

Visit Keyes Peak Ski Hill

Take a trip to Keyes Peak Ski Hill to enjoy downhill skiing, snow tubing, snowshoeing and cross country skiing. Not only will you enjoy winter fun with the whole family, you can enjoy panoramic views from the highest peak in Florence County. The Keyes Peak Recreation Area is county owned and operated. Cross-Country Ski Trails Florence County

The rolling terrain on the Lake Emily Cross Country Ski Trail is best suited for skiers with a moderate amount of experience. The trail travels 2.5 miles in a large loop through the beautiful forest which lies in close proximity to Lake Emily. The Lauterman Lake Trail includes steep terrain giving this trail system a medium to high difficulty level as you trek 9 miles through

the Nicolet National Forest. Hall's Creek Trail includes gentle rolling terrain on the 7 mile loop with a difficulty rating which is low.



Marinette County

Woods Road Ski Trail - Probably the most unique ski trail around, the Woods Road Ski Trail offers stations along the trail to tell about the many animals found in the area. The mostly flat landscape offers many loop options and is approximately 6 miles long, a great place

for beginners and children. Spring Rapids and Seymour Rapids Trails - Both trails include steep hills, breathtaking views and peacefulness. Spring Rapids is the larger of the two trails and is comprised of various loops and distances. This trail is groomed for both classic and skate skiing. Pets, hiking and snowshoeing are not allowed on the groomed ski trails. The Peshtigo River Trail is an 11mile trek in the wetland habitat in the Lower Peshtigo River. The trail extends from the city of Peshtigo to Green Bay, the same path that loggers, early explorers and tribes used as their main route for travel and shipment of goods.

Snowmobile & ATV in

Florence & Marinette Counties The breathtaking scenery, well maintained trails, rolling hills, endless miles of rivers and streams, tall pines and beautiful hardwoods; these

are what snowmobilers in Florence and Marinette Counties will enjoy. Sled on nearly 1000 miles of trails between Florence and Marinette Counties. Take a stop by one of the many waterfalls accessible by snowmobile for a unique winter experience. State Corridors 1, 3, 5, 7, and 18 cross Marinette County and meet up with the 25,000 miles state trail system. Also, Marinette County is one of the few counties in the state to offer year-round ATV trail access. For trail conditions and reports, go to www.therealnorth.com.


F1 Snowmobile & ATV Trails


Forest County offers over 400 miles of groomed trails. 100 Mile Snow Safari Trail: The 100 Mile Snow Safari has approximately 150 miles of marked and groomed trails through the Nicolet National Forest linking all the localities of Forest County. Maps, food, etc., are available at pit stops throughout the system. Lumberjack Memorial Trails: The Lumberjack Memorial Trails Club grooms and maintains over 90 miles of trails in central and southern Forest County. These trails link to the 100 Miler as well as to the trails in the Lakewood area. Three Lakes/Brule River Trails: The Three Lakes/Brule River Trail system has over 80 miles of groomed trails in the Nicolet National Forest, linking northern Forest County to Florence, Vilas, and Oneida Counties, as well as upper Michigan trails. Tombstone-Pickerel Trails: The Tombstone-Pickerel Trails include over 20 miles of groomed trails in southwestern Forest County, with numerous pit stops and resorts, as well as a link to the Langlade County trail system. Black Bear Sportsmen's Club: The Black Bear Club is Forest County's has over 40 miles of groomed trails, linking the Crandon area north and west to trails in Oneida County. Snowmobile and ATV Trails

Langlade County provides an abundance of opportunities for everyone to enjoy snowmobiling. In the winter months there are over 500 miles of beautifully groomed snowmobile and ATV trails. These trails are maintained for the enjoyment and use of the public by 10 different local clubs and Langlade County. The County of Trails offers winter enthusiasts a beautiful ride through varying terrain including forests of beautiful hardwoods as well as frozen lakes and open fields.


Cross-Country Ski & Snowshoe Trails

The Antigo Lake Trail offers two miles of crosscountry loops. Bear Paw Outdoors include 8 miles of trails that are groomed for skating and classic skiing. Gartzke Flowage Cross-Country Ski Trail is a 5.5 mile long trail designed for all abilities, and groomed for both classic and freestyle. Jack Lake Cross-Country Ski Trail. This 15 mile trail is designed for all abilities and is

groomed for both classic and freestyle. Kettlebowl Cross-Country Ski Trail is 4.3 miles long, includes three loops, and is groomed for classic skiing. Maranatha Ski Trail System. Maintained by Silver Birch Ranch, this 4-mile system is made of of interconnected loops, with one of them crossing Rose Lake. Before skiing this loop, check ice conditions on the lake. This system is groomed for traditional skiing and is marked for beginner, intermediate, and advanced skiers. Moccasin Lake Cross-Country Ski Trail - 5.5 miles long, designed for all abilities, and groomed for both classic and freestyle. Parking area, restrooms, warming shelter with firewood and tables.

Ice Skating

If your family is looking for an afternoon of fun, grab your skates and head over to one of the skating rinks. No skates? Join in one of the free open skate afternoon or night sessions at the Langlade County Fairgrounds rink. For dates and times, contact the City of Antigo



Parks and Recreation. Langlade County Indoor Ice Rink, Multi-Purpose Building at the Langlade County Fairgrounds. The building includes a seasonal ice rink, bleachers, a full-service kitchen and large restrooms. Peaceful Valley Park skating rink & Heinzen Pavilion, 420 Field Street, Antigo. The ice rink is lighted for after-dark practice or games. Restroom and warming house facility on-site.

Downhill Skiing & Snowboarding

#4 Kettlebowl Ski Area - The Kettlebowl Area also offers an excellent, publicly owned downhill facility providing great downhill skiing and snowboarding for the entire family. The slopes are machine-groomed and open for skiing every weekend during daylight hours. The facility includes a tow rope, concessions, and a chalet featuring restrooms and a large warming area with to view the slopes.





Ski the trails of the Nicolet National Forest

The Lakewood Ski Trail winds through beautiful, wooded setting with rolling hills. The 22 kilometer main trail, known as the blue trail is continuous between McCaslin Brook Country Club and County F. Several secondary loops connect to the blue trail. The blue trail is maintained for both traditional cross-country skiing and ski skating. Trails are groomed in accordance with snow conditions. In the summer season, mountain bikes are welcome, but are not allowed on the golf course part of the trail. The Maranatha Ski Trail is a system of interconnected loops. One of these loops that crosses Rose Lake. This trail is groomed for traditional skiing and is marked for beginning, intermediate and advanced skiers. A map is available at Silver Birch Ranch. The Nicolet Nordic Ski Trails are cross-country trails groomed by volunteer efforts of local ski club members and friends in cooperation with the Forest Service. Most of the trails are double tracked. A trail map is located at the trailhead. The Nicolet State Trail in Oconto County begins in the town of Gillett near the Oconto/Shawano county line. The trail runs for about 30 miles north from Gillett in Oconto County and passes through the communities of Suring, Mountain, Lakewood and Townsend. The Quartz Hill Trail has two sections, one located on the east and one on the west side of State Highway 32. The east section leads across a boardwalk to the top of McCaslin Mountain. It has moderately steep sections, but the view from the top of this quartz rock outcrop is worth the climb. Along the trail to the top, you will pass a quartz crystal deposit with an informational sign which describes how early Indians came here to quarry quartz to create their tools. The west portion of this trail leads to the site of the Carter Fire Lookout Tower.

Shop, dine, relax. After a day on the lake or trails, explore the Lakewood Enchanted Shops. Lakewood is home to the Woodland Trail Winery perched at a scenic spot elevated over the town. The Shawano Country Barn Quilt Project was started in 2010 as a way to promote tourism to the Shawano & Menominee Counties and to encourage the preservation of historic barns in Shawano County. In 2013, a sign proclaiming Shawano County as Wisconsin's Barn Quilt Capital was erected. Today, brightly colored quilts are "blanketing" over 400 barns located throughout Shawano Country. As quilts are completed, Featured quilt stories, locations and photos can be viewed online at shawanocountry.com.

Ice Fishing & Ice Races

Shawano Lake is one of the top fishing lakes in the state and is over 6,000 acres. It features Muskie, Northern, Walleye, Crappie, Perch, Rock Bass, Large Mouth and Small Mouth Bass, Bluegill and Bullhead. The area has many other lakes-visit the Shawano Country Chamber of Commerce for a complete listing. Ice Racing takes place when the water freezes over creating a thick layer of ice on both Cecil Bay on Shawano Lake (Sundays) and on the Tilleda Pond (Saturdays) during the months of Jan. and Feb. Families watch and cheer on cars race around an icy track, competing in different classes of cars.

Take a break from the trails to visit the Snowmobile Hall of Fame and Museum in St. Germain. See historic race sleds, trophies, clothing and the Ramstad Photo Collection. Vilas County is known as the ultimate ice fishing destination. With over 1300 lakes, it is one of the largest concentrations of freshwater lakes offering smallmouth bass, walleye and musky fishing. In addition, Vilas County lakes boast exceptional fishing for crappie, bluegill and northern pike. Lakes range in size from trout ponds to a multitude of chains of lakes. Whether you're a serious angler or out for a weekend of relaxation, Vilas County is a fit for you.



Cross-Country Ski & Snowshoe Trails

An avid sports enthusiast or a just enjoying a day on the trails, Vilas County's groomed trails offer both skating and classicstyle cross-country skiing as well as opportunities for snowshoers out

on a trek.. With a mix of public forest trails and service group maintained trails, you'll find hundreds of miles of trails groomed for both skating and classic-style cross-country skiing.

Anvil Lake Trail - Terrain varies from mostly level to hilly. Trail difficulty is marked (beginner, intermediate, expert). The trail showcases the many opportunities provided within the National Forest. Mud Minnow Lake Trail - This segment of the Vilas County Forest Trail System winds through a variety of timber types including oak, pine, and aspen/birch. Although the trails may be enjoyed through the winter season, the Sunken Lake Road and Mud Minnow Lake Road are not plowed. Mud Minnow Lake Road serves as a segment of the Vilas County Snowmobile Trail System. Nicolet North Trails - These trails offer a favorite spot for cross-country skiers, hikers and mountain bikers. A parking lot (sticker required) is located on the west side of the trailhead. Part of the Nicolet National Forest, these trails connect to the Anvil Lake Trail. Length of the Nicolet North is 15 miles. Nordmarka Trails - This 3 mile system offers easy/ beginner and intermediate ski opportunities along with some hills and is maintained by the Nordmarka Ski Club of Eagle River. Ski Hill Trails - As part of the Vilas County Forest Hunter/Hiking Trail System, this trail is mowed on a three-year rotation to maintain access and improve wildlife habitat. Gentle terrain is featured on this trail system which traverse through stands of aspen, pine, oak, and hardwoods. The first .25 miles of the Ski Hill Road is a Town of Conover Road and is plowed during the winter season, making the system accessible for winter enjoyment. Snipe Lake & Ewald Lake Trails - This extensive trail system includes rolling terrain and a variety of wildlife habitats and timber types. The Vilas County Forest Roads are not plowed during the winter and several segments of these roads serve as snowmobile trails.

Wisconsin Snowmobile Information

Snowmobile registrations are required for operation of any snowmobile within the state (unless exempt), and the registrations decals must be properly displayed.

Trail Passes & Registration

A snowmobile registration certificate is valid for 2 years beginning the July 1 prior to the date of application if registration is made prior to April 1, and beginning July 1 subsequent to the date of application if registration is made after April 1 and ending on June 30, 2 years thereafter. The fee for the issuance or renewal of a public-use registration certificate is \$30.00. For more information, contact the WI DNR.

If you're coming from out of state, Wisconsin law requires those who use Wisconsin snowmobile trails to display either Wisconsin registration or a snowmobile trail pass. Funds from this program will be designated for use as trail aids and related costs to enhance all Wisconsin snowmobile recreation.

The trail pass may be purchased over the counter at many authorized sales locations or by calling WDNR at 1-888-WDNRINFO.

The \$50.00 non-resident snowmobile trail use pass is valid from July 1st through June 30th.
