

## Big kickoff

The Wausau area has a new minor league arena soccer team that will be kicking off next month.

**Dr. Alexander Eddo took a job** at a Marshfield pharmacy several years ago. He didn't know much about the area, but that's where the job happened to be.

Formerly a soccer player who came within a breath of making the pros, that move ultimately led to Wausau having its own arena soccer team.

The Wausau Conquerors are set to kick off next month. The team is the brainchild of Eddo, who became a pharmacist after a career in soccer.

Eddo, the head of the arena league the team will play in, and his coaches and players were present for a ribbon cutting Monday at the Greenheck Turner Center in Weston. The new center will be the home to the team, which kicks off its first home game on Dec. 14 against the Minnesota Blizzard.

The team will also have a pre-season friendly match Nov. 30 against the Milwaukee Wave, a professional arena soccer team in the top league of the sport. Wausau's team will be a League 2 team, similar to how the English Premier League has multiple levels.

Eddo said when he got called up to the development team of a professional league when he was a teenager, it changed his life. With players from college and high school selected through tryouts, plus some who were recruited (one player said he was from North Dakota), Eddo hopes to give new players the same opportunity he had, and possibly a road to becoming a professional player.

Eddo also recruited a coach from Portugal. Ricardo Jorge Oliveiro Pedro is a former professional player who will be the head coach for the team.

Arena soccer is a little different than the outdoor version of the sport. It's fast-paced in a smaller field, and typically higher scoring.

The arena team launches as other semi-pro and amateur sports emerge. A new football team launched this summer called The Muskies, and last decade a new minor league hockey team moved to town. That team, the RiverWolves,


ultimately rebranded to The Cyclones in honor of the team that once played in Wausau in the 80s and 90s.

The team will make use of the newly completed Greenheck Turner Community Center, with its giant indoor sports space next to D.C. Everest Senior High.

#### Kronenwetter clerk latest Kronenwetter resignation

Kronenwetter's embattled village clerk has resigned.
Clerk Bobbi Jo Birk LaBarge resigned last week, according to a copy of her resignation letter obtained by City

LaBarge's resignation comes on the heels of the village's finance director resigning last month. In her email to board members, LaBarge cites harassment by board member Ken Charneski and the board's lack of willingness to do anything about it.



Village President Chris Voll and Charneski did not respond to requests for comment about the resignation letter. Another board member, Kelly Coyle, said he couldn't speak on the record about the situation.

LaBarge's resignation is the latest in what has become a revolving door at the village. She is the third clerk since 2020. Lisa Kerstner was one of several finance directors since that time and the village has had two administrators start and quit this year alone.

Charneski filed a lawsuit against LaBarge, former interim administrator Kim Manley and contracted attorney Lee Turonie alleging open records violations. And there were several election complaints filed against LaBarge, including by Charneski.

#### T. Wall to start leasing process for Foundry project

Developers have started a waitlist for the first mall redevelopment project, though it's not slated to open for nearly a year.

Work is currently underway on the Foundry on Third project, the first development to start up in the former Wausau Center mall area. The mall was demolished in 2021, and after a long battle with city leaders that grew contentious at times, the project kicked off construction earlier this year.

The Foundry on Third building will have 150 units plus some commercial space. T. Wall Enterprises, which is building the Foundry on Third project, has detailed a second, similar building but nothing has been announced yet. The company will likely seek tax increment finance incentives for that project as it did for the first.







#### Infused redevelopment nears completion but committee balks at exterior

Development that is turning a former industrial site on the city's north Riverfront into an event space is nearly complete, but a city committee is sending that developer somewhat back to the drawing board.

The city's Economic Development Committee asked that Asch Properties LLC bring new plans to the city for beautifying one side of the company's business, Infused, by

Asch Properties, run by Matt Aschbrenner a local eye doctor, bought the former Wausau Chemical building at 180 E Wausau Ave. from the city in 2022 with the idea that he would rehabilitate it into an event space and greenhouse with herbs where customers can sip mocktails and tea.

After several delays, the building is nearly complete and part of the building has been granted occupancy by the city.

But while committee members were impressed with the interior of the building, committee members said they didn't care for the south side entrance, saying it looks too warehouse-like.

That left Aschbrenner perplexed, since he felt he wasn't really getting a strong direction on what to do. Asch Properties originally planned \$250,000 worth of improvements to the building in their original proposal - that has ballooned to nearly \$400,000 not including the cost of the building, which the company bought from the city for

Planters and sculptures were suggested by various committee members, though the committee collectively didn't vote or agree to any specific items.

Aschbrenner said he will work with a designer to bring back a plan for beautifying that side to the February

for proposals for those lots, and keep coming up empty handed.

City Community Development manager Tammy Stratz told the city's Economic Development committee that the city has had interest from modular home builders but contractors need to be the ones to bid on the parcels and build the projects. The city has a grant through the Department of Natural Resources to build homes on those parcels.

Modular homes would work best, Stratz says, because


they can be more easily built to specifications neighbors said they would like to see on the site. The city held neighborhood meetings in that area to gather feedback to get a sense of what neighbors might like to see built there and compiled that into a list.

Those meetings came after residents in those neighborhoods expressed concern about what was built on the remnant parcels left over from the first half of the Thomas Street reconstruction.

# Transportation golden age?

Former WI Congressman

Sean Duffy tapped for Trump's

transportation secretary



**Former GOP U.S. Rep. Sean Duffy** is promising to help President-elect Trump to "usher in a new golden age of transportation" after he was nominated to join the cabinet.

Trump late Monday announced he had tapped Duffy for Transportation secretary, saying the former 7th CD lawmaker will "greatly elevate the Travel Experience for all Americans."

During his time in Congress, Duffy's committee assignments largely focused on the financial sector. That includes the Committee on Financial Services, and he chaired the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations. According to Open Secrets, Duffy lobbied on miscellaneous transportation issues while at BGR Group.

In a statement, Trump said Duffy "will prioritize Excellence, Competence, Competitiveness and Beauty when rebuilding America's highways, tunnels, bridges and airports

"He will ensure our ports and dams serve our Economy without compromising our National Security, and he will make our skies safe again by eliminating DEI for pilots and air traffic controllers."

Duffy, 53, was elected to northern Wisconsin's 7th CD in 2010. He then abruptly resigned in September 2019 after announcing that his ninth child, who was due that fall, had

a heart condition. The girl was born with Down syndrome.

Duffy was a prominent Trump backer while in Congress, and the former president publicly encouraged him in October 2021 to run for Wisconsin guv the following year. Duffy, who had already moved his family to New Jersey as he began work at Fox News, declined the overture.

#### Hovde officially concedes amidst election concerns

GOP U.S. Senate candidate Eric Hovde today conceded to Dem Tammy Baldwin, saying a recount would not change the results.

In a nearly six-minute video posted on X, Hovde continued to raise concerns about the election. But he said a "request for a recount would serve no purpose" because it would only involve recounting the ballots.

According to unofficial results, Hovde trailed Baldwin by just more than 29,000 votes. That's within the margin that would've allowed Hovde to seek a recount. But he would have to cover the cost.

Hovde continued to blame his loss on the presence of third-party candidates, including Thomas Leager, who ran under the American First banner.

He also said he's not sure what the future holds for him.

Some Republicans have suggested Hovde could run for guv in 2026, and he said in the video he will take a "much needed break" before returning to his businesses and his foundation. He also pledged to always "fight for the country and state that I love and work to restore the American dream."

A Baldwin spokesperson said Hovde hadn't called her as of late this morning. The campaign declined comment on Hovde's remarks, instead pointing to Baldwin's Nov. 7 victory speech in which she said it was time to come together to attack problems facing Wisconsinites and to "put the politics of division behind us."

State Dem Party spokesperson Arik Wolk said, "Now that he's finally conceded, I wish Eric Hovde a safe trip back to California."

#### DNR approval of Enbridge line sparks blowback

The DNR announced it has approved permits for the Enbridge Line 5 pipeline relocation, angering tribal members and spurring threats of legal action from environmentalists.

Enbridge is seeking to relocate a 12-mile segment of Line 5 and build a new 41-mile segment outside the Bad River Band of Lake Superior Chippewa reservation. The proposal came after a federal judge ruled in 2022 Enbridge had illegally trespassed on the tribe's land.

Enbridge will still need another permit approved by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to begin the project, and DNR in its release noted the agency may require additional permits or approvals.

Following yesterday's announcement, the Wisconsin Jobs and Energy Coalition, a group of labor unions, business groups and agricultural organizations, hailed the

decision. The coalition has warned shutting down Line 5 could lead to propane shortages in the region and significant price increases.

Wisconsin Propane Gas Association Executive Director Cheryl Lytle noted propane suppliers in the state have been waiting more than four years for DNR to review the project.

"We are thankful for the Wisconsin DNR's diligence and hopeful our state can now avoid the supply and price shock closing down Line 5 would have on the 280,000 families, farms and businesses that depend on propane for heat and fuel," Lytle said.

#### Van Orden won re-election, at odds with Trump's AG pick

U.S. Rep. Derrick Van Orden, R-Prairie du Chien won reelection to a second term representing western Wisconsin's 3rd CD, in one of the most closely watched races in the Badger State.

The Cook Political Report rated the district as a "lean Republican" seat ahead of the

election. Van Orden won reelection with 51.4% of the vote, according to unofficial results.

Trump announced former U.S. Rep. Matt Gaetz, who has publicly clashed with U.S. Rep. Derrick Van Orden, R-Prairie du Chien, as his pick for attorney general.

Van Orden in a statement to WisPolitics said "I support the president" and did not address his past comments about Gaetz, which include calling him "tubby." 🖙

#### **Disinherited? Ask Questions**

Before seriously considering a will or trust contest—which could be a long, expensive, and ultimately fruitless undertaking—it may be worth asking a few questions to put things into perspective.

If your parents said you were going to receive something and you did not, this could be an issue. If you do not know what their wishes were, it may be harder to argue that you were supposed to receive something.

Health-related and long-term care expenses can deplete a lifetime of savings and leave little or no money for inheritance. Money left to a sibling or another family member or charity might also explain your omission.

Club membership is dwindling these days — but local clubs are trying to stem the tide and appeal to younger potential members

When you care for a community, you do things to contribute to its well-being. Wausau shows signs of this thanks to fundraisers for area veterans, donations to the needy, and humanity for the homeless. However, if current national trends continue, service clubs in the city that have brought people together for these noble purposes will have fewer members and a blunted impact.

Reports from as early as 2000 in books like Robert Putnam's "Bowling Alone: The Collapse and Revival of American Community" reveal attendance at meetings for groups like Rotary International, Elks, and Kiwanis International declined 58 percent over the previous 25 years. A cursory Google search shows the problem persists in places as far away as Washington and as near as Milwaukee.

While nothing is guaranteed to last forever, in Wausau local groups are taking on renovations and reorganizations in an effort to freshen themselves up and attract new members, especially in harder-to-reach younger demographics.

"I think we are sitting pretty good, but COVID-19 hit everybody hard," Wausau Elks Lodge No. 248 Events Coordinator Maureen Johnson says of the club's current 500 or so members. "For a lot of years nothing really happened and now what I'm trying to do is breathe life back into this."

#### Making changes

Changes at the group's Scott Street facility include a renovation costing over \$100,000 unveiled earlier this year as

part of the group's 100th anniversary. Johnson adds they have also gone digital with some activities like game show nights. The group has a modern venue space for brides or businesses looking to gather.

But none of that is a guarantee that the club will be able to stem the change in membership. The Elks Lodge's membership is a far cray from the 90s, when membership peaked at around 1,200 or so.

David Imlah, the Wausau Freemasons' worshipful master, has 115 members to work with in his organization less than half of the previous high of 300 members years

But their numbers have been increasing again in recent years. That's because in Imlah's view in part because of structural changes like soliciting members (before, prospective members had to ask an active member to join) and evolving with the times.

"There is so much online presence," he says. "People spend so much time online doing research and looking for things, so we developed an online presence so people find us. I think you'll find a lot of service organizations aren't doing that. They need to think outside the box if you will."

#### Some have struggled

However, rule changes and other upgrades has not always worked out for clubs looking to revive their memberships. The Service Club of Milwaukee (which was for high schoolaged girls) made local headlines in 2022 when its board said the century-old organization was "not a sustainable organization." The group tried to boost its numbers with a new website, but was severely hobbled by the global COVID-19 pandemic.

Of course, social change is often irreversible, but, at the Wausau Rotary Club, they are trying to overcome it and stay fresh with a lot of flexibility.

"We are actively trying to recruit younger," Wausau Rotary Club President Dr. Lisa G. Dodson says. "With that demographic, they are often starting families and in the very busy phase of their lives. They are new homeowners; they have a new baby or puppy ... having three different times of day our various clubs meet has been intentional at least in part to address that issue. People might not be able to come to our meeting at noon, but they might be able to attend a morning early bird meeting or the after-hours club which meets less often and meets more informally."

#### Changing religious values

Another aspect of some historical service clubs and fraternal orders is religious connection. The Elks and Freemasons have belief in a higher power as a general requirement to become a member while Rotary and Kiwanis International

do not appear to as of this story being filed.

Millennials and those in the Generation Z demographic are considered to be some of the least religious age groups in the United States. The percentage of Americans who identified as Christian, for instance, declined from 90% in 1972 to 64% by 2020, according to a study conducted by Pew Research. Pew projects that number to continue

When asked if religion also has a role to play in signing up younger people to organizations that once had no difficulty in growing, Johnson adds it is something embedded in Elks history, but is not a part of their regular practices to a high degree.

"We are a Christian organization but that is as far as that goes," she says. "We are not picking out any sort of religion or anything. One of our philosophies is believing in God, that is the easiest way to put it. If I see something as belief in God I don't go 'Oh, they're worshiping on knees."

For now, the struggle continues and those interested in learning about the mentioned clubs can find out more about them by visiting their Facebook pages, attending a meeting, or other open events.



### Kicking off a new sport

**Derrick Harris launched his Muay** Thai gym in Mosinee last month

Derrick Harris has been training in Muay Thai since 2005, starting in San Diego and later in La Vegas, where he trained alongside mixed martial arts fighters — some of whom you've probably heard of.

When he moved to Wausau (he works remotely for a company outside the area), he realized he wanted to continue that tradition, so he started his own gym.

Harris started Bull Falls Muay Thai last month in the Elite Health Club building in Mosinee. He's holding classes Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at the health club, teaching students the kicks, punches and clinches many people by now have probably seen MMA fighters perform on TV in the UFC or other mixed martial arts organizations.

Harris isn't unfamiliar with those sports, especially in Las Vegas which he says is the fighting capital of the world right now, with a UFC training center and plenty of martial artists. Harris in Vegas trained alongside fighters in UFC, K1 and several Muay Thai promotions.

Muay Thai, as the name might suggest, originates in Thailand. Muay Thai incorporates punching, kicking, elbows and knees, along with what is called the Thai clinch, making it similar to other striking martial arts but with its own unique style. Many MMA fighters incorporate Muay Thai into their fighting styles, and some have famously traveled to Thailand to train in the sport in preparation for competition.

Harris came to Muay Thai from powerlifting, he told City Pages. Harris was over 300 pounds, had a lot of muscle but also a lot of fat, he says.

One day he drove past a Muay Thai gym while living

in San Diego and it intrigued him. He hadn't heard of Muay Thai but he decided to check it out. "I was hooked," Harris said. He said the physical nature of it, the vigorous workout and also the way it clears your mind when you're

(As someone who trained in Brazilian Jiujitsu, I can attest to that. As I've long said, it's hard to worry about life's problems when someone is trying to choke you.)

A typical class will start with some stretching, followed by shadow boxing, then drill some techniques like specific kicks or knees. Eventually students will work on the clinch, and eventually spar, but not in the beginning, Harris says

"We've been kind of lucky to start from square one, and hopefully these first students can be a core group that will help bring other people along," Harris says. "But my goal

is that when new people show up, that I can take time to work with them, help them get up to speed on some of the basics."

Harris says students will eventually spar, but they practice light sparring. That wasn't the case at the Las Vegas gym he trained at. "I've trained at a gym where people spar 100%, and that's great when you're in your 20s. But it's not the best for learning."

Harris, who works in editorial for a venture capital firm outside of the area, says anyone with interest in joining should, regardless of age. They are demanding workouts, he says, but he encourages people to try it out for themselves.
