

Wisconsin The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) reminds anglers that Lake Superior's lake trout season opened on Dec. 1 and runs until Sept. 30, 2025, or until the harvest cap is met.

Lake Superior's Wisconsin waters divided are into two management WI-1, which encompasses all waters from Superior to Bark Point (considered the Western Arm), and WI-2, which includes waters from Bark Point to the Michigan border (considered Apostle the Islands region).

Each of these management units has its own lake trout harvest quota based on current lake trout populations, different allocations different user groups. Since the Apostle Islands region experiences fishing pressure, the lake trout season will close early if the quotas are reached. This year's recreational quota is 15,000 lake trout.

A bag limit of three lake trout may be harvested from the Western Arm waters,

Linked to Cucumbers Sold in Wisconsin

Wisconsinites urged

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS), along with the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection (DATCP), local health departments, and federal partners, is working to investigate a multistate outbreak of Salmonella infections linked to cucumbers.

According to the U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA), the cucumbers were sold by SunFed Produce, LLC (SunFed) and shipped to 26 states, including Wisconsin, between October 12 and November 26. The cucumbers have now been recalled. Individual cucumbers may have a sticker that says "SunFed Mexico." More information about the recall and how to identify the recalled cucumbers is available on the FDA website.

Anyone who purchased the contaminated cucumbers is advised to not eat, serve, sell, use, or distribute them and to throw them away. DHS urges Wisconsinites to check their homes for cucumbers, and if unsure whether those cucumbers are part of the recall, contact the store where they purchased them. DHS also encourages Wisconsinites to clean and sanitize surfaces that could have come into contact with the recalled product to reduce cross-contamination. Anyone who ate contaminated cucumbers and is experiencing symptoms of Salmonella infection should contact a health care provider right away. Signs and symptoms of Salmonella infection include diarrhea, abdominal pain, fever, and vomiting that lasts for several days.

Salmonella infection, or Salmonellosis, is caused by Salmonella bacteria that are spread by eating or drinking contaminated food or water, or by direct or indirect contact with poop from infected people or animals. Salmonella is a common cause of diarrheal illness, though in rare cases it can cause bloodstream infections. Children, older adults, and people with weakened immune systems may have more serious symptoms. Though most people will recover from salmonellosis on their own, some may require extra fluids to prevent dehydration.

unwillingness to provide one as a significant red flag.

 Know your rights. Laws vary by region, but in general homeowners have a right to a written contract and contractors are obligated to provide a copy of that contract signed by both parties. That contract must be provided prior to the start of the project. The contract should provide a detailed account of the work that will be done, as well as a timeline indicating important dates that components of the project will begin and be completed. The contract also should detail materials and who is providing them. Details regarding payments, guarantees and warranties also should be cited.

• Do not pay in cash. Some contractors may suggest that the project will cost less if they're paid in cash. However, home improvements should never be cash transactions. Cash does not indicate proof of payment, which can be problematic if a dispute arises.





DNR Launches Brook Trout Reserves Program Aims To Conserve Brook Trout Populations

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) today announced the implementation of the Brook Trout Reserves program, a new initiative to protect Wisconsin's native brook trout populations from changing environmental conditions.

Cold water streams provide the ideal habitat for native brook trout. Wisconsin has an estimated 22,000 miles of cold water stream habitat suitable for brook trout to call home. However, with warming stream temperatures, it's projected that in 30 vears, two out of every three miles of this habitat will become too warm to support brook trout.

To help combat this problem, DNR fisheries biologists have used survey and environmental data to identify cold water streams in 205 subwatersheds that are the most likely to persist in the face of climate change. Each subwatershed within the Brook Trout Reserves contains:

Self-sustaining brook trout populations. Above-average brook trout abundance, exceeding that of nonnative trout and

Limited or no brown trout stocking.

More than two stream miles of brook trout habitat are projected to remain by
