state law

"Instead, they have to restart the amendment process," Lenz said, "and that takes a minimum of a number of years."

Esenberg, from the Wisconsin Institute for Law & Liberty, said he was skeptical that the amendment's passage would authorize another voting restriction that couldn't be enacted now.

"Given the history of the amendment (which is clearly aimed at noncitizen voting), it's hard to imagine what limitation that is not possible today would sneak in," he said. "This (viewpoint) seems like an effort to make the issue something other than noncitizen voting."

It's possible that the provision could be challenged in court in the future, with the Wisconsin Supreme Court getting the final word on whether the change from "every" to "only" is legally substantive, Wilde said.

Constitutional amendment proposals have to pass the Legislature in two successive sessions before going to voters for a final say. Republicans say the amendment process helps them protect and advance conservative policies that they fear the Wisconsin Supreme Court, currently with a liberal majority, or a future Legislature with a Democratic majority could otherwise reverse.

They've also used it to pass policies that Evers would almost certainly veto.

In April, voters approved two GOP-written constitutional amendments banning private grants for elections and restricting outside assistance for election officials during the conduct of elections. In August, voters rejected two GOP amendments that would have given the governor less control over federal funds.

Some voting rights advocates have criticized Republicans for backing constitutional changes to enact narrow policy changes.

"That's not the way to do business. It's not the way to legislate and make policy," Newcomer said. "The constitution is a sacred document that protects our rights, and like any change that's going to be made to the constitution, we need to take it really, really seriously."






