

# Crash in Rudolph leaves three with critical injuries

WOOD COUNTY - On Dec. 2, 2024 at approximately 3:59 p.m. Wood County Central Dispatch received report of a two vehicle crash at the intersection of CTH C and CTH S in the Township of Rudolph. A SUV was traveling westbound on CTH C approaching CTH S. A pickup truck was traveling northbound on CTH S approaching CTH C. The pickup truck failed to yield the right-of-way and the vehicles collided in the intersection of CTH

came to rest in the northwest ditch with the SUV on its side. The operator of the pickup received minor injuries. The operator and two juvenile passengers in the SUV received critical injuries. The two juveniles were flown by helicopter to Marshfield Medical Center and the female operator was transported by ambulance to Marshfield Medical Center. CTH C, CTH S and Zubella Rd were closed for several hours. The crash remains under investigation.

"It is a responsibility that I take very seriously and I cannot wait to begin the budget proceedings in January. One of my top priorities will be making key investments in our state while also reducing the tax burden on the hard-working taxpayers of Wisconsin."

The next biennial budget will cover the two-year period from July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2027.



salting and applying liquid brine. WisDOT works closely with Wisconsin counties year-round to establish best practices and test new tools for safety and efficiency.

"With great gratitude we appreciate the dedication of our snowplow drivers. They work overnight, weekends and holidays so that we can get to where we need to be," WCHA Executive Director Patrick Vander Sanden said. "WCHA stands with Wis-DOT in urging patience and vigilance for all motorists traveling during storms. Please be aware, and give the snowplows the room to work."

Wisconsin allows flashing green warning lights on county or municipal maintenance vehicles - in addition to red or amber lights. The green warning lights are meant to increase safety, enhance driver awareness and improve visibility of maintenance vehicles.

# Plan ahead to prevent impaired driving this holiday season

### Dec. Law of the Month: Impaired driving

WOOD COUNTY - Dec. is here, and with it, another season of holiday celebrations. Don't cut the party short by driving impaired--it is dangerous, reckless and never the only option.

Wisconsin State Patrol's Dec. Law of the Month brings attention to impaired driving laws and encourages motorists to find safe ways to get to their destinations this holiday season.

"Across the state, Wisconsinites are celebrating the holidays and the end of another year," Wisconsin State Patrol Superintendent Tim Carnahan said. "We encourage everyone to take responsibility and plan ahead if you plan to celebrate. Designate a sober driver ahead of time, take public transit, or use a rideshare program to keep yourself and others safe on the roads. There is never an excuse for driving impaired."

On average, someone is injured or killed in an impaired driving crash every two hours in Wisconsin. In 2023, there were over 7,700 impaired driving crashes that claimed the lives of 186 people on Wisconsin roads.

In Wisconsin, drivers are prohibited from operating any vehicle with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of more than 0.08. Under Wisconsin's "not a drop" law, drivers under age 21 are prohibited from having any detectable amount of alcohol in their system. Drivers may not have any illegal drugs in their system when behind the wheel.

Motorists who refuse a blood/breath alcohol test will lose their license for at least one year and may have their vehicle impounded.

Over 7,500 law enforcement officers across the state are trained in Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE). This helps law enforcement detect impaired drivers and get them off the road.

With almost 400 Drug Recognition **Experts** (DREs) across the state, Wisconsin is helping lead the nation in eliminating drug-impaired driving. DREs help prevent tragedies by identifying the signs of drug-impaired driving and securing convictions to keep them off the roads.

The Wisconsin State Patrol is continuing to highlight the danger that impaired driving poses throughout the holiday season with its Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over campaign. Running from Dec. 13, 2024, through Jan. 1, 2025, Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over is an annual holiday partnership with local law enforcement to keep Wisconsin roads safe and free of impaired driv-

Driving impaired carries serious consequences. Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) charges can cost you around \$10,000. Stay safe and save money on the road this holiday season:

- · Select a sober designated driver ahead of time. If you're feeling impaired, you are likely over the 0.08 Blood Alcohol Concentration limit and should not drive.
- · Remember you have options: take the bus, call a taxi, use a rideshare or ask a sober friend to drive you home.
- · If you have a friend who is about to drive under the influence, step in. Take away their keys and get them home safely.
- If it's your turn to be the sober driver, take that job seriously.
- If you suspect a driver is impaired, safely gather as much information as you can about the vehicle, driver and location. Then call 911.

### DNR seeking public input on the statewide comprehensive outdoor recreation plan

FOR CITY TIMES

WOOD COUNTY - The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is seeking public input on the draft Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP).

The SCORP describes the supply and demand for outdoor recreation in Wisconsin. The draft Wisconsin SCORP includes an analysis of the motivations for recreating and the barriers Wisconsin residents may experience preventing them from participating in outdoor recreation.

States are required to complete SCORPs every five years to be eligible for participation in the Land and Water Conservation Fund State Assistance Program.

The Land and Water Conservation Fund was enacted by Congress in 1965 "to strength the health and vitality of the United States" through the acquisition and development of outdoor recreation resources and facilities. States are allocated funds as matching (50%) grants for the acquisition and development of public outdoor recreation sites and facilities.

The public is encouraged to submit comments using the online public input form on the DNR's Wisconsin Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan webpage. Comments may also be sent via U.S. mail, phone or email. Submit comments by Dec. 15, 2024 to:

Since the program began in 2000, hunters have donated over 98,000 deer, totaling nearly 4 million pounds of venison, to help Wisconsinites in need. A network of venison donation partners. including county land and water conservation departments, food pantries, charitable organizations. USDA-Wildlife Services and participating meat processors, all help administer and implement the program.

Hunters interested in donating a Wisconsinharvested deer to the Deer Donation Program should follow these steps:

Field dress the deer. Register the deer

through GameReg. When dropping it off, you will need the registration confirmation number.

Test the deer for CWD before taking the deer to a processor if harvested from a CWD-affected county. A list of CWD sampling locations is available on the DNR's Chronic Wasting Disease Sampling webpage.

Contact a participating processor before dropping off the deer to ensure they have the capacity to accept it. More processors may be added later in the season.

Bring the deer to the processor. If donating a deer being tested for CWD, inform the processor and provide the CWD barcode number. The processor will not distribute the deer until the results are

Hunters and non-hunt-

ers may also support the Deer Donation Program through a monetary donation at any license sales location or online through their Go Wild account. Visit Wisconsin's Deer Donation Program webpage to learn more about the program.

Avoid Lead In Venison. Deer harvested with lead bullets have been shown to have tiny lead particles or fragments remaining in a portion of the processed meat. Some of the lead fragments may be too small to see during processing. Although research has not linked lead in venison to human health effects, hunters are encouraged to use nonlead ammunition. Visit the DNR's Safely Eating Venison webpage for more information and steps to reduce potential expo-





# "The Wealth InFormation Lady": Social Security's More Recent Changes

The Trustees Reports for our Social Security OASDI (Old-Age, Survivors and Disability Insurance) Trust Fund have indicated since 2012 that changes need to be made to the system. The reports have essentially said that if nothing is done legislatively, the trust fund reserves would become depleted sometime between 2033 and 2035, which would mean that about threefourths of expected benefits would be able to be paid out, coming from the payroll taxes collected from workers each year. The last major overhaul to the system was in 1983 when President Reagan signed into law the Social Security Amendments. There have been a few notable changes that you may or may not recall more recently which

trimmed a couple of claiming strategies.

The legislative modifications to Social Security were due to section 831 of the 2015 Bipartisan Budget Deal that was signed into law on November 2, 2015 (you can read it at congress.gov). The changes affected couples who planned on using the "file and suspend" strategy. The elimination of "file and suspend" went into effect on May 1, 2016. If you turned full retirement age (66) before April 30, 2016, you were still eligible to take advantage of the "file and suspend" strategy, as long as you'd "filed" for the file and suspend prior to April 30, 2016, even if you did not want your spouse to begin receiving benefits immediately. "File and suspend" allowed a spouse who had

reached full retirement age to file for benefits, but then immediately suspend them. "Filing" for benefits allows benefits to be paid to you, a spouse or a dependent of yours. "Suspending" the benefit suspended YOU from receiving money from social security, but your spouse or dependents still could while your personal benefit was allowed to continue to grow by earning "delayed retirement credits" until the maximum age of 70. This allowed a married couple, for example, to receive ½ of the social security benefit through the spousal benefit option, by the spouse who had reached FRA having filed and suspended. Both spouses' own personal benefits could then continue to grow until the maximum age of 70.

"Restricted Application" was the second elimination for social security recipients. "Restricted Application" allowed a person who had reached full retirement age to file for benefits, "restrict" THEIR personal benefits and collect a spousal benefit from

their spouse who was receiving their own benefit. Therefore once "file and suspend" was eliminated, the spouse who's benefit was being claimed upon, would have to be receiving their monthly check from social security (in other words, they can not take advantage of the delayed retirement credits by allowing their benefit to grow while their spouse collected the spousal benefit). Restricted application was available to anyone who turned 62 prior to the end of 2015. That means if your spouse was receiving their benefit, you could file at FRA and receive your spousal benefit, delaying your own benefit and switching over at a later date when your benefit, through delayed retirement credits, become higher than your spousal benefit.

With the above changes signed into legislation in 2015, filers have been and are now deemed to be filing for all of the benefits that they are eligible for (for example, your own, and your spousal benefit if you are married, or if you were married

for at least ten years, are divorced and not remarried). You will then receive the higher of the two benefits, and will not be allowed to switch later on (to your own benefit which under the old rules, could have grown to a higher amount through "delayed retirement credits").

You can check your an-

You can check your annual social security statement at ssa.gov. I have found their site to be easy to use and very helpful. Your local social security office is also a great resource. To understand how social security benefits will coordinate with vour retirement income strategy, I highly recommend that you do a more complex analysis. There are decisions to be made that once elected, can not be undone. Seeking the advice of an experienced professional is a great

Time will tell when and how we see the next legislative changes unfold. There have been some modest adjustments to the system, looking back at Social Security's more recent changes.


