

Council battle

Council, mayor maneuver against each other as ballot battle intensifies

Mayor Doug Diny muttered "seriously?" after a city council member maneuver left a resolution he'd put forward to die on the vine.

That came at the end of a meeting dominated by shouting matches, heated public comment and maneuvering sparked by a ballot box removal that garnered national press.

The chaos began as Diny attempted to give a speech prior to public comment, which included at least 20 speakers. As he continued delivering his opinion on the absentee ballot situation, council members started shouting that he was out of order and chastised him to get on with the meeting.

It didn't go much better for the mayor after that.

Two weeks ago it was revealed that Diny had removed the city's absentee ballot box from the steps of city hall. It was locked and empty, and was awaiting installation on Monday morning. A photo of Diny in a hard hat and suit carting the box away made the rounds on social media, residents and council members lambasted the mayor for removing the box and the whole thing made national news.

The State Department of Justice is now investigating the box's removal.

On Tuesday, Diny announced that he had removed from the agenda an item that would have given the council authority over the city's ballot box, which state law puts under the purview of the city clerk.

Other cities such as Brookfield passed similar resolutions.

The ballot box has become a hot-button issue. People speaking during the public comment period, which took up more than an hour Tuesday, were divided between supporting Diny's actions and chastising him for removing the box.

But most interesting was a resolution that would have spent \$3,000 for extra security around the ballot box. It required a vote to suspend the rules, something that rarely comes into play in actual practice as council members typically agree to it.

On Tuesday, it did come into play. Council member Michael Martens voted to take the security resolution and another separately. And when Diny asked for a motion to suspend the rules for his security measures resolution, no one said anything. "Seriously?" Diny asked. "This is your last chance."

Other notable Council actions:

- The council approved a planning option for Wangard Partners for a site on the city's flagship RiverLife development area. The company has until 2025 to conduct due diligence on the site and come up with a plan.
- The council sent back a mayoral appointment after Council Member Carol Lukens called attention to the fact that not enough information was included in the council's materials to enable them to make a decision.



Riverlife Brig's to close

When the Briq's RiverLife location closed this season, it turns out that was for good.

Wausau leaders announced last week that Briq's, an ice cream shop with locations throughout Wausau and central Wisconsin, would not be renewing its lease for the location. Briq's first opened in RiverLife, the city's flagship development area, in 2019 after the city completed the park project. It's located near the park's playground area.

The ice cream shop opened seasonally in the building owned by the city. It was a popular ice cream stop for people along the riverfront.

In a press release, Wausau officials said they would be putting out requests for other vendors who might want to operate in the location.

UWSP enrollment numbers continue to plummet

Numbers at UWSP-Wausau have continued to decline, as some UW College schools are facing closure.

Fall enrollment at the Wausau campus this fall is 269 students, says UWSP official Miranda Gentry-Siegel. That's down from 368 students the previous fall.

That news comes as more campuses similar to UWSP Wausau have closed. Those closures include UW-Platteville Richland, UW-Milwaukee at Washington County, UW-Oshkosh Fond du Lac and UW-Green Bay Marinette, according to the Daily Cardinal. UW-Milwaukee at Waukesha and UW-Oshkosh Fox Cities will close in 2025,

according to the Cardinal.

Gentry-Siegel says things are looking up for spring and fall of 2025, however. The campus has had 270 applications so far, which is much more than the 20 applications the campus had at the same time last year.

UWSP Wausau has increased its recruitment around returning adults, Gentry-Siegel says, and right now many students who enroll are getting sizable scholarships, she says.

Timekeeper Distillery eyes Ashwaubenon location

Timekeeper Distillery is eyeing a second location in Ashwaubenon in the Green Bay area.

The Ashwaubenon Village Board recently approved the distillery to open a second location in the village next to Souper Day.

A new state law allows a brewery or distillery to open a second location somewhere else in the state to serve its product without getting a new liquor license, according to village board meeting materials. The brewery or distillery does need to get permission from the municipality.

Timekeeper Distillery opened in 2018 in a former railroad depot on Wausau's east side.

One dead, several injured in Schofield apartment fire

State agencies are investigating a fire that left one dead and several injured in a Schofield apartment fire Monday morning.

An apartment building at 630 Grand





One person is dead and several were injured in a fire at this Schofield apartment complex on Grand Avenue Monday.

Avenue in Schofield caught fire in the early morning hours of Monday, according to a Department of Justice press release. The Riverside Fire District responded at 4:41 am Monday to the blaze. Firefighters found one adult dead and several injured.

One person was transported to a hospital with injuries, officials say.

The State Fire Marshall's Office is investigating the cause of the fire. Several agencies responded to the fire scene to assist Riverside Fire District.

Soil at Riverside Park to be tested for arsenic

A company that bought some railroad property along Riverside Park plans to test areas in the park for potential arsenic contamination.

Parks Department Assistant Director of Operations Andy Simms told the city's Parks and Recreation Committee Monday that 3M company would like to test the soil in Riverside Park. Testing on their property found trace levels of arsenic, Simms told the committee, and they're required to test the area around that site. That includes land in Riverside Park.

Riverside Park became the center of controversy about five years ago in the midst of residents demanding soil be tested at the park. Testing and soil removal finally happened at the park a few years ago.

The committee Tuesday granted permission for 3M to test the soil in the park.

Boy and the Boot statue to be relocated downtown

Those who remember walking the now-demolished Wausau Center mall might remember the Boy and the Boot statue housed within its confines.

That statue has remained safely stored by the city since the mall was torn down in 2021, but now the statue could get a home within the new development area downtown. City leaders at the Economic Development Committee Monday approved a plan to install the statue in the development area. A representative of Becher-Hoppe told the committee it would be installed in the warm months and replaced in the winter months with something more weather-resistant to keep the statue safe.

The statue has a water feature that recycles water, and likely wouldn't need to be hooked up to a water source, but could be if needed, representatives say.

Leading timeline

Biden announces deadlines on lead service line replacements

President Joe Biden in Wisconsin today will announce the EPA has finalized federal regulations requiring drinking water systems in the U.S. to replace lead service lines within 10 years.

He will also announce the EPA is investing \$2.6 billion more into drinking water upgrades and lead pipe replacements, funded by his Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

Of the new funding, 49% must be provided to disadvantaged communities as grant funding or principal forgiveness that does not have to be repaid. EPA is also announcing the availability of \$35 million in competitive grant funding for reducing lead in drinking water.

The city of Milwaukee, where Biden will make the announcement, is already set to replace lead pipes within the 10-year timeline. So far, lead pipe replacement in the city, funded by a \$30 million investment from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law in 2024, has cut what had been a 60-year timeline. Similarly, Edgerton, southeast of Madison, has replaced 100% of its known lead pipes after receiving funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

Biden established the Lead and Copper Rule during his first year as president; that required all lead service lines to be replaced. Since then, he has secured \$15 billion in dedicated funding for lead pipe replacement and \$11.7 billion more that can be used for drinking water projects and lead pipe replacement. So far, 367,000 lead pipes in the U.S. have been replaced, benefitting around 918,000 people.

Senior Administration White House officials said they are sure 99% of the cities will make the 10-year deadline, and the EPA will aggressively pursue a timeline that stays in line with the president's vision for the 1% that don't.

The officials also said Vice President Kamala Harris and U.S. Sen. Tammy Baldwin have been significant partners to the EPA. They added that clean water should be a bipartisan issue.

Trump slams federal hurricane response in WI campaign stop

JUNEAU — Former President Trump slammed the federal government's response to Hurricane Helene, claiming "the White House is doing nothing," as he repeatedly called Dem rival Kamala Harris incompetent.

Making his fourth stop to Wisconsin in eight days, Trump on Sunday attacked Harris as a "dummy" who can't answer a question and is lost without a teleprompter while slamming her on immigration and other issues.

He also mocked her promise to lower costs for Americans if elected.

"Why the hell didn't she do it four years ago, all right?" Trump asked the crowd at an airport here.

Trump called the Biden administration's response to the hurricane the worst ever seen, "probably worse than Katrina, and that's hard to beat." He made the misleading claim that those affected by the hurricane only get \$750 from the federal government. That is the initial payment those affected can receive for immediate needs such as groceries, with additional aid available.

Trump also took credit for Elon Musk providing Starlink internet service to affected areas.

Cheney joins Harris in WI campaign stop

RIPON — Dem presidential nominee Kamala Harris condemned Donald Trump as a threat to democracy and vowed to be a "president for all Americans" as she sought to appeal to GOP voters in the birthplace of the Republican Party.





Harris spoke at a rally Thursday with former GOP U.S. Rep. Liz Cheney, who has endorsed her campaign. Cheney is an outspoken Trump critic who led the House committee tasked with investigating the Jan. 6 U.S. Capitol attack following the former president's 2020 loss.

"If people across Wisconsin and our nation are willing to do what Liz is doing, to stand up for the rule of law, democratic ideals and the Constitution of the United States, then together I know we can chart a new way forward," Harris said. "Not as members of any one party, but as Americans."

Harris said she has never wavered in upholding her oath of office.

"And therein lies the profound difference between Donald Trump and me," Harris said. "He who violated the oath to uphold the Constitution of the United States of America, and — make no mistake — he who, if given the chance, would violate it again."

Cheney took the stage to several rounds of the crowd chanting, "Thank you, Liz". The former Wyoming representative condemned Trump for inciting his supporters to attack the U.S. Capitol on Jan. 6. She said she had never voted for a Dem, but would proudly cast her vote for Harris.

MU Law poll shows Harris, Baldwin hold edge

Kamala Harris had an edge on Donald Trump in the latest Marquette University Law School Poll, continuing a trend of little movement in the presidential race.

Meanwhile, Dem U.S. Sen. Tammy Baldwin's lead on GOP businessman Eric Hovde ticked up slightly compared to a month ago, though the movement was within the margin of error.

The latest poll found 52% of likely voters backed Harris, while 48% favored Trump. In a multiple candidate race, it was 49-44 for Harris, with Robert F. Kennedy Jr. at 3%. Support for the independent, who remains on the Wisconsin ballot after dropping out of the race, has dropped in half compared to the last poll, which was released Sept. 11.

Poll Director Charles Franklin said Dems have been remarkably unified behind Harris with 99% of them saying in this poll that they backed the vice president after 100% favored her in the last one. Franklin said such unity is rare, and the poll could be overestimating how loyal Dems are to Harris. But the consistency "suggests we should take them seriously," Meanwhile, 94% of Republicans back Trump.

Franklin also noted 61% of independents backed Harris in the latest poll, compared to 60% in the last survey. He said that group is small — accounting for 34% of the sample this time — and they often bounce around. But that Harris eclipsed 60% with them in the last two polls was noteworthy. In the poll released in early August, 54% of independents supported Trump.

The Marquette poll found edges for the Dem nominee in the 2020 and 2016 cycles in the results released in early October. Four years ago, Joe Biden was up on Trump 45-39 among registered voters in a multiple candidate race. In 2016, it found Hillary Clinton leading Trump by 41-35. Those races were each decided by less than 23,000 votes.



emergency services. -We residents cannot use the path.... we will be ticketed. $\,$

-The ambulance will fit down the path, but the ladder truck cannot go down the path. Any of us with a two-story home, home set back a distance, or having a metal roof, will not have adequate fire service.

-We discussed personal emergencies, such as a woman in labor, or an injury that does not require an ambulance. I stressed that the residents NEED to have a way IN AND OUT of their properties. Not JUST emergency vehicles.

-They said that WPS put in a loop – therefore it is not an issue. They said that WPS is moving to natural gas in about seven years, so it is not an issue. They said that the train engineer is supposed to call the WPS gate before arriving so this would never happen. But it still does!!

-In February of 2024, the Village Board directed Leonard Ludi, the Public Works Director at the time, to create an official Request for Proposal (RFP), to hire a firm to analyze the issue and find all the possible solutions. Then Leonard Ludi, now administrator, said that there was no money for the study. (Previous administrator Manley put money in the budget, but others removed it, leaving no funds in 2024 budget for such a study).

-The Village Board then directed the APC committee to find the funds. Trustee Coyle said 'there are no funds'.

-Peter Kampfer, our next administrator, was fully on board with the necessity of the project, but, an unresponsive village president and obnoxious fire chief, caused him to resign. I was then told we had to wait until the 2025 budget was addressed and get funds set aside for a study.

-On Wed, 9/4/2024, CLIPP began discussions of the 2025 budget. Members of the committee voted 5 to 1 to NOT PROCEED with the funding. This was after a lengthy discussion of their personal opinions that we did not need resolution: The committee expressed that this is a DEAD ISSUE. NO ONE IS GOING TO ACT!!! They feel that the 200 people who signed the petition have nothing to complain about. They stated, it's been this way for fifty years, so the residents can live with it for another fifty years. Theresa O'Brien, Fire Chief, has even stated that the stories I relayed from each of you were NOT TRUE.

We have 3 choices: 1) give up and let them dismiss our concerns, 2) bombard the members with emails and phone calls to express our displeasure and 3) vote these people out of office.

Megadonors dominate the 'era of the big checkbook'

The era of the big checkbook continues. And it's factoring into legislative races in remarkable — perhaps unprecedented — ways.

The latest reports to the state underscore the impact of the 2015 rewrite of campaign finance laws.

Republicans engineered the rewrite that allowed donations of any size to political parties and legislative caucuses, plus unlimited transfers to candidates.

That paved the way for donations such as the \$6.3 million that Diane Hendricks and Liz Uihlein combined to give the Assembly and Senate GOP caucuses over the past two months.

Hendricks also gave the state GOP \$1.1 million over that period, while the state Dem Party's own megadonors came through again with LinkedIn founder Reid Hoffman giving \$2.25 million over the past month and Illinois Gov. J.B. Pritzker chipping in \$2 million.

The state Dem Party has mastered the rules Republicans wrote nearly a decade ago and has consistently used them to trounce the state GOP for donations.

Since Jan. 1, the state Dem Party has reported \$19.9 million in donations, compared to \$4.8 million by the state GOP. The state Dem Party, in turn, has sent \$2.75 million to the Assembly Democratic Campaign Committee since Jan. 1 and \$2.3 million to the State Senate Democratic Committee. But Hendricks and Uihlein — Nos. 38 and 216 on the latest Forbes list of the wealthiest Americans — may have single-handedly leveled the playing field in legislative races — and possibly tilted it in the Assembly GOP's favor.

The Hendricks and Uihlein donations helped the Republican Assembly Campaign Committee raise \$7.2 million between July 30 and Sept. 23, compared to the \$3 million the Assembly Democratic Campaign Committee pulled in, including \$1.25 million from the state party.


Meanwhile, the Committee to Elect a Republican Senate raised \$2.3 million, compared to the \$1.7 million the State Senate Democratic Committee pulled in.

Control of the state Senate isn't up for grabs this fall. The key is whether Dems net at least three seats to put them in position to try flipping the chamber in 2026.

The Assembly is a different story. Dems would likely need Kamala Harris to win Wisconsin by a couple of points or so to improve their chances of winning.

A true 50-50 presidential race likely helps Republicans maintain the majority they've had for the past 14 years. And having a financial advantage bolsters that opportunity. Insiders note the goal for Assembly Republicans isn't just 50 seats — not if they want a functioning majority next session. Several members expected to return have been thorns in the side of Speaker Robin Vos, R-Rochester, and a majority more in the range of 55 seats would be a lot more comfortable.

The infusion of cash helps Vos play in more seats and helps boost GOP incumbents such as Rep. Todd Novak, R-Dodgeville, who was drawn into a 54% Dem seat. Insiders also note Republicans are trying to expand the



map by going after Dem Rep. Jodi Emerson and her 53% Dem seat in the Eau Claire area. Emerson's district is 10 points less Dem than it used to be and loses the pieces of the UW-Eau Claire campus to a neighboring seat. Some Republicans believe that opens up a path to pick her off.

Some also note that Novak has run ahead of the top of the ticket before. But his district didn't just get more Dem. It shed some areas that he'd represented for the past dozen years.

Dems argue the top of the ticket will drive results in legislative races with voters going with their partisan tendencies rather than crossing over to vote for candidates they don't know. Dems have their own challenges, some point out. They have the opportunity to dramatically improve their lot after starting the session with just 35 seats in the 99-seat chamber. But they haven't had to build infrastructure in some of the areas they're now competing in because the old GOP-drawn maps were so bad for them before.

However this fall turns out, the era of big donors may be here to stay. And the change from before the 2015 rewrite is stark.

Between July 30, 2014, and Sept. 23 of that year, there were 32 donations of \$50,000 or more totaling \$11.2 million, according to a WisPolitics check of the state's database. That included \$2 million that Dem Mary Burke gave her gubernatorial campaign in that window.

For that same period this year, there were 119 donations of \$50,000 or more, totaling \$28.9 million. Along



with the growth in large transactions, the latest window showed numerous transfers between parties and campaigns.

That shows how unlimited donations to parties and caucuses can fuel the growth in spending by candidates.

From autos to art

Chuck O'Brien and Brenda Stiegman turned a former oil change shop into an art studio

Chuck O'Brien has had a pretty interesting life.

He left Rhinelander after high school seemingly never to return 40 years ago, and served in the military and the Department of Homeland Security after 9/11.

Now a new commercial creation has pulled him back to Wausau after a long

With partner Brenda Stiegman, O'Brien is assembling the Art on Grand gallery, shopping and retail space. The 2202 Grand Ave. facility is on track for a soft opening this month as of this story's filing and will have a grand debut near the end of November.

The space had previously been an auto repair shop where people could get an oil change or their brakes fixed. And while auto repair can be its own art form, O'Brien and Stiegman have turned the space into a haven for local artists.

It features spaces for artists to create

and display their work before a sale, a rentable studio for a wide variety of classes and avoids some of the standard procedures others in the industry regularly adhere to with art sales.

"What sets this business plan apart is we don't take a commission (these can typically be half of a purchase price or higher) on artist sales," O'Brien says. "We are striving to keep the costs for people low. Our goal is to fill the place with art and constantly evolving, changing inventory."

Costs are as low as one dollar per chair for any event and as high as \$250 for renting out the gallery space for an exhibition. O'Brien and Stiegman – who met online and connected for the long term over a mutual love of art – have already filled four of the six available artist workspaces which run for \$180 a month. They want to expand to more industrial arts involving the fabrication of wood or metal material in the future and, above all, hope each day allows one who may feel intimidated by

artistic creation to find love and engagement with it in their way.

"This is to allow artists of every level, of every type of art they wanted to show, we wanted to make it accessible," Stiegman adds. "This will also give them a broader audience Wausau may not have had. For those who say 'I am not an artist, does this work for me?' We'd say 'yes."
