

Big Stone Golf Course in Three Lakes offers more than just nine holes

Big Stone Golf Course in Three Lakes has implemented numerous improvements in recent years, and with head PGA and LPGA Professional Patti Marquis at the instructional helm, a hidden gem awaits golfers in the North Woods.

State-of-the-art cutting equipment, expanded irrigation systems, re-engineered bunkers, new hole challenges, online tee times, revamped tee boxes and a long list of other improvements await golfers at the historic course.

Under the ownership of Three Lakes residents Ed Jacobsen and his wife Sue Sadowske, the course is open to the public and welcomes walkers or cart riders at any time.

New this summer are some Friday night fish fries, with the next one scheduled for June 28. Patrons can check Facebook for additional dates and details.

Improvements to the course in recent years include the planting of nearly 2,500 saplings and 30 mature trees,

the addition of seven new tee boxes and the introduction of an environmentally friendly fertilizer program. All of which have brought renewed life to Big Stone's greens and fairways.

Located at 847 Golf Course Loop Road in Three Lakes, a scenic view of Big Stone Lake and area forests awaits golfers and their guests.

"The course is so beautiful thanks to the grounds crew and it gets better every year," said Marquis. "Superintendent John Schultz, course manager Lennel Sergent, and Bobby Schneider are the three hardest working people I've ever worked with. You could give John a coat hanger and he could fix anything."

Some of the course holes have been lengthened, and with tree trimming and grass management completed, average golfers can challenge their skills and have a chance to score well. Players of all abilities will appreciate the casual atmosphere, smooth

consistent greens and enjoyable nine-hole layout.

The PGA has rated the course to a slope of 129 from the blue tees. Marquis noted that the course is challenging but fair, and added that Big Stone is the "perfect venue" for new or advanced golfers. Three additional sets of tees are available including white, gold and red sets.

Marquis has been giving lessons at Big Stone Golf Course since 2020. She has been teaching golf for more than 45 years, and has won numerous awards.

In 2022, Marquis was named one of the Top-50 LPGA Teachers in the country. She offers individual lessons and clinics, in addition to classes for new golfers. Classes are available for women, men and juniors.

"Mondays with Patti" is open to all women golfers, regardless of ability. Classes are \$25 per person and run on Mondays from 5 to 7 p.m. Monday, July 1, will be the only date this summer when this class will not run.

Additionally, a junior camp will run on Wednesdays in July from 10 a.m. until noon. Patrons can check the website or Facebook for exact dates. The cost is \$125 per student.

Six different golf leagues are also available for the public to join, including men's and women's leagues, men's and women's senior leagues, a couples league and a men's individual senior league.

With seating available for people inside the air conditioned clubhouse and out on the patio, golfers can meet up with family and friends before or after a round of golf. A late afternoon setting affords many deer sightings of the numerous fawns born on the course, according to Marquis.

The clubhouse patio has views of the course, the local wildlife and Big Stone Lake. A new pavilion, added in 2021, compliments the patio. It can be utilized for special events; or simply to keep golfers dry during rain, or cool on hot days.

The full-service bar features a broad selection of tap beers, wine, liquor, snacks and the usual golf course fare of brats, sandwiches and pizzas.

Big Stone Golf Course is open seven days a week from 8 a.m. until close, with the last tee time each day being 5:50 p.m.



The eFoil gives riders the experience of a combination of surfing, flying, and deep-powder snowboarding, and the staff at WalkAbout can confirm this experience firsthand after demonstrating the eFoil with the store's owners.

Handmade in Puerto Rico, Lift boards are shipped by a family-run business that has developed the eFoil, a hydrofoil board that incorporates technology found in smartphones, drones, and even electric vehicles.

The boards propel their operators forward and above the water using an eFoil fin, relying on electric power instead of manual power or wind. They run on a rechargeable lithium battery and create no emissions or noise.

Speeds are controlled by a Bluetooth-connected hand remote and riders can go upwards of 25 mph on a two-hour charge.

Northland Marine of Three Lakes, the largest Minn Kota online dealer in the world, are boat-rigging experts ready to equip anglers with Minn Kota trolling motors and other electronics from Humminbird and Talon.

Located on the corner of West School Street and Anderson Street in downtown Three Lakes, the authorized service and rigging center specializes in integrating trolling motors and graphs to work in tandem.

Northland Marine, which ships products and boat parts around the world, celebrated its 10th anniversary in April under the guidance of owners Andrew Boers and Jason Kral.

Starting with a business where 80% of their work was online shipments, they have launched a new business model that added installation services for trolling motors, batteries, on-board chargers and wiring.

Boosting that expansion was their movement the past year into a new showroom that is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., the year around.

Kral said they also answer questions about buying the correct Minn Kota trolling motors and Humminbird graphs.

"Minn Kota is the leader in the 'One Boat Network,' integrating your Minn Kota trolling motor and Hummingbird graphs to work together so you spend less time searching for fish and more time fishing," said Kral.

The two say the top-of-the-line One Boat Network setup is the Minn Kota Terrova, Ulterra or Ultrex I-Pilot Link trolling motor, with a networkable Humminbird Helix or Solix unit(s). And there are many add-on features such as the Minn Kota Talon. With a communication port, all of these units can be controlled from the Humminbird graph. A remote control or by simply using a foot pedal.

The Minn Kota I-Pilot System is a stand-alone GPS trolling motor system that allows anglers to record tracks or "drifts."

"This allows you to set the

desired speed of the boat and the trolling motor will take you down your prerecorded track of up to 2 miles long," said Boers. "Probably the biggest selling feature of the I-Pilot system is the 'SpotLock' feature. With the push of a button, you can anchor your boat and the trolling motor will hold the boat on your favorite fishing spot. No more swinging the mud off your anchor when you pull it into your boat," he said.

I-Pilot also offers an autopilot function that allows anglers to point the trolling motor in the direction they want to go and the trolling motor will autocorrect to keep anglers on course while they fish.

Northland Marine is now stocked with Minn Kota's new brushless Quest trolling motors – added thrust, longer run times and a longer lifespan. Boers and Kral were born and raised in the area, both graduating from Three Lakes High School. Boers and Kral are both Minn Kotaauthorized certified technicians and Garmin-authorized certified technicians.





Three Lakes Shootout races set this weekend

High-powered race boats from around the Midwest will once again converge on Big Stone Lake Saturday, June 22 for the 15th annual Three Lakes Shootout and Radar Run. It's a full day of racing beginning at 11 a.m. and running almost non-stop until 5 p.m.

The popular boat racing event features all types of boats vying against the radar gun for the fastest speed and trophies in 11 different racing classes. Boat speeds can reach up to 130 miles per hour among the tunnel, drag, hydro, and jet boat classes as they speed down the 1,000-foot race course. The shootout delivers a unique experience for spectators, who can enjoy free viewing of all the action from piers and bleacher seating on Big Stone Lake at the Sunset Grill and Anchor Marine, just east of Three Lakes on Highway 32.

Free parking will be available on Connors Road, just east of the Three Lakes Airport, and shuttles will bring spectators to bleacher seating.

"Generally a good time," said Aaron Aschenbrenner. "This is a really unique event."

Spectators are also encouraged

to watch the racing action from their boats.

Anyone who anchors their personal boats near the 1,000-foot course can visit the shootout grounds via a shuttle pontoon from Watercraft Sales.

There will also be great food and beverage options, 50-50 raffles, shootout T-shirts and memorabilia for sale and a special raffle to win rides in some of the race boats at the 1 p.m. intermission.

In addition to the racing action on Saturday, the public is invited to get an up-close look at the race boats on Friday, June 21, beginning at 5 p.m. at SpiritView Lakeside Restaurant on Highway 32. There will be food and beverages available for purchase outside, along with Shootout T-shirt sales and 50-50 cash raffles. Live music begins later in the evening at SpiritView. There will also be the popular race boat tour of the Three Lakes Chain on Friday starting at 1 p.m. leaving from the Sunset Grill. This tradition, which began as a way to introduce the Three Lakes Chain of Lakes to boat racers from out of the area, has become a great way for local residents to see the boats as

they pass by their piers. Proceeds from the shootout event will again benefit the American Veterans (AmVets) organization of Oneida County Post 724 in Rhinelander. AmVets is the nation's oldest and largest service group, chartered by the U.S. Congress to assist military heroes with all aspects of life, from disability claims to finding a job. The local AmVets Post serves veterans from not only the Three Lakes area, but also those from all of Oneida and portions of Langlade counties. Post 724 members assist the shootout with parking, traffic control and raffles. This annual event also helps to benefit the entire Three Lakes area, as it brings in boat drivers and their families and friends, who spend the weekend in and around our community.


landing.
