our lives and the lives of those around us.



Rib Mountain created a new TIF district. Motivated residents helped put a stop to it.

Rib Mountain last month approved the creation of a new TIF district, its second district for the newly minted village.

But some residents were not having it. On Tuesday, the Rib Mountain Village Board voted to reconsider creating the district, a rare move when most districts are approved without much fanfare and rarely reversed.

The district, located primarily along the Highway NN corridor in Rib Mountain where the village hall, Granite Peak Ski Area and Rib Mountain Golf Course are located, would have funded roughly \$33 million in infrastructure, according to project plans included in village board packet materials.

The district's formation sparked outcry from residents who said the district was snuck through without enough time for those residents to have any input into the process.

An opposition group, formed by Rib Mountain resident Cindy Hogan, formed on Facebook to help spread the word about the district's creation. Hogan told City Pages residents were initially concerned about being hooked up to village sewer and water, which they said would be costly for those residents and wasn't what they wanted.

Beyond that, residents were concerned about the impact on taxpayers and increased development in that area. According to the project plan, that corridor would be 75% retail.

TIF districts are a method for municipalities to develop blighted areas. Tax increment finance districts work by essentially letting a municipality to borrow against future tax revenue to fund infrastructure projects and provide incentives to developers to build where they otherwise wouldn't. When a district is created, the current property value is set as a baseline. The tax revenue from any additional value created in the district goes toward repaying the district's debt.

But many debate the impact on taxpayers. Marathon County recently formed

a task force that looked at the impact of districts. The problem with them, the task force identified, is that while a district has been open for decades, the municipality and other taxing jurisdictions aren't getting the new tax revenue from those districts. That's why the state caps how much of a municipality's value can be locked in

On Monday, residents protested outside the Rib Mountain Village Hall, seeking an end to the district

Rib Mountain Board Members Tuesday said while they believed a lot of misinformation had been shared about the TIF district, they heard residents' concerns and unanimously voted to rescind their earlier decision.

Committee OKs planning option with **Wangard Partners**

Wangard Partners will have until the end of 2025 to review a site in Wausau's RiverLife development area.

The city's Economic Development Committee on Tuesday OKed the planning option.

Wangard responded to a request for interest from the city's community development department, proposing to build a two-building, 135-unit apartment project in the city's flagship development area.

The RiverLife area has suffered from numerous setbacks since it opened for development in 2015. So far only one development project has been completed, in addition to WOW Family Entertainment Center and the parks project.

Wangard representatives say they plan to start construction next fall, but the planning option gives them more time in case setbacks come up.

Interim Community Development Director Randy Fifrick told committee members that the city working with Stantech has done a lot of environmental cleanup on the site though issues could still arise as Wangard does its due

Clerk forwards mayoral ballot removal to investigators

Wausau's city clerk has forwarded the mayor's removal of an absentee ballot box to investigators as the story gains national attention.

Last week news broke that Wausau Mayor Doug Diny on a Sunday moved the box from the front of city hall steps to somewhere in city hall outside of public view. The box was empty and locked, and was awaiting being secured by city staff on Monday morning.

City Pages obtained a copy of an email exchange between Diny and Rasmussen. The exchange included a photo of Diny wearing a suit, hard hat and work gloves moving the box. On Tuesday night, residents expressed outrage over the removal and Diny and Rasmussen sparred briefly over the removal.

On Wednesday afternoon, Wausau City Clerk Kaityn Bernarde, who didn't respond to media requests for comment, sent out a press release that she was forwarding the situation to the Marathon County District Attorney's office and to the Wisconsin Election Commission for investigation.

Republicans have been defending Diny. Marathon County Republican Party Chair Kevin Hermening sent a letter to Bernarde, obtained by City Pages, questioning why the ballot box was left outside unsecured. That letter asked for more details about the chain of custody for the ballot box from the clerk.

As of Wednesday morning, no such complaint has appeared on the WEC

website where they are publicly available.

The story drew national attention from outlets including The New York Times, the Washington Post and Fox News among others.

On Friday, Diny issued a press release saying that he doesn't work for the city clerk, and that he had hired an outside law firm to undergo a performance review of the city attorney "because she wasn't doing her job."

City leaders told City Pages that the clerk had given the mayor a deadline of noon to replace the ballot box or he would be reported for election interference. City Pages visited City Hall Friday afternoon. The ballot box was not at city hall and the mayor's office was closed with the lights off

On Monday, the box reappeared outside of city hall. Bernarde issued a press release about the drop box, which can accept payments and ballots, is now available but did not address the investigation that was announced last week.

One dead following crash in Eau Pleine

Marathon County Sheriff's deputies are investigating a two-vehicle crash that left one dead in the town of Eau Pleine.

Emergency workers were called to the scene at 10:25 am Friday at the intersection of highways 153 and E in the town of

Sheriff's Office officials say 75-year-old Wendy Wojner of Abbotsford was killed in the crash.

The crash is still under investigation.

Judge orders Minocqua Brewing Co to cease outdoor operations

An appellate court judge has denied an appeal to Minocqua Brewing Company over the Oneida County Zoning Department's decision to deny the brewery a conditional use permit.

In response, Oneida County issued a letter to Bangstad on Monday ordering him to cease outdoor operations, according to a copy of the letter first reported by Northwoods News.


The county's zoning committee last year revoked the brewery's conditional use permit after saying Minocqua Brewing Co. failed to comply with its orders over outdoor seating at the brewery. Bangstad claimed he wasn't violating the order, and that his patio was still part of the actual building and didn't constitute an outdoor space.

A judge earlier this year upheld the county's decision, but an appellate court judge granted an injunction against the county enforcing the permit revocation until a court could review the case.

According to appellate court records, a three-judge panel denied the appeal.

Minocqua Brewing Co. recently faced a lawsuit over its' Ope beer, meant to celebrate vice presidential candidate Tim Walz, after Ope! Brewing Co. in West Allis claimed it violated the brewery's trademark. Minocqua Brewery Owner Kirk Bangstad initially resisted the claim but ultimately changed the beer's name in response.



Ballot dispute

Elections commission members bicker over absentee ballot returns



The Wisconsin Elections Commission

postponed until after the November election a vote on whether to reprimand two clerks for not accepting absentee ballots at polling places until 8 p.m. on Election Day during previous elections.

The postponement came after Republican commissioners argued against allowing voters to return their absentee ballots at polling places despite WEC Chief Legal Counsel Jim Witecha saying the practice aligns with "how the commission has long been interpreting" the law.

'I'm sorry for getting flustered, but this is a misrepresentation of the case law that's out there, as well as how the commission has interpreted and messaged it," Witecha said of Republican Commissioners Don Millis and Bob Spindell's arguments against allowing voters to hand in ballots at polling places. The debate came as the commission

took up two complaints that had been filed against the clerks of Greenfield and Brookfield for not allowing voters to hand in absentee ballots at polling places after 7 p.m. for the Aug. 9, 2022, fall primary and 5 p.m. for the Feb. 20, 2024, spring primary. The complaints accused them of failing to tell voters how they could still legally hand in those ballots ahead of the 8 p.m. Election Day deadline, and the staff recommending approving a reprimand directing them to follow past agency guidance.

The uniform instructions for absentee voters that the commission created include a section that notes absentee ballots must be received in time to deliver them to the polling place no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day. Those instructions state one option to return absentee ballots is to "Drop it off at your polling place or central count location."

Brandtjen files suit to block WI from ERIC

GOP state Rep. Janel Brandtjen has filed a suit that argues Wisconsin is barred from participating in a multi-state effort created to improve voter rolls under a constitutional amendment approved this spring.

That amendment states only election officials may perform tasks related to a primary, election or referendum. Brandtjen, R-Menomonee Falls, argues that prohibits the Electronic Registration Information Center from aiding the state Elections Commission in maintaining the state's voter rolls.

Her suit, filed two weeks ago in Waukesha County Circuit Court, seeks a judgment that Wisconsin's participation in ERIC is unconstitutional under the new amendment, as well as an injunction barring the Elections Commission from transmitting data to the multi-state partnership.

She also wants Judge Brad Schimel - the former GOP AG who's now running for state Supreme Court — to order the Elections Commission to retrieve Wisconsin data from ERIC and any thirdparty vendors working with the group.

The Elections Commission had no comment on the suit.

State law requires Wisconsin to participate in ERIC, and the commission uses the partnership to check for voters who cast

ballots in other states, for example, and to clean up the official registration list. States participating in the system share information such as driver's license records to aid states in their efforts. States that participate also agree to encourage those who aren't on the voter rolls to register. It has become a focus for some Republicans, from those who believe encouraging people to register is inappropriate to conspiracy theories about how the group is funded.

Vivek says GOP Senate candidates have 'room for improvement'

Former GOP presidential candidate Vivek Ramaswamy says "there's always room for improvement" for Republicans ahead of Election Day, noting GOP Senate candidates are struggling in key swing states like Wisconsin.

"I'm somebody who holds myself to a high standard," Ramaswamy said on WISN's "UpFront," which is produced in partnership with WisPolitics. "I can criticize the other side, but part of this is also holding our side to the highest possible standard. I think we're doing great. I think I'd like to see many of the Senate candidates, one of the things that we're seeing, it's a hard truth, so I'll just say it: Donald Trump is overperforming Senate candidates by double digits on the Republican

"So I think Donald Trump is doing great," he added. "What I'd like to see in the next five weeks is a lot of down-ballot candidates take that level of fortitude and leadership to their own message as well as from Ohio to Wisconsin to candidates in other states as well. It's not enough just to put Donald Trump in the White House."

Ramaswamy was in Waukesha last week as part of a town hall hosted by the Trump campaign, which in part used a statewide bus tour to encourage Republicans to vote early.

Supreme Court rejects Kennedy ballot removal

A unanimous Wisconsin Supreme Court today rejected Robert F. Kennedy Jr.'s bid to be taken off the state's presidential ballot.

The justices knocked Kennedy's legal briefs as "inadequate" as he tried to persuade them that a Dane County judge had erroneously rejected Kennedy's request for a temporary injunction barring the Elections Commission from placing him on the ballot.

Kennedy argued keeping him on the ballot would violate constitutional rights to equal protection, free expression and the freedom of association. But the court found his briefs failed "to develop those arguments to even a minimal standard sufficient for us to consider their merits." That left no sufficient argument to persuade them Judge Stephen Ehlke made a mistake.

The court's decision came down the same day the U.S. Supreme Court rejected Kennedy's bid to persuade those justices to place him on the ballot in New York.

At the heart of the case is a state law that states anyone who files signatures to run for office and qualifies to appear on the ballot may not decline the nomination. Kennedy filed his nomination papers ahead of the Aug. 6 deadline, but then announced he was suspending his campaign in swing states and urging his supporters there to support Donald Trump. The Elections Commission voted 5-1 to place Kennedy on the ballot, citing the requirement in state law.

Four years ago, an idea to start a non-profit funeral home near Mount Olive Lutheran Church was percolating among leaders there.

It almost seemed crazy to the folks who were dreaming it up. After all, at the time there weren't any non-profit funeral homes in the state.

This year that vision became a reality. Ascent non-profit funeral home opened its doors in July. More than 300 people came to the open house the funeral home held marking the occassion.

And since that opening date in July, Ascent Funeral Home has handled the funeral services for more than a dozen families so far, says Ascent Executive Director Lucas Gajewski. That's far more than they expected in the early days of the service, which is something of a new model for the area.

Though the idea launched with Mount Olive Lutheran Church, it operates independently and is open to people of all denominations.

Construction began in August of 2023 on the roughly 8,500-square-foot facility and wrapped up July 25 for the dedication.

The funeral service is priding itself on not only saving money for those who are grieving a loved one, but also helping out by not requiring upfront payment so loved ones of the deceased can focus on the grieving process. "Especially considering people are going through a time of loss, we want to be especially mindful of that," Gajewski told City Pages.

Those founding Ascent thought that the first customers would come from Mount Olive parishioners, but so far their customers have actually come from throughout the greater Wausau area, Gajewski told City Pages.

"I'm very grateful for the positive community referrals from people, whether they are from hospice service, or whether it's community members who worked with me in the past, or even sometimes clergy who have helped get our name out," Gajewski says.

Right now Ascent has two funeral directors on staff,

including Gajewski himself. He says the plan is to continue growing the funeral home until it gets to the point they would need four to five directors to operate the site.

City Pages first reported on the new non-profit funeral home in our October 2023 Senior Spirit issue. At the time, some had reached out concerned about the funeral home's location.

Our correspondent, the late Pat Peckham, reached out to some of those people in the Weston area concerned about where the home was being built. But none would return his requests for comment.

Gajewski says he hasn't heard any of that concern anymore either. Gajewski says they've mostly heard only positive feedback from those who have used the service.

"At the end of the day we feel privileged to this community to be caring for them, privileged to be serving my hometown," Gajewski says. "We want to continue to be worthy of taking care of our community."

NATIONAL FUNERALS TREND TOWARD CREMATION

Cremations are starting to become far more common. According to the National Funeral Directors Association, roughly two-thirds of all services, or 61.9%, are cremations, with only 33.2% are burial services.

That's expected to change, according to the NFDA: By

2045, they expect 82.1% to be cremations.

Cost might be a factor. According to the NFDA, the median cost of a burial with service was \$8,300, while the median cost for funeral with cremation was \$6,280.

Green options are becoming more popular, according to the NFD, and over half of those surveyed said they attended a funeral recently in a non-traditional location.

SOME RESPONSE FROM TRADITIONAL FUNERAL HOMES

When City Pages published Peckham's story about Ascent, many of the traditional funeral homes were concerned about how they felt their services were painted in the story. While none were specifically named in the story, many felt they should have been given a chance to speak.

I decided to sit down with them to hear what they had to say.

The funeral homes also give back to the community, says Anna Zoromski,


manager of the Peterson/Kramer Funeral Home. She points out that area funeral homes have donated to fire departments, groups such as the Lion's Club and Noon Optimists, as well as sports teams and scholarships.

Brainard and Helke have donated \$125,000 to local community organizations and charities in the last year alone, officials there say.

And, many of those present said they really value their relationship with the community members — they have families in which multiple generations have been loyal customers.

Also, Zoromski points out, they help out families who have financial difficulties, and none of the homes charge for infant funerals.

Scott Brainard added that between the four funeral homes they have more than 300 years of experience. "With a community of people, if they don't think you're doing a good job, they have options," Brainard says.







Comfy conversation

The Lounge opened in Rib Mountain last month - its owners say it's become a chill place where patrons put down their phones and converse

It's a lot like your rich uncle's basement.

That's how owners Megan and Bob Lamovec describe their newest venture, The Lounge. Taking a look inside the new Rib Mountain establishment, it's hard not to get that impression, with plush, comfy couches, dim lighting and wood paneling (made with a special technique we'll talk about later) all creating a chill atmosphere.

Considering the original idea was to start an arcade bar, The Lounge's transformation is pretty incredible.

People are already getting a sense of that transformation as they've started patronizing the place that originally was intended to be the Central Wisconsin Convention and Visitors Bureau. The new direction seems to have been the better choice.

Originally, Bob says he planned an arcade bar. But like any good business person, he toured similar bars in other cities and found unfortunately that they had one thing in common: they were usually pretty empty.

He and Megan then considered a cigar lounge, but that didn't seem sustainable, considering the expense involved in outfitting a space for a cigar lounge.

Instead, The Lounge emerged, and it has some interesting features. For one, there are three different sets of sofa/chair combinations. Whereas The Garage is a fun, lively bar, The Lounge is meant to be a more chill place to have a conversation.

And that's what is happening, more so than they could

have imagined. "A friend commented the other day while the bar was full 'Bob, look around, what don't you see?" When he asked him, his friend replied "no one is on their phone." Bob points to a nook across from the bar - sometimes it's full of one group, and other times it's seen three couples all engaged in conversation.

The decor got some special attention. The wood panels are created using a Japanese wood burning technique where one actually sets the wood on fire and then scraps off the chair, giving a stained wood finish without any wood stain. And a sandalwood scent is pumped through the HVAC, completing that rich uncle aesthetic.

The alcohol is also a special case. There are plenty of taps for beer but also rare bottles of whiskey, bourbon and scotch, for instance. "It's stuff you won't find anywhere else." Bob says.

And for the non-alcohol crowd, The Lounge carries Forward Beverage. Megan says the NA movement is growing at the Granite View Marketplace too, which the couple owns along with The Garage.

But the menu is truly a special case. All the food is

made fresh and designed to be forked with no cutting required. That's because most diners will be eating from a side table, and trying to cut a steak in that awkward position might produce disastrous results.

The menu includes items such as beef tartare, panseared blackened Ahi Tuna, or even a dessert pizza.

You may not have a rich uncle yourself - but you can enjoy that experience at The Lounge.
